WAGES COUNCILS

Wages Regulation (Baking)

ORDER, DATED 6TH AUGUST, 1959, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945(a), TO GIVE EFFECT TO WAGES REGULATION PROPOSALS RECEIVED FROM THE BAKING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND).

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order (Northern Ireland), 1959.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall have effect on and from the specified date.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 20th day of August, 1959, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

SCHEDULE

STATUTORY MINIMUM REMUNERATION FOR CERTAIN MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN THE COUNTY OF THE CITY OF BELFAST AND IN DISTRICTS SITUATE WITHIN A RADIUS OF 15 STATUTE MILES THEREFROM

The Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 1) Order, 1958(b) (Order N.I.Bk. (237)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto for paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 there were substituted the following paragraphs:—
