CHAPTER ii

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936 relating to Clyde Navigation. [20th December 1960.]

WHEREAS the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed has been made by the Secretary of State under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936 and it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

2. This Act may be cited as the Clyde Navigation Order Confirmation Act 1960. Short title.

SCHEDULE

CLYDE NAVIGATION

Provisional Order to amend the provisions of the Clyde Navigation Acts 1929 to 1959 relating to rates and for other purposes.

WHEREAS the Trustees of the Clyde Navigation (hereinafter called "the Trustees") were incorporated by the Clyde Navigation Consolidation Act 1858 and powers have been conferred upon them by the Clyde Navigation Acts 1858 to 1959:

And whereas it is expedient that the rates dues tolls rents and charges (hereinafter called "rates") authorised by the Clyde Navigation Act 1929 as amended by the Clyde Navigation Order Confirmation Act 1950 and the Clyde Navigation Order Confirmation Act 1957 should be increased and revised and that the powers of the Trustees to demand and recover rates should be amended as provided in this Order:

And whereas the Trustees were authorised by the Clyde Navigation Order Confirmation Act 1957 to construct certain works and for that purpose to acquire certain lands by compulsory purchase:

And whereas it is expedient that the period limited for the compulsory purchase of the said lands should be extended as provided in this Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the period limited by the Clyde Navigation Order Confirmation Act 1950 for the completion of certain new works should be extended as provided in this Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees should be authorised to borrow temporarily sums of money for the purposes of the undertaking:

And whereas it is expedient that the further powers mentioned in this Order should be conferred on the Trustees:

And whereas the purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last-mentioned Act the Secretary of State orders as follows:—

Short and

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Clyde Navigation Order 1960.

(2) The Clyde Navigation Acts 1858 to 1959 and this Order may be cited together as the Clyde Navigation Acts 1858 to 1960.

Incorporation
of Harbours

2.—(1) Sections 28 99 and 100 of the Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847 are hereby incorporated with and form part of this Order:

Provided that section 28 as so incorporated shall be read and have effect—

(a) as if in that section the expression “vessel” includes any vessel ship lighter keel barge boat raft pontoon and craft of any kind howsoever navigated propelled or moved and any seaplane on the surface of the water; and

(b) as amended by subsection (2) of section 31 of the Post Office Act 1953.

(2) In construing the enactments so incorporated “the special Act” shall mean this Order the expression “the harbour dock or pier” shall mean the river and the harbour and the expression “rates” shall mean the rates and charges authorised by this Order.

3.—(1) In this Order—

“the Act of 1929” means the Clyde Navigation Act 1929;

“the Clyde Navigation Acts” means the Clyde Navigation Acts 1858 to 1960;

“the date of commencement” means the date when this Order is confirmed by Parliament;

“enactment” means any Act whether public general or local and any order made thereunder or any provisions in any Act or in any such order;

“the harbour” means the harbour as defined in subsection (1) of section 10 (Definition of harbour) of the Act of 1929;

“the Order of 1950” means the Clyde Navigation Order 1950 scheduled to and confirmed by the Clyde Navigation Order Confirmation Act 1950;

“the Order of 1957” means the Clyde Navigation Order 1957 scheduled to and confirmed by the Clyde Navigation Order Confirmation Act 1957;

“owner” when used with reference to any vessel includes the owner agent master consignee or other person in charge of such vessel and when used in relation to goods animals or vehicles includes the owner agent consignor shipper consignee or other person in charge of such goods animals or vehicles and their respective agents in relation thereto:

Provided that where any interest or liability of any owner as hereinbefore defined is involved such interest or liability shall be joint and several;

“the river” means the river Clyde within the limits defined in section 11 (Limits of river defined) of the Act of 1929;

“the Trustees” means the Trustees of the Clyde Navigation;

“the undertaking” means the undertaking of the Trustees for the time being authorised.

(2) References in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as references to that enactment as amended by any other enactment including this Order.

4. As from the date of commencement the Act of 1929 is hereby amended—

(a) by the substitution of the First Second Third and Fourth Schedules to this Order for the First Second Thirteenth and Fourteenth Schedules respectively to the Act of 1929;

- (b) by the insertion in section 6 (Interpretation) after the definition of "Clyde Navigation Acts" of the following definition:—
" 'enactment' means any Act whether public general or local and any order made thereunder or any provisions in any Act or in any such order ";
- (c) by the substitution in the said section 6 in the definition of "rates" of the words "which the Trustees are for the time being authorised to levy demand and recover in pursuance of any existing or subsequent enactment" for the words "authorised by this Act";
- (d) by the substitution in section 19 (Power to hire out cranes &c) of the words "as they may from time to time determine" for the words "as they think fit";
- (e) by the substitution in the said section 19 of the words "than those from time to time demanded and recovered by the Trustees for the use of such cranes hoists and other appliances" for the words "than are authorised by this Act";
- (f) by the substitution in section 21 (Rates for Renfrew Ferry) of the words "Third Schedule" for the words "Thirteenth Schedule" where those words first occur and the omission of the proviso to that section;
- (g) by the substitution in section 22 (Rates for Erskine Ferry) of the words "Fourth Schedule" for the words "Fourteenth Schedule" where those words first occur and the omission of the proviso to that section;
- (h) by the omission in subsection (1) of section 30 (Rates to be charged equally &c.) of the words "levied by the Trustees under the authority of this Act" and by the substitution in subsection (2) of that section of the word "rates" for the words "such rates under either of the two immediately preceding sections of this Act";
- (i) by the omission in section 34 (Services for bulk grain at granary berths Meadowside Quay) of the figures and word "2 and 3";
- (j) by the substitution in the said section 34 of the words "such reasonable charges as they may from time to time determine" for the words "the charges specified in the Eleventh Schedule to this Act";
- (k) by the omission in section 35 (Services for grain flour &c. in bags at granary berths Meadowside Quay) of the figures and word "2 and 3";
- (l) by the substitution in the said section 35 of the words "such reasonable charges as they may from time to time determine" for the words "the charges specified in the Eleventh Schedule to this Act" in both places where those words occur;
- (m) by the substitution in subsection (2) of the said section 35 of the words "as they may from time to time determine" for the words "as they may think fit";

and the Clyde Navigation Acts shall be read and construed accordingly.

5. Section 25 (Registered tonnage of tugs) of the Act of 1929 (as amended by section 22 of the Order of 1950 and section 28 of the Order of 1957) is hereby amended by the substitution of the words " sixty-eight pounds " for the words " fifty-four pounds ". Further amendment of section 25 of Act of 1929.

6.—(1) The Trustees may demand and recover such reasonable rates as they may from time to time determine for the use of cranes hoists grabs magnets tramways capstans planks trestles weighing-machines graving docks granaries timber yards sheds buildings moorings road transport vehicles buoys works and any other plant appliances and conveniences belonging to or provided by the Trustees or in respect of any services rendered by them in connection with the undertaking. Rates for use of cranes etc. and for miscellaneous services.

(2) All such rates shall be respectively recoverable from the owner of the goods or other articles dealt with or from the owner of any vessel using or applying for the use of such plant appliances conveniences or services or from any person who may so apply.

7.—(1) The Trustees may supply water for all purposes to vessels entering and using the harbour or for the extinguishing of fire on board such vessels or at the harbour and may demand and recover for water so supplied by them such rates as will in their opinion be likely to be not more and not less than sufficient to meet the costs charges and expenses incurred or to be incurred by the Trustees in providing and maintaining such supply taking one year with another. Rates for supply of water.

(2) The rates authorised by this section shall be paid to the Trustees by the owner of the vessel or other person requesting and taking such supply.

8. The Trustees may demand and recover the rates and charges by this Order authorised to be charged at such place or places as they shall from time to time appoint. Rates to be collected at places appointed by Trustees.

9. Section 5 (Lands) of the Order of 1957 is hereby amended by the substitution of the words " nineteen hundred and sixty-three " for the words " nineteen hundred and sixty ". Extending period for compulsory purchase of lands.

10. Section 8 (Period for completion of new works) of the Order of 1950 shall be read and have effect as if for the reference therein to the words " within ten years from the date of the passing of the Act confirming this Order then on the expiration of that period " there were substituted the words " by the twenty-eighth day of July nineteen hundred and seventy then on that day ". Extending period for completion of works.

11. In addition to the moneys which the Trustees are authorised to borrow under the Clyde Navigation Acts 1858 to 1959 the Trustees may for the purpose of providing temporarily for current expenditure for any of the purposes of their undertaking borrow such moneys as may be necessary to provide for such expenditure: Power to borrow for current expenses.

Provided always—

- (a) that the aggregate amount outstanding at any one time of the moneys so borrowed shall not exceed five hundred thousand pounds;
- (b) that such moneys so borrowed shall as nearly as may be be repaid at or before the thirtieth day of June next ensuing after the dates of borrowing; and
- (c) that the provisions of sections 47 and 48 of the Clyde Navigation Act 1883 in reference to the sinking fund to be provided by the Trustees shall not apply to moneys borrowed under the powers of this section.

12. From the date of commencement the following enactments are hereby repealed:—

The Act of 1929—

Section 18 (Rates for cranes graving docks granary &c.);

Section 23 (Toll for Govan passenger wharf);

The Third to the Twelfth Schedules and the Fifteenth Schedule:

The Order of 1957—

Section 27 (Increase of rates);

Section 29 (Rates and services not otherwise provided for).

Costs of Order. 13. All costs charges and expenses of and incident to the preparing for obtaining and confirming of this Order or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Trustees out of the revenues of the undertaking.

Rebate.—On all vessels arriving from and departing to any place out of the United Kingdom Isle of Man Channel Islands or Republic of Ireland and which are dealt with as coming within the first stage of the river (a) arriving light or in ballast or with cargo which is not discharged and loading cargo or (b) arriving with and discharging cargo and departing light or in ballast or with part cargo which has not been discharged or after loading only fuel for the vessel's own use a rebate of elevenpence per net register ton will be allowed on the voyage in which cargo has neither been discharged nor loaded.

Rebate.—On all vessels arriving from and departing to any place out of the United Kingdom Isle of Man Channel Islands or Republic of Ireland and which are dealt with as coming within the first stage of the river light or in ballast or with cargo without breaking bulk or after loading only fuel for the vessel's own use a rebate of elevenpence per net register ton will be allowed on the outward voyage.

- V. On all new vessels (a) launched or coming into the harbour or any stage of the river for the first time from any shipbuilding yard graving dock or other works eastward of the Castle of Newark or (b) arriving in the harbour or any stage of the river to be fitted out per net register ton
