**SHEEP IMPROVEMENT**

SCHEME, DATED 13TH AUGUST 1971, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 9 OF THE AGRICULTURE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1949.

The Ministry of Agriculture by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Section 9 of the Agriculture Act (Northern Ireland) 1949(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance hereby makes the following Scheme:—

**PART I****INTRODUCTORY***Citation and commencement*

1. This Scheme may be cited as the Sheep Improvement Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1971 and shall come into operation on 1st September 1971.

*Definitions*

2. In this Scheme:—

“accepted flock” means a flock which has been accepted by the Ministry for the purposes of the Flock Recording Scheme under Article 4;

“appropriate breed society” means the society responsible for the identification and registration of the breed in the Flock Book;

“approved” means approved by the Ministry;

“flock owner” means the owner of a flock which has been accepted by the Ministry for the purposes of the Flock Recording Scheme in accordance with Article 4;

“grant” means a payment made to any person towards the purchase of an approved ram in accordance with Articles 9 and 10;

“grant aided rams” has the meaning assigned to it by Article 10;

“incentive payment” means the payment made to a flock owner under Article 7 towards the cost of recording his flock;

“normal breeding season” means in respect of the Dorset Horn breed a calendar year and in respect of the Border Leicester and Suffolk or other approved breeds the period from 1st December to 30th April;

“ram lamb” means an uncastrated male sheep under 1 year old;

“registered” means registered with the appropriate breed society;

“selected ram” means a ram of the Border Leicester or Suffolk breeds which the Ministry has selected for exhibition at an approved annual sale in accordance with Article 5(5);

“shearling ram” means an uncastrated male sheep at least 1 year old and under 2 years old;

“the Ministry” means the Ministry of Agriculture.

## PART II

## FLOCK RECORDING SCHEME

*Objects of scheme*

3. The Ministry shall operate in accordance with this Part a Scheme to be known as the Flock Recording Scheme and may make incentive payments to flock owners participating therein as hereinafter provided.

*Eligibility*

4.—(1) An application by the owner of a flock to have that flock accepted by the Ministry for the purposes of the Flock Recording Scheme shall be made to the Ministry in the form set forth in the First Schedule.

(2) Only registered pure bred flocks of the Border Leicester, Suffolk, Dorset Horn or any other approved breed may be accepted by the Ministry for the purposes of the Flock Recording Scheme.

(3) The Ministry shall not be bound to accept any flock for the purposes of the Flock Recording Scheme and shall not accept any flock unless in the opinion of the Ministry it satisfies the conditions set forth in the Second Schedule.

*Conditions of acceptance*

5. If the Ministry accepts an application under Article 4(1) it shall give to the flock owner a notice in writing of such acceptance and thereupon the flock owner shall in respect of the flock so accepted

- (1) record the following information in the form set forth in the Third Schedule:
  - (a) tuppings dates,
  - (b) number of lambs born,
  - (c) sex,
  - (d) dates of birth,
  - (e) deaths and abnormalities,
  - (f) the weights at the times referred to in paragraph (4);
- (2) ear mark, ear notch, or ear tag all lambs born within the period stipulated by the Rules of the appropriate breed society or 30 days from birth whichever is the lesser period;
- (3) notify ear tattoo marks or tag numbers to the Ministry within two days of the birth of a lamb;
- (4) weigh all lambs at the following times:
  - (a) at birth,
  - (b) on a date specified by the Ministry being a date when first born lambs are approximately 14 weeks old,
  - (c) at monthly intervals the first of such intervals to be one calendar month from the date specified by the Ministry under sub-paragraph (b);
- (5) in the case of Border Leicester and Suffolk flock exhibit for sale each year at an approved annual sale of those breeds or at other sales by permission of the Ministry, animals selected from the flock by the Ministry having regard to the information recorded under paragraph (1).

*Inspection of flocks*

6. A flock owner shall permit an authorised officer of the Ministry at all reasonable times to enter upon the premises where the flock is kept and to inspect the said premises and flock.

*Incentive payments*

7. The Ministry may subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme pay to a flock owner

- (1) an incentive payment of £3 in respect of
  - (a) each ewe of the Border Leicester breed giving birth to 2 or more lambs in the normal breeding season,
  - (b) each ewe of the Dorset Horn breed producing 2 crops of lambs containing together not less than 3 lambs within a calendar year;
- (2) an incentive payment of £2 in respect of each ewe of the Suffolk Breed or of other approved breeds which has produced live lambs in the normal breeding season.

8. Applications for incentive payments shall be made on the form set forth in the Fourth Schedule.

**PART III****GRANTS FOR PURCHASE OF RAMS***Payment of grant*

9. The Ministry may subject to and in accordance with this Part pay grants to flock owners purchasing selected rams which have been determined by the Ministry as being eligible for such grants in accordance with Article 10.

*Grant aided rams*

10. The Ministry shall determine which selected rams shall be eligible for grant under this Part and such rams are in this Scheme referred to as "Grant aided rams."

*Application*

11. Application for grants towards the purchase of grant aided rams shall be made to the Ministry at least one month before the date of the approved annual sale of rams of the breed concerned takes place.

*Rate and conditions of grant*

12. Grants shall be payable at the rate of £24 or one-half of the amount remaining after the sum of £24 has been deducted from the purchase price, whichever is the less, but not in any case less than £3.

- (1) to a flock owner who owns a pedigree Border Leicester flock recorded in the Scheme containing not less than 25 pedigree ewes in respect of the purchase by him of a grant aided ram of the Border Leicester breed. The payment of such grant shall be subject to the conditions set out in Part I of the Fifth Schedule;
- (2) to a flock owner who owns an approved Suffolk flock recorded in the Scheme containing not less than 25 pedigree ewes in respect of the purchase of a grant aided ram of the Suffolk breed. The payment of such grant shall be subject to the conditions set out in Part II of the Fifth Schedule.

13. The Ministry may pay to a flock owner who owns a pure bred Black-face flock a grant in respect of the purchase of a grant aided ram of the Border Leicester breed. The amount of the grant shall be £10 or one-half the amount remaining after the sum of £18 has been deducted from the purchase price of the ram, whichever shall be the less, but not in any case less than £3.

The payment of such grant will be subject to the conditions set out in Part III of the Fifth Schedule.

14. Flock owners who purchase a grant aided ram under the Scheme shall make application for the grant in the form set forth in the Sixth Schedule and shall sign an agreement relating to the placing out of the ram before the grant is paid.

#### *Disqualification*

##### 15. Where a flock owner

- (a) fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Scheme, or
- (b) through misrepresentation or fraud receives payment of any grant or incentive payment under this Scheme, or in connection with a claim for any such grant or payment makes any statement which he knows to be false or does not believe to be true,

the Ministry without prejudice to any other rights or remedies available to it may suspend or cancel any acceptance or approval granted for the purposes of this Scheme, and may withhold payment of grant or incentive payment, and may recover as a civil debt any sums paid by way of grant or incentive payment.

#### *General*

16. The Ministry may publish any information which is obtained as a result of the operation of this Scheme, including facts about the performance of any flock participating in the Flock Recording Scheme.

## SHEEP IMPROVEMENT SCHEME (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1971

## Conditions to be satisfied before acceptance

- (1) All sheep on the applicant's farm shall be sound and healthy.
- (2) All pure bred breeding stock of the eligible breeds in the flock shall have been registered in the Flock Book of an approved Breed Society or other approved register.
- (3)
  - (i) Flocks of the Border Leicester breed shall have not less than 6 ewes at the time of entry to the Scheme and not less than 10 ewes after a period of two years in the Scheme;
  - (ii) Flocks of Suffolk, Dorset Horn or other approved breed shall have not less than 10 ewes at the time of entry to the Scheme and not less than 20 ewes after a period of three years in the Scheme.
- (4) The necessary facilities shall be available for the weighing of lambs, the checking of records, and all other matters connected with this Scheme.
- (5) Authorised Officers of the Ministry shall be permitted to inspect the flock, check earmarks, weights, etc., at all reasonable times.

(b) The flock owner will maintain a flock of at least 25 pure bred Border Leicester ewes and mate the ram with the said ewes.

(c) The flock owner will allow only grant aided rams to run along with the ewes running with the ram.

(d) Without prejudice to any other provision of this Scheme the flock owner will at all reasonable times permit an authorised officer of the Ministry to inspect the ram.

(b) The flock owner will maintain a flock of at least 25 pure bred Suffolk ewes and mate the ram with the said ewes.

(c) The flock owner will allow only grant aided rams to run along with the ewes running with the ram.

(d) Without prejudice to any other provision of this Scheme the flock owner will at all reasonable times permit an authorised officer of the Ministry to inspect the ram.

(b) The flock owner will maintain a flock of at least 25 Blackface ewes and mate the said ram with the said ewes.

(c) The flock owner will allow only grant aided rams to run along with the ewes running with the ram.

(d) Without prejudice to any other provision of this Scheme the flock owner will at all reasonable times permit an authorised officer of the Ministry to inspect the ram.

 vision of grants for the purchase of approved rams of the Border Leicester  
 and Suffolk breeds and for the payment of incentives towards the cost of  
 recording all flocks participating in the Scheme.

## Ram Subsidies

SCHEME, DATED 13TH AUGUST 1971, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 9 OF THE AGRICULTURE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1949.

The Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 9 of the Agriculture Act (Northern Ireland) 1949(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance hereby makes the following Scheme:—

*Citation and commencement*

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Ram Subsidies (Amendment) Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1971.

(2) This Scheme shall be construed as one with the Ram Subsidies Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1962(b) (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Scheme").

(3) This Scheme shall come into operation on 1st September 1971.

*Amendment of the Principal Scheme*

2. For paragraph 4 of the Principal Scheme substitute the following:—  
"Eligible breeds.

4. Only pure bred rams of the Blackface, Border Leicester, Suffolk, Dorset Horn or other breed approved by the Ministry shall be eligible to be selected as approved rams."
