WAGES COUNCILS**Wages Regulation (Baking)**

ORDER, DATED 6TH AUGUST, 1959, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945(a), TO GIVE EFFECT TO WAGES REGULATION PROPOSALS RECEIVED FROM THE BAKING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND).

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1959.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall have effect on and from the specified date.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 20th day of August, 1959, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

SCHEDULE

STATUTORY MINIMUM REMUNERATION FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN THE COUNTY OF THE CITY OF LONDONDERRY

The Baking Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1959(b) (Order N.I.Bk. (244)) shall have effect as if, in the Schedule thereto:—

1. for paragraph 1 there were substituted the following paragraph—

"Paragraph 1.

Subject to the provisions of this Schedule the statutory minimum remuneration payable to workers of the classes specified in the following table is:—
