

REGULATIONS DATED 5TH FEBRUARY, 1954, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF
COMMERCE UNDER SECTION 12 OF THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

1954. No. 12

The Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred upon it under or by virtue of Section 12 of the Roads Act, 1920(a), the Ministries Act (Northern Ireland), 1944(b), and the Ministries (Transfer of Functions) (No. 3) Order, 1944(c) hereby makes the following Regulations:

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as “The Road Vehicles (Registration and Licensing) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1954.”

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921(d) applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Road Vehicles (Registration and Licensing) (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1947(e), shall have effect as though the words “silver or light grey” were inserted after the word “white” in sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 2 of the Fifth Schedule.

School Crossings

REGULATIONS, DATED THE 19TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1954, MADE BY THE
MINISTRY OF COMMERCE UNDER THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD
TRAFFIC ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1929.

1954. No. 154

The Ministry of Commerce in exercise of the powers vested in it by Section 8 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland), 1929 (f), and of all other powers in that behalf enabling it, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as “The Road Vehicles (School Crossings) Regulations, 1954”, and shall come into force on 1st day of January, 1955.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (a), as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921 (b), applies for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. A person driving or propelling a vehicle on a public highway where children are crossing or seeking to cross the highway shall not on being directed so to do by a School Crossing Patrol neglect or refuse to stop the vehicle.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations "School Crossing Patrol" means a person appointed in accordance with a Scheme framed under Section 51(5) of the Education Act (Northern Ireland) 1947 (c) who is wearing the uniform described in the first part of the Schedule to these Regulations and equipped with a sign of the size, colour and type shown in the second part of the Schedule.

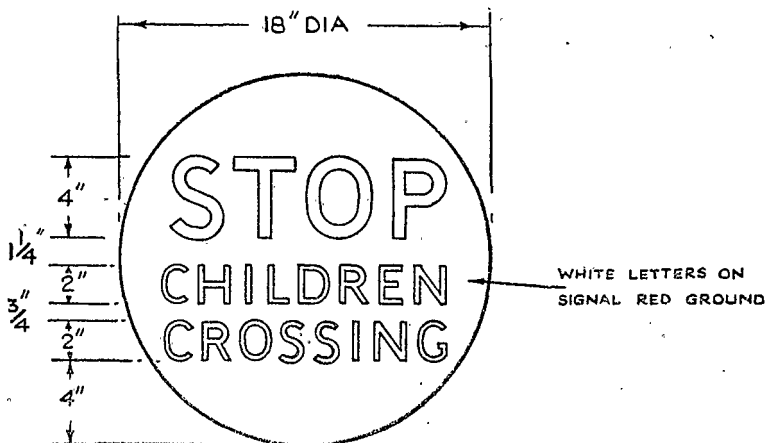
SCHEDULE

PART I

The uniform mentioned in Article 3 of the Regulations shall consist of:—

- (a) a peaked cap;
- (b) a white dust coat or a white raincoat;
- (c) an armband bearing the words "school crossing patrol" to be worn over the dust coat or raincoat.
