#### Type of proposal:

#### Name the proposal, and describe its overall aims and intended purpose.

The proposal is an order with the title "The A76 Trunk Road (Kirkconnel) (Temporary Prohibition on Waiting, Loading and Unloading) (No.2) Order 2025". The order prohibits vehicles from parking, loading, unloading, and waiting and applies to the length of road specified in the schedule of the order, from 17 November 2025 until 23 November 2025. The order is needed to promote the resurfacing works.

Works undertaken within the carriageway boundary and along the designated stretch of road, requiring the prohibition of parking, waiting, loading, and unloading to ensure the work can be completed effectively. Emergency vehicles and those vehicles involved in carrying out the resurfacing works will not be affected by this prohibition.

None of these facilities will directly be affected by the restrictions of the order in this area of the road. There are suitable alternative areas nearby for parking, waiting, loading, or unloading. Therefore, this order will not impact articles 14, 24, 28 and 31. We do not see any potential negative impacts on children and young people as a result of this order.

**3. Please provide a summary of the evidence gathered which will be used to inform your decision-making and the content of the proposal**

Mapping routes have shown that there are no facilities unable to be accessed or having the restricted access for children, young people, or their families, carers, and representatives as a result of the proposal. Therefore, we can rule out that this order has the potential to restrict access and so potentially impact on articles 14, 24, 28 and 31.
