Foreign Animals Order (Northern Ireland) 1957.

ORDER, DATED THE 25TH APRIL, 1957, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 27 OF THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1894(a).

The Ministry of Agriculture by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Diseases of Animals Acts (Northern Ireland) 1894 to 1955(b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf orders and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Citation and Commencement

1. This Order, which may be cited as the Foreign Animals Order (Northern Ireland) 1957 shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of May, 1957.

Interpretation

2. In this Order

“Animal” means ruminating animal.

“Foreign country” means any country other than Great Britain and the Irish Republic.

Importation under Licence

3.—(1) The Ministry may by licence and in accordance with any conditions it may attach to such licence, authorise the importation into Northern Ireland of an animal from a foreign country.

(2) The Ministry may issue a licence under this Order only when it is satisfied that the animal is required for exhibition or for other exceptional purpose.

4. When a licence is issued by the Ministry under this Order the provisions of Part I of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 shall not apply to the animal mentioned therein.
