REGULATIONS, DATED 19TH MARCH, 1958, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SUB-SECTION (1) OF SECTION 126 AND SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION 134 OF THE CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1950.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by sub-section (1) of Section 126 and sub-section (2) of Section 134 of the Children and Young Persons Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. The contributions to be made under sub-section (1) of Section 126 of the Children and Young Persons Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, by the local authority named in a training school order to the expenses of the managers of a training school throughout any time in the financial year 1958-59 during which the person to whom the order relates is under the care of the said managers and not out on licence or under supervision shall be at the rate of ninety-six shillings a week.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Training Schools (Contributions by Local Authorities) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1958, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1958.

I, the Right Honourable Terence Marne O'Neill, Minister of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by sub-section (1) of section one of the Ulster Folk Museum Act (Northern Ireland), 1958, and of every other power enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order as follows:—

1. The Trustees of the Ulster Folk Museum shall be established on the 1st day of October, 1958.
