Institutions of Further Education: Teachers' Salaries and Allowances

REGULATIONS, DATED 22ND DECEMBER 1971, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1947 TO 1971.

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 83 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland) 1947(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Institutions of Further Education (Salaries and Allowances) Amending Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1971 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st April 1971.

2. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Institutions of Further Education (Salaries and Allowances) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1969 No. 3(b).

3.—(1) An assistant lecturer who was in service on 1st April 1971 shall have his remuneration increased as set out hereunder in respect of any period of service as an assistant lecturer on and after that date.

The following shall be increased by 10 per cent:—

- (a) The rate including the amount of any increment awarded since 1st April 1971 payable on the scale set out in Regulation 6(1) of the existing Regulations or beyond the maximum of that scale as provided for in Regulations 7(2)(c)(vii) and 7(2)(c)(viii) of those Regulations provided however that where an increment has been awarded the increment with such increase added thereto shall not exceed the rate of £76 per annum.
- (b) Any increase payable under Regulation 8(1) or 8(2) of the existing Regulations.
- (c) Any addition payable under Regulation 9 of the existing Regulations.
- (d) Any allowance payable under Regulation 20(2) of the existing Regulations.

(2) An assistant lecturer appointed on or after 2nd April 1971 and entitled to the rate specified for any of the first three points of the scale set out in Regulation 6(1) of the existing Regulations shall have his rate on this scale increased to £1,055.

4.—(1) A lecturer Grade I who was in service in that capacity on 1st April 1971 shall have his remuneration increased as set out hereunder in respect of any period of service as a lecturer Grade I on and after that date.

The following shall be increased by 10 per cent:—

- (a) The rate including the amount of any increment awarded since 1st April 1971 payable on the scale set out in Regulation 6(1) as augmented in Regulation 6(2) of the existing Regulations provided however that where an increment has been awarded the increment with such increase added thereto shall not exceed the rate of £80 per annum.

(b) Any increase payable under Regulation 8(1) of the existing Regulations.

(c) Any addition payable under Regulation 9 of the existing Regulations.

Provided that the increases awarded at (a), (b) and (c) of this Regulation shall not operate so as to exceed a rate of £2,355 per annum or to be less than £1,375 per annum.

(d) Any increase payable under Regulation 8(2) of the existing Regulations.

(e) Any addition beyond the maximum of the scale set out in Regulation 6(1) as augmented by Regulation 6(2) of the existing Regulations as provided for in Regulations 7(2)(c)(vii) and 7(2)(c)(viii) of the existing Regulations.

(f) Any allowance payable under Regulation 20(1) of the existing Regulations.

(2) A lecturer Grade I appointed in that capacity on or after 2nd April 1971 and entitled to the rate specified for any of the first four points of the scale set out in Regulation 6(1) as augmented by Regulation 6(2) of the existing Regulations shall have his rate on this scale increased to £1,375.

5.—(1) A lecturer Grade II, senior lecturer, principal lecturer, head of department, principal or vice-principal who was in service in that capacity on 1st April 1971 shall have his rate on the appropriate salary scale in Schedule II, III, IV or V as the case may be of the existing Regulations including the amount of any increment awarded since that date increased by 10 per cent in respect of any period of such service on and after that date provided that he shall, where appropriate, receive a rate of salary not less than that specified in paragraph (2) or (3) of this Regulation.

(2) A senior lecturer, principal lecturer or head of department appointed in that capacity on or after 2nd April 1971 shall be paid at the rate appropriate to the grade of the post specified in the Schedule to these Regulations.

(3) A lecturer Grade II appointed in that capacity on or after 2nd April 1971 and entitled to the rate specified for any of the first five points of the appropriate salary scale set out in Schedule II of the existing Regulations shall have his rate on this scale increased to £2,195.

6. Any allowance paid to an acting principal under the terms of Regulation 18 of the existing Regulations in respect of any period between 1st April 1971 and the date of these Regulations shall be increased by 10 per cent.

7. Any allowance paid to a head of department discharging the duties and responsibilities of a vice-principal under the terms of Regulation 19 of the existing Regulations in respect of any period between 1st April 1971 and the date of these Regulations shall be increased by 10 per cent and the amount of the allowance shall not exceed £583 per annum.

8. Where a teacher's remuneration has been increased under Regulations 3, 4, 5 or 6 above the rate of such remuneration shall be the aggregate amount rounded to the nearest whole pound, an amount of 50p being rounded up.

9. The minimum rate of remuneration specified in Regulation 28 of the existing Regulations shall be increased from £703 to £775 per annum.
