

EXECUTIVE NOTE

THE PUBLIC APPOINTMENTS AND PUBLIC BODIES ETC. (SCOTLAND) ACT 2003 (AMENDMENT OF SPECIFIED AUTHORITIES) (No. 2) ORDER 2011

2011 No. Draft

The above instrument was made in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3(2)(a) of the Public Appointments and Public Bodies etc. (Scotland) Act 2003 (“the 2003 Act”). The instrument is subject to affirmative resolution procedure.

Policy Objectives

The purpose of the instrument is to amend the 2003 Act to the effect that Architecture and Design Scotland is listed under the heading of Executive bodies rather than Advisory bodies following the recommendations of the Policy and Financial Management Review of Architecture and Design Scotland carried out in 2009 which recommended that the body be reclassified as an Executive NDPB on the basis that the structure and responsibilities of the body are already more akin to that of a small Executive NDPB than an Advisory one. This instrument is part of a package of changes recommended by the Review intended to ensure that the body is constituted and operated in a way that realises its potential to inspire better quality in design in the built environment. These include the simplification of the governance structure to have a single board; the remuneration of the Chair and Board members; the taking-over of a revised design review process by a Design Review Panel separate from the Board and the concentration of the activities of the organisation on the practical promotion of good design by focusing efforts on a limited number of core priority areas and themes.
