An Act for making and maintaining a Road from *Rhayader*, in the County of *Radnor*, to *Llangerrig* in the County of *Montgomery*.

[23d March 1829.]

WHEREAS the making and maintaining a Turnpike Road from *Rhayader*, in the County of *Radnor*, to *Llangerrig* in the County of *Montgomery*, would be of great Utility, not only to the Persons residing on and adjacent to that Line of Road, but would also be of general public Advantage: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That all His Majesty's Justices of the Peace acting for the Counties of *Radnor* and *Montgomery* respectively, together with the Right Honourable *Thomas Frankland Lewis*, *Richard Price*, *Edward Rogers*, *Edward Rogers junior*, *Hugh Powell Evans*, *Thomas Evans*, *Robert Peel*, *William Peel*, *Thomas Lewis Lloyd*, *David Oliver*, *Thomas Prichard*, *Richard Venables Clerk*, D. according to the Directions of several Acts of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, for regulating Turnpike Roads in *England*, shall be and they are hereby appointed Trustees for making and maintaining a Road from *Rhayader*, in the County of *Radnor*, to *Llangerrig* in the County of *Montgomery*, and also a Branch from the said Road extending from or near a Place called *Felinfaur Mill* to join the Turnpike Road leading from *Llangerrig* to *Llanidloes* at or near a Place called *Coed-y-voel*, passing along the Valley of the River *Wye*, and through the Places, Townships, or Parishes of *Rhayader*, *Nantmel*, and *Saint Harmon*, in the County of *Radnor*, and *Llangerrig* in the County of *Montgomery*, and for otherwise putting this Act into execution.

II. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, from Time to Time, at any of their Meetings, to elect and appoint any Number of Persons not exceeding Three, being duly qualified, in addition to the Trustees herein named and appointed, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act; and such Persons so elected and appointed shall be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, and are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities for executing the same as if they had been herein named and appointed.

III. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall hold their First Meeting at some convenient House or Place in the Town of *Rhayader* in the said County of *Radnor*, or at some other convenient Place on the Line or in the Neighbourhood of the said Road, as the said Trustees shall think proper, on the Second *Monday* next after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be; and the said Trustees shall and may then and from Time to Time after adjourn to and meet at the same Place, or at such Times, and Places on the Line or in the Neighbourhood of the said Road, as they shall think proper.

IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby fully authorized and empowered, to set out and make the said Road in such Manner as to them shall seem right and proper, according to the Map or Plan herein mentioned; and for that Purpose to take and use any Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, they the said Trustees first making Satisfaction to the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, or such Part or Parts thereof as they the said Trustees may require for making and constructing the said Road.

V. And whereas Maps or Plans describing the Lines of the said Road, and of the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments through which the same are to be made or carried, together with a Book of Reference containing Lists of the Names of the Owners and Occupiers, or reputed Owners and Occupiers, of such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, have been deposited in the Offices of the Clerks of the Peace for the Counties of *Radnor* and *Montgomery* respectively; be it therefore enacted, That the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the said Clerks
of

of the Peace, to the end that all Persons may at seasonable Times have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and to take Copies or Extracts thereof at their Will and Pleasure, paying the said Clerks of the Peace for the Time being the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words for making such Copies or Extracts; and the said Trustees in making the said Road shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards from the Line described in the said Maps or Plans, without the Consent in Writing first had and obtained of the Person or Persons, Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments such Deviation shall be made.

VI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to make the said Road into, through, across, or over the several Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments of any Person or Persons who is, are, or may be Owner or Owners, or Occupier or Occupiers, of Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments through or over which the same are set out and described in the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference, although such Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments, or the Name or Names of such Person or Persons, may happen to be erroneously described, omitted, or misstated in the said Maps or Plans or Books, in case it shall appear to any One or more Justice or Justices of the Peace for the said Counties of *Radnor* and *Montgomery* respectively, and be certified by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, that such Error or Omission proceeded from Mistake.

Misnomers not to prevent the Execution of this Act.

VII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Powers and Authorities hereby granted shall not extend or be construed to extend to authorize or empower the said Trustees, in making the said Road, to take or pull down, injure or damage, any Dwelling House or other Building, or to take in or make use of any Garden, Yard, Park, Paddock, Lawn, Shrubby, planted Walk, or Avenue to a House, or any inclosed Ground planted and set apart as a Nursery for Trees, without the Consent in Writing of the Owner thereof, or other Person interested therein, first had and obtained (except those specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed).

Trustees not to take down Houses, &c. without the Consent of the Owners, except those specified in the Schedule.

VIII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That in case the said Trustees shall not purchase the several Premises mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Act annexed within the Term of Five Years from the passing of this Act, then and from thenceforth it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to take and use such Premises, except with the Consent in Writing of the Owners and Occupiers thereof.

IX. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Person or Persons to be appointed by them as Collector or Collectors of the Tolls to be taken by virtue of this Act, to demand and take the Tolls hereinafter mentioned upon the Road hereby directed to be made and maintained, on all Horses, Beasts, or Cattle passing through the several and respective Toll Gates or Turnpikes,

piques, or Side Gates or Side Bars or Chains, which shall be erected or placed in, upon, across, or on the Side or Sides of the said Road; that is to say,

Tolls.

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle drawing any Coach, Landau, Machine, Hearse, Chariot, Caravan, Curricule, Chaise, Chair, or other such like Carriage, any Sum not exceeding Eight-pence :

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, having the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Six Inches at the Bottom or Soles thereof, the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny :

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, having the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Four and a Half Inches, and less than Six Inches, at the Bottom or Soles thereof, the Sum of Five-pence :

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, having the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of less Breadth than Four and a Half Inches at the Bottom or Soles thereof, the Sum of Sixpence :

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast, laden or unladen, and not drawing, any Sum not exceeding One Penny Halfpenny :

For every Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, any Sum not exceeding One Penny :

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or other Neat Cattle, any Sum not exceeding Ten-pence *per* Score ; and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :

For every Drove of Calves, Sheep, Lambs, or Pigs, any Sum not exceeding Five-pence *per* Score ; and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :

Which said Tolls, and all other Tolls, and all Monies arising by virtue of this Act, shall be and the same are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and shall and may be applied in manner hereinafter directed.

X. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if the Toll hereby authorized to be taken for the passing of any Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage, through any One of the Toll Gates erected on the said Road, shall have been paid, such Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage shall, upon a Ticket denoting the Payment thereof for that Day being produced, be permitted to pass Toll-free through the same Toll Gate, and also through such other Gate or Gates (if any) as the Ticket for such Payment shall free, at any Time or Times during the same Day, to be computed from Twelve of the Clock at Night to Twelve of the Clock on the next succeeding Night.

Number of Tolls on passing the whole Length of the Road.

XI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no more than Three full Tolls shall be demanded or taken in the same Day, to be computed as aforesaid, from any Person or Persons, for or in respect of the passing and repassing of the same Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage through all the Turnpikes, Toll Gates, or Side Gates erected on the said Road.

XII. Pro-

XII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for and in respect of all Horses or other Beasts drawing any Stage Coach, Van, Caravan, Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage, conveying Passengers or Goods for Pay or Reward, every Time of passing or repassing along the said Road.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for and in respect of all Horses or other Beasts let out for Hire, and drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage, every Time of passing or repassing along the said Road, whenever a new Hiring thereof shall take place.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That out of the Monies already subscribed or to be subscribed or advanced for the Purpose of making the said Road, or which shall be borrowed on the Credit of this Act, or out of the first Monies which shall arise or be received from the Tolls by this Act granted, the said Trustees shall, in the first place, pay and discharge all the Costs, Charges, and Expences relative to the obtaining and passing of this Act; and the Remainder of all such Monies so subscribed, or to be subscribed, advanced, or borrowed, and raised by Tolls as aforesaid, shall be applied in defraying the Expences of making the said Road, and in purchasing Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, and Materials for the Purpose, and in otherwise carrying this Act into execution; and after Payment of all such Expences, the Remainder of such Money shall from Time to Time be applied in paying the Interest of the Monies subscribed or advanced for the Purposes of this Act, or which may be borrowed on the Credit thereof; in the next place, in maintaining and repairing the said Road, and the Toll Gates and Toll Houses thereon, and in otherwise putting this Act into execution; and lastly in paying the Principal Monies subscribed or advanced for the Purposes of this Act, or which shall be borrowed for the Purposes thereof.

XV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

XVI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence upon the Second *Monday* after the passing thereof, and shall continue and be in force for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
