LOCAL GOVERNMENT**Transfer of Historic Monuments**

ORDER, DATED 12TH SEPTEMBER 1973, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SECTION 134 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1972.

The Ministry of Finance on behalf of the Secretary of State and in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 134 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1972(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Historic Monuments (Transfer) Order (Northern Ireland) 1973.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“historic monument” has the meaning assigned to it by section 27 of the Historic Monuments Act (Northern Ireland) 1971(b);

“the Ministry” means the Ministry of Finance.

Transfer of historic monuments

3. On the 1st day of October 1973 all lands which immediately before that date are vested in the County Councils specified in Column 1 of the Schedule and comprising the historic monuments specified in Column 2 situate in the townlands specified opposite their names in Column 3 of the Schedule shall by virtue of this Order and without the necessity of any conveyance, deed of transfer, or other instrument be transferred to the Ministry.

Functions of Ministry

4. The Ministry shall have as respects all historic monuments transferred to it by virtue of this Order the same functions as it has in respect of historic monuments acquired under Part I of the Historic Monuments Act (Northern Ireland) 1971.
