PETROLEUM**Liquid Methane**

ORDER, DATED THE 21ST DAY OF DECEMBER 1973, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 19 OF THE PETROLEUM (CONSOLIDATION) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1929.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 19 of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act (Northern Ireland) 1929(a) and section 1(1) of the Northern Ireland (Temporary Provisions) Act 1972(b) and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf I hereby make the following Order:—

Application of the Act of 1929 to liquid methane

1.—(1) The provisions of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act (Northern Ireland) 1929 except the provisions specified in the Schedule to this Order shall apply to liquid methane subject to the modifications specified in paragraph (2) of this Article.

(2)(a) Section 5 (which contains provisions as to the labelling of vessels containing petroleum spirit) shall have effect as if, in the words required by that section to be shown on the label referred to therein, the words "liquid methane" were substituted for the words "petroleum spirit".

(b) Subsections (1) and (2) of section 7 (which requires bye-laws to be made for harbours as to the loading of ships with petroleum spirit and generally as to the precautions to be observed with respect to ships carrying petroleum spirit whilst in harbour) shall not apply except in relation to a harbour in which there is an installation specially constructed for landing liquid methane from ships or for loading liquid methane onto ships and in relation to the harbour authority having jurisdiction therein.

2. This Order may be cited as the Petroleum (Liquid Methane) Order (Northern Ireland) 1973.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended
only to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order applies to liquid methane the provisions of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act (Northern Ireland) 1929 except those which are inappropriate; in particular provisions appropriate only in the case of fuel for vehicles are not applied. Under the principal provisions applied, a licence will be required to keep liquid methane, vessels containing liquid methane will be required to be appropriately labelled, the Ministry of Home Affairs is empowered to make regulations as to the conveyance of liquid methane by road and harbour authorities are required to make bye-laws as to ships loading and carrying liquid methane in the harbour for harbours where liquid methane can be landed or loaded.

These Regulations have been made by the Secretaries of State concerned with health in England, in Wales and in Scotland and the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 75(1)(2), 76(1)(2)(4)(6) of the Medicines Act 1968.
