An Act for incorporating the Town of Portsea Gaslight Company. [28th May 1821.]

THEREAS in and by an Act, passed in the Thirty-second Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act for the better paving, cleansing, widening, and regulating 32G.3.c.103 the Streets, Courts, Roads, Lanes, Ways, Rows, Alleys, and public Passages and Places, within the Town of Portsea in the County of Southampton, and for removing and preventing Nuisances, Annoyances, and Obstructions within the said Town, the Trustees thereby appointed, or any Seven or more of them, were empowered from Time to Time and at all Times when and as often as they or any Seven or more of them should think proper, to order and direct all or any of the Pavements in the said Streets, Courts, Roads, Lanes, Rows, Ways, Alleys, and public Passages then in being, or thereafter to be made, in the said Town, or any Part or Parts thereof, as well those Parts used by Carriages as those used by Foot Passengers, to be taken up, and the said Streets, Courts, Lanes, Rows, Ways, Alleys, and public Passages to be paved, re-laid, repaired, raised, lowered, or altered, in such Manner as the said Trustees or any Seven or more of them should think proper, and the Person or Persons authorized or directed by them to do the same accordingly, in such Manner and upon such Plan as is directed by the said Act; and the said Trustees, or any Seven or more of them, were by the said Act further empowered, from Time to Time, at any Public Meeting to be held in pursuance of the said Act, to contract with any Person or Persons for paving, re-laying, repairing, raising, lower-[Local.] 25 D

ing, or altering all or any of such Streets, Courts, Lanes, Rows, Ways, Alleys, and public Passages, or any Parts or Part thereof, subject to such Regulations as in the said Act are expressed and contained: And whereas the Inhabitants of the Island of Portsea are desirous of having the lighting by Gas introduced therein for lighting the Streets and public Passages thereof, and for the Use of such Persons as may wish to light their Shops, Warehouses, and Houses therewith: And whereas the lighting the Island of Portsea with Gas will very materially add to the Comfort and Accommodation of the Inhabitants thereof, and be of public Utility, and many Persons are willing to contribute Sums of Money in aid of and for the Completion of the said Undertaking and carrying on the same: But inasmuch as such Undertaking cannot be effectually carried into execution, or a competent Supply of Gas afforded to the said Island, without the Aid and Authority of Parliament, may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That John Barlow and George Barlow, and all and every such other Person or Persons as shall from Time to Time become Proprietors of Shares in the Undertaking hereby established as herein-after is mentioned, and their respective Successors, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, shall be and they are hereby united into a Company, and declared to be One Body Politic and Corporate, by the Name of the "Portsea Island Gaslight Company," and by that Name shall have perpetual Succession and a Common Seal, and by that Name shall and may sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, at Law or in Equity, and shall and may prefer and prosecute any Bill or Bills of Indictment against any Person or Persons who shall commit any Felony Misdemeanor, or other Offence indictable by the Laws of this Realm, and shall by that Name be authorized and empowered to purchase Lands and Hereditaments for the Purposes of the said Gasworks, not exceeding Three Acres, without being subject to the Penalties of the Statutes of Mortmain; and that the said Company shall be established for the Purpose of making or producing Gas, Coke, Oil, Tar, Pitch, Asphaltum, Ammoniacal Liquor, and Essential Oil, from Coal or other Materials, and of lighting the Island of Portsea with Gas or inflammable Air, and of selling and disposing of the Coke and other Products of the Manufactory of the said Company, in such Manner as they shall from Time to Time

Power to Company to contract for the Lighting the Streets and Houses. think fit.

II. And be it further enacted, That the said Company shall have full Power to contract with any Commissioners, Trustees, Bodies Politic, Corporate, Collegiate, or Corporations Aggregate or Sole, or Person or Persons whomsoever, who shall or may be desirous or willing to contract or agree with the said Company for the lighting of the said Island, or any Part or Parts thereof, or any public or private Ways or Roads, Streets, Lanes, Buildings, Houses, Shops, Manufactories, Warehouses, or Premises, within the said Island, and to sell or dispose of the Coke, and other Products of the Manufactory of the said Company, in such Way and Manner as the said Company or their Committee of Management may from Time to Time think proper.

" III. And be it further enacted, That for the Purposes of this Act it Power to shall be lawful to and for the said Company, or their Committee of Management, to be chosen as herein-after is mentioned, and they are hereby empowered, to treat, contract, and agree for the absolute Purchase of any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments within the said Island, and the Freehold and Inheritance thereof, or any Estate or Interest therein, with any Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, or any Tenants for Life or in Fee Tail, General or Special, or for any Term or Terms of Years absolute, or determinable on any Life or Lives, or with any Executors, Administrators, Husbands, Guardians, Committees for Lunatics and Idiots, Feoffees in Trust, or other Trustees whomsoever, not only for and on behalf of themselves, their Heirs and Successors, but also for and on behalf of their Cestuique Trusts respectively, whether Infants or Issue unborn, Lunatics, Idiots, Femes Covert, or other Persons under any Disability of acting for himself, herself, or themselves, and also with all Femes Covert who are or shall be seised, possessed of, or interested in their own Right or with any Persons whomsoever who shall be willing to sell the same, or his, her, or their Right and Interest in the same, for the Uses and Purposes of this Act, provided that the Quantity of Land to be purchased as aforesaid shall not exceed Three Acres; and upon Payment of the Purchase Money for the same respectively to the Person or Persons entitled thereto, or into the Bank of England in manner directed by this Act, (as the Case may be,) the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments respectively shall absolutely vest in the said Portsea Island Gaslight Company, and may be taken and used by them for the Purposes of this Act.

Guardians, Committees for Lunatics and Idiots, and other Trustees whomsoever, not only for and on behalf of themselves, their Heirs and Successors, but also for and on behalf of their Cestuique Trusts, whether Infants or Issue unborn, Lunatics, Idiots, or Femes Covert, or other Person or Persons under any Disability of acting for himself, herself, or themselves, and also to and for all Femes Covert who are or shall be seised, possessed of, or interested in their own Right, and for all and every Person and Persons whomsoever who are or shall be seised, possessed of, or interested in any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, or any Part thereof, which shall be thought necessary by the said Company to be purchased for the Uses and Purposes of this Act, to treat, contract, and agree with the said Company, or their Committee of Management, for the Sale thereof or of any Part thereof, and to sell and convey all or any Part thereof, and all Estate, Right, Title, and Interest whatsoever of, in, and to the same, to the said Company for the Purposes of this Act; and all Contracts, Bargains, Sales, and Conveyances which shall be so made by virtue and in pursuance of this Act shall, without Fine or Recovery, or other Conveyances or Assurances in the Law whatsoever, and without Enrolment, be good, valid, and effectual to all Intents and Purposes, not only to convey the Estate and Interest of the Person and Persons conveying, but also to convey all Right, Estate, Interest, Use, Property, Possibility, Claim, and Demand whatsoever of their said several Cestuique Trusts

Trusts, and of all Persons whomsoever claiming or to claim by, from, or under him, her, or them, or claiming or to claim in remainder or reversion expectant on any such particular Estate, or by way of Executory Devise or springing Use, and the same shall be deemed and considered to bar all Dower and Dowers of any such Person or Persons, and all Estates Tail and other Estates, in possession, reversion, remainder, or expectancy, and the Issue and Issues of any Person or Persons claiming under them, as effectually as Fines or Common Recoveries would do if levied or suffered by the proper Parties in due Form of Law, any Law, Statute, or Usage, or any other Matter or Thing whatsoever, to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding; and all Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, and all Tenants for Life or in Fee Tail, General or Special, or for any Term or Terms of Years absolute, or determinable on any Life or Lives, and Feoffees in Trust, Executors, Administrators, Husbands, Guardians, Committees, Trustees, and all and every other Person and Persons, is, are, and shall be indemnified for what he, she, or they shall do by virtue and in pursuance of this Act.

Directing Application of Purchase Money when amounting to 200% and upwards.

V. And be it further enacted, That if any Money shall be contracted to be paid for any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments purchased, taken, or used by virtue of this Act for the Purposes thereof, which shall belong to any Body Politic, Corporate, Collegiate, or Ecclesiastic, Tenant for Life or in Tail or for Years, Trustee, Feme Covert, Infant, Lunatic, or Person or Persons under any Disability or Incapacity as aforesaid, such Money shall, in case the same shall amount to or exceed the Sum of Two hundred Pounds, with all convenient Speed be paid into the Bank of England, in the Name and with the Privity of the Accountant General of the High Court of Chancery, to be placed to his Account ex parte "The Portsea Island Gaslight Company;" to the Intent that such Money shall be applied, under the Direction and with the Approbation of the said Court, to be signified by an Order made upon a Petition to be preferred in a summary Way by the Person or Persons who would have been entitled to the Rents and Profits of the said Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, in the Purchase of Land Tax, or towards the Discharge of any Debt or Debts, or such other Incumbrances, or Part thereof, as the said Court shall authorize to be paid, affecting the same Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, or affecting other Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments standing and being settled therewith to the same or the like Uses, Intents, and Purposes; or where such Money shall not be so applied then the same shall be laid out and invested, under and with the like Direction and Approbation of the said Court, in the Purchase of other Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, which shall be conveyed and settled to, for, and upon such and the like Uses, Trusts, Intents, and Purposes, and in the same Manner, as the Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments which shall be purchased, taken, or used for the Purposes of this Act stood and were settled and limited, or such of them as at the Time of making such Conveyance and Settlement shall be existing undetermined and capable of taking Effect; and in the meantime, and until such Purchase shall be made, the said Money shall, by Order of the said Court of Chancery, upon Application made thereto as aforesaid, be invested by the said Accountant General, in his Name, in the Purchase of Three Pounds per Centum Consolidated or Three Pounds per Centum Reduced Bank Annuities; and in the meantime, and until

until the said Bank Annuities shall be ordered by the said Court to be sold for the Purposes aforesaid, the Dividends and annual Produce of the Consolidated or Reduced Bank Annuities shall from Time to Time be paid, by Order of the said Court, to the Person or Persons who would for the Time being have been entitled to the Rents and Profits of the said Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, so hereby directed to be purchased, in case such Purchase or Settlement thereof were then actually made.

Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if any Money so Application to be paid for any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, to be purchased, taken, or used for the Purposes aforesaid, and belonging to any Body Politic, Corporate, Collegiate, or Ecclesiastic, Tenant for Life, or in Tail, or and exceedfor Years, Trustee, Feme Covert, Infant, Lunatic, or any Person or Per- ing 201. sons under Disability or Incapacity as aforesaid, shall be less than the Sum of Two hundred Pounds, and shall exceed the Sum of Twenty Pounds, then and in all such Cases the same shall, at the Option of the Person or Persons for the Time being entitled to the Rents and Profits of the Hereditaments so purchased, taken, or used, or of his, her, or their Guardian or Guardians, Committee or Committees, in Cases of Infancy, Idiotcy, or Lunacy, to be signified in Writing under their respective Hands, be paid into the Bank in the Name and with the Privity of the said Accountant General of the High Court of Chancery, and be placed to his Account as aforesaid, in order to be applied in manner herein-before directed, or otherwise the same shall be paid, at the like Option, to Two Trustees, to be named by the Person or Persons making such Option, and approved of by Three or more of the Committee of Management of the said Company (such Nomination and Approbation to be signified by Writing under the Hands of the nominating and approving Parties), in order that such Principal Money, and the Dividends to arise thereon, or the Interest thereof, may be applied in manner herein-before directed, so far as the Case shall be applicable, without obtaining or being required to obtain the Direction or Approbation of the said High Court of Chancery.

Expenses of Purchase Money to be allowed by Court.

IX. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That where by reason of any Disability or Incapacity of the Person or Persons, or Corporation, entitled to any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments to be purchased under the Authority of this Act, the Purchase Money for the same shall be required to be paid into the Bank of England, and to be applied in the Purchase of other Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, to be settled to the like Uses in pursuance of this Act, it shall be lawful for the said Court of Chancery to order the Expenses of all Purchases from Time to Time to be made in pursuance of this Act, or so much of the Expenses as the said Court shall deem reasonable, to be paid by the said Company, who shall from Time to Time pay such Sums of Money for such Purposes as the said Court shall direct.

Upon Payment of the Purchase Money, Premises to be vested in the Company.

- X. And be it further enacted, That upon Payment of the Money to be contracted or agreed to be paid for the Purchase of any such Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, or any Estate, Right, or Interest therein, to the Party or Parties, or Person or Persons respectively entitled to such Monies, or their Agents, or upon Payment thereof into the Bank of England in manner herein directed (as the Case may be), all the Estate, Right, Title, Interest, Use, Trust, Property, Claim, and Demand, in Law or in Equity, of the Party or Parties, and Person or Persons respectively to whom or for whose Use or Benefit the same shall be paid, into or out of such Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, shall vest in the said Company and their Successors for ever, for the Purposes of this Act.

XII. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Re-sale of said Company to sell and dispose of, and by Indenture or Indentures Land not under their Common Seal to grant and convey, all or any Part or Parts of wanted. the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments which may have been so purchased or acquired, and which shall not be wanted for the Purposes of the said Company; and upon Payment of the Purchase Money for the same, it shall be lawful for the Treasurer for the Time being to the said Company to sign and give a Receipt or Receipts for the Money for which the same shall be sold, which Receipt or Receipts shall be a sufficient Discharge or Discharges to any Person or Persons for the Money which shall be therein and thereby expressed or acknowledged to be received; and such Person or Persons having bona fide paid the same, shall not afterwards be answerable or accountable for any Loss, Mis-application, or Non-application of such Purchase Money, or any Part thereof.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Com- Power to pany hereby established, and their Successors, and they are hereby fully break up the authorized and empowered, by their Servants, Agents, Workmen, and Pavements and lay Pipes, others, from Time to Time, with the Consent of the Trustees under the &c. said recited Act, or any Seven or more of them, in respect to the Town of Portsea, and with the Consent of the Commissioners for the better paving the Town of Portsmouth, in respect of the Town of Portsmouth, to make and erect such Retorts, Gasometers, Receivers, and other Buildings, Cisterns, Engines, Machines, and other Apparatus, Cuts, Drains, Sewers, Watercourses, Reservoirs, and other Works and Devices, on the Lands taken or to be purchased or acquired by them by virtue of the Powers herein-before contained, and (with the Permission or Consent of the Owners and Occupiers, but not otherwise) to erect and fix Pipes against any Walls, or in Posts or Pillars in the Streets, of such Construction, and in such Manner, as the said Trustees and Commissioners respectively, or any Seven or more of them, shall think necessary or proper for carrying the Purposes of this and the said recited Act into execution; and, with the like Consent from Time to Time of the said Trustees and Commissioners respectively, to break up the Soil and Pavements of any of the Streets, Highways, Roads, Ways, Lanes, and Passages within the said Towns, and, with the Consent of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of *Portsmouth*, to dig and sink Trenches and Drains, and lay Mains or Pipes, and put Stopcocks, Syphons, Plugs, or Branches from such Pipes, in, under, across, and along the said Streets, Highways, Roads, Ways, Lanes, and Passages; and from Time to Time, with such Consent respectively as aforesaid, to alter the Position of, and to repair, relay, and maintain such Pipes, Stopcocks, Syphons, and Plugs, or Branches, and also to carry, fit up, and furnish any Pipe or Pipes, Cocks or Branches, or other necessary Apparatus, from any Main or Pipe laid in any Street, Road or Highway, Lane or Passage, by virtue of this Act, into or through any Dwelling House or Houses, Manufactories, public or private Buildings, for the Purpose of lighting any public or private Lamp from any of such Mains or Pipes; and to erect and set up any Machine

or other Apparatus necessary or requisite for securing to any Dwelling House or Houses, Manufactories, public or private Buildings, a proper and competent Supply of Gas, or for measuring and ascertaining the Extent of such Supply; and also to alter or amend any bad or imperfect Work which shall have been so placed, which shall be injured or damaged; and to do all such Acts, Matters, and Things as the said Trustees and Commissioners respectively shall from Time to Time think necessary and convenient for completing, amending, repairing, improving, supplying, and using the same; provided a proper Compensation be made for any Damage which may be done thereby: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall authorize or empower the said Company, or any of their Servants, Agents, Workmen, or others, to enter into any private Lands, Grounds, or Premises, without the Consent in Writing of the Owners and Occupiers thereof respectively for the Time being first had and obtained.

Company not to make any Drains, &c. without Consent of the Occupiers, &c.

XIV. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to authorize or empower the said Company, or their Successors, to sink or make any such Cuts, Drains, Sewers, Watercourses, and Reservoirs, in any Situation or Direction where the same can, shall, or may interfere with any present or future public or private Drain, Sewer, or Well, nor to carry or lay any Pipes, Cocks, or Branches from any Main or Pipe into any Dwelling Houses, Manufactories, public or private Buildings as aforesaid, without the Consent in Writing of the Occupiers for the Time being of every such Dwelling Houses, Manufactories, public or private Buildings as aforesaid; and provided also, that no such Consent of the Occupier or Occupiers shall be considered to be binding and conclusive on the Owner or Owners of the said Property for the Time being for any longer Period than for the Estate and Interest of such Occupier or Occupiers so giving Permission as aforesaid; provided also, that all public Streets, Highways, Roads, Lanes, and Passages shall only be broken up with the Consent of the Commissioners, Trustees, or other Persons having the Control of the said Streets, Highways, Roads, Ways, Lanes, and Passages, and that all private Roads or Ways shall only be broken up with the Consent of the Occupier or Occupiers, and Owner or Owners of the Soil thereof respectively.

To be subject Parliament relating to Roads.

XV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this to all Acts of Act contained shall extend or be construed to extend to authorize or empower the said Company, or any other Person or Persons whomsoever, to break, take up, or disturb the Soil or Pavement in or of any Street, Road, Highway, Lane, or Passage, within the Limits of this Act, without the Consent in Writing of the Commissioners, Trustees, or other Persons in whom the Superintendence, Property, or Control of any such Street, Road, Highway, Lane, or Passage is by Authority of Parliament, or otherwise how soever, vested, under the Hand or Hands of their proper Officer. or Officers; and that all and every the Works, Matters, and Things at any. Time hereafter to be done or performed by the said Company, or their Servants, Workmen, or others, in, upon, through, or over any such. Street, Road, Highway, Lane, or Passage, shall be subject to the Provisions, Regulations, Penalties, and Notices, and all and every the Powers, Authorities, Provisions, Rules, Directions, Forfeitures, Claims, Matters,

and Things contained in any Act or Acts of Parliament for the making, amending, repairing, or improving any such Street, Road, Highway, Lane, or Passage, or otherwise relating thereto, so far as the same, or any of them, are applicable to Gas Light Companies, as fully and effectually as if the same had been amply re-enacted herein.

XVI. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Company, at any Time after the Tide in the Harbour of Portsmouth shall have ebbed One Half Hour, to drain or convey, or cause to be drained or conveyed, into the said Harbour, or into the Sea, any Wash-conducted ings or other waste Liquids, Substances, or Things whatsoever, which into the shall arise or be produced in the Prosecution of the Works of the said Company: Provided nevertheless, that if the said Company shall drain or convey, or cause to be drained or conveyed, any such Washings or other Liquids, Substances, or Things into the said Harbour before the Tide shall have so ebbed Half an Hour, such Company shall forfeit and pay for each and every Offence the Sum of Two hundred Pounds; and such Penalty shall and may be sued for, recovered, levied, and applied in such and the same Manner as any other Penalty or Forfeiture is by this Act directed to be sued for, recovered, levied, and applied.

Directing at what Time Liquids shall be drained or Harbour of Portsmouth.

LIX. And be it further enacted, That at the General Assemblies or Accounts to Meetings in the Months of January and July, or some Adjournment be settled thereof, the Accounts of the said Company shall be from Time to Time settled; and that such General Assembly or half-yearly Meeting, or any Assembly or Meeting especially called for the Purpose, shall have full Power from Time to Time to call for and examine the Accounts of the said Company; and that at every Half-yearly General Assembly or Meet- Meetings to ing, or some Adjournment thereof, a Dividend or Dividends shall be declare Divimade out of the Interests, Profits, or Advantages of the said Undertaking, unless such Meeting shall declare otherwise; and such Dividend shall be at and after the Rate of so much per Centum for every Share, upon all and every the Sum and Sums of Money paid to the said Company by the said Subscribers, their Successors, Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, as such Meeting or Meetings shall think fit to appoint and determine; provided that no Dividend shall be made whereby the Capital of the said Company shall in any Degree be reduced or impaired, nor within Six Calendar Months after the passing of this Act; nor shall any Dividend be paid in respect of any Share or Shares after a Day appointed for Payment of any Call for Money in respect thereof, until such Call shall have been paid.

LX. And be it further enacted, That a Special Meeting may be called at any Time by the Committee of Management; and also, that Five or more Members of the said Company, holding in the aggregate One hundred Shares or upwards in the said Undertaking, may at any Time, by Writing under their Hands, left at the Office of the said Company, or given to any Member of the said Committee of Management, or left at his last or usual Place of Abode, require the Committee of Management to call a Special General Meeting, so as such Requisition fully express the General Objects for which such Special General Meeting is required to be called; and in case of Neglect or Refusal of the said Committee to call such Meeting for the Space of Five Days after such Notice given as aforesaid, the same may be called by the said Members, by giving Five Days Notice thereof in some One or more Newspaper or Newspapers printed or circulated in the said County of Southampton.

LXI. And be it further enacted, That if any Person or Persons shall be summoned as a Witness or Witnesses to give Evidence before any Justice or Justices of the Peace touching any Matter contained in any Infor- Witnesses. Local. mation

For compelling the Attendance of mation or Complaint for any Offence against this Act, either on behalf of the Prosecutor, or on behalf of the Person or Persons accused, or touching any Matter to be inquired into, or to be determined by virtue of this Act, and shall refuse or neglect to appear from Time to Time at the Time and Place to be for that Purpose appointed, without a reasonable Excuse for his, her, or their Refusal or Neglect of appearing, or appearing shall refuse to be examined upon Oath, or in case of a Quaker or Quakers on solemn Affirmation (which Oath or Affirmation such Justice or Justices is and are hereby authorized and required to administer), or to give Evidence before such Justice or Justices of the Peace, then and in every such Case every such Person shall forfeit and pay for every such Offence any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds, provided a reasonable Sum shall have been paid or tendered to such Person for his or her Attendance as a Witness.

LXII. And be it further enacted, That no Person or Persons, Body or Bodies Politic or Corporate, shall be subject or liable to the Payment of any of the Penalties or Forfeitures inflicted by virtue of this Act, for any Offence or Offences against this Act, unless Information shall be given, or the Action shall be commenced, within Six Calendar Months next after such Offence committed.

Recovery and Application of Penalties.

LXIII. And be it further enacted, That all Penalties and Forfeitures for all and every the Offences in this Act mentioned, in relation to which the Manner of convicting the Offenders is not particularly mentioned or directed, shall be adjudged by and recovered before any Justice of the Peace for the County or Place where the Offence shall have been committed, in a summary Way, and who is hereby authorized and empowered to convict the Offender or Offenders upon Information by the Oath of any Person or Persons, or on the Confession of the Party offending (which Oath such Justice is hereby authorized to administer); and in default of Payment of such Penalties or Forfeitures, the same shall be levied by Distress and Sale of the Offender's Goods and Chattels by Warrant under the Hand and Seal of such Justice; and One Moiety of the Penalties and Forfeitures, when recovered, after rendering the Overplus (if any), on Demand, to the Party or Parties whose Goods and Chattels shall be so distrained, the reasonable Charge for such Distress and Sale being first deducted, shall, where not otherwise by this Act directed, be paid to the Informer, and the other Moiety thereof shall be paid to the Overseers of the Poor of the Parish wherein such Offence shall be committed, to be by them applied towards the Relief of the Poor of such Parish; and in case sufficient Distress cannot be found, and such Penalties, Forfeitures, and Fines shall not be forthwith paid upon Conviction, then it shall be lawful for such Justice or Justices to order the Offender or Offenders so convicted to be detained and kept in safe Custody until Return can conveniently be made to such Warrant of Distress, unless the Offender or Offenders shall give sufficient Security, to the Satisfaction of such Justice or Justices, for his or their Appearance before any Justice or Justices on such Day or Days as shall be appointed for the Return of such Warrant of Distress, such Day or Days not being more than Fourteen Days from the Time of taking any such Security, and which Security the said Justice or Justices is and are hereby empowered to take by way of Recognizance or otherwise; but if upon the Return of such Warrant it shall appear that no sufficient Distress can be had thereupon, then and in such Case it shall be

be lawful for such Justice, and he is hereby authorized and required, by Warrant under his Hand and Seal, to commit such Offender or Offenders to the Common Gaol of the Borough of Portsmouth or House of Correction for the County of Southampton (as the Case may be) for any Time not exceeding Six Calendar Months.

Provided always, and be it further enacted, That any Body or Appeal to be Bodies Corporate or Collegiate, or any Person or Persons whomsoever, made to the thinking himself, herself, or themselves aggrieved by any Rule, Order, or Sessions. Byelaw to be made by virtue of this Act, or any Alteration thereof, or by the Order or Determination of any Justice or Justices of the Peace in pursuance of this Act, may appeal to the Justices of the Peace at their next General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden for the Borough of Portsmouth or County of Southampton (as the Case may be), the Person or Persons appealing having first given at least Ten clear Days Notice of such Appeal, and the Nature and Matter thereof, to the Person or Persons appealed against, and forthwith after such Notice entering into a Recognizance before some Justice of the Peace for the said Borough or County (as the Case may be), with Two sufficient Sureties, conditioned to try such Appeal, and to abide the Order and Award of the said Court thereon; and the said Justices, upon due Proof of such Notice and Recognizance having been given and entered into, shall in a summary Way hear and determine such Complaint at such General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace, or if they think proper may adjourn the Hearing thereof to the next General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for the said Borough or County (as the Case may be), and if they see Cause may mitigate any Forfeiture or Fine, and may order any Money to be returned which shall have been levied in pursuance of such Order or Determination, and shall and may also award such further Satisfaction to be made to the Party injured, or such Costs to either of the Parties, as they shall adjudge reasonable and proper; and all such Determinations of the said Justices at such General or Quarter Sessions shall be binding, final, and conclusive upon all Parties, to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever.

LXVI. And be it further enacted, That in all Cases wherein it may be requisite or necessary for any Person or Persons, Party or Parties, to serve

any Notice or Notices, Demand or Demands, upon the said Company, or any Summons, Writ or Writs, or other legal Proceedings, the Service thereof upon any Member of the said Committee of Management, or left at his last or usual Place of Abode, or upon the Clerk of the said Company, or at the Office of such Clerk, or left at his last or usual Place of Abode, or at the Office of the said Company, or in case the same respectively shall not be found or known, then Service upon any Agent or other Officer employed by the said Company, or left at his last or usual Place of Abode, or at the Manufactory of the said Company, shall be deemed sufficient Service of the same respectively on the said Company.

Nothing in this Act to prevent the Company from being indicted for a Nuisance.

LXVII. And be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend or be construed to extend to prevent the said Trustees, Commissioners, or any Person or Persons, from proceeding by Indictment or otherwise against the said Company, or against any of their Officers, Servants, or Workmen, in respect of any Works of the said Company, or the Method which shall be employed by them for furnishing such Light as aforesaid, as a Nuisance, or from bringing any Action against the said Company, or any of their Officers, Servants, or Workmen, for any Injury sustained by reason of any such Works, or Method of Lighting, whether such Injury shall proceed from the Nature of such Method of Lighting, or the Carelessness or the Want of Skill of the Persons employed therein, or otherwise howsoever, or from any other Cause or in any other Manner whatsoever.

Justices of the Peace to act within their own

LXVIII. And be it further enacted, That all Powers and Authorities by this Act given to and vested in any Justice or Justices of the Peace shall be exercised and executed by such Justice or Justices within the Jurisdictions. Limits of their respective Jurisdictions only, and not elsewhere.

Expenses of Act how to be paid.

LXIX. And be it further enacted, That all the Costs, Charges, and Expenses attending the applying for, obtaining, and passing of this Act shall be paid and discharged out of the Monies to be subscribed by virtue of this Act.

General Saving of Rights.

LXX. Saving always to the King's most Excellent Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, all Rights, Privileges, and Franchises, in such and the same Manner as if this Act had not been made: Saving always to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portsmouth, and their Successors, and to the Trustees acting under the said recited Act, and to the Commissioners for paving the Town of Portsmouth, their respective Rights, Privileges, and Franchises, in such and the same Manner as if this Act had not been made.

Public Act.

LXXI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
