Regulation 2 is intended to clarify a provision of the principal Regulations and Regulation 4 postpones the date of election for accepting the provisions of the Regulations arising out of the reports of the Committee appointed by the Minister of Education to consider the salaries, allowances and other matters affecting the remuneration of teachers.

Registration and Attendance of Pupils (Amending Regulations), 1957

REGULATIONS DATED 16TH MAY, 1957, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF
EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS. (NORTHERN IRELAND),
1947 TO 1956.

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 35, 75 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:

1.—(1) These Regulations shall be cited as the Registration and Attendance of Pupils (Amending Regulations), 1957.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st August, 1957.

(3) The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Registration and Attendance of Pupils Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948(a).

2. After Regulation 5 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following Regulation:—

“The provisions of Paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Regulation shall not apply in the case of a child who is withdrawn from a primary school and admitted to a secondary school.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE
