An Act for giving further Powers to the Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation, and to the Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal, and to confirm an Agreement entered into between the said Companies.

[21st June 1819.]

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Fifty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for making and 57 G. 3. c. 63. maintaining a Navigable Canal from the River Arun to Chichester Harbour, and from thence to Langstone and Portsmouth Harbours, with a Cut or Branch from Hunston Common to or near the Gity of Chichester, and for improving the Navigation of the Harbour of Langstone and Channels of Langstone and Thorney, several Persons therein named were united into and made a Body Politic and Corporate by the Name of "The Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation," for carrying the Purposes of the said Act into execution; and the said Company of Proprietors were, amongst other Things, authorized and empowered by the said Act to make and keep navigable and passable for Boats, Barges, and other Vessels a Canal from the River Arun, at or near to a certain Public House called the Ship and Anchor, in the Parish of Ford, in the County of Sussex, to the Harbour of Chichester, at or near to a certain Place called the Salterns, in the Parishes of Birdham and Itchenor, in the said County of Sussex, in, to, or through the several Parishes of Ford, Yapton, [Local.] Barnham,

Barnham, Aldingbourn, Birsted, Oving, Merston, North Mundham, Hunston, Donnington, Appledram, Birdham, and Itchenor, some or one of them in the said County of Sussex; and also to make and keep navigable and passable for Boats, Barges, and other Vessels another or Branch Canal from and out of the Main Line of the said Canal, at or near to a certain Place called Hunston Common, in the said Parish of Hunston, to a certain Place near to Southgate in the Parish of Saint Bartholomew, at or near the City of Chichester in the said County of Sussex, in, to, or through the several Parishes of Hunston, Donnington, Rumboldswyke, Saint Pancras, Saint Peter the Great, or the Subdeanery, and Saint Bartholomew, or some or one of them; and also to make, deepen, and keep navigable and passable for Boats, Barges, and other Vessels the Channels of Thorney and Hayling, and the Harbour of Langstone, in, through, or near the several Parishes of West Thorney and Westbourne, or one of them, in the said County of Sussex; and also in, through, or near the several other Parishes of North Hayling, Warblington, Havant, Bedhampton, and Portsea, or some or one of them, in the County of Southampton; and also to make and keep navigable and passable for Boats, Barges, and other Vessels another Canal from the said Harbour of Langstone, at or near to a certain Marsh belonging to James Knight, in the Parish of Wymering in the said County of Southampton, to the Harbour of Portsmouth, at or near to a certain Meadow belonging to Richard Pittis, in the Parish of Wymering in the said County of Southampton, in, to, or through the several Parishes of Farlington, Wymering, and Widley, or some or one of them, in the said County of Southampton; and also to make and keep navigable and passable for Boats, Barges, and other Vessels another Canal from the said Harbour of Langstone, at or near to certain Lands lately inclosed and heretofore called Milton Common, in the Parish of Portsea, to at or near a certain Place called the Half-way-houses, in the said Parish of Portsea, in, to, or through the said Parish of Portsea in the said County of Southampton: And whereas it will be of great public Benefit, and greatly increase the Trade of the City of Chichester, to make that Part of the Main Line of the said Canal from the River Arun to the said Harbour of Chichester, authorized to be made by the said recited Act, leading from Hunston Common aforesaid to the said Harbour of Chichester, and the other or Branch Canal from Hunston Common aforesaid, to or near to Southgate, at or near the said City of Chichester, of a sufficient Depth for Vessels of One hundred Tons Burthen to navigate thereon; and it will also be of considerable Advantage and public Utility to make the said Canal authorized to be made from the said Harbour of Langstone to the said Place called the Half-way-houses; in the Parish of Portsea in the County of Southampton, of a sufficient Depth' to admit and allow Vessels of the Burthen of One hundred and fifty Tons to pass and re-pass thereon: And whereas to make the said Parts of the said Canals of a sufficient Depth for the Purposes aforesaid it will be necessary to expend larger Sums of Money thereon than in the making the other Parts of the said Navigation, Cuts, or Canals; and it is therefore expedient to allow the said Company of Proprietors to take increased Tolls and Wharfage on those Parts of the said Canals to be made of such Depth as aforesaid: And whereas it will be necessary for the said Company of Proprietors to have Power to make a Road from their Basin or Works, at or near to Southgate aforesaid, to the said City of Chichester, for the Conveyance of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize conveyed on the said Canal: And whereas considerable Expence will be saved to the said Company of . Proprietors,

Proprietors, and the intended Navigation between Langstone and Portsmouth Harbours be much shortened, if the said Company were authorized to widen, deepen, and make and keep navigable and passable for Boats, Barges, and other Craft, a certain natural Creek called Portsbridge Creek, which unites the said Harbours of Portsmouth and Langstone, instead of making the said intended Canal from the said Harbour of Langstone, at or near the said Marsh of James Knight, into the said Harbour of Portsmouth, at or near the said Meadow of Richard Pittis, described in the said recited. Act: And whereas by an Act passed in the Fifty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for making and maintaining a Navigable 53 G. 3. c. 19. Canal to unite the Rivers Wey and Arun in the Counties of Surrey and Sussex, certain Persons therein named were united and made into a Body Politic and Corporate by the Name of "The Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal," for the Purpose of making and maintaining a Navigation to unite the Rivers Wey and Arun, which said Canal is connected with the said intended Navigation between the River Arun and Portsmouth, to be established under the Authority of the said recited Act of the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign: And whereas the said Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal have proceeded to put the said Act, passed in the Fifty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, in execution, and have nearly completed the Navigation and other Works thereby authorized to be made: And whereas, for the Encouragement and Support of the Navigation between the River Thames and Portsmouth, the said Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal, and the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation, have entered into certain Articles of Agreement, bearing Date the First Day of September in the Year One thousand eight hundred and eighteen, allowing the Conveyance of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize on their respective Navigations, from the River Thames to Portsmouth, and from Portsmouth to the River Thames, for certain specific Charges, being at a less Rate than the Tolls, Rates, and Duties which the said Companies are respectively entitled to take, demand, and recover under and by virtue of the said recited Acts of the Fifty-seventh and Fiftythird Years of His Majesty's Reign, and it will be very beneficial to the Public that such Agreement should be confirmed and made binding on the said Companies: And whereas the whole of the Money which the said Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal were authori rized to raise under the said Act, passed in the Fifty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, hath been laid out and expended by virtue and according to the Directions of the said Act: And whereas, in order to enable the said Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal to execute the several Works directed by the said Act, which are yet incomplete, so as to render the said Undertaking generally beneficial to the Neighbourhood and the Public, and that the said Articles of Agreement entered into between the said respective Companies may be carried into full force and effect, it is necessary that the said Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal should be empowered to raise or borrow a further Sum of Money, and that the said Act should be altered, explained, and amended; but the several Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assem-

bled, and by the Authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to make and keep navigable and passable so much of the Main Line of the said Canalfrom the River Arun to the Harbour of Chichester, authorized to be made, as leads from Hunston Common aforesaid to the Harbour of Chichester, at or near a certain Place called the Salterns, in and to or through the several Parishes in the said County of Sussex herein-before and in the said Act of the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign mentioned, and also the Branch Canal from and out of the Main Line of the said Canal at or near to Hunston Common aforesaid in the said Parish of Hunston to the said Place near to Southgate in the said Parish of Saint Bartholomew, at or near the said City of Chichester in the said County of Sussex, in, to, and through the several Parishes herein-before and in the said Act of the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign mentioned, of a sufficient Depth for Vessels of One hundred Tons Burthen to navigate therein.

Power for the Company of the Proprietors of the Portsmouth | and Arundel take increased Tolls on certain Parts of the Main Line of Canal from the River Arun to Chichester Canal to Chichester.

II. And be it further enacted, That in consideration of the extraordinary Expences which the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation will be at in making those Parts of the Main Line of Canal and the Branch Canal of such Depth as aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful for the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Navigation to Arundel Navigation, from Time to Time and at all Times for ever after the same shall be made of such Depth as aforesaid, to ask, demand, take, and receive to and for their own Use and Benefit, for the Tonnage of all Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and Commodities whatsoever which shall be carried or conveyed upon so much of the Main Line of the said Canal from the River Arun to Chichester Harbour as leads from Hunston Common aforesaid to the Harbour of Chichester, at or near the said Place called the Salterns, Harbour, and and on the said other or Branch Canal from and out of the said Main Line on the Branch of the said Canal, at or near to Hunston Common aforesaid, to or near to Southgate aforesaid, at or near the said City of Chichester or any Part thereof, from the Owner or Owners of such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and Commodities, or of or from the Owner or Owners, or Person or Persons having the Care, Custody, or Charge of or navigating the Vessels, Boats, or Barges conveying the same, at the Option of the said Company of Proprietors, the respective Rates, Tolls, and Duties herein-after mentioned; that is to say,

For all Dung and Ashes, and for all Chalk, Marl, Lime and Limestone, intended to be used for Manure, the Sum of Three-pence per Ton for every Mile, and so in proportion for any greater or less Quantity than a Ton, or

greater or less Distance than a Mile:

For all Chalk, Marl, Lime, Limestone, (except such as shall be intended to be used for Manure,) and for all Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and Commodities whatsoever, the Sum of Sixpence per Ton for every Mile, and so in proportion for any greater or less Quantity than a Ton, or greater or less Distance than a Mile:

For every empty or light Boat, Barge, or Vessel of any Sort or Description whatsoever, passing through any Lock on the said Canals, or either of them, the Sum of One Shilling and Sixpence for every such Lock:

For every Passenger or other Person who shall be carried upon the said Canals or either of them in any Boat, Barge, or Vessel, not being a Person then employed in navigating the same, for every Mile which any such Passenger

Passenger shall be carried upon the said Canal, or any Part thereof, the Sum of Two-pence, and so in proportion for any less Distance than a Mile:

For every separate Package, Parcel, or other Article, not exceeding Two hundred Weight each, and consigned to different or distinct Persons, the Sum of Three Halfpence for every Mile, and so in proportion for any less Distance than a Mile which any such Package, Parcel, or other Article may be carried.

III. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to make of a sufficient Depth, and keep navigable and passable for Vessels of One hundred and fifty Tons Burthen, the said Canal authorized to be made by the said recited Act, from the Harbour of Langstone at or near to certain Lands lately inclosed, and heretofore called Milton Common, in the Parish of Portsea, to at or near the said Place called the Half-way-houses, in the said Parish of Portsea, in, to, or through the said Parish of Portsea in the said County of Southampton.

Canal from Langstone to be made of sufficient Depth for Vessels of 150 Tons.

IV. And be it further enacted, That in consideration of the extra- Power for the ordinary Charges and Expences which the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation will be at in making the said lastmentioned Canal of the Depth aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful for the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation from Time to Time and at all Times hereafter, after the same shall be made of such Depth as aforesaid, to ask, demand, take, and receive, to and for their own Use and Benefit, for the Tonnage of all Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and Commodities whatsoever which shall be carried and conveyed upon the said Canal from the said Harbour of Langstone, at or near the said Lands lately inclosed and heretofore called Milton Common, in the Parish of Portsea, to at or near the said Place called the Half-way-houses, in the said Parish of Portsea in the said County of Southampton, or any Part thereof, from the Owner or Owners of such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and Commodities, or of or from the Owner or Owners or Person or Persons having the Care, Custody, or Charge of, or navigating the Vessels, Boats, or Barges conveying the same, at the Option of the said Company of Proprietors, the respective Rates, Tolls, and Duties herein-after mentioned; that is to say,

Company of **Proprietors of** the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation to takeincreased Tolls on the Canal from Langstone Harbour to the Half-wayhouses.

For all Dung and Ashes, and for all Chalk, Marl, Lime, and Limestone. intended to be used for Manure, the Sum of Three-pence per Ton for every Mile, and so in proportion for any greater or less Quantity than a Ton, or any greater or less Distance than a Mile:

For all Chalk, Marl, Lime, Limestone, (except such as shall be intended to be used for Manure,) and for all Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and Commodities whatsoever, the Sum of Sixpence per Ton for every Mile, and so in proportion for any greater or less Quantity than a Ton, or any greater or less Distance than a Mile:

For every empty or light Boat, Barge, or Vessel of any Sort or Description whatsoever, passing through any Lock on the said Canal, the Sum of One Shilling and Sixpence for every such Lock:

For every Passenger or other Person who shall be carried upon the said Canal in any Boat, Barge, or Vessel, not being a Person then employed [Local.]

in navigating the same, for every Mile which any such Passenger shall be carried upon the said Canal or any Part thereof, the Sum of Two-pence, and so in proportion for any greater or less Distance than a Mile:

For every separate Package, Parcel, or other Article, not exceeding Two hundred Weight each, and consigned to different or distinct Persons, the Sum of Three Halfpence for every Mile, and so in proportion for any less Distance than a Mile which any such Package, Parcel, or other Article may be carried.

Limitation of Tolls.

V. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall authorize the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation to take, demand, have, and receive the said Tolls herein-before granted upon any Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities conveyed upon any other Part of the said Canals, Cuts, Sluices, or Harbours by the said recited Act of the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign authorized to be cut, made, deepened, and kept navigable and passable, save and except upon that Part of the Main Line of the Canal from the River Arun to the said Harbour of Chichester, leading from Hunston Common aforesaid to the said Harbour of Chichester, and the Branch Canal from Hunston Common aforesaid, to or near the said Place called Southgate, at or near the said City, and upon the said Canal from the said Harbour of Langstone to the said Place called the Half-wayhouses, in the Parish of Portsea in the County of Southampton, nor upon any Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities carried or conveyed on those Parts of the said Canals, Cuts, Sluices, and Harbours so authorized to be made as aforesaid, except such as shall be carried and conveyed from the said Harbour to the said City of Chichester, or any Place or Places situate between the same, and there landed, or shall be shipped at the said City, or at any Place or Places situate between the said City and the Harbour of Chichester, and conveyed to the said Harbour of Chichester, and except such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and Commodities as shall be carried from the said Harbour of Langstone to the said Place called the Halfway-houses, in the said Parish of Portsea, and there landed, or shall be shipped at the said Half-way-houses, and carried direct to the said Harbour of Langstone, but that all Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities which shall be carried or conveyed from or out of or into the River Arun, or from or to any Place or Places situate beyond the Distance of One Mile to the Eastward from the Junction of the said Branch Canal with the Main Line of Canal at Hunston Common aforesaid, shall be liable and subject to the Tolls imposed and authorized to be taken, demanded, and received by the said recited Act of the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign, and no more: Provided always, that all Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities which shall be caried or conveyed into or out of the said Harbour of Chichester, having been shipped or laden, or intended to be unshipped or unladen, at or near the said City of Chichester, or any Place or Places situate between the same and the said Harbour of Chichester, or within the Distance of One Mile to the Eastward from the said Junction of the Branch Canal with the Main Line of Canal at Hunston Common aforesaid, shall be subject and liable to the increased Tolls, Rates, or Duties imposed and authorized by this Act to be taken, demanded, or received. notwithstanding such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities shall or may have passed upon any other Part of the Canals or Navigation belonging to the said Company.

VI. And be it further enacted, That in consideration of the Expence The Comwhich the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel pany of the Navigation will be at in providing sufficient Basins, Wharfs, and Quays Portsmouth for the Purposes herein-before mentioned, it shall and may be lawful for Navigation the said Company of Proprietors and they are hereby authorized to take, empowered demand, and receive for all Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other to take Commodities landed or discharged, and shipped at the said Place called Southgate, near the said City of Chichester, or any other Place between the said City and the Harbour of Chichester, a Wharfage of Four-pence per Ton, and on all Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and Commodities landed or discharged or shipped at the Basin or Basins, or the Borders thereof, at the Half-way-houses aforesaid, a Wharfage of Four-pence per Ton; and if any such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities shall remain on any Wharf or Quay belonging to the said Company for a longer Time than Ten Days, then the Owner or Owners of such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities shall pay to the said Company of Proprietors the further Sum of Three Halfpence per Ton for every Day the same shall remain after the Expiration of the said Period of Ten Days, and the said Company shall recover the Payment of such Wharfage in the same Manner and by the same Means as they are authorized to recover Wharfage under and by the said recited Act of the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign.

VII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this Saving the Act contained shall extend or be construed to extend to lessen or abate, or in any Manner to affect or prejudice, the Rights, Titles, or Privileges of the of Chichester Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Chichester, or of the and Ports-Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portsmouth, to such mouth. Rates, Cranage, Wharfage, petty Customs, and other Dues as they are respectively authorized to ask, demand, take, have, and receive; but that they shall and may have, take, receive, and enjoy the same Rates, Cranage, Wharfage, petty Customs, and other Dues as they the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Chichester, and the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portsmouth, are now respectively entitled to ask, demand, take, and receive, and to collect, sue for, levy, recover, and enforce the Payment of all such Rates, Cranage, Wharfage, petty Customs, and other Dues, by the same Means, in the same Manner, and according to the same Regulations as are mentioned and directed in and by the said recited Act passed in the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign, as fully and effectually to all Intents and Purposes as if this Act had not been made.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for Power for the the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Naviga- Company of tion, their Servants, Agents, and Workmen, to make, set out, and the Portsmaintain a Road, not exceeding Forty Feet in Width, from the Wharfs mouth and and Quays, Basin, and Establishment of the said Company, to be made Navigation to and kept at or near to Southgate aforesaid, and into the said City of make a Road Chichester, for the Conveyance of Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and from their Commodities to or from the said Wharfs, Quays, Basin, and Establish- Wharfs, &c. ment; such Road to be made through the Lands, Tenements, and gate to Premises in the Parish of Saint Peter the Great, or the Subdeanery, in or Chichester. near the said City of Chichester, specified and described in the Schedule to

this Act annexed; and the said Company of Proprietors shall have all the same Powers and Authorities to agree with any Person or Persons, Bodies Politic or Corporate, and others, for the Purchase or Use of any Lands or Grounds wanted for the Purpose of making and setting out such Road, or for taking or making use of the same, as are given to them by the said recited Act of the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign, for the obtaining Lands and Grounds necessary for carrying that Act into execution.

No Houses, &c. to be taken without Consent, except those specified in the Schedule.

IX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend to authorize and empower the said Company of Proprietors, or any other Person or Persons, in making and setting the said Road hereby authorized to be made, to take, use, injure, or damage any House or Building, or any Ground which, from the First Day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighteen, was the Site of any House or other Building, or any Park, Avenue, planted Walk, Lawn, or Pleasure Ground, or any Yard, Garden, or Orchard, without the Consent in Writing of the respective Owners and Occupiers thereof (other than and except such as are specified and described in the Schedule hereunto annexed).

Penalty on Persons using the Road except for the Carriage of Goods to and from the Wharfs, &c.

X. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the said Road so hereby authorized be made, set out, and maintained shall be made for the Conveyance from and to the said City of Chichester of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize landed or discharged or to be shipped at the said Wharfs, Quays, Basins, and Establishment of the said Company of Proprietors at or near Southgate aforesaid, and for no other Use or Purpose whatsoever; save and except that Doctor Thomas Sanden and Stephen Hack, and their respective Heirs, Tenants, Servants, and Assigns, shall for ever hereafter have free Access to and from their Land adjoining the said Road, over or through the said Road; and if any Person or Persons shall drive any Coach, Chariot, Cart, Wain, Waggon, or other Carriage on the said Road, the said Coach, Chariot, Cart, Wain, Waggon, or other Carriage not being loaded with or going to be loaded with any Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities landed or discharged, or to be shipped at the Wharfs, Quays, or Establishment of the said Company of Proprietors, or shall drive on the said Road any Horses, Bullocks, Sheep, Swine, or other Cattle, not having been landed, or not being intended for Shipment as aforesaid, or shall ride on or in any other way use the said Road so hereby authorized to be made, set out, and maintained, every Person so offending, except the said Thomas Sanden and Stephen Hack, and their respective Heirs, Tenants, Servants, and Assigns, shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds, to be recovered and applied in the same Manner and by the same Means as Penalties are by the said recited Act of the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign directed to be recovered and applied.

And be it enacted, That so much of the said recited Act of the Fifty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign as authorizes and empowers the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation to make and keep navigable and passable for Boats, Barges, and other Vessels another Canal from the said Harbour of Langstone, at or near to a certain Marsh belonging to James Knight, in the Parish of Wymering in the County of Southampton, to the Harbour of Portsmouth, at or near to a certain

Junction Canal, their Successors and Assigns, that the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation, their Successors and Assigns, from and after the said Canals or Cuts and Navigations being made or becoming navigable throughout as aforesaid, and during so long Time as the Covenant and Agreement, on the Part of the said Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal, shall, under the Provisions and Stipulations thereof, continue or be operative and in force, but not longer or otherwise, ask, demand, have, recover, and receive for all Goods, Wares, and Merchandize whatsoever that shall pass or be carried or conveyed from the said Port of Portsmouth into and throughout the said Wey and Arun Junction Canal, or from the said Wey and Arun Junction Canal into the said Port of Portsmouth, the Sum of Three-pence per Ton per Mile, and no more, instead and in lieu of the Tolls, Rates, and Duties particularly mentioned and granted by the said in part recited Act of Parliament of the Fifty-seventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, and so in proportion for any greater or less Quantity than a Ton; and further, that the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation shall not nor will at any Time or Times hereafter give, grant, or extend this Benefit, Advantage, Limitation, or Reduction of Tolls, Rates, or Duties, for the Tonnage of any Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities whatsoever which shall be carried or conveyed from and out of the River Arun Navigation or Port of Arundel into and through the said intended Canals and Navigation, or any Part thereof, or from and out of the said intended Canals and Navigation, into the River Arun Navigation or Port of Arundel, other than for such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities as shall be carried or conveyed throughout the said Wey and Arun Junction Canal and the River Wey Navigation into the River Thames or the River Rother Navigation, and vice versa; nor on any such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities as shall be carried or conveyed into the River Rother Navigation for the Purpose of claiming the Reduction of Tolls, and are not bond fide landed and delivered there: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall hinder or prevent the said Company of Proprietors of the said Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation from having, taking, and receiving its full and entire Tolls, agreeably to the Provisions of the said in part recited Act of Parliament passed in the Fifty-seventh Year of the Reign aforesaid, for all Goods, Wares, and Merchandize whatsoever which shall pass or be carried or conveyed on or through the said intended Canals and Navigations, or any Part thereof, during such Time as this Nation or Kingdom shall be in a State of War with the several Powers or Kingdoms of Europe or the United States of America, or any or either of them, or any other State or Nation trading immediately with the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, during such Time as the said Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal shall demand or receive a higher Toll than Four Shillings and Sixpence per Ton, or for all Goods, Wares, and Merchandize whatsoever which shall, either in Time of War or Peace as aforesaid, be laden at any intermediate Place between the Port of Portsmouth and the River Thames, and which shall be carried or conveyed from such intermediate Place into and through the said intended Canals and Navigations or any Part thereof, or which shall be carried and conveyed through the said intended Canals and Navigations or any Part thereof, and from thence to any intermediate Place situate between the said River Thames and the Port of Portsmouth, and be unladen and unshipped at the same: Provided always, that not-[Local.] withstanding 31 M

withstanding the Covenants and Agreements so hereby mutually made as aforesaid, all and every the Provisions and Remedies for collecting, levying, and enforcing the Payments of the Tolls, Rates, and Duties by the said several Acts of Parliament imposed, in the said several Acts expressed and contained, shall remain, continue, and be in full force and effect, and shall not by these Presents be anywise prejudiced or affected, except as to the Reduction and Limitation of Tolls, in manner above specified: And for the better enabling the said respective Companies of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal and of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation to ascertain, recover, and collect the Tolls, Rates, and Duties for the Goods, Wares, and Merchandize that shall pass or be carried or conveyed from the River Thames into the Port of Portsmouth, or from and out of the Port of *Portsmouth* into the River Thames, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal, their Successors and Assigns, to have, keep, or employ such Person or Persons from Time to Time as they, or any Three or more of their Committee of Management for the Time being, may think proper, upon the said Canals and Navigation to be made in pursuance of the said Act passed in the Fifty-seventh Year of the Reign aforesaid, for the Purpose of preventing any Evasion of the Payment of the Tolls, Rates, and Duties to which such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize will be liable or subject to, under a Pretence that such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize was or were liable or subject to the Payment of the reduced Tolls, Rates, and Duties only, as in the Cases before mentioned, or under any other Pretence whatsoever; and that it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Company of Proprietors of the said Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation, their Successors and Assigns, to have, keep, or employ such Person or Persons from Time to Time as they or any Three or more of their Committee of Management for the Time being shall think proper, upon the said Wey and Arun' Junction Canal, for the Purpose of preventing any like Evasion of the Payment of their Tolls, Rates, and Duties as aforesaid, so as such Person or Persons to be so respectively kept or employed on the said respective Canals or Navigations in manner aforesaid do not in any Manner whatever impede, hinder, or obstruct the Navigation of the Canals or Navigation whereon they shall be so respectively kept or employed: In witness whereof, to one Part of this present Indenture remaining with the Company of Proprietors of the said Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation the said Company of Proprietors of the said Wey and Arun Junction Canal, the Common Seal of the said Company of Proprietors of the said Wey and Arun Junction Canal have caused to be set, and to the other Part thereof remaining with the said Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal the said Company of Proprietors of the said Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation have caused to be set the Common Seal of the said Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel Navigation, the Day and Year first above written: And whereas it is expedient the said Agreement should be confirmed; be it therefore enacted, That the said Agreement shall be and the same and every Part thereof is hereby confirmed, ratified, and made effectual and binding on the respective Parties thereto, and shall be good, valid, and effectual, any Law, Usage, or Statute to the contrary notwithstanding; and it shall and may be lawful for the said respective Companies, and they are hereby authorized and empowered; to ask, demand, receive, and recover the several Rates, Tolls, and Duties

Duties in the said Agreement mentioned, in the same Manner, and by the same Means, and by such and the same Powers and Authorities, as they are respectively entitled and empowered by the said recited Acts of the Fifty-seventh and Fifty-third Years of His Majesty's Reign to ask, demand, receive, and recover the several Rates, Tolls, and Duties by the said recited Acts respectively granted: Provided always, that the said Rates, Tolls, and Duties in the said Agreement mentioned shall and are hereby declared to be instead and in lieu of the several Rates, Tolls, and Duties by the said recited Act respectively granted.

Part thereof, shall give to such Person so appointed, or to any Collector or other Officer or Person in the Employ of either of the said Companies of Proprietors, a false Account of the Place from whence such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, and Commodities were shipped, or have been brought from or of the Destination of, or of the Place to which the same are to be carried for the Purpose of being charged with the lesser Rates, Tolls, and Duties by the said Agreement to be taken, and shall in consequence of such false Account be only charged with such lesser Tolls, Rates, and Duties when in fact liable to pay more, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds, over and above all the Rates, Tolls, or Duties which shall be payable for such Goods, Wares, Merchandize, or Commodities, such Penalty to be recovered in the Manner in which Penalties are directed by either of the said recited Acts to be recovered, and to be applied to the Use of the Company of Proprietors on whose Navigation such Offence shall be committed.

XXVIII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That nothing in the said Agreement Agreement or this Act contained shall be deemed, held, or construed, to mot to affect Mortgages. alter, vary, or in any way affect any Mortgages, Assignments, or Transfers of the Tolls, Rates, and Duties of the said respective Navigations entered into and now existing, but that all such Mortgages, Assignments, and Transfers shall be good, valid, and effectual, as if the said Agreement and this Act had not been made,

XXIX.
