# Training Colleges

Provided, however, that if the holder of an Exhibition is for any reason absent from his course of study or fails to comply with the directions of the Ministry or the authorities of the university, college or institution, the Ministry may reduce or withhold any payment normally due in respect of the Exhibition.

9. A person who has held an Exhibition may not at any time hold another Exhibition.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations provide for the award of a number of Exhibitions annually to students who have followed part-time courses in institutions of further education.

# Admission of Students to Training Colleges

REGULATIONS, DATED 21ST JULY, 1958, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1956.

### 1958. No. 113

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Section 59 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the "Admission of Students to Training Colleges Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1958."

(2) These Regulations shall have effect from 1st January, 1959.

2.—(1) In these Regulations the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:

- (a) "recognised " means recognised by the Ministry for the purpose of the payment of grant;
  - "general training colleges" means approved training colleges in Northern Ireland which provide courses of general training for primary and secondary teachers;
- (b) with reference to applications for admission to a general training college "Mature Candidate" means a candidate who is not less than 23 years and not more than 30 years of age on 1st March in the year in which admission is sought and who has been engaged in teaching or in remunerative full-time employment other than teaching, for at least two years; and "Ordinary Candidate" means a candidate who is not less than 17 years and not more than 21 years of age on 1st March in the year in which admission is sought:

Provided that in the case of a university graduate, who is not a Mature Candidate, the upper limit of age may be extended at the discretion of the Ministry.

(2) In these Regulations, any expression which refers to candidates for, or subjects or results of, the Ministry's Grammar School Senior Certificate Examination, shall have the same meaning as in the Rules and Programme of the Ministry governing that examination.

3. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations—

(1) Candidates for admission to the general training colleges shall be required to fulfil the conditions in Part I, Part II or Part III of the Schedule.

(2) Candidates for admission to the Ulster College of Physical Education shall be required to fulfil the conditions in Part IV of the Schedule.

4. The number of candidates to be admitted each year to each training college shall be determined by the Ministry after consultation with the Principal of the college.

5. A candidate for admission to a course of training shall make application in such form and, in any year, by such date as the Ministry may determine and in connection with the application shall pay any fee prescribed and shall furnish the Ministry with such information as it may require.

6. Nothing in these Regulations shall be regarded as extending the latest dates of application for admission to the Ministry's Grammar School Senior Certificate Examination.

7. Candidates shall be required, as a condition of admission to training, to sign an undertaking that on completion of the course of training they will without undue delay seek employment as teachers in recognised schools in Northern Ireland and will serve as teachers in such schools for a period of at least two years.

8. When applying for admission to training candidates must furnish the names and addresses of two persons to whom reference

may be made by the Ministry as to the suitability of the candidate. In the case of Ordinary Candidates to whom Part I of the Schedule applies, one of those persons must be the Principal of the school last attended.

### SCHEDULE

# PART I

1. To be eligible for admission to training in a general training college an Ordinary Candidate, other than a candidate to whom Part II or Part III refers, must—

- (a) have been awarded the Ministry's Grammar School Senior Certificate or have obtained such marks as are required for the award of that Certificate;
- (b) show aptitude for a course provided in the College; and
- (c) pass tests in general suitability and medical fitness.

2. Candidates, to whom this part of the Schedule refers, shall be placed in order of merit in respect of each Training College. The order of merit shall be determined for men and women separately and shall be calculated by the addition in accordance with the following provisions of the marks obtained in six subjects of the Senior Certificate Examination. The provisions relating to the selection of subjects and the calculation of marks shall be as follows:—

- (a) English Language shall be included;
- (b) not more than three mathematical subjects may be included;
- (c) subject to the provisions of sub-paragraphs (a), (b), (d) and (e) the subjects selected shall be those which are most advantageous to the candidate and, where a candidate presented for a subject of the Senior Certificate Examination more than once (whether the subject has been taken at ordinary level or at advanced level or at both ordinary and advanced level), the most advantageous mark obtained shall be regarded as the mark appropriate to that subject;
- (d) where a candidate has obtained marks in the Senior Certificate Examination in any subject which is shown in the left-hand column hereunder and has, in addition, obtained marks in the subject or subjects shown opposite it in the right-hand column, the subject in the left-hand column or the corresponding subject or subjects in the right-hand column, but not both, may be selected

- (e) marks obtained in a subject at advanced level shall, if the candidate has been credited with a pass in that subject, be increased as follows:—
  - (i) if the candidate has been credited with a pass at ordinary level, by 33<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> per cent.;
  - (ii) if the candidate has obtained a mark at least equal to 40 per cent. of the maximum, by 50 per cent.

### PART II

A candidate who does not fulfil the provisions of 1(a) of Part I may be considered for admission to a general training college if—

- (1) he can show that he has reached a satisfactory standard of education and, in the case of an Ordinary Candidate, that by reference to the subjects of any
- course which he has followed and the marks obtained in any examination, he has reached a standard which is comparable with that applicable to successful candidates under Part I:
- (2) he can show aptitude for a course provided in the College; and
- (3) he passes tests in general suitability and medical fitness.

# PART III

Graduates of approved universities shall be eligible for admission to the general training colleges, subject to showing aptitude for a course provided in the College and to passing tests in general suitability and in medical fitness.

# PART IV

To be eligible for admission to the Ulster College of Physical Education a candidate must—

(a) be not less than 17 years of age on 1st March in the year in which admission is sought;

(b) have been awarded the Ministry's Grammar School Senior Certificate or have reached a standard of education recognised by the Ministry as at least equivalent;

(c) pass a practical test of aptitude for the course; and(d) pass tests in general suitability and medical fitness.

### Training Colleges: Salaries and Allowances Amending Regulations

REGULATIONS DATED 23RD DECEMBER, 1958, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1956, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 83 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the "Training College Teachers (Salaries and Allowances) Amending Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1958."

(2) The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Training College Teachers (Salaries and Allowances) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1957(a).

2. With effect from 1st January, 1959, the rates of salaries of full-time lecturers, senior lecturers and principal lecturers calculated by reference to the scales prescribed in paragraph (1) of Regulation 3 of the existing Regulations shall be increased by 5%.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE
