EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations provide that premises to which the Office and Shop Premises Act (Northern Ireland) 1966 applies which are in factories shall be excepted from the requirements of section 24 of the Act of 1966 (which relates to the provision of first-aid boxes or cupboards and the qualifications in certain cases of the persons in charge of them) and shall be deemed to be part of the factories for the purposes of section 60 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965 (which contains similar requirements as to first-aid but differing in detail).

The Regulations also provide that, in reckoning the number of employees in these premises to which the Act of 1966 applies for the purpose of ascertaining whether the person in charge of a first-aid box or cupboard must be trained in first-aid treatment, only one in three shall be taken into account.

OFFICE AND SHOP PREMISES

Offices in Electrical Stations (First-aid)

REGULATIONS, DATED 27TH JUNE 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER SECTION 69(2) AND (3) OF THE OFFICE AND SHOP PREMISES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services—

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 69(2) and (3) of the Office and Shop Premises Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf; and
- (b) after publishing, pursuant to Schedule 1 to the Act, notice of the proposal to make the Regulations and not having received any objection to the draft in regard to which it is required by the said Schedule to direct an inquiry to be held,

hereby makes the following special Regulations:—

(a) 1966, c. 26 (N.I.).

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Offices in Electrical Stations (First-aid) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1968.

(2) In these Regulations—

“the Act of 1965” means the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965(a) and

“the Act of 1966” means the Office and Shop Premises Act (Northern Ireland) 1966.

Premises to which the Regulations apply

2. These Regulations shall apply to office premises to which the Act of 1966 applies, being premises which, but for the operation of section 69(1) of the Act of 1966 (which section, for the purposes of section 121(1) of the Act of 1965, excludes from electrical stations office premises comprised therein) would, for the purposes of the said section 121(1) form part of premises to which the said section 121(1) applies.

Exception of premises from operation of section 24 of the Act of 1966

3. Office premises to which these Regulations apply—

(a) shall be excepted from the operation of section 24 (first-aid: general provisions) of the Act of 1966; and

(b) shall, notwithstanding section 69(1) of the Act of 1966, be deemed for the purposes of section 60 (first-aid) of the Act of 1965 to form part of the premises of which, but for the said section 69(1), they would form part.

Counting of employees for purposes of section 60 of the Act of 1965

4. For the purposes of the application to premises to which section 121(1) of the Act of 1965 applies, of subsection (4) of section 60 of that Act (which, amongst other things, requires that the person under whose charge is placed a first-aid box or cupboard provided in a factory must, where more than fifty or other lower prescribed number of persons are employed, be trained in first-aid treatment), persons employed to work in office premises which, by virtue of these Regulations, are deemed for the purposes of the said section 60 to form part of the first-mentioned premises shall be taken into account to a number less than the full number thereof, that is to say, of the persons employed to work at any one time in any such office premises as aforesaid—

(a) of every unit of 3 persons, 1 person shall be taken into account; and

(b) of any fraction of a unit of 3 persons, where the fraction consists of 2 persons, 1 person shall be taken into account and where the fraction consists of 1 person, that person shall be left out of account.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations provide that office premises which are in electrical stations shall be excepted from the requirements of section 24 of the Office and Shop Premises Act (Northern Ireland) 1966 (which relates to the provision of first-aid boxes or cupboards and the qualifications in certain cases of the persons in charge of them) and shall be deemed to be part of the electrical stations for the purposes of section 60 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965 (which contains similar requirements as to first-aid but differing in detail).

The Regulations also provide that in reckoning the number of employees in such office premises only one in three employees shall be taken into account for the purpose of ascertaining whether the person in charge of a first-aid box or cupboard must be trained in first-aid treatment.

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING

Engineering Industry Training Board

ORDER, DATED 28TH JUNE 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE INDUSTRIAL TRAINING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services after consultation with the Engineering Industry Training Board and with organisations and associations of organisations appearing to it to be representative respectively of substantial numbers of employers engaging in the activities hereinafter mentioned and of substantial numbers of persons employed in those activities and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Industrial Training Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and interpretation

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967.

(2) In this Order—

“the Act” means the Industrial Training Act (Northern Ireland) 1964;

“the Board” means the Engineering Industry Training Board;

“the principal Order” means the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order (Northern Ireland) 1964(b).

Activities of the Board

2. The activities in relation to which the Board exercises the functions conferred by the Act upon industrial training boards shall, in lieu of the activities
