EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Scheme, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Scheme amends the Cattle Headage Payments Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1964, and enables the Ministry of Agriculture to pay to farmers Headage Payments in respect of home-bred cattle certified under the Fatstock Guarantee Scheme 1965/66. The periods and the rates of payment are set out in Article 3 of the Scheme.

CLEAN AIR ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964

Appointed Day

ORDER, DATED 14TH APRIL, 1965, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER SECTION 45 OF THE CLEAN AIR ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964.

I, the Right Honourable William J. Morgan, Minister of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 45 of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a), do hereby order as follows:—

(a) 1964. c. 16 (N.I.).

1. This Order may be cited as the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964 (Appointed Day) Order (Northern Ireland) 1965.

2. The Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964 shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1965.

CLEAN AIR

Dark Smoke—Permitted Periods

REGULATIONS, DATED 14TH APRIL, 1965, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE CLEAN AIR ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964:

The Ministry of Health and Social Services in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 1 of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation and Commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Dark Smoke (Permitted Periods) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1965, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1965.

Interpretation

2.—(1) In these regulations “black smoke” means smoke which, if compared in the appropriate manner with a chart of the type known at the date of the passing of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964 as the Ringelmann Chart, would appear to be as dark as or darker than shade 4 on the chart.

(2) Where a single boiler or unit of industrial plant is fired by more than one furnace discharging to the same chimney those furnaces shall, for the purposes of these regulations, be deemed to be one furnace.

Permitted Periods

3.—(1) Subject to the provisions of these regulations, emissions of dark smoke from any chimney for not longer than 10 minutes in the aggregate in any period of 8 hours, or, if soot-blowing is carried out within any such period, for not longer than 14 minutes in the aggregate in that period, shall be left out of account for the purposes of section 1 of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964.
