PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS: FORMS

REGULATIONS, DATED 2ND MAY, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN OF AND THE FOURTH AND SEVENTH SCHEDULES TO THE ELECTORAL LAW ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1962(a).

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section one hundred and twenty-seven of and the Fourth and Seventh Schedules to the Electoral Law Act (Northern Ireland), 1962, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Electoral Law (Parliamentary Elections) (Forms) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1962.

Forms

2. The forms contained in the Schedule shall be used in connection with parliamentary elections in constituencies other than the University constituency, for the purposes for which they are expressed to be applicable.

INSTRUCTIONS TO PERSONS DESIRING TO APPOINT PROXIES TO VOTE
AT PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS

1. WHO MAY APPOINT A PROXY—Any parliamentary elector registered by virtue of a residence qualification or a business premises qualification who satisfied the electoral officer that he will or is likely to be at sea or out of the United Kingdom for a period or two or more periods together exceeding four weeks in any six consecutive months.

2. WHO MAY BE APPOINTED PROXY—A person to be appointed a proxy must be a registered elector for a constituency (other than the university constituency) in Northern Ireland and be not under any legal incapacity to vote.

3. POWERS OF A PROXY—A person appointed as proxy will be able to vote on your behalf at a parliamentary election initiated during the period for which you have appointed him.

Neither the electoral officer nor the election officials can be responsible for the way in which your proxy votes. It is for you to give your proxy any instructions you think necessary as to the way in which he is to vote on your behalf.

4. HOW TO APPOINT A PROXY—In the application you must insert your own name and the name of the person whom you desire to nominate as proxy. It is desirable that the name of a second person should be inserted as the first may be unwilling or not qualified to act. You must sign the application in the presence of a witness known to you, and the witness must also sign the form and state his address.

A proxy paper issued in accordance with the application will be sent by the electoral officer direct to the person appointed as proxy, so that it may be available for use without delay.

5. DURATION OF APPOINTMENT—The appointment will remain in force for such period not exceeding six months as specified in this form but this appointment shall terminate if before the last-mentioned date the elector dies, ceases to be entitled to appoint a proxy or cancels this appointment or the proxy dies or ceases to be qualified to be appointed proxy.

You may cancel the appointment by giving written notice of cancellation to the electoral officer.

6. RESTRICTIONS AS TO THE APPOINTMENT OF AND VOTING BY PROXIES—A person may not be appointed or vote as proxy for more than two electors in any constituency of whom he is neither the spouse, parent, grandparent, brother, sister, child or grandchild.

You may not appoint more than one person as proxy in any one constituency and may not in any case appoint more than two proxies.

7. A PROXY APPLICATION OR THE CANCELLATION OF THE APPOINTMENT OF A PROXY WILL BE OF NO EFFECT UNLESS RECEIVED BY THE ELECTORAL OFFICER NOT LATER THAN FOUR DAYS BEFORE THE NOMINATION DAY FOR THE ELECTION.
