An Act to provide for the Municipal Government of the Town and Suburbs of Leith; for the further Administration of Justice; and for the Regulation of the Police therein.

[2d July 1827.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, intituled An Act for cleansing and lighting 11G.3.c.30. the Streets of the Town of South Leith, the Territory of Saint Anthony's, and Yard Heads thereunto adjoining, and for supplying the several Parts thereof with fresh Water: And whereas another Act was passed in the Forty-sixth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, intituled An Act for amending an Act passed in the Eleventh Year of His 46G.3. c. 36 present Majesty, intituled 'An Act for cleansing and lighting the Streets of the Town of South Leith, the Territory of Saint Anthony's, and Yard Heads thereunto adjoining, and for supplying the several Parts thereof with fresh Water;' and for the better regulating the Police of the said Town and Territory, and of the Town of North Leith, Coalhill, and Citadel; and for other Purposes therein mentioned relating thereto: And whereas it is expedient that the said Acts should be repealed, and that the Commissioners of Police hereinafter appointed should be enabled to maintain an efficient Police, and to preserve Peace and good Order within the whole District comprehended under this Act, and hereinafter described; and that Provisions should be made for the watching, paving, cleansing, and lighting the said District: And whereas from the great and increasing Population of the said Town of Leith, and the Increase of Trade and of the Shipping frequenting the Docks and Harbour thereof, it is necessary to provide 32~Etor [Local.]

for the further Administration of Justice within the said Town and District: But as these Objects cannot be attained without the Aid and Authority of Parliament; May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of Recited Acts the same, That from and after Six Weeks after the passing of this Act, the said recited Acts of the Eleventh and Forty-sixth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and the Provisions herein contained shall from that Period commence and be in full Force.

II. And be it further enacted, That from and after Six Weeks after the passing of this Act, the Provisions, and the Powers and Regulations herein contained, shall extend over and comprehend the following District; videlicet, the Grounds, Streets, Lanes, Roads, Beach, and Shores, and whole other Places locally situated and comprehended within the following Limits; videlicet, from Seafield Toll Bar Westward along the Sea at Low Water Mark to the North-west Point of the Sea Wall of the Inner or Westermost Wet Dock; then by a Line drawn due South from that Point to the South Wall of the Warehouses and Yards on the South Side of the Wet Docks, and then extending in such Manner as to include the Houses on both Sides of Albany Street, Portland Place, Portland Terrace, Cooper Street, and Admiralty Street, and thence from the South-east End of Cooper Street, continuing in the Line of the last-mentioned Street, to the River of Leith; then extending along the North Side of the Harbour and River of Leith to the New Stone Bridge at Leith Mills, and crossing the said River or Harbour until it intersect the Boundary Line between Mr. Boyd's Property of Leith Mills and Mr. Dunlop's Lands of Bowling Green; then extending along that Boundary Line to the River of Leith, and then along the River until it reaches the Wall between the Lands of Bowling Green and the Garden belonging to Mr. Stewart; then along the Boundary Line between Hadaway's Park, Swanfield, and the Garden Ground belonging to Mr. Stewart, to the Water Run from Leith Walk where it crosses the Bonnington Road; from that Point extending by a straight Line drawn from thence to the West Corner of Duke Street; then along Duke Street and Thomson's Place; and from thence along the Lochend Road to Burns Street, including Burns Street, Vanburgh Place, Hermitage Place, and Hermitage House, and Lands thereof, and thereafter by the North Side of the Road leading along or round the Eastern Links of Leith, and from thence until it reaches the Boundary Wall between Seafield Baths and the Grounds of the House of Seafield, and then following the Line of the Boundary Wall to Seafield Toll Bar.

Town of Leith.

The District III. And be it further enacted, That the said District so described, described to and all the Lands, Streets, Roads, Houses, Buildings, and Heritages be called the therein included, shall be now and in all Time hereafter called and known by the Name of the "Town of Leith," for the Purposes of this Act.

Sheriff Substitute to be appointed.

IV. And be it further enacted, That within Six Weeks from and after the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for the Sheriff Depute of the County of Edinburgh, and he is hereby specially authorized and required to nominate and appoint, and from Time to Time thereafter as

any

any Vacancy may occur, or pro tempore, if necessary, a fit Person, qualified according to Law, to be the Sheriff Substitute in and for the said Town of Leith, and such District adjoining thereto as to the said Sheriff Depute shall seem proper, for the due Administration of Justice within the same; and that no Appointment of any such Person as Sheriff Substitute shall be valid, or enable any such Person to do any Act by virtue thereof, unless and until there shall be annexed a. Certificate under the Hands of the Lord President of the Court of Session and the Lord Justice Clerk, bearing that such Person is duly qualified and capable to discharge the Duties of the said Office, which Certificate, after due Enquiry made, the Lord President and Lord Justice Clerk are hereby required either to grant or refuse.

V. And be it further enacted, That if the Judge Admiral of Scotland Salary to shall grant to the said Sheriff Substitute of the said District of the Town of Leith a Deputation of his the said Judge Admiral's Powers and Jurisdictions over the Bounds and Territories of the said District of the Judge Ad-Town of Leith, and upon such Part of the Waters of the Frith of Forth miral. as the said Judge Admiral shall judge necessary and expedient, then and in such Case the Commissioners of Police of the said Town of Leith shall be obliged, and they are hereby obliged and required to make Payment to the said Sheriff Substitute, in addition to any Salary to be received by him from any other Source as Sheriff Substitute, of the Sum of Two hundred Pounds per Annum, to be paid Half-yearly, and to be raised and levied by Assessment upon the Property within the District aforesaid, in Manner hereinafter provided.

VI. And be it further enacted, That the said Sheriff Substitute shall Sheriff Subbe resident within the said Town of Leith, and shall keep or hold such daily or regular Courts therein, in the Court Room to be provided in Leith. for that Purpose in Manner after mentioned, as shall be necessary for the full and due Administration of Justice, both Civil and Criminal, as fully as it is competent to any Sheriff Substitute elsewhere in Scotland; and the Sentences or Judgments of the said Sheriff Substitute. as Sheriff Substitute, or as Depute Admiral, shall be subject to such and the like Review as the Sentences or Judgments of any Sheriff Substitute or Depute Admiral are severally and respectively subject and liable to by the Law and Practice of Scotland.

VII. And be it further enacted, That on the First Thursday after the A Leet for Term of Michaelmas in this present Year, the Admiral and Resident Magistrates Magistrates of South Leith, the Masters of the Four Incorporations of to be chosen. Leith, namely, of the Trinity House, Maltmen, Convener of the Trades, and Master of the Traffickers, commonly called the Merchant Company, together with all and every Person who shall at any Time have held the Office of Resident Magistrate of South Leith, shall assemble in the Council Chamber of Leith at Twelve o'Clock Noon, and shall make choice of a Leet of Nine Persons, qualified to hold the Office of Resident Magistrate of South Leith, to be presented to the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council of the City of Edinburgh, on or before the Second Wednesday after the said Term of Michaelmas in this present Year: Provided always, that at the said Meeting so to be held on the First Thursday after Michaelmas, and at all subsequent Meetings to be held tor

for the choosing of Leets in Manner hereinafter directed, the Admiral or Senior Bailie of Leith present shall be Preses, and in case of an Equality of Votes shall, besides his own deliberative Vote, have a casting Vote; and if at any such Meeting neither the Admiral nor any Bailie of Leith. shall be present, the Persons present shall choose a Preses, who in like Manner, besides his own Vote, shall have a casting Vote; and at all such Meetings Ten shall be a Quorum.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Edinburgh shall, on or before the Third Wednesday after Michaelmas in this present Year, out of the Leet of Nine Persons so to be presented to them in Manner foresaid, elect and choose Three Persons to be the Resident Magistrates of Leith for the Year next ensuing, who shall have Precedence according to the Order in which their Names shall have been set down in the said Leet of Nine, and who shall, in virtue of their Election, have, possess, and enjoy all the Powers, Jurisdictions, and Privileges heretofore enjoyed by the Resident Magistrates of Leith appointed by the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of Edinburgh.

One of the Magistrates to go out of Office annually.

IX. And be it further enacted, That at the Expiration of One Year from the Date of his Appointment, the Senior Magistrate of Leith so chosen shall go out of Office, and at the Expiration of every subsequent Year the Senior Magistrate for the Time being shall go out of Office, and another Magistrate shall be elected and chosen by the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council, out of a Leet of Three to be chosen and presented to them annually by the Admiral and Resident Magistrates of Leith, and the Masters of the Four Incorporations of Leith for the Time being, together with all and every Person who shall have held the Office of Resident Magistrate of South Leith, who shall for that Purpose assemble annually on the First Thursday after Michaelmas in each Year, at the Place and Time above directed in regard to the choosing of the Leets for Magistrates in this present Year; and which Magistrate so to be annually chosen hereafter shall be held to be the Junior Magistrate of South Toith until the north Annual Election Junior Magistrate of South Leith until the next Annual Election, or until another Magistrate shall have been chosen to supply any Vacancy, in Manner hereinafter directed.

Vacancies how to be filled up.

X. And be it further enacted, That if a Vacancy shall at any Time occur by any of the Magistrates of Leith so to be chosen refusing to act, or by Death or Resignation, it shall and may be lawful to the Town Clerk of Leith for the Time being, and he is hereby required, within Forty-eight Hours after such Vacancy shall have been notified to him by Order of the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council of Edinburgh, to convene a Meeting of the Admiral and Resident Magistrates of Leith, the Masters of the Four Incorporations of Leith, and of all and every Person who shall have held the Office of Resident Magistrate of Leith, in the Council Chamber of Leith, by Notices addressed to each Individual, (through the Post Office,) to be held at Twelve of the Clock Noon, on some Day not sooner than Five nor later than Ten Days after the Date of such Notice, in order that they may choose a Leet of Three, to be presented to the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council on the First Council Day thereafter, towards their choosing a Magistrate to supply the Vacancy: Provided always, that the said Lord Provost,

Provost, Magistrates, and Council shall be and they are hereby required to make such Choice within Ten Days after such Leet shall have been presented; and that the Magistrate so chosen shall be the Junior Magistrate until the next General Election; and provided also, that if more than One Vacancy shall occur at the same Time, a Leet of Three shall be presented to the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council, for the filling up of each such Vacancy: Provided also, that if the Persons entitled to present the Leets in the Manner above mentioned shall fail to present the same, it shall and may be lawful to the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council, to nominate and appoint fit Persons to be the Resident Magistrates of Leith as heretofore.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the Resident Magistrates of Leith, Magistrates and Masters of the Four Incorporations for the Time being, shall be and Masters entitled to hold and to administer all Property of whatever Description, Property. Heritable or Moveable, to be acquired by them for the Use and Behoof of the Inhabitants of the said Town; and at all Meetings of the said Resident Magistrates and Masters the Senior Magistrate present, or, in his Absence, the Senior Master present, in the Order in which the said Incorporations are hereinbefore set down, shall be Preses, and shall have a deliberative as well as a casting Vote; and all Acts and Things done by a Quorum of not less than Three of the said Magistrates and Masters shall be as valid and effectual as if done by the Whole.

XII. And be it further enacted, That in all Matters and Things touching How to sue the said Property, whether Heritable or Moveable, it shall and may be lawful and be sued. for the said Magistrates and Masters to sue and be sued, in any Court of Law or Equity, in the Name of the Senior Resident Magistrate of Leith for the Time being; and no such Suit or Action shall fall or become abated by the Death, Removal, or Resignation of such Magistrate.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That the Commissioners hereinafter Court House named shall, out of the said Assessment vested in them by this Act, be and Offices to obliged, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, if necessary, to provide a suitable Court House and other proper and necessary Offices for the Use of the said Sheriff Substitute, and for the Books, Records, and Proceedings of the said Sheriff Court; and for that End it shall be lawful for them, and they are hereby authorized to contract and agree with any Person or Persons, and any Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, for the Purchase of a suitable Building or Buildings for the aforesaid Purposes; or it shall and may be lawful to the said Commissioners to purchase any Land or Ground not exceeding One Acre, and to build thereon or contract for the building of a suitable Court House and other proper and necessary Offices, and in the mean time to rent or take upon Lease any such Building or Premises as may be suitable or necessary; and also to pay the Salaries of Schoolmasters in the High School of Leith, should the Funds pertaining to the said School, or applicable to the Purposes of the said School, be inadequate to such Purposes, and for the Improvement of the said Schools, Markets, or any Heritable Property of the Inhabitants of Leith.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall take Saving away or affect any Power, Authority, or Jurisdiction now competent to Rights of [Local.]

the Sheriff Depute of the County of Edinburgh, and in particular his Right to decide, in the First Instance, all Civil Causes competent to be brought before the Sheriff Court, as also his Right to exercise and discharge all Powers and Duties competent to any of his Substitutes, including all those entrusted to his Substitute at Leith under the Provisions of this Act; neither shall any thing herein contained take away or be construed to take away from, or to deprive the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council of the City of Edinburgh, the Admiral and Resident Magistrates! of South Leith, the Baron Bailie and Resident Magistrates of Canongate; the Ministers, Deacons, and Elders of South Leith, the Justices of the Peace of the said County, and the Justices of the Peace of the City' of Edinburgh and its Liberties, the Town Clerks of South Leith and of Canongate, the Society of Solicitors before the Commissary, Sheriff, and City Courts of Edinburgh, incorporated by Royal Charter, or any other Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, or Superior or Vassal, or Person or Persons whatsoever, of any Power, Privilege, Authority, Jurisdiction, Patronage, Office or Casualty, or any Right, Title, or Interest, patrimonial or pecuniary, civil or feudal, or of any other Description whatsoever, or to alter, impair, or affect any Tenure, Title, or Holding within the said District; but all such Powers, Privileges, Authorities, Jurisdictions, Patronages, Offices, Casualties, Rights, Interests, Tenures, Titles, and Holdings, and others, are hereby saved and reserved as ample and entire as if this Act had not been passed: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall recognize or bestow any Right or Power on any Persons or Bodies Corporate hereinbefore mentioned that they do not already possess.

Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council of the said City of Edinburgh, or Comto be indem-munity of the said City, the Burgh of Canongate, and all and every Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, and all and every public Officer or Officers, Person or Persons, shall be fully indemnified, paid, and remunerated for the Value of any Superiority, Right, Privilege, Immunity, or Revenue, or other Interest whatsoever, which they respectively, or any of them, now lawfully enjoy or can claim within the said Town of Leith, and of which they, or any of them, shall be deprived by the Operation of this Act; and which Value shall be fixed and determined by a Jury to be summoned and impannelled, on Application to the Sheriff Depute of the said County, in the Manner in which Juries are usually summoned and impannelled for such Purposes in that Part of the United Kingdom called Scotland, within Twelve Calendar Months next after any Claim for Compensation shall have arisen; and such Value being so ascertained, the said Commissioners of Police shall be bound and obliged, within Two Years from the Date at which such Valuation shall be declared, to make Payment to the Party or Parties entitled thereto of the Sum or Sums so awarded to them, or any of them, in such Manner and by such Instalments, or otherwise, as the said Jury shall award and direct, and which Sums shall be raised in Manner after mentioned.

Ward Fourth to be bounded on the East by the Kirkgate, on the North and North-east by Giles Street and the Leith Mill Road, and on the West and South-west by the Boundary Line between Mr. Boyd's Property of Leith Mills, and Mr. Dunlop's Lands of Bowling Green, the River of Leith, the Boundary Line between Hadaway's Park, Swanfield, and the Garden Ground belonging to Mr. Stewart, the Water-Run from the Foot of Leith Walk, where it crosses the Bonnington Road, and the Boundary Line of the District on the West from that Point to the Head of the Kirkgate:

Ward Fifth to be bounded on the East by the Kirkgate, on the North-east by Saint Andrew's Street, on the North by the River or Harbour of Leith, on the South by the Leith Mill Road, and on the Southwest by Giles Street:

Ward Sixth to be bounded on the East by the Kirkgate, on the North-east by the Tolbooth Wynd, on the North by the River or Harbour of Leith, and on the South-west by Saint Andrew's Street:

Ward Seventh to be bounded on the West by the Kirkgate, and from the South End thereof by the Boundaries of the District to Restalrig Toll Bar, and on the North by the Road in Front of James's Place and Charlotte Street:

Ward Eighth to be bounded on the South by the Tolbooth Wynd and Charlotte Street, on the East by Constitution Street, on the North-east by Bernard Street, and on the North-west by the River or Harbour of Leith:

Ward Ninth to be bounded on the South and South-east by Bernard Street, Baltic Street, and Salamander Street, on the North by the Sea, and on the North-west by the River and Harbour of Leith:

Ward Tenth to be bounded on the West by Constitution Street, on the South by Charlotte Street and the Road along by James's Place to the Restalrig Toll Bar, on the South-east by the Road leading from the Restalrig Toll Bar to the Wall between the Seafield Baths and the House of Seafield to the Seafield Toll Bar, on the South by the said Wall,

and on the North and North-west by the Sea, Salamander Street, and Baltic Street.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That where any Streets or Roads are: taken as the Boundaries or Divisions between any of the foregoing Wards, the Centre of the Street or Road shall be the Line of Division between the adjoining Wards respectively.

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, Commission- the Dean of Guild, the Four Bailies of Edinburgh, and the Admiral and Baron Bailie, the Three Bailies of Leith, the resident Bailies and Treasurer of Canongate, the Lord Advocate of Scotland, the Sheriff Depute of the County of Edinburgh, and his Substitute in Leith, all for the Time being, the Bailie of Saint Anthony's for the Time being, and the Masters of the Four Incorporations of Leith for the Time being, shall ex officio be Commissioners for putting this Act in Execution, along with the Commissioners to be annually elected and chosen in Manner after mentioned; and at all the Meetings of the said ex officio Commissioners the Members present at such Meetings shall elect their own Preses; and the Clerk of the said Commissioners shall have the Power of calling Meetings of the said ex officio Commissioners, whenever he shall be required so to do by any Three or more of them.

Incorporations to elect Two Commissioners each.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That each of the said Four Incorporations of Leith, videlicet, the Shipmasters, the Maltmen, the Trades, and the Merchants or Traffickers, commonly called the Merchant Company, shall annually elect Two of their Number (qualified as hereinafter required) to be Commissioners for executing the Purposes of this Act, along with the other Commissioners appointed, and to be annually elected and chosen in virtue hereof.

Commission. XX. And be it further enacted, That there shall be Two Commissioners (qualified as hereinafter required) elected also in Manner after mentioned by and for each of the said Wards, One of whom at least shall be resident within the Ward for which he is chosen.

Commission-Constables.

XXI. And be it further enacted, That the said Commissioners, whether ers to have elected or acting ex officio, shall be and they are hereby authorized the Power of and empowered to exercise and enjoy within the Limits of this Act all and empowered to exercise and enjoy within the Limits of this Act all the Powers which by the Law of Scotland belong to the Office of Constable; and the Resident Commissioner, and where both are resident, the Senior Commissioner, shall be Head Constable within his respective Ward, and shall take all Measures necessary, for promoting the general Peace, Order, and Comfort of the Inhabitants of such Ward.

For the First Ward, Alexander Sime and Robert Douglas; For the Second Ward, John Gavin and Hugh Kinghorn;

For the Third Ward, John Hutchinson and John Wishart; For the Fourth Ward, Alexander Dudgeon and James Bairnsfather

For the Fifth Ward, William Auld and David Brash; For the Sixth Ward, James Reoch and John Russell;

For the Seventh Ward, John Hardie and Charles Murray;

Dwelling Houses, Shops, Warehouses, and other Buildings and heritable Subjects within the respective Wards, the Yearly Rent or Value of which, to be ascertained by the Roll or Book for the Assessment authorized to be levied by this Act, shall amount to Fifteen Pounds Sterling or upwards; and no Person shall be eligible or be elected as a Commissioner, or shall be entitled to act as a Commissioner under this Act (other than the said ex officio Commissioners), unless he is either Proprietor, Life-renter, or Occupier of Property within the District comprehended under this Act, the yearly Rent or Value of which, to be ascertained in Manner before mentioned, shall amount to Fifteen Pounds Sterling or upwards: Provided always, that no Person shall have more than One Vote in any One Ward, but without Prejudice to his voting in any other Ward or Wards in which he may be qualified to vote as before mentioned; and provided further, that no Person shall be entitled to vote or to be elected a Commissioner who shall not reside or have a Place of Business situated within the Bounds of Police, or District, before defined; and also provided, that in case of Error in the said Roll or Book of Assessment, the same may be rectified by the Magistrates or Sheriff Substitute of Leith, or any One of them, on Petition, in Manner hereinafter provided in respect of Errors and Complaints against Elections made in virtue of this Act.

Copartneries may vote by One of their Partners.

XXVI. Provided always, and be it enacted, That where Companies or Copartnery Concerns, consisting of more than One Person carrying on Business, shall be Occupiers of any heritable Subject within the Bounds comprehended under this Act, the yearly Rent or Value of which shall amount to Fifteen Pounds Sterling or upwards, then any One of the Partners of the said Companies or Copartnery Concerns shall be entitled to vote at the Elections of the said Commissioners for the Wards in which the said Subjects may be situated, and may also be elected a Commissioner or Commissioners under this Act; but such Company or Copartnery shall have no more than One Vote, and no more than One Partner of any Company or Copartnery shall be elected a Commissioner, unless qualified individually.

Proprietors of Houses rented at entitled to vote and be elected.

XXVII. Provided always, That all and every Proprietor or Life-renter of Houses, Warehouses, Lofts, or other Property let for a less Period than 151. Sterling One Year, whose gross yearly Rental or Valuation in respect of such Houses or Warehouses in any One Ward, after Deduction as hereinafter mentioned, shall amount to Fifteen Pounds Sterling yearly, shall be entitled to vote for, and may be elected a Commissioner for the Ward in which such Property is situated, in the same Manner as if he or they were the actual Occupiers of Property to that Amount: Provided always, that when such Property shall belong to any Company or Copartnery, any One of the Partners of such Copartnery shall be entitled to vote for, and may be elected a Commissioner for the Ward in which such Property shall be situated, the Rental of such Property amounting to Fifteen Pounds in the Gross.

XXVIII. And be it further enacted, That the Votes shall be given in each Commission. tion shall be final and binding on all concerned; and the said Magistrates or Sheriff Substitute of Leith, or any One of them, shall likewise, in case there shall be an Equality of Votes in any of the Wards, determine which of the Candidates shall be preferred: Provided that no Objection shall lie against any such Election on any Grounds, unless the same shall have been stated by Petition to the said Magistrates or Sheriff Substitute of Leith, or any One of them, within Fourteen Days from the Day of Election, by whom it shall be finally determined and decided within Fourteen Days. thereafter; failing which, such Election shall be and be deemed to have been good.

And be it further enacted, That when the Place of any of the Vacancies said Commissioners shall become vacant, either by the Death, or wrongous how to be Election, or Refusal to act, of any of the Commissioners hereinbefore filled up. named, or to be elected in Manner aforesaid, or by any of them ceasing to be qualified or to reside within the Bounds of Police, or by any elected Commissioner being elected to Two Wards or becoming an ex officio Commissioner, the Clerk of the said Commissioners hereinbefore appointed shall, within Fourteen Days after such Vacancy or Vacancies may happen, or become known to them, give Notice, in such Manner as they may deem proper, of an Election or Elections, to be made in Manner before appointed, not more than Four Days after such Notice, of a Commissioner or Commissioners qualified in Manner aforesaid to supply such Vacancy or Vacancies.

XXXIII. And be it further enacted, That in case the said Incorporations, In case of or any of them, or the Electors of any of the said Wards, shall refuse to Refusal to

Powers and Duties of Commission - ers.

XXXV. Contracts under recited Acts to remain effectual.

XXXVI. And be it further enacted, That all Debts contracted, and all Contracts entered into by the Commissioners under the before-recited Acts. or either of them, shall remain valid and binding upon the Commissioners hereinafter appointed and named, and to be elected and chosen in Manner hereinafter mentioned for executing this Act, and be chargeable upon the Rates and Assessments hereinafter authorized to be levied; and that the whole Property heritable and moveable, of whatever Description, which was acquired by and vested in the Commissioners under the beforerecited Acts now repealed, shall and the same is hereby declared to belong to and be vested in the Commissioners under this Act, for executing the Purposes thereof: Provided further, that the whole Rates assessed, and Monies levied, in virtue of the before-recited Acts, now repealed, or either of them, and all Arrears of the same, shall be and the same are hereby vested in and made payable to the Commissioners acting under the Authority of this Act; and also that all Monies payable to the Collector

And be it further enacted, That the said Commissioners shall Commissionhold Four stated General Meetings in the Year for carrying this Act into ers to hold Execution, that is to say, on the Second Mondays of July, October, January, and April, within the Council Chamber of Leith, or such other Place within the Bounds and Limits comprehended under this Act as the Commissioners under this Act shall fix, with Power to adjourn to such Times and Places as to the Commissioners present shall seem expedient; and in the Event of such Adjournment taking place, the Clerk to the said Commissioners shall summon the said Commissioners to such adjourned Meetings, by causing Notices to be served in the Way and Manner hereinafter prescribed for the calling of Special Meetings authorized by this Act.

XL. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful to any Three of the ex officio Commissioners under this Act, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, by themselves, or by Requisition upon the Clerk as aforesaid, to call a Special Meeting of the said Commissioners at any Time they may think fit, by the delivering or leaving, or causing to be delivered or left, Notices in the same Way and at the like Distance of Time as is hereinbefore directed in regard to the calling Special Meetings.

Acts not to be inconsistentwith Acts of General Meeting. Quorum.

XLI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing shall be done at the said Special Meetings which may be derogatory from or inconsistent with the Acts, Orders, or Regulations of any of the said stated General Meetings: Provided further, that Seven Commissioners must be present at all and each of the Quarterly, Adjourned, and Special Meetings, to constitute a Quorum.

Power to appoint Committees.

XLII. And be it further enacted, That the aforesaid Commissioners shall and they are hereby authorized and empowered, if it appears to them to be necessary, to form Committees of their Number for carrying the various Purposes of this Act into more prompt and immediate Execution, and to remit and delegate to such Committees the whole Powers competent to the said Commissioners under this Act, or in such other Way and Manner as they shall consider expedient and proper with regard to the Subject which may be remitted; to name the Convener, and to fix the Number of Members of said Committees who shall form a Quorum; and where any Meeting of a Committee is called, and the requisite Number of Members, or Quorum, shall attend, they shall be entitled to proceed with the Business remitted to them in the same Manner as if the whole Members of such Committee were present; and the Convener or Conveners of such Committee or Committees shall be entitled to convene the Members by Notices, or in the Way they shall think most convenient.

or Matter concerning this Act; and such Books or Records shall be open and liable to the Inspection of any Person interested therein without Payment of any Fee or Reward, and the Clerk shall always when required give certified Copies or Extracts therefrom upon Payment of such reasonable Sum as shall be fixed by the said Commissioners, not exceeding One Shilling for every Three hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts.

XLV. And be it further enacted, That the Commissioners shall in Treasurer like Manner annually, at their first Meeting, elect and appoint a and Col-Treasurer and Collector, and that during their Pleasure; and such appointed. LXVII. And whereas the Commissioners of Police acting under the said recited Acts hereby repealed have come under a Guarantee to the Edinburgh Water Company, incorporated by an Act of the Fifty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, which was amended by an Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for more effectually supplying the City of Edinburgh and Places adjacent with Water, and for supplying the Town and Port of Leith and Places adjacent and His Majesty's Duck Tard at Leith with Water: And whereas it is just and reasonable that the Commissioners of Police who have come under such Guarantee as aforesaid should be indemnified and secured against all personal or individual Responsibility arising or to arise from their so doing, and that any pecuniary Demand under the said Guarantee, if any such shall arise, should be defrayed out of the Assessments already imposed under the Authority of the said last-recited Acts hereby repealed, or that may be levied in virtue hereof; be it therefore enacted, That the Commissioners appointed and named and to be elected and chosen under this present Act, shall be entitled, and they are hereby authorized and required, to apply the Funds raised and levied under the said recited Acts hereby repealed, and now vested in the said Commissioners, or the Monies or Assessments to be levied under the present Act, in Payment of any Debt already incurred or that may be incurred to the said Edinburgh Water Company under the Guarantee aforesaid.

And be it further enacted, That the Proprietor or Proprietors Water Pipes of any Floor or Flats shall be entitled to have a Service Pipe from the Main Water Pipe in the Street (paying therefor the Water Rate lawfully exigible) brought up, at the Sight of the Engineer of the Edinburgh Water Company, along the inside back Wall of the Tenement of which such Floor or Flat forms a Part, and passing under Ground, where necessary, through the sunk Story or lowest Flat of such Tenement, or brought up by the inside Stair, or in such other Way as the said Engineer shall direct: Provided always, that Authority shall first be obtained from the said Commissioners for laying and putting up such Pipe, and that the Expence thereof, and of keeping it in Repair, and of the Damage occasioned thereby, shall be defrayed by the Person or Persons using the same, according to their respective Rents, as fixed by the Books of Assessment.

LXIX. And whereas, if it shall appear at any Time unnecessary or inexpedient, in consequence of the Supply of Water already provided or to be hereafter provided by the said Edinburgh Water Company, to maintain and keep up the present Water Establishment in Leith, vested in the Commissioners of Police under the said recited Acts hereby repealed; be it enacted, That such Water Establishment shall be and is hereby vested in the said Commissioners appointed and named and to be elected and chosen under this Act, who shall have Power and are hereby authorized to abolish the Whole or such of the Public Wells belonging to the said Establishment, and situated within the Bounds of Police, as they may judge fit and proper, and to sell and dispose of the Whole or such Part of the said Water Establishment, including

Water Houses, Cisterns, Water Pipes, and all other Works or Erections, or other Materials or Apparatus, of whatever Name or Denomination, which belong to or form Part of, or is or are used in the present Water Establishment, as they may think fit, and at such Prices as they can obtain for the same; the Price or Money to be paid to the Commissioners therefor to be accounted for and to be applied by them to the like Purposes and in the like Manner as the other Monies leviable under this Act are directed to be accounted for or applied: Provided always, that it shall only be lawful for the said Commissioners to exercise the Power hereby conferred upon them, to abolish the Public Wells and to dispose of the present Water Establishment, after a Supply of Water for the Dwelling Houses of such of the said Inhabitants of Leith as shall have applied or may apply for the same, shall have been introduced by the said Edinburgh Water Company under the Agreement and Guarantee aforesaid: Provided also, that until such Time as the said Commissioners shall deem it proper and expedient to abolish the said Public Wells and dispose of the said Water Establishment, they shall be entitled and they are hereby authorized to defray, from the Rates and Assessments to be levied in virtue hereof, all the necessary Expences connected with the upholding and maintaining of the said Water Establishment; saving always and reserving to all and every Person and Persons, Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, all and whatever Right or Claim of Right any such Person or Persons or Body or Bodies have or may claim to have in, to, or concerning the Water of Lochend, or other Springs or Sources connected with the said Water Establishment.

LXX. And be it further enacted, That the Commissioners appointed Commisand named, and to be elected and chosen under the present Act, shall sioners to have Power and are hereby authorized to take under their Direction and provide Fire Management all the Fire Engines, Pipes, and other Apparatus used in the extinguishing of Fires, provided under the said recited Acts hereby repealed, and to provide One or more Fire Engines and Fire Cocks or Plugs, as the said Commissioners may judge necessary for the Use of the Inhabitants and Protection of their Property situated within the Bounds described by this Act, and to apply such Parts of the Assessments hereby authorized to be levied as may be necessary for the purchasing, upholding, and Management and keeping of the said Engines.

LXXXVII. Inhabitants, with Power to the said Commissioners to rent or purchase Depots for that Purpose within or without the Bounds described by this Act, from such Person or Persons as may be willing to contract and agree with them therefor, and to make and enact such Rules and Regulations as they shall from Time to Time consider necessary and proper for their Order and Government, for regulating the Time and Manner of paving, sweeping, and cleansing the different Streets, Roads, Lanes, and Places within the said District, and for prohibiting and preventing the Inhabitants from throwing out and laying down upon the said Streets, Roads, Lanes, Closes, and other Places, any Dung, Ashes, Filth, Rubbish, Stones, or other Nuisance, and generally for the Enforcement and effectual Execution of the Purposes of this Act, under a Penalty not exceeding Twenty Shillings.

Power to open Streets for laying Pipes.

XCIV. And be it further enacted, That in case it shall be necessary, for the Purpose of laying Pipes for the Service of the said Town with Water, or for any other Purposes, that the Streets within the said Bounds and Limits, or any Part thereof, should be opened, it shall be in the Power of the said Commissioners, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to grant Warrant for that Purpose, on the Application of the Intendant, or of any Party or Parties suing therefor.

Holes or Openings. in Streets and Building Materials to be fenced and lighted.

XCV. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Intendant of Police, and Persons acting under his Orders, and they are hereby required to provide, that where any House shall be building or repairing, or other Reparations of the like Kind carrying on, the Foundations or Grounds adjoining shall be fenced in, so that the Inhabitants may run no Risk of Danger from the same; and in case any Hole or Opening shall be made in any of the Streets, Lanes, Passages, Squares, or Public Places of the said Town and Places within the Limits of this Act, for the Purpose of digging Foundations for building, for paving the Streets, for digging Wells, Drains, laying Pipes, or any other Purposes, the Persons or Body Corporate making or causing to be made such Holes or Openings, and the Persons employed or concerned therein, shall at their own Expence cause a sufficient Rail or Fence to be put round The such Holes or Openings, and shall also cause a Lamp or Lamps, Light or Lights, to be affixed at or near the same, to be kept burning every Night that such Holes or Openings shall remain unfilled up from Sun-setting to Sun-rising; and in case any of the said Persons or Bodies Corporate aforesaid shall refuse or neglect to fence such Foundations or Holes, or to affix and keep burning such Lamps or Lights in Manner aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful for the Resident Magistrates or any of them, or the Sheriff Substitute aforesaid, on the Complaint of the said Intendant, to decern the Person or Body Corporate so Two fending to pay any Sum not exceeding Two Pounds for each Day or Night that the same may remain without a sufficient Rail or Fence and Light during the Night; and also to order such Foundations, Holes, or Openings to be fenced, and Lamps or Lights to be affixed and kept burning, at the Expence of the Persons employed or concerned therein; reserving always to any Persons who may suffer Injury by such Operations to prosecute for Reparation and Damages according to Law.

XCVI. And be it further enacted, That when any House or Tenement. Pavements adjoining to the Street is to be taken down or unroofed, the Pro- to be fenced prietor or Proprietors thereof, or the Person or Persons carrying on such when Houses Works, shall erect and keep in Repair a Fence round the Foot Pavement down or unwhich is opposite to such House or Tenement, during the whole Time roofed. such Works are carrying on, under the Penalty of Five Shillings Sterling for each Day's Failure; and the said Commissioners or their Intendant shall order and direct such Foot Pavement so to be fenced in at the Expence of those carrying on such Works, and the Extent. of the Space to be so fenced in shall be fixed by the said. Magistrates or any of them, or the Sheriff Substitute; and no Part of any Street or Road shall be so occupied without a Warrant being previously obtained, under the Penalty of Two Pounds for each Transgression, over and above all Damages which may be any way incurred by the Person or Persons so contravening.

XCVII. And be it further enacted, That if any Person or Persons shall No Carts or place, or leave or cause to be placed or left, upon any Quay, or any Carriages, Street, Road, Lane, Passage, or Side Pavement within the foresaid &c. to be left on the District, any Cart or Carriage of any Description, or any Lead, Iron, Quays, Wood, Goods, Commodities, Provisions, or other Articles, Matter, or Streets, &c. Thing whatever, which may be calculated or considered to render dangerous or obstruct the free and commodious Passage through or along such Quays, Streets, Roads, Lanes, Passages, or Side Pavements, (except where Permission is granted by the said Magistrates or the Sheriff Substitute, or any One of them,) the Person or Persons so offending shall be liable in a Fine not exceeding One Pound Sterling for each Offence; and it shall be in the Power of the Intendant acting under this Act to cause all such Articles to be immediately removed, at the Expence of the Person or Persons so offending, and to detain the same, if he shall consider it necessary, till such Expences, and the Fine which may be imposed, are paid.

Competency of Actions.

CLI. And be it further enacted, That no Action shall lie or be competent against the said Judge officiating as aforesaid, Commissioners, or any other Person or Persons, for any thing done in the Execution of this Act, unless wilful Corruption or Oppression be alleged or charged; nor in any Court shall such Action be competent after Three Calendar Months from the Time the alleged Fact is committed.

CLII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Lands belonging to the Trustees of George Steel's Hospital, Part of the Lands of Hermitage, shall not be deemed or taken to be included within the Limits of the said District of the Town of Leith.

Saving Jurisdiction of Sheriffs, &c. CLIV. And be it further enacted, That all Judges, Sheriffs, Justices of the Peace, Magistrates, with their Officers, Messengers at Arms, and all other Officers and Executioners of the Law whatsoever, and every of them, are hereby required to be aiding and assisting in putting this Act into due and effectual Execution: Saving and reserving the Jurisdiction of the Sheriff Depute of the Shire of Edinburgh and his Substitutes, and the Justices of the Peace thereof, and to the City of Edinburgh and Magistrates and Community thereof, and to their Clerks of South and North Leith, to the Burgh of Canongate, and all other Parties, all Rights and Jurisdictions and Privileges presently possessed and legally enjoyed by them within the Towns of South and North Leith, and the other Places mentioned in this Act respectively.
