

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Scheme, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Scheme provides for the making of subsidy payments in each of the years 1962, 1963 and 1964 to farmers in respect of certain breeding cows and in-calf heifers owned by them and in respect of which the conditions of the Scheme have been complied with. The rate for 1962 is £9 per head or such higher amount as may be determined, while the rates for 1963 and 1964 are to be prescribed by Order.

REGULATIONS, DATED 7TH MAY, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTIONS SEVENTY, ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN AND THE SIXTH AND SEVENTH SCHEDULES TO THE ELECTORAL LAW ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1962(a).

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections seventy, one hundred and twenty-seven of and the Sixth and Seventh Schedules to the Electoral Law Act (Northern Ireland), 1962, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Electoral Law (Parliamentary Elections) (University Constituency) (Forms) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1962.

Forms

2. The forms contained in the Schedule shall be used in connection with parliamentary elections in the University Constituency, for the purposes for which they are expressed to be applicable.

TO THE REGISTRATION OFFICER, University Constituency

The elector must insert here his surname and other names in full.

I, of hereby state that during the period from to I will or am likely to be at sea or out of the United Kingdom, and that I desire to nominate to act as my proxy at any parliamentary election initiated during that period the person nominated below as first choice or (if he or she is unwilling or not qualified to act) the person nominated below as a second choice.

3. The elector may if he so desires enter opposite particulars of the person (who may be a person nominated above) whom he authorises to furnish to the electoral officer such information as that officer may require for the purpose of determining the application.

NOTE

1. WHO MAY APPOINT A PROXY—Any elector who satisfies the registration officer that he will or is likely to be at sea or out of the United Kingdom for a period or two or more periods together exceeding four weeks in any six consecutive months.

2. WHO MAY BE APPOINTED PROXY—Any person who is—

(a) a British subject or person to whom section one hundred and twenty-one of the Electoral Law Act (Northern Ireland), 1962, applies;

(b) of full age;

(c) not subject to any legal incapacity to vote; and

(d) resident within the postal voting area, which is Northern Ireland, Great Britain, the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands and the Republic of Ireland.

3. POWERS OF A PROXY—A person appointed as proxy will be able to vote on your behalf at a parliamentary election initiated during the period for which the appointment is in force.

The registration officer cannot be responsible for the way in which your proxy votes. It is for you to give your proxy any instructions you think necessary as to the way in which he is to vote on your behalf.

4. HOW TO APPOINT A PROXY—In the application you must insert your own name and the name of the person whom you desire to nominate as proxy. It is desirable that the name of a second person should be inserted as the first may be unwilling or not qualified to act. You must sign the application in the presence of a witness known to you, and the witness must also sign the form and state his address.

A proxy paper issued in accordance with the application will be sent by the registration officer direct to the person appointed as proxy.

5. DURATION OF APPOINTMENT—Unless otherwise specified by the elector making the appointment the appointment of a proxy shall remain in force—

(a) (i) so long as the elector remains entitled to appoint a proxy; or

(ii) the proxy remains qualified to be appointed; or

(b) until—

(i) the death of the elector or proxy; or

(ii) the cancellation of the appointment.

You may cancel the appointment by giving written notice of cancellation to the registration officer.

6. RESTRICTIONS AS TO THE APPOINTMENT OF AND VOTING BY PROXIES—A person shall not be appointed proxy or vote as such for more than two electors in the constituency of whom he is neither the spouse, parent, grandparent, brother, sister, child or grandchild.

You may not appoint more than one person as proxy in any one constituency and may not in any case appoint more than two proxies.

7. A PROXY APPLICATION OR THE CANCELLATION OF THE APPOINTMENT OF A PROXY WILL BE OF NO EFFECT UNLESS RECEIVED BY THE REGISTRATION OFFICER NOT LATER THAN FOUR DAYS BEFORE THE NOMINATION DAY FOR THE ELECTION.

NOTE: RESTRICTIONS AS TO THE APPOINTMENT OF AND VOTING BY PROXIES

1. A person shall not be appointed or vote as proxy unless he is—
 - (a) a British subject or person to whom section one hundred and twenty-one of the Electoral Law Act (Northern Ireland), 1962, applies;
 - (b) of full age;
 - (c) not subject to any legal incapacity to vote; and
 - (d) resident within the postal voting area which is Northern Ireland, Great Britain, the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands and the Republic of Ireland.
