ORDER, DATED 22ND SEPTEMBER, 1954, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION SEVEN C OF THE GAME PRESERVATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1928, AS INSERTED BY SECTION THREE OF THE GAME LAW AMENDMENT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1951.

ORDER, DATED 19TH AUGUST, 1954, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION SEVEN OF THE GAME PRESERVATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1928, AS AMENDED BY SECTION TWO OF THE GAME LAW AMENDMENT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1951.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (3) of Section Seven of the Game Preservation Act (Northern Ireland), 1928, (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Act") as amended by Section Two of the Game Law Amendment Act (Northern Ireland), 1951, that the Minister of Home Affairs may by order vary any period of close season referred to in sub-sections (1) and (2) of Section Seven of the principal Act;

AND WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (5) of Section Seven F of the principal Act notice of the proposal to make an Order and the purport thereof was duly given on the 1st day of June, 1954;

AND WHEREAS objections to the making of the Order have been received;

AND WHEREAS the said objections have been duly considered by me:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, THE RIGHT HONOURABLE GEORGE B. HANNA, Q.C., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by Section Seven of the principal Act as amended by Section Two of the Game Law Amendment Act (Northern Ireland), 1951, hereby Order and Direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. It shall be unlawful for any person wilfully to take, kill or destroy any snipe during the period commencing on the first day of February in any year and ending with the thirty-first day of August next following.

2. This Order shall have effect as and from the 1st day of September, 1954.
