## The Building (Energy Performance of Buildings) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2016

## Amendment of the Building (Scotland) Regulations 2004

- **2.**—(1) The Building (Scotland) Regulations 2004(1) are amended in accordance with paragraphs (2) and (3).
  - (2) For regulation 17(1)(a) (continuing requirements)(2) substitute—
    - "(a) accessible parts of every air-conditioning system within a building are inspected at regular intervals not exceeding five years; and".
- (3) In paragraph 6.1 (carbon dioxide emissions)(3) of Schedule 5 (building standards applicable to design and construction)(4)—
  - (a) omit "and" after sub-paragraph (a);
  - (b) after sub-paragraph (b) insert—
    - "; and
    - (c) it is a nearly zero-energy building"; and
  - (c) at the end insert—

"Interpretation of this standard

In this standard—

"energy from renewable sources" means energy from renewable non-fossil sources, namely wind, solar, aero-thermal, geothermal, hydrothermal and ocean energy, hydropower, biomass, landfill gas, sewage treatment plant gas and biogases; and

"nearly zero-energy building" means a building that has a very high energy performance, as determined in accordance with a methodology approved under regulation 7 of the Energy Performance of Buildings (Scotland) Regulations 2008(5), where the nearly zero or very low amount of energy required should be covered to a very significant extent by energy from renewable sources, including energy from renewable sources produced on site or nearby."
