An Act for altering an Act passed in the Forty-sisth Year of His present Majesty, for repairing Roads in the County of Ayr. [28th April 1809.]

THEREAS by an Act passed in the Forty-sisth Year of the 45 G. 38 Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Ast for alter- c. 38. ing, amending, and consolidating several Acts, for repairing Turnpike-Roads in the County of Ayr, for repairing other Roads therein, and for making more effectual the Statute Labour in the said County; certain Persons were appointed Trustees, and various Powers were granted for making and keeping in Repair the Roads therein mentioned: And whereas the Roads hereinaster mentioned, are narrow, incom modious, and out of Repair, and cannot be effectually amended by the ordinary Course of Law; and it would be advantageous to the Public, if the same were put under the Care and Management of the said Trustees, videlicet: A Road beginning at the North End of the Long Walk, where the Road joins the Lochlibo Road, and proceeding by Auchenharvie Callle, Irvinehill, Pointhouse, Dunlophouse, and Craignaught, to the March of the County with Renfrew, passing through the Parishes of Irvine, Stewartoun, Dunlop, Kilwinning, and Dregborne, a Road from the Little Bridge, over Weirston Burn, on the Turnpike Road from Irvine to Kilwinning, and from thence through Weirston Farm, and croffing the End of the Village of Corsebill, near james Wilson's House, and going through Corsebill Moor, and proceeding through the Lands of Auchenmead to Beith, and from thence to the Confines of the County at or near Kersebridge, passing through the Parishes of Irvine, Kilwinning, and Beith; a Road leaving the Road from Kilmarnock to Dundonald, [Loc. & Per.] 72 near

near the little Gatebead by Crossbouse, till it joins the Road from Kilmarnock to Stewartoun, at the Town of Kilmaurs, passing through the Parish of Kilmaurs: Road leaving the Road from Kilmarnock to Stewartoun, near Mienbill, by Sandyford, till it joins the same Road, near the Sharobridge, passing through the Parishes of Kilmarnock and Kilmaurs: a Road leaving the Road from Kilmarnock to Mauchline, near the Braehead Toll Bar, through Part of the Estate of Kilmurnock, Baronies of Monkland and Grongar, till it joins the Road from Galstoun to Kingswell, by the Lime Works near Hairshaw Toll Bar, passing through the Parish of Kilmarnock; a Road from Beith, by, at, or near Coldstream Bridge to a Junction of the Road between Biggart and Whitehouse, all in the Parish of Beith; the Road from Mauchline by the Old Bridge of Barskimming, till it joins the Road at Drongan, passing through the Parishes of Mauchline, Ochiltree, and Stair; the Road from Failbridge by Lochbrown, till it wins the Road from Mauchline to Kilmarnock, passing through the Parishes of Tarboltoun and Mauchline; the Road from Little Miln by Kerseloch to Dalrymple Bridge, all within the Parish of Dalrymple; the Road from where it joins the Mauchline Road, leading to Kilmarnock, West of Lawer's Bridge to the High Road leading from Ayr to Galstown, at Gaucherland, passing through the Parishes of Gaulstoun and Riccartoun; a Road from Wallstoun, where it crosses the Road from Ayr to Mauchline at Boigend Bridge, and from thence till it joins the Road from Saint Evox to Monkton at Sandyford, passing through the Parishes of Tarboltoun and Saint Evox; a Road striking off from the Road through the Farm of Muirstoun to go by the North-west Side of Drumjoan Meadow, and through the Farm of Bardarroch by Roading Head to Dambford, and from thence through the Lands of Cairn and Lessnessock, and Laigh Tarbeg, until it joins the Road from Ayr to Cumnock, all within the Parish of Ochiltree; a Road from Lugar Bridge through the Village of Cumnock till it joins the Road from Ayr to Cumnock at the Toll Bar, within the Parish of Cumnock; a Road from Dalrymple Bridge, till it joins the Road from Maybele to Ayr, near Monkwood Bridge, passing through the Farm of Carclowie on the Southwest Side of the Farm Houses going through the Parishes of Dalrymple and Ayr; a Road from a Point in the Road from Girvan to Colmonell, between Craig and Garnaburn, to join the Road from Girvan to Ballantrae passing through the Parish of Colmonell; a Road from Douglastoun to Manabae Bridge, near the Village of Kirkoswald, and from thence through Corriestoun and Hollowsheen, to join the Water of Girvan Road near Wallacestoun, with a Branch from Hollowsheen Muir to join the Maybole and Kirkoswald Road, at or near Blainfield, going through the Parishes of Kirkoswald and Daily; a Road from Patna Bridge in the best Line to Maybole, passing through the Parishes of Straitoun, Kirkmichael, and Maybole; a Road from Kirkmichael by Orchyard and Guiltree Mill, Dalvennan, and Kierbill to Patna Bridge, passing through the Parishes of Kirkmichael and Straitoun: And whereas it is expedient that the said Trustees should be dischargedfrom the Care and Management of the Roads hereinaster mentioned, videlicet: the Road which departs from the Road between Stewartoun and Pollocktoun to the March of the Shire towards Neilstoun; the Road leading from at or near Kilwinning by Auchinmead, Marchland Bridge, and Beith, to the Confines of the County at or near Kerseland

land Bridge; the Road from the Sea Shore of Ayr between Blackburn and Cuningpark around the Race Course, and by Shawsield, Whinmuir, Fishertown, Sandyford, Duphold, and Holmstoun, to the Water of Ayr at the Upper Mills of Ayr; May it therefore please Your Majesty, That it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the Roads herein sirst be-fore particularly mentioned and described, shall be made, repaired, and first described kept in Repair, by the Trustees appointed by the said recited Act, in to be made such and the same Manner as if the said Roads had been enumerated and included therein, and all the Powers, Provisions, Rules, Regulations, under Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Clauses, Matters, and Things, contained in the said recited Act, so far as the same are applicable thereto, shall be and are hereby extended to, and shall be used, observed, applied, and enforced, for the Purpole of making, repairing, and keeping in Repair the said Roads.

II. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Tolls or Duties shall No Tolls to be levied for or in respect of any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other be paid for Carriage what soever, or the Horse or Horses, or other Cattle drawing Stores. the same, which shall be employed in conveying any Ordnance, Barrack, or Commissariat, or other public Stores of or belonging to His Majesty, or for the Use of His Majesty's Forces.

III. And be it further enacted, That no Person owning or driving, or Stores. causing to be driven, any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage provided for the Service of His Majesty's Forces, or conveying any Ordnance, Barrack, or Commissariat, or other public Stores of or belonging to His. Majesty, or for the Use of His Majesty's Forces, shall be subject to any Penalty or Forfeiture for Overweight; nor shall any such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage, be stopped or detained by reason of any Weight in any such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage, or of being drawn by any Number of Horses or Oxen; but it shall be lawful for any Owner or Driver of any such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage, to put any Number of Horses or Oxen to such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage, any Thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament relating to Highways or Turnpike Roads, or in this Act consained, to the contrary notwithstanding.

IV. And he it further enacted, That from and immediately after the Certain passing of this Act, so much of the said recited Act as relates to the Roads not to Roads herein last particularly mentioned and described, shall be, and be made and the same is hereby repealed, and that the said Trustees shall be, and repaired. they are hereby absolutely freed and discharged, of and from the future Care and Management thereof: Provided always, Tht the said last mentioned Roads shall and may be maintained and kept in Repair, in the same Manner as any Roads in Scotland, may now by Law be maintained and kept in Repair.

V. And be it further enacted, That the Charges and Expenses of ob- Expenses of taining and passing this Act, shall be paid and defrayed in such and the this Act to be Jame
