



CHAPTER liv.

An Act to confirm a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners for the management of various Charities in the City and County of the City of Norwich. A.D. 1910.

[26th July 1910.]

WHEREAS the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales in their report to His Majesty of their proceedings during the year one thousand nine hundred and nine have reported that they have approved and certified a scheme for the management of various charities in the city and county of the city of Norwich or in certain areas therein respectively particulars of which charities are specified in the First Schedule to this Act:

And whereas it is expedient that the Scheme as the same is fully set out and defined in the Second Schedule to this Act should be confirmed:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The said Scheme as amended is hereby confirmed Confirmation
of Scheme.
Provided always that nothing in this Act or in the said Scheme shall be held to interfere with the ordinary jurisdiction over endowed charities now exerciseable or hereafter to become exerciseable by the High Court of Justice and the Charity Commissioners.

2. This Act may be cited as the Norwich Charities Scheme Short title.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

SCHEME FOR THE APPLICATION OR MANAGEMENT OF THE CHARITIES SPECIFIED IN THE FIRST SCHEDULE TO THIS ACT.

1. *Administration of Charities.*—The above-mentioned Charities and the endowments thereof specified in the First Schedule to this Scheme, and all other the endowments (if any) of the said Charities shall be administered so as to give effect to the following provisions:—The Norwich Town Close Estate Charity and its endowments shall be administered by a body of trustees consisting of the persons for the time being holding office under this Scheme on the body of trustees herein-after constituted (each of whom for the time being shall be an ex-officio trustee of the said Norwich Town Close Estate Charity), and eight representative trustees appointed by the freemen of the city of Norwich. Subject to this provision the said Norwich Town Close Estate Charity and its endowments shall continue to be administered in all respects in conformity with the existing Schemes affecting the same. The Barnham Broom Estate shall be administered as a separate estate charity by the body of trustees herein-after constituted, subject to and in conformity with the provisions of this Scheme. The remaining above-mentioned Charities and their endowments shall be consolidated and shall be administered by the body of trustees herein-after constituted, subject to and in exclusive conformity with the provisions of this Scheme, under the title of the Consolidated Charities. In this Scheme, except where the context may otherwise require, the expression “the Charities” shall mean the Barnham Broom Estate and the Consolidated Charities.

VESTING AND TRANSFERS.

2. *As to Freeholds or Leaseholds.*—Any rentcharges and freehold or leasehold lands and other hereditaments belonging to or held in

trust for the Charities, and not already vested in "the official trustee of charity lands," are hereby vested in the said official trustee for all the estate and interest therein so belonging or held in trust.

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3. *As to Copyholds.*—The right to call for a surrender of any copyhold lands and hereditaments belonging to or held in trust for the Charities and to be admitted as tenants thereof on the court rolls of the manor or manors of which the same are held, shall forthwith vest in such of the persons herein-after appointed to be the first co-optative trustees under this Scheme as the trustees may select. So long as any property of the Charities is of copyhold tenure, the trustees shall from time to time on the determination of office of the last survivor of the tenants on the said rolls of such property take all proper steps to obtain the admittance of a competent number of co-optative trustees as such tenants.

4. *As to Stock and Cash.*—The trustees shall (unless otherwise directed) take all proper steps for obtaining a transfer into the name of "the official trustees of charitable funds" of any sum of stock specified in the said First Schedule standing to an account in the High Court of Justice (Chancery Division), and any cash standing to the same account. Subject as aforesaid, all sums of stock belonging to or held in trust for the Charities and not already held by the said official trustees, shall be transferred, under the authority of a further order of the Charity Commissioners, into the name of the said official trustees; and all sums of cash now or at any time belonging to or held in trust for the Charities and not needed for immediate working purposes shall (unless otherwise directed) as soon as possible be invested, under the like authority, in that name.

TRUSTEES.

5. *Trustees.*—The body of trustees for the administration of the Charities shall (except at first as herein-after provided), when complete, consist of twenty-four competent persons, being—

- Sixteen representative trustees, and
- Eight co-optative trustees.

6. *Representative Trustees.*—The representative trustees shall be appointed as follows:—

- Eleven by the council of the city of Norwich;
- Two by the board of guardians of the Norwich Poor-law Union, or the body for the time being exercising the functions of that board;
- One by a body consisting of a joint committee of the governing bodies of the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital and the Jenny Lind Infirmary for Children, duly constituted and empowered for that purpose;

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One by the Norwich and District Trades and Labour Council ;
and

One by the medical board of the friendly societies of Norwich.

Each appointment shall be made for a term of three years, except in the case of a casual vacancy occurring otherwise than by effluxion of time, and shall be made at a meeting convened and held according to the ordinary practice of the appointing body. The chairman of the meeting shall forthwith cause the name of each person appointed to be notified to the trustees or their clerk. The person appointed may be, but need not be, a member of the appointing body. On a casual vacancy in the office of representative trustee occurring as aforesaid, the trustee appointed to fill the vacancy shall hold office only for the unexpired residue of the term of office of the trustee in whose place he is appointed.

7. *First Representative Trustees.*—The first representative trustees shall be appointed as soon as possible after the date hereof, and their names shall be notified to the town clerk of the city of Norwich on behalf of the trustees.

8. *Co-optative Trustees.*—The co-optative trustees shall be persons residing or carrying on business in the city and county of the city of Norwich or within seven miles thereof.

9. *First Co-optative Trustees.*—The following persons shall be the first co-optative trustees under this scheme, and shall be entitled, subject to the provisions herein-after contained with respect to determination of trusteeship, to hold office for life:—

10. *Future Co-optative Trustees.*—Every future co-optative trustee shall be appointed for life by a resolution of the trustees to be passed at a special meeting.

11. *Declaration by Trustees.*—No person shall be entitled to act as a trustee, whether on a first or any subsequent entry into office, until after signing in the minute book of the trustees a declaration of acceptance and of willingness to act in the trusts of this Scheme.

12. *Determination of Trusteeship.*—Any co-optative trustee who ceases to be qualified as aforesaid, any representative or co-optative trustee who is absent from all meetings of the trustees and of any committee of the trustees during a period of one year, and any trustee who is adjudicated a bankrupt, or who is incapacitated from acting, or who communicates in writing to the trustees a wish to resign, shall thereupon cease to be a trustee.

13. *Vacancies.*—Upon the occurrence of a vacancy the trustees shall, at their next meeting, cause a note thereof to be entered in their minute book, and in the case of a vacancy in the office of representative trustee shall cause notice thereof to be given as soon as possible to the proper appointing body. The appointing body may, if they think fit, before receiving such notice appoint a representative trustee to fill a prospective vacancy, provided the appointment is made within four months before the vacancy occurs. Any competent trustee may be re-appointed. No vacancy in the office of co-optative trustee shall be filled till after the lapse of one calendar month from its occurrence, and there shall be no such vacancy until the number of co-optative trustees is reduced below eight.

14. *Temporary Provision.*—Until the expiration of the first three calendar months from the date of this Scheme, or such further period as may be sanctioned in writing by the Charity Commissioners, the present trustees shall remain unaltered and shall retain such powers as will enable them to administer the Charities in the meantime in accordance with the existing trusts affecting them respectively, but on

A.D. 1910. the day of such expiration they shall become ipso facto discharged from office, and the administration of the Charities shall pass to the body of trustees constituted by this Scheme. The first meeting of that body shall be summoned by the town clerk as soon as possible after the date of such expiration, or, if he fails to summon a meeting for one calendar month after that date, by any two trustees.

MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS OF TRUSTEES.

15. *Ordinary Meetings.*—The trustees shall hold at least two ordinary meetings in each year.

16. *Chairman and Vice-Chairman.*—The trustees shall at their first ordinary meeting in each year elect two of their number to be chairman and vice-chairman respectively of their meetings for the year. They shall make regulations for supplying the place of either of them in case of death, resignation, or absence. The chairman and vice-chairman shall always be re-eligible.

17. *Special Meetings.*—A special meeting may at any time be summoned by the chairman or vice-chairman or any four trustees upon four days' notice being given to all the other trustees of the matters to be discussed.

18. *Quorum.*—There shall be a quorum when seven trustees are present at a meeting.

19. *Voting.*—Every matter shall be determined by the majority of votes of the trustees present and voting on the question. In case of equality of votes the person acting as chairman of the meeting shall have a casting vote, whether he has or has not previously voted on the same question, but no trustee shall in any other circumstances give more than one vote.

20. *Minutes and Accounts.*—A minute book and books of account shall be provided and kept by the trustees. All proper accounts in relation to the Charities shall in each year be made out and audited by a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales or of the Society of Accountants and Auditors, and shall be certified in such manner as the Charity Commissioners require, and copies thereof shall be transmitted to the said Commissioners, and published in conformity with the provisions of the Charitable Trusts Acts. Copies of the accounts so transmitted shall be sent to the town clerk of the city of Norwich for the information of the city council and for public inspection.

21. *General Power to make Regulations.*—Within the limits prescribed by this Scheme the trustees shall have full power from time

to time to make regulations for the management of the Charities, and for the conduct of their business, including the summoning of meetings, the deposit of money at a proper bank, the custody of documents, and the appointment of a clerk and other necessary officers at such rates of remuneration as the trustees may think fit. A.D. 1910.

22. *Power to delegate Functions to Committees.*—The trustees may appoint any committees of their own body and may delegate any of their powers to any such committee with or without power to act without reference to the trustees. All proceedings of a committee shall be reported to the trustees.

MANAGEMENT OF REAL PROPERTY.

23. *Allotments Extension Act, 1882.*—The trustees shall let and otherwise manage in conformity with the provisions of the Allotments Extension Act, 1882, such of the lands belonging to the Charities as are subject to the provisions of the fourth section of that Act. The trustees may set apart and let in allotments in the manner prescribed by and subject to the provisions of the said Act any portion of the lands belonging to the Charities other than buildings and the appurtenances of buildings.

24. *Management and Letting of Property.*—Subject as aforesaid, all the property of the Charities not required to be retained or occupied for the purposes thereof shall be let and otherwise managed by the trustees. The trustees shall not create any tenancy in reversion after more than three years of any existing term, or for more than 21 years certain, or for less than the improved annual value at rack-rent, without the sanction of the Charity Commissioners or a competent court. Any lease, agreement, conveyance, deed, or other document which shall have been previously agreed to or approved by a majority of the trustees present at any meeting or at any committee to which there has been delegated power to deal with the matter pursuant to clause 22 hereof and shall be signed by five trustees shall be binding upon all.

25. *Leases.*—The trustees shall provide that on the grant by them of any lease the lessee shall execute a counterpart thereof; and every lease shall contain covenants on the part of the lessee for the payment of rent and all other usual and proper covenants applicable to the property comprised therein, and a proviso for re-entry on non-payment of the rent or non-performance of the covenants.

26. *Repair and Insurance.*—The trustees shall keep in repair and insure against fire all the buildings of the Charities not required to be kept in repair and insured by the lessees or tenants thereof.

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APPLICATION OF INCOME.

27. *Expenses of Management.*—The trustees shall first defray—

- (1) The cost of repairs and insurance, and all other charges and outgoings payable in respect of the property of the Barnham Broom Estate, out of the income of that charity;
- (2) The like costs, charges, and outgoings payable in respect of the property of the Consolidated Charities out of the income of those charities;
- (3) All the proper costs, charges and expenses of and incidental to the joint administration and management of all the charities out of the income thereof, but so that the amount to be contributed towards the same out of the income of the Barnham Broom Estate shall be a fixed yearly sum of 2*l.*

28. *Specific Payments.*—The trustees shall make out of the income of the Charities the several yearly payments specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Scheme, to the persons specified in the second column of that schedule:

Provided that as soon as may be after this Scheme takes effect the said official trustees of charitable funds shall transfer to separate accounts in their books sums of consols sufficient at the time of transfer to provide by the dividends thereof for those of the said several yearly payments which are specified in the first column of Part I. of the said Second Schedule, and such sums of consols shall, from and after the transfer thereof, be in full satisfaction of the yearly payments for the provision whereof the same respectively have been transferred.

29. *Remaining Net Yearly Income.*—The net yearly income of the Charities remaining after the payments aforesaid shall be applied by the trustees in the manner and to the objects herein-after prescribed.

BRANCHES.

30. *Branches.*—For the purpose of the administration of the almshouses belonging to the Charities and the net yearly income of the Charities remaining as aforesaid, the Charities shall be administered in branches as follows:—

- (1) The almshouse branch, consisting of the several almshouse buildings belonging to the Charities and a yearly sum of 1,200*l.* out of the said net yearly income;
- (2) The pension branch, consisting of a yearly sum of 600*l.* out of the said net yearly income;
- (3) The loan branch, consisting of the sum of cash outstanding on loans at the date of this Scheme in respect of the

above-mentioned Charities called or known as the charity loans and a yearly sum of 100*l.* out of the said net yearly income ;

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- (4) The apprenticing branch, consisting of a yearly sum of 500*l.* out of the said net yearly income ;
- (5) The poor's branch, consisting of the residue of the said net yearly income.

As to the Almshouse and Pension Branches.

31. *Almshouse.*—The almshouse buildings belonging to the Charities and the property heretofore occupied therewith shall be appropriated and used for the residence of the almspeople in conformity with the provisions of this Scheme.

32. *Absence from Almshouse.*—No almsperson shall be absent for a period exceeding 24 hours from the almshouse in which he or she resides, except with the consent in writing of the trustees, or their clerk ; but in special cases such consent may, for any sufficient reason, be given retrospectively after the absence has occurred.

33. *Rooms not to be Let.*—No almsperson shall be permitted to let or part with the possession of the room or rooms allotted to him or her, or, except with the special permission of the trustees, to suffer any stranger to share the occupation of the same or of any part thereof.

34. *Matrons and Nurses, &c.*—The trustees may, if they think fit, whenever the income of the Charities suffices for the purpose, appoint matrons or nurses, dismissible at their pleasure, to perform such duties as may be necessary for the superintendence and care of the almspeople, at such salaries as they may think fit, and may allot to the matrons or nurses rooms in the almshouses as residences while they hold office. Provided that nothing herein shall prejudice the legitimate interests of the existing superintendent of Doughty's Hospital. The trustees may provide medical attendance for the almspeople, and such medicines and medical or surgical appliances as may be necessary.

35. *Saving for existing Almspeople and Pensioners.*—Appointments of almspeople and pensioners under this Scheme shall be made without prejudice to the interests of existing almspeople and pensioners.

36. *Qualifications of Almspeople and Pensioners.*—The almspeople and pensioners shall be poor persons of good character, who have resided in the city and county of the city of Norwich for not less than four years next preceding the time of their appointment, and who from age, ill-health, accident, or infirmity, are wholly or in part unable to maintain themselves by their own exertions : Provided that no person shall be disqualified on account of having received poor law relief prior to the

A.D. 1910. time of his appointment notwithstanding any rule of law laid down by the High Court of Justice to the contrary.

37. *Stipends, &c., of Almspeople and Pensioners.*—There shall be paid to each almsperson and to each pensioner out of the income of the almshouse and pension branches respectively, by weekly or other periodical payments as the trustees think fit, such a stipend as the trustees may from time to time fix, having regard to the needs and circumstances of the respective almspeople and pensioners and to the income and other circumstances of the Charities: Provided that the trustees, instead of paying the whole amount of the stipend to any almsperson or pensioner in money, may from time to time expend the whole or any portion thereof for his or her benefit as they think fit. The trustees may also provide fuel, lighting, clothes and washing for the almspeople.

38. *Payment of Stipends and Conduct of Inquiries.*—The clerk of the trustees shall pay the stipends to the almspeople and pensioners, and he or some other person appointed by the trustees for the purpose shall conduct any inquiries with regard to the almspeople and pensioners and to applicants for appointment.

39. *Notice of Vacancy.*—No appointment of an almsperson or a pensioner shall be made by the trustees until a sufficient notice (which may be according to the form annexed hereto) of the vacancy to be filled up, specifying the qualifications required from candidates, has been published in the city and county of the city of Norwich by advertisement or otherwise, so as to give due publicity to the intended appointment; provided that such notice shall not be required in the case of a vacancy occurring within a period of six calendar months next after the publication of a notice under this clause, or in the case of an appointment of the widow of an almsperson upon a vacancy caused by his death. Every applicant must be prepared to produce sufficient testimonials and other evidence of his or her qualification for the appointment.

40. *Applications for Appointment.*—Applications for appointment as almspeople or pensioners shall be made in the first place in writing to the trustees or their clerk, in such manner as the trustees prescribe. Except in case of physical disability, the trustees shall, before appointing any applicant to be an almsperson or a pensioner, require him or her to attend in person.

41. *Appointments of Almspeople and Pensioners.*—Every appointment of an almsperson or of a pensioner shall be made by the trustees, and shall be made at a special meeting to be held as soon as conveniently may be after an interval of one month from the occurrence of the vacancy to be filled, allowing a reasonable time for publication of notice and for inquiries as to the applicants.

42. *Selection of Almspeople and Pensioners and Payment of Pensions.*—The almspeople and pensioners shall be selected as nearly

as practicable equally from the two sexes, and under the following conditions :— A.D. 1910.

- (1) After full investigation of the character and circumstances of the applicants, and inquiry whether they have shown reasonable providence, and whether and to what extent they may reasonably expect assistance from relations or others ;
- (2) Where claims are equal, preference shall be given to those applicants who have been longest resident in the beneficial area.

The pensions shall be paid subject to such reasonable regulations for ascertaining the identity and good conduct of the pensioners and their continued possession of the required qualifications as the trustees from time to time prescribe.

For the purpose of this clause the trustees may avail themselves of the agency of any charity organisation society, or other like agency.

43. *Term of Pensions.*—Each pension shall be granted for a term of not more than three years in the first instance, but may be prolonged by the trustees, if they think fit, for a further period of not more than three years at each prolongation.

44. *Register.*—The trustees shall provide and keep a book, in which shall be entered the name, age, and description of every person appointed to be an almsperson or a pensioner, the date of every appointment and the date and occasion of every vacancy. They shall also keep a register for all applications for appointment.

45. *Removal of Almspeople and Pensioners.*—(1) Any almsperson or pensioner who receives poor-law relief other than medical relief, shall be removed from being an almsperson or a pensioner.

(2) If, in the opinion of the trustees, any almsperson or pensioner is guilty of insobriety, insubordination, breach of regulations, or immoral or improper conduct, or is disqualified for retaining his or her appointment by having become entitled to a sufficient income from sources other than the Charities, or on account of mental disease (in the case of an almsperson) or from any other cause, or if in any case it appears that any almsperson or pensioner has been appointed without having the required qualifications, the trustees, upon proof thereof to their satisfaction, may remove the almsperson or pensioner.

(3) Upon the removal of any almsperson, matron, or nurse, the trustees shall take possession of the tenement or room occupied by him or her, and upon the removal of any almsperson or pensioner the trustees may proceed to appoint another almsperson or pensioner in his or her place.

(4) In any case of such misconduct as aforesaid the trustees may suspend the payment of the stipend to the almsperson or pensioner, either wholly or in part, during such time as they think fit.

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(5) Any almsperson removed on account of mental disease, and any pensioner removed on account of receiving poor-law relief while being detained under lawful authority as a person suffering from mental disease, may, on recovery, be re-appointed without previous notice being given of the vacancy to be filled up, and need not possess the qualifications as to residence and previous non-receipt of poor-law relief.

46. *Regulations.*—The trustees may from time to time prescribe such reasonable regulations as they consider expedient for the government of the almspeople and pensioners, provided that the same shall not be at variance or inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Scheme, and by such regulations may provide that the almspeople shall render such assistance to each other and to the matron or nurse as is within their power.

As to the Loan Branch.

47. *Loans.*—The funds of this branch, viz., the sum of cash outstanding as aforesaid, as and when received, and the said yearly sum of 100*l.*, shall be applied by the trustees in the grant of loans to persons, to be selected for this purpose by the trustees, who have resided in the city and county of the city of Norwich for not less than four years next preceding the time of their selection, and who have started or are starting or about to start in business as tradesmen. The loans shall amount to not less than 50*l.* in each case, and shall be granted for not more than seven years, upon such terms and conditions as to sureties (if any) and repayment and otherwise as the trustees think proper. In so far as in any year the trustees cannot usefully apply the funds of this branch for the purposes thereof as herein-before directed the same shall be accumulated by them, but so that the accumulations shall be applicable from time to time for the purposes of the branch in any future year or years; provided that if and so often as an amount equivalent to 500*l.* in cash has been accumulated that amount (unless otherwise ordered) shall cease to be so applicable as aforesaid, and shall be vested under clause four hereof in the name of the said official trustees of charitable funds, in augmentation of the capital endowments of the Consolidated Charities.

As to the Apprenticing Branch.

48. *Apprenticing, Outfits and Instruction.*—The yearly income of the apprenticing branch shall be applied by the trustees, under one or more of the following heads, for the benefit of such deserving and necessitous children, bonâ fide resident in the city and county of the city of Norwich, as the trustees select for the purpose:—

- (1) In apprenticing them to some useful trade or occupation;
- (2) In assisting them by the provision of outfits (including clothes, books, tools, travelling expenses, admission fees, or the like),

or otherwise, upon their entering, or to enable them to enter, upon a trade, profession, or occupation, or into service ;

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- (3) In making payments for maintenance, including payments for travelling expenses to enable them to receive instruction in workshops or at classes or otherwise, so as to prepare them for further instruction or for employment.

49. *Conditions of Apprenticing.*—Upon the apprenticing of any child—

- (1) An indenture of apprenticeship shall be executed containing provisions for carrying into effect the following stipulations :—

(a) The apprenticeship premium shall be of such amount as the trustees shall from time to time think necessary or proper, and shall be payable in not less than two portions, and the second portion and any subsequent portions shall be payable after the lapse of at least six months from the commencement of the term of apprenticeship or from the payment of the preceding portion ;

(b) The second or any subsequent portion of the premium shall not be payable unless or until the trustees have satisfied themselves by personal inquiry that the apprentice is being properly taught ;

(c) Substantial wages increasing yearly shall be paid to the apprentice on a scale to be specified in the indenture :

- (2) The trustees may also agree for the repayment to them of the whole or any part of the apprenticeship premium out of any wages of the apprentice or otherwise ; and may properly refuse to accept any master or mistress except upon the following conditions :—

(a) The permission of a probationary period not exceeding three months, and either with or without wages, during which the apprentice concerned shall be at liberty to recede from his or her engagement ;

(b) The permission of access at all reasonable times to the place of employment of the apprentice concerned by any person authorised by the trustees to inspect and report upon the condition, conduct, and diligence of the apprentice ;

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(c) Such other conditions or stipulations as to evening instruction, or other matters as in the judgment of the trustees may be beneficial to the apprentice concerned or otherwise advantageous to the Charities:

- (3) Any or all of the arrangements for the apprenticeship and visiting of, and consequent reports upon, the apprentice, may be delegated to the National Institution of Apprenticeship, No. 39, York Place, Baker Street, London, W., or to the Apprenticeship and Skilled Employment Association, No. 36, Denison House, Vauxhall Bridge Road, London, S.W., or to any similar institution which may be nominated by the trustees and approved by the Charity Commissioners, and in that case the moneys applicable to the apprenticeship shall be paid to the institution at the time of the signing of the apprenticeship indenture.

As to the Poor's Branch.

50. *General Benefit of Poor.*—The yearly income of the poor's branch shall be applied by the trustees in making payments, under one or more of the following heads, for the benefit either of the poor of the city and county of the city of Norwich generally, or of such deserving and necessitous persons resident therein as the trustees select for this purpose, and in such way as they consider most advantageous to the recipients, and most conducive to the formation of provident habits:—

- I. Payments to an amount not exceeding 250*l.*, in any one year, by way of—

(1) Subscriptions or donations in aid of the funds of any dispensary, infirmary, hospital, or convalescent home, whether general or special, upon such terms (so far as may be) as to enable the trustees to secure the benefits of the institution for the objects of the charities;

- (2) Contributions towards—

(a) The provision of nurses for the sick and infirm;

(b) The provision of duly certified midwives to attend women in childbirth;

(c) The support of any maternity society or lying-in fund;

(d) The travelling expenses of patients to and from such institutions as are above-mentioned in paragraph I. (1);

(e) The cost of providing proper care and supervision (including any necessary cost of locomotion) for poor persons requiring temporary change of air or special protection or treatment :

II. Subscriptions or donations to an amount not exceeding 100*l.* in any one year in aid of the funds of—

(1) Any provident club or society established in or near the city and county of the city of Norwich for the supply of coal, clothing, or other necessaries ;

(2) Any duly registered provident or friendly society accessible to the inhabitants of the city and county of the city of Norwich :

III. The supply to an amount not exceeding 200*l.* in any one year of—

(1) Clothes, linen, bedding, fuel, tools, medical, or other aid in sickness, food or other articles in kind ;

(2) Temporary relief in money, by way of loan or otherwise, in case of unexpected loss, or sudden destitution :

Provided that the income of the poor's branch shall in no case be applied so that any individual or institution may become entitled to a periodical or recurrent benefit therefrom.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

51. *Appropriation of Benefits.*—The appropriation of the benefits of the Consolidated Charities shall be made by the trustees from time to time at meetings of their body or of any committee of their body, and not separately by any individual trustee or trustees.

52. *Charities not to relieve Rates.*—The funds or income of the Consolidated Charities shall not in any case be applied in aid of any rates for the relief of the poor or other purposes.

53. *Trustees not to be personally interested.*—No trustee shall take or hold any interest in any property belonging to the Charities otherwise than as a trustee for the purposes thereof, and no trustee shall receive any remuneration, or be interested in the supply of work or goods, at the cost of the Charities.

54. *Alteration of Scheme.*—The Charity Commissioners may from time to time, in the exercise of their ordinary jurisdiction, establish schemes for the alteration of any provisions of this Scheme, as if those provisions had been made by the founder in the case of a charity having a founder.

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55. *Questions under Scheme.*—Any question as to the construction of this Scheme, or as to the regularity or the validity of any acts done or about to be done under this Scheme, shall be determined conclusively by the Charity Commissioners, upon such application made to them for the purpose as they think sufficient.

FORM OF NOTICE.

In the matter of the CONSOLIDATED CHARITIES, in the City and County of the City of NORWICH.

The trustees of these Charities give notice that they will on the day of 19 , proceed to elect [an *almsperson*] [a *pensioner*] to fill a vacancy in the number of [almspeople] [pensioners] of the Charities. The election will take place at o'clock on that day, at . Poor persons of good character who have been resident in the city and county of the city of Norwich for *four* years at least, and who from age, ill health, accident or infirmity are unable to maintain themselves by their own exertions, are eligible for the appointment. Preference will be given to those who have shown reasonable providence, and to those who have been longest resident in the beneficial area.

Application for the appointment must be made in the first place in writing to the trustees or their clerk or inquiry officer at , 28 days at least previously to the election. Every applicant must state *his* or *her* name, address, age, and occupation, and must be prepared to produce sufficient testimonials and other evidence of *his* or *her* qualification for the appointment, and, except in case of physical disability to attend in person.
