

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order, which comes into operation on 28th December, 1960, amends the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1958 (Order N.I.W.R. (59)) as amended by the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1960 (Order N.I.W.R. (61)) by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders. New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.

Order N.I.W.R. (61) is revoked.

*These Regulations shall cease to have effect unless before the expiration of six months from the 3rd day of April, 1961, they have been approved by a Resolution of each House of Parliament.*

## NATIONAL ASSISTANCE

## Determination of Need

REGULATIONS, DATED 20TH DECEMBER, 1960, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTIONS 5 AND 6 OF THE NATIONAL ASSISTANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance in accordance with the provisions of section 6 of the National Assistance Act (Northern Ireland), 1948(a), and in exercise of powers conferred by section 5 of that Act, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

*Citation, interpretation and commencement*

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the National Assistance (Determination of Need) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1960, shall be read as one with the National Assistance (Determination of Need) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and shall come into operation on the 3rd April, 1961.

*Amendment of scales for the computation of requirements other than rent*

2.—(1) Paragraph 2 of Part I of the Schedule to the principal regulations (which paragraph provides the ordinary scale for computing the requirements other than rent of applicants for assistance) shall have effect as if for the sums specified in the said paragraph there were substituted the sums following:

(2) Paragraph 3 of Part I of the said Schedule (which paragraph provides a special scale for computing the requirements other than rent of blind and certain tuberculous persons who are applicants for assistance) shall have effect as if for the sums specified in the said paragraph there were substituted the sums following:

(b) For any other such person, being—		
(i) aged 21 years or over .....	76	0

*Amendment relating to the requirements of applicants in accommodation provided under the Welfare Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1949*

3. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 5 of Part I of the Schedule to the principal regulations:

*“Applicants in accommodation provided under the Welfare Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1949.*

5. The requirements of an applicant who is residing in accommodation provided under section 4 or section 7 of the Welfare Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1949(a), and in whose case the accommodation so provided includes board and other services shall be taken to be the amount which exceeds by eleven shillings and six pence the weekly sum appropriate to his case for the time being prescribed under sub-section (3) of section 5 of that Act as the minimum charge for that accommodation.”

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)*

These Regulations increase the weekly sums prescribed for the purpose of computing the requirements, other than rent, of applicants for assistance under the National Assistance Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, and also increase the weekly sum taken to be the requirements of an applicant for national assistance who is residing in accommodation provided under the Welfare Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1949.
