The A90 and A96 Trunk Roads (Aberdeen Western Peripheral Route/Balmedie to Tipperty) (Stonehaven Bypass, Portlethen, Murcar to South Ellon and Blackburn to Bucksburn) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Specified Turns, Overtaking and Speed Restrictions) Revocation Order 2021

Made - - - - *29th October 2021*

Coming into force - - *30th October 2021*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1), 4(1), 14(1)(a) and (4), 15(2) and 124(1)(d) of, and paragraph 27(1) of schedule 9 of, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A90 and A96 Trunk Roads (Aberdeen Western Peripheral Route/Balmedie to Tipperty) (Stonehaven Bypass, Portlethen, Murcar to South Ellon and Blackburn to Bucksburn) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Specified Turns, Overtaking and Speed Restrictions) Revocation Order 2021 and comes into force on 30 October 2021.

Revocation

2. The A90 and A96 Trunk Roads (Aberdeen Western Peripheral Route/Balmedie to Tipperty) (Stonehaven Bypass, Portlethen, Murcar to South Ellon and Blackburn to Bucksburn) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Specified Turns, Overtaking and Speed Restrictions) Order 2015(b) is revoked.
