**The A85 (Main Street, Methven) (Temporary Prohibition of
Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2011**

Made

21st June 2011

Coming into force

4th July 2011

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2), 4(1), and 14(1)(a) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(a) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be prohibited from waiting, loading and unloading because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the said length of road.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A85 (Main Street, Methven) (Temporary Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2011, comes into force on 4th July 2011 and ceases to have effect at 0001 hours on 1st August 2011.

Temporary prohibition of use of vehicles

2. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait, load or unload, at any time on the length of road specified in the Schedule, when a prohibition is identified as applying to any part or parts of the said length of road by means of traffic signs prescribed in Diagrams 636 and 636.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b).

The Scottish Ministers are the traffic authority by virtue of section 121A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (inserted by the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 (c.22), Schedule 8, paragraph 70 and amended by the Scotland Act 1998 (Consequential Modifications) Order 2001 S.I. 2001/1400) as read with section 151(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 (c.54). The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46).

Permission or direction of Police Constable

3. No provision of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

4. No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to vehicles being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or a vehicle being used for carrying out the works.

That length of the A85 Perth – Lochearnhead Trunk Road from its junction with Skelton Road, Methven westwards to its junction with College Road, Methven, a distance of 455 metres or thereby.
