An Act to alter and amend several Acts for erecting a Bridge over the River Thames, from the City of London to the opposite Bank in the County of Surrey.

[8th July 1820.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Fifty-first of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled $\bar{A}n$ 51G.3.c.166. Act for erecting a Bridge over the River Thames, from or near the Three Cranes, in the Parishes of Saint James, Garlick Hithe, and Saint Martin, Vintry, in the City of London, to the opposite Bank of the said River, in the Parish of Saint Saviour, in the County of Surrey, and for making proper Streets and Avenues to communicate therewith: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fiftythird Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, intituled An Act to 53 G.3. c. 87. amend an Act passed in the Fifty-first Year of His present Majesty, for erecting a Bridge over the River Thames, from the City of London to the opposite Bank in the County of Surrey: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fifty-sixth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, intituled An Act to amend Two Acts of His present Majesty, for 56 G.3. c. 11. erecting a Bridge over the River Thames, from the City of London to the opposite Bank in the County of Surrey: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fifty-eighth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, intituled An Act for enabling the Southwark Bridge Company to raise 58G.3.c.68. a further Sum of Money, and to amend the Acts for building the said Bridge: And whereas the said Company have proceeded in the Exe-[Local.]

cution of the Works authorized by the said recited Acts, and have completed the said Bridge, and have also completed a Road or Street leading from the South Side of the said Bridge to Union Street in Southwark aforesaid, being Part of the Road or Street by the said first recited Act authorized to be made: And whereas the said Company, in proceeding to put the said recited Acts into Execution, find that it will be expedient that the remaining Part of the said Road or Street which the said Company are authorized to make by the said first recited Act, passing from the South Side of the said Bridge, at or near a certain Place or Alley called Horse Shoe Alley to Blackman Street, both in Southwark aforesaid, should be varied and altered: And whereas for the more speedy and effectual Completion of such Road or Street, and for defraying the Expences in and about the said Bridge and Works yet remaining to be discharged, it will be expedient that the said Company should be authorized to raise a further Sum of Money, and that the said recited Acts should be amended; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Company of Proprietors, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to raise a further Sum of Money, not exceeding One hundred thousand Pounds, over and above the Sums authorized to be raised by the said Acts.

Power to raise an additional Sum of Money.

General Power to raise Money. II. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Company to raise all or any Part of the Monies authorized to be raised by this Act, by all or any or either of the Ways or Means by which the said Company are authorized to raise any Money, by virtue of the said recited Acts or either of them, or by Tontine.

Money raised under the Act to have a Priority.

III. And be it further enacted, That all Mortgages, Annuities, Bonds, Notes, or other Securities, to be given for securing the said Sum of One hundred thousand Pounds, or any Part or Parts thereof, shall be registered with the Clerk of the said Company; and the same, and the Principal and Interest, Annuity or Annuities, thereby secured, shall have Priority over and precede all Dividends and Division of Profit or Interest, to or amongst the Proprietors of Shares in the said Bridge and Undertaking; any thing contained in the said recited Acts of the Fifty-first, the Fifty-third, the Fifty-sixth, and the Fifty-eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty, or either of them, to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding: Provided always, that the Holders of such Mortgages, Bonds, Annuities, Notes, or other Securities, shall stand upon the same Footing, the one with the other, in respect of their Right to the Payment of the Principal and Interest, or Annuities thereby secured or made payable, without any Priority among themselves, notwithstanding the Sums of Money for which such Securities shall have been given or issued may have been advanced at different Times.

IV. And be it further enacted, That such Mortgages, Bonds, Assignments and Annuities, as shall or may be given or issued by virtue of this Act may be assigned and transferred in such and the like Manner as Clerk of the Deeds of Mortgage of the Tolls of the said Bridge are by the said Company. recited Act of the Fifty first Year of the Reign of His late Majesty. authorized to be assigned and transferred; and every Assignment and Transfer of such Mortgages, Bonds, and other Securities shall be entered with the Clerk of the said Company, in such or the like Manner as Assignments and Transfers of such Mortgages are by the same Act directed to be entered; and the Clerk of the said Company shall be paid for entering every such Mortgage, Bond, or other Security, and every such Assignment or Transfer, the Sum of Five Shillings and no more.

V. And be it further enacted, That so much of the said recited Repealing Act of the Fifty-first Year of His said late Majesty as provides, that Clause for if the said Company of Proprietors shall not, within Ten Years from the Bridge and after the passing of that Act, complete the said Bridge, and also and Street the said Street from the said Bridge to Blackman Street aforesaid, so within Ten as to make the same passable for Horses and Carriages, that then Years. and from thenceforth all and singular the Powers and Authorities vested in them by that Act shall cease and determine to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

VI. And be it further enacted, That in case the several Works Work to be authorised to be made by the said Acts and this Act shall not have completed in been completed so as to answer the Purposes thereof within a certain Time. the Space of Three Years from the passing of this Act, then and from thenceforth all the Powers and Authorities given for making the said Works shall cease and determine, save only as to so much of the said Works as shall have been completed within such Time.

VII. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful Power to for the said Company of Proprietors to vary and alter the Line of alter the Road mentioned in the said recited Act of the Fifty-first Year of Line of Road. the Reign of His late Majesty, passing from the South Side of the said Bridge, at or near a certain Place or Alley called Horse Shoe Alley, to Blackman Street, both in Southwark aforesaid, by making the same pass across Union Street in Southwark aforesaid, at or near the Obelisk lately erected in the said Street by the said Company of Proprietors, and continuing the same across Peter Street, Queen Street. Cannon Street, and Great Suffolk Street, in Southwark aforesaid, to Belvidere Place, in the Parish of Saint George, Southwark, and continuing the same thence so as to terminate in Alfred Place, in the London Road; and also to take and purchase the Lands, Buildings, and Hereditaments, mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Act annexed, for the Purposes of the said intended Road.

VIII. And whereas Maps or Plans describing the said new intended. Line of Road, and Books of Reference containing a List of the Owners or reputed Owners and Occupiers of the Lands and Premises the Clerk of

Plans and Books of Reference lodged with the Peace.

necessary to be taken for the Purposes of this Act, have been deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Surrey; be it therefore enacted, That the said Maps or Plans, and Books of Reference, shall remain in the Custody of the said Clerk of the Peace, to the End that all Persons interested therein may at all seasonable Times have Liberty to inspect and peruse and take Copies and Extracts thereof at their Will and Pleasure, paying to such Clerk of the Peace the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and after the Rate of Four-pence for every Seventy-two Words of such Copies or Extracts of the said Books of Reference.

Forty-five Feet.

Road to be of IX. And be it further enacted, That the said Company of Prothe Width of prietors shall and they are hereby required to make and construct the said new intended Road of the Width of Forty-five Feet at the least throughout the whole Line thereof.

For rectifying Mistakes in Schedule.

X. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the said Company shall and may make the said Alterations in the said Line of Road, and may purchase and take Possession, for the Purposes of this Act, of any of the Houses, Buildings, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Act annexed, notwithstanding the Name or Names of any Person or Persons shall or may have been omitted, or incorrectly mentioned or spelt in the said Schedule, in case it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the County or Place in which such Premises are situate, and be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Error, Omission, or incorrect Description proceeded from Mistake.

For removing Doubts as to Payment of Tolls on Waggons, &c.

XI. And whereas Doubts have arisen whether, by the said recited Act of the Fifty-first Year of His said late Majesty, the said Company of Proprietors are authorised to demand and take Toll for any Waggon, Wain, Dray, Car, Cart, or such other Four-wheeled Carriage, drawn by Six or more Horses or other Beasts of Draught, or drawn by Four, and not more than Six Horses or other Beasts of Draught, or drawn by Two or Three Horses or other Beasts of Draught, or drawn by One Horse or other Beast of Draught, unless the same Waggon, Wain, Dray, Car, Cart, or such other Four-wheeled Carriage be laden with Hay or Straw, having Wheels of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards on the Bottom or Sole thereof, being horizontal on the Surface of the Tire, and rolling an even Surface; be it therefore further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Company of Proprietors to demand, take, and recover the respective Tolls by the said recited Act authorized to be demanded, taken, and recovered, for all and every such before mentioned Fourwheeled Carriage respectively, notwithstanding the same Carriages shall not be laden with Hay or Straw, having Wheels of the Breadth of Six Inches or upwards on the Bottom or Sole thereof, being horizontal on the Surface of the Tire, and rolling an even Surface; any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XII. And be it further enacted, That the said Company of Proprietors, or their Committee or Court of Direction, shall not be compelled or compellable to pave the said Bridge, or the Road authorized to be made by this Act, or any Part or Parts thereof not within the Bridge and Manor of Southwark, otherwise called The Clink or Bishop of Win-Roads. chester's Liberty, in the Parish of Saint Saviour, Southwark, in the County of Surrey; any thing in the said recited Acts, or either of them, to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That in case it shall appear to Lands, &c. the said Company of Proprietors, or their Committee or Court of not in the Direction, that it will be more convenient and advisable to vary, Schedule alter, or improve any Part of the said Roads, or the Accesses or Approaches to the said Bridge, or any Roads or Streets communi- pany by Concating therewith, in such Manner that any Lands, Grounds, Houses, sent. Buildings, Tenements, or Hereditaments, may be wanted, which are not contained in the Schedules to the said recited Acts or this Act annexed, or in any or either of them, or in any or either of the Plans in the said recited Acts or this Act mentioned, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Company of Proprietors, or their Committee or Court of Direction, and they are hereby fully authorized and empowered to carry into Effect such Variations or Alterations, upon their obtaining the Consent of the several Owners and Occupiers, and other Persons or Parties interested in the said last-mentioned Lands, Grounds, Houses, Buildings, Tenements, or Hereditaments respectively, and all and every Body and Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Ecclesiastical or Civil, Corporations Aggregate or Sole, and all Tenants for Life, and Tenants in Fee Tail. General or Special, or for Years determinable on any Life or Lives, whether in Possession, Reversion, Remainder, Expectancy, or otherwise, and all Husbands, Guardians, Trustees, or Feoffees in Trust for charitable or other Purposes, Committees, Executors, and Administrators, and all other Trustees and Persons whomsoever, not only for and on Behalf of themselves, their Heirs and Executors, but also for and on Behalf of their Cestuique Trusts, whether Infants, Issue unborn, Lunatics, Idiots, Femes Covert, or other Person or Persons, and all Femes Covert who are or shall be seised, possessed of, or interested in their own Right, or entitled to Dower or other Interest therein, and all other Person or Persons under any Disability or Incapacity whatsoever, is and are hereby fully authorized and empowered to give such Consent, and thereupon to sell and convey the same and every Part thereof to the said Company, in like Manner as if such Lands, Grounds, Houses, Buildings, Tenements, and Hereditaments, had been contained in the said Schedule to this Act annexed.

XIV. And whereas certain Lands, Buildings, Tenements, and Authority to Hereditaments, which the said Company of Proprietors, or their sell Lands not Committee or Court of Direction are authorized to take and use wanted. under and by virtue of the said recited Acts or this Act, or some Parts thereof, may not be necessary to be made use of for the Purposes of the said Acts or this Act; be it therefore further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Company of Pro-[Local.] prietors

prietors to sell and dispose of, and by Indenture under their Common Seal, absolutely to grant and convey the same or any Part or Parts thereof, to any Person or Persons whomsoever, and that all such Conveyances from the said Company of Proprietors shall be valid and effectual, any Law, Statute, or Custom to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding; and that all Money which shall arise by any such Sale or Sales, as aforesaid, shall be applied to the Purposes of the said recited Acts and this Act, and the Purchaser or Purchasers thereof shall not be answerable or accountable for any Misapplication or Non-application of such Money.

Extending the Provisions of the former Acts to this Act.

XV. And be it further enacted, That the said recited Acts, and all and every the Duties, Powers, Authorities, Provisions, Regulations, Privileges, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things whatsoever therein contained, so far as the same are not hereby altered or repealed, shall extend and be construed to extend to operate and be in full Force and Effect with respect to the Premises mentioned and contained in the Schedule to this Act, and with respect to all Matters and Things which may arise in the Execution of this Act, as fully and effectually to all Intents and Purposes as if the same and every of them and every Part thereof were repeated and reenacted in this Act, and were made Part thereof.

Clerk restrained from acting as Treasurer, and vice versa.

XVI. And be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Company to continue or appoint the Person who has been or may be appointed to act as their Clerk in the Execution of the said Acts or either of them, or of this Act, or the Partner of any such Clerk, the Treasurer for the Purposes of the said Acts or either of them, or of this Act, or to continue or appoint the Person who may have been or may be appointed Treasurer, or the Partner of any such Treasurer, the Clerk to the said Trustees for executing the said Acts or either of them, or of this Act; and if any Person shall act in both the Capacities of Clerk and Treasurer for the Purposes of the said Acts or either of them, or of this Act, or if any Person being the Partner of any such Clerk shall act as Treasurer, or being the Partner of any such Treasurer shall act as Clerk in the Execution of the said Acts or either of them, or of this Act, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of Fifty Pounds to any Person or Persons who shall sue for the same, to be recovered in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster, by Action of Debt or on the Case, or by Bill, Suit, or Information, wherein no Essoign, Protection, or Wager of Law, or more than One Imparlance shall be allowed.

Preventing
Nuisances
and Annoyances on
Bridge or
Road.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That the said Company shall and they are hereby required, from Time to Time, to cause to be erected Guide Posts, upon such Parts of the said Road, where the same may be crossed or joined by other Roads, as they shall think proper; and if any Person or Persons shall wilfully pull up or damage any Direction Post erected or fixed, or to be erected or fixed, in or near the Side or Sides of the said Road, or shall obliterate or deface any of the Letters, Figures, or Marks inscribed thereon; or if any Person shall ride upon any Causeway or Footpath formed upon or on

the

the Side of or adjoining the said Bridge or Road, or shall drive any Horse, Beast, or Swine or any Carriage upon, or cause any Damage to be done to any Causeway or Footpath, or shall leave or suffer any Horse, Beast, Cattle, Sheep, or Swine to be and remain loose on the said Bridge or Road, or any Part thereof; or if any Person shall cause to be drawn upon any Part of the said Bridge or Road any Timber, Stone, or other Thing, otherwise than upon wheeled Carriages, or shall suffer any Timber, Stone, or other Thing, which shall be carried upon wheeled Carriages, to drag upon the said Bridge or Road to the Prejudice thereof; or if any Person driving any Pigs or Swine upon the said Bridge or Road, shall suffer the same to root up and damage the said Road, or the Fences on either Side thereof; or if any Person driving any Carriage upon the said Bridge or Road shall ride upon the Shafts or other Part of the said Carriage, without holding the Reins of the Horse or Horses, or meeting another Carriage, shall not keep his or her Carriage on his or her Left or Near Side of the said Bridge or Road, and also keep on the same Side himself; or if any other Person shall in any other Manner wilfully prevent any other Person or Persons from passing him or her, or any Carriage under his or her Care upon the said Bridge or Road; or if any Person shall make or assist in making any Fire or Fires, or shall set fire to, or let off or throw any Squib, Rocket, Serpent, or Firework whatsoever, on any Part of the said Bridge or Road, or within Eighty Feet of the Centre of the said Road, or play at Foot-ball, or any other Game or Games on any Part of the said Bridge or Road, to the Annoyance of any Passenger or Passengers; or if any Person shall leave any Carriage (except in Cases of Accident) upon or on the Side of the said Bridge or Road, longer than may be necessary to load or unload the same, either with or without any Horse or Beast of Draught harnessed or yoked thereto, or in case such Carriage shall not, during such Time, be drawn up to the Side of the said Bridge or Road, as near as conveniently may be; or if any Person, after having blocked or stopped any Waggon, Cart, or other Carriage, in going up any Hill or rising Ground, shall not immediately remove from the said Bridge or Road the Stone or other Thing with which such Waggon, Cart, or other Carriage shall have been so blocked or stopped; or in case any Person shall lay any Timber, Stone, Chalk, Marl, Lime, Hay, Straw, Dung, Manure, Soil, Rubbish, or other Matter or Thing whatsoever, upon the said Bridge or Road, or on the Side or Sides thereof, between the said Road and the Fences to be erected on the Sides thereof, or shall plough up, dig up, or break up any of the Soil between the said Road and such Fences as aforesaid, for the Purpose of making Compost or Manure, or otherwise shall scrape off any Soil or other Thing from the said Road or the Sides thereof, or shall take up and carry away any Scrapings thereof, or any Dung, Mould, Soil, Compost, or Manure from the Sides thereof, except such as may be lying in his own Grounds, and be carried away without being brought over any Part of the said Road, or that the same may be done at such Times and under such Regulations as the Company shall direct and order; every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and

and pay any Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, to be recovered and applied as by the said Act is directed.

Expences of the Act.

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That the Charges and Expences of obtaining and passing this Act shall be defrayed by the said Company out of the first Monies arising or to arise by virtue of the said recited Acts or of this Act, or any of them, or now in the Hands of the said Company.

Public Act.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.
