**ROADS AND BRIDGES**

**The Road Works (Settlement of Disputes and Appeals  
against Directions) (Scotland) Regulations 2008**

The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 115(2A), 115A(5), 117(7), 120(6), 121(5), 133(2), 143(3), 155(3), 157A and 163(1) of, and paragraphs 2(1) and 12(2) of Schedule 6 to, the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991<sup>(1)</sup> and section 18(3) of the Transport (Scotland) Act 2005<sup>(2)</sup> and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 163A of New Roads and Street Works Act 1991<sup>(3)</sup> they have consulted with such—

- (a) persons considered by them to be representative of the interests of undertakers;
  - (b) road works authorities; and
  - (c) other persons,
- as they think appropriate.
