An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders made by the Board of Trade under the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 and 1888 the Electric Lighting (Scotland) Act 1890 and the Electric Lighting (Scotland) Act 1902 relating to Eastwood and Cathcart and Kilpatrick.

WHEREAS under the authority of the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 and 1888 the Electric Lighting (Scotland) Act 1890 and the Electric Lighting (Scotland) Act 1902 the Board of Trade have made the several Provisional Orders set out in the schedule to this Act :

And whereas a Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under the authority of the said Acts is not of any validity or force whatever until the confirmation thereof by Act of Parliament :

And whereas it is expedient that the several Provisional Orders made by the Board of Trade under the authority of the said Acts as set out in the schedule to this Act be confirmed by Act of Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 6) Act 1906.

2. The several Orders as amended and set out in the schedule to this Act shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof in manner and form as they are set out in the said schedule shall from and after the passing of this Act have full validity and effect.

3. The Eastwood and Cathcart Electric Lighting Order 1906 and the Kilpatrick Electric Lighting Order 1906 confirmed by this Act shall have effect as if section 62 of the Clyde Valley Electrical Power Act 1901 which makes provision for the protection of county authorities as therein defined were incorporated with each of those Orders and as if in that section as so incorporated in each such Order the Undertakers under that Order were substituted for the Clyde Valley Electrical Power Company.

EASTWOOD AND CATHCART ELECTRIC LIGHTING. A.D. 1906.

Provisional Order granted by the Board of Trade under the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 and 1888 the Electric Lighting (Scotland) Act 1890 and the Electric Lighting (Scotland) Act 1902 to the Strathclyde Electricity Supply Company Limited in respect of portions of the Parishes of Eastwood and Cathcart in the County of Renfrew. *Eastwood and Cathcart.*

1. This Order may be cited as the Eastwood and Cathcart Electric Lighting Order 1906. *Short title.*

2. The provisions contained in the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 (with the exception of section 84 of that schedule) are incorporated with and form part of this Order. *Incorporation of Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899.*

3. The Undertakers for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 2 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are the Strathclyde Electricity Supply Company Limited incorporated under the Companies Acts 1862 to 1900 and having their registered office at No. 53 Bothwell Street Glasgow. *Undertakers.*

4. The area of supply for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 4 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 shall be the area which is described in the First Schedule to this Order and is more particularly delineated on the map deposited together with this Order at the Board of Trade by the Undertakers and signed by an assistant secretary to the Board of Trade. *Area of supply.*

5. Subject to the provisions incorporated with this Order the Undertakers are specially authorised by this Order to break up the streets not repairable by the local authorities which are mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order and the tramways which are also mentioned in that schedule. *Power to break up streets &c.*

6. The streets and parts of streets throughout which the Undertakers are to lay down suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purposes of general supply within a period of two years after the commencement of this Order as mentioned in section 21 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those mentioned in the Third Schedule to this Order. *Compulsory works.*

7. The maximum prices which may be charged by the Undertakers as mentioned in section 32 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those stated in the Fourth Schedule to this Order. *Maximum prices.*

8. The sum to be deposited or secured in pursuance of section 5 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 is two hundred and fifty pounds in respect of the parish of Eastwood and two hundred and fifty pounds in respect of the parish of Cathcart. *Deposit.*

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA OF SUPPLY.

So much of the parishes of Eastwood and Cathcart in the county of Renfrew as are bounded by a line commencing on the southern boundary of the city of Glasgow at the point of intersection of the said city boundary with the boundaries of the parishes of Rutherglen and Cathcart proceeding thence along the eastern and southern boundaries of the parish of Cathcart to the point where the said southern boundary intersects the public road leading from Clarkston to Mearns proceeding thence in a north-westerly direction in a straight line to a point on the south fence of the public road between Busby and Paisley 550 yards or thereby west from the intersection of the said road with the public road from Thornliebank to Stewarton proceeding thence in a north-easterly direction in a straight line to the point where the western boundary of the burgh of Pollokshaws intersects the south-eastern boundary of the Glasgow Barrhead and Kilmarnock Joint Railway proceeding thence in a southerly direction along the said western boundary and the southern and eastern boundaries of the burgh of Pollokshaws to the junction of the said eastern boundary with the southern boundary of the city of Glasgow and proceeding thence along the said southern boundary of that city to the point of commencement above described. Provided that in case of difference between this description and the area as delineated on the deposited map the latter shall prevail.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

MAXIMUM PRICES.

In this schedule—

The expression “unit” shall mean the energy contained in a current of one thousand ampères flowing under an electro-motive force of one volt during one hour.

SECTION 1.

Where the Undertakers charge any consumer by the actual amount of energy supplied to him they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates per quarter :—

(i) In the case of a supply to the local authority or any public lighting authority and in the case of a supply to any consumer for power purposes and for lighting any premises so supplied with energy for power purposes—

(a) For any quantity not exceeding the equivalent of four hundred hours of supply at the maximum power which has been demanded by the consumer at the rate of threepence per unit ;

(b) for any further quantity exceeding the equivalent of four hundred hours of supply at such maximum power at the rate of twopence per unit :

And the prices so charged under this subsection shall include the cost of transforming the energy (if so required by the authority or person supplied) to such pressure and in the case

of a supply in bulk to a local authority or any public lighting authority to such description of current as the authority or person respectively may reasonably require :

(ii) In the case of a supply to any consumer other than the local authority or public lighting authority for any other purpose—

For any amount up to twenty units ten shillings and for each unit over twenty units sixpence.

SECTION 2.

Where the Undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity contained in the supply given to him they shall be entitled to charge him according to the rates set forth in section 1 of this schedule the amount of energy supplied to him being taken to be the product of that electrical quantity and the declared pressure at the consumer's terminals that is to say such a constant pressure at those terminals as may be declared by the Undertakers under the Board of Trade regulations.

KILPATRICK ELECTRIC LIGHTING.

Short title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Kilpatrick Electric Lighting Order 1906.

2. The provisions contained in the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 (with the exception of section 84 of that schedule) are incorporated with and form part of this Order.

Undertakers.

3. The Undertakers for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 2 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are the Strathclyde Electricity Supply Company Limited incorporated under the Companies Acts 1862 to 1900 and having their registered office at No. 53 Bothwell Street Glasgow.

Area of supply.

4. The area of supply for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 4 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 shall be the area which is described in the First Schedule to this Order and is more particularly delineated on the map deposited together with this Order at the Board of Trade by the Undertakers and signed by an assistant secretary to the Board of Trade.

Power to break
up streets &c.

5. Subject to the provisions incorporated with this Order the Undertakers are specially authorised by this Order to break up the streets not repairable by the local and road authorities which are mentioned in the

Second Schedule to this Order and the railways and tramways which are also mentioned in that schedule. A.D. 1906.

6. The streets and parts of streets throughout which the Undertakers are to lay down suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purposes of general supply within a period of two years after the commencement of this Order as mentioned in section 21 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those mentioned in the Third Schedule to this Order. *Kilpatrick.*
Compulsory works.

7. The maximum prices which may be charged by the Undertakers as mentioned in section 32 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those stated in the Fourth Schedule to this Order. Maximum prices.

8. The sum to be deposited or secured in pursuance of section 5 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 is two hundred and fifty pounds in respect of the parishes of Old and New Kilpatrick and two hundred and fifty pounds in respect of the parish of Renfrew. Deposit.

9. This Order shall come into force upon the day when the Act confirming this Order is passed and that day for the purposes of the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 shall be the commencement of this Order. Commencement of Order.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA OF SUPPLY.

So much of the parishes of Old and New Kilpatrick in the county of Dunbarton and of the parish of Renfrew in the county of Renfrew as are bounded by a line commencing at the point where the western boundary of the burgh of Clydebank meets the southern boundary fence of the Glasgow Dunbarton and Helensburgh Railway and proceeding thence along the centre of Duntocher Burn in a north and north-easterly direction for a distance of 1,490 feet or thereabouts thence in a straight line due north to the south side of Duntocher Road thence in a straight line due north for a distance of 4,900 feet or thereabouts proceeding thence in an easterly direction in a straight line to the north east corner of Boclair Farm Steading proceeding thence in a straight line in a southerly direction to a point on the boundary of the city of Glasgow at the centre of the River Kelvin on the east side of Garscube Bridge proceeding thence in a southerly direction along the western boundaries of the city of Glasgow and the burgh of Partick to the centre of the said River Clyde proceeding thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the said River Clyde to the eastern boundary of the burgh of Clydebank proceeding thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of the said burgh of Clydebank to the point of commencement above described Provided that in case of difference between the description in this schedule and the area as delineated on the deposited map the latter shall prevail.

The tramways of the corporation of the city of Glasgow.
