**The Public Water Supplies (Scotland)
Amendment Regulations 2022**

The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sections 76B, 76J, 101(1) and (1A) and 109(1) of the Water (Scotland) Act 1980⁽¹⁾, section 1(1) of UK Withdrawal from the European Union (Continuity) (Scotland) Act 2021⁽²⁾ (“the 2021 Act”), and all other powers enabling them to do so⁽³⁾.

In accordance with section 5(2) of the 2021 Act, a draft of this instrument has been laid before and approved by resolution of the Scottish Parliament.

The definition of “prescribed” in section 109(1) was amended by paragraph 38(f) of schedule 11 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992 (c. 14). The functions conferred on the Secretary of State under sections 76B, 76J, 101(1) and (1A) and 109(1) of the Water (Scotland) Act 1980 are, so far as they are exercisable within devolved competence, exercisable by the Scottish Ministers by virtue of section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c. 46).

- (3) The powers to make these Regulations are exercised together by virtue of section 33(2) of the Interpretation and Legislative Reform (Scotland) Act 2010 (asp 10). These Regulations are subject to the affirmative procedure by virtue of section 33(3) of that Act.
