An Act for more effectually repairing, widening, and improving the Road from Cosham in the County of Southampton to the City of Chichester.

[21st March 1827.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-sixth Year of the HEREAS an Act was passed in the Forty-sixth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act for repealing Two Acts passed in the Second and 46 G.3. c. 46. Twenty-fourth Years of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road from Cosham in the County of Southampton to the City of Chichester, and for more effectually repairing the said Road: And whereas a considerable Sum has been borrowed and is now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken by the said Act, and the said Road is now out of repair, and cannot be sufficiently widened, altered, diverted, improved, and kept in repair, nor can the Money so borrowed, with the Interest thereon, be discharged, unless further Provisions be made for those Purposes: And whereas an Act was passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act to amend the General Laws now in being for regu- 3 G.4. c. 126. lating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England: And whereas another Act was passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act to explain and amend an 4 G. 4. c. 95. Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, to amend the General Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England: And whereas another Act was passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled  $\lceil Local. \rceil$ 

5 G. 4. c. 69. intituled An Act to enable Justices of the Peace for Ridings, Divisions, or Sokes, to act as Thustees for remaining and maintaining Turnpike Roads: And whereas some Part of the Road comprized in the said first-recited Act is narrow and inconvenient and it would be of public Utility if the same was widened, and if other Part of the same Road was shortened and improved; and it would be more convenient if the said best recited Act were repealed, and more effectual break made for repairing, maintaining, diverting, widening, and improving the said Road in manner herein-after mentioned: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the Third Saturday next after the passing of this Act, the said recited Act made in the Forty-sixth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and from thenceforth this Act shall commence and take effect, and be put in execution for and during the Term herein-after mentioned, for the Purpose of making, amending, altering, diverting, turning, widening, improving, and keeping in repair the Road from Cosham in the County of Southampton, through the Parishes of Widley, Wymering, Farlington, Bedhampton, Havant, and Warblington, in the said County of Southampton, and Westbourne, Funtington, Childham, Bosham, New Fishbourne, and Saint Bartholomew, in the County of Sussex, to the said City of Chichester.

II. And be it further enacted. And be it further enacted, That this Act, and the Term and Tolls hereby granted and made payable, shall be and they are hereby declared to be subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies which have been borrowed and are now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken by the said recited Act of the Forty-sixth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, and of all Interest due and to grow due thereon, as fully and effectually to all Intents and Purposes as if such Monies had been borrowed and become due on the Credit of this Act, or the Tolls hereby authorized to be collected.

IV. And be it further enacted, That all Bonds, Covenants, Agreements, Contracts, Securities, and Debts entered into or owing by any Person or Persons with or to the Trustees for executing the said recited Act hereby repealed, shall remain in full Force and Effect, tinue in force. and be and continue available in all Courts of Law and Equity, until the same are fully satisfied and performed on account of and for the Benefit of the Trustees of this Act; and all Contracts or Agreements duly made or entered into by the Trustees of the said recited Act hereby repealed, to or with any Person or Persons, shall remain in full Force and Effect, and be observed and kept by the Trustees for executing this Act, according to the Terms or Stipulations thereof respectively; the Repeal of the said former Act, or any Law to the contrary notwithstanding.

And be it further enacted, That all and every the Books and Books kept Book of Proceedings which have been kept by the Trustees acting under former in the Execution of the said recited Act hereby repealed, or by their Act to be Evidence. Treasurer or Clerk under their Direction, according to the Provisions of such Act, and made Evidence thereby, shall be admitted as Evidence in all Courts, and by all Judges, Justices, and others.

VI. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees may receive Old Mortin and cancel all or any of the Mortgages now standing out, and gages may instead and in lieu thereof respectively give and execute another be called in, Mortgage or other Mortgages, at the Expence of the Parties granted. requiring the same, upon the Tolls of the said Road granted by this Act.

VII. And whereas divers Creditors on the said Road may have Where old lost or mislaid the Mortgages or Assignments of the Tolls executed Securities by the Trustees for securing to him, her, or them the Principal Money lent on the Credit of the said Act hereby repealed, or the executed. Tolls thereby granted, with Interest for the same, or the Transfer of such Mortgages or Assignments; and it is reasonable that in Cases where it can be proved to the Satisfaction of the Trustees, that any Person is truly and bona fide entitled to any Sum or Sums of Money secured on the Tolls granted by the said last-mentioned Act, although they may not be able to produce the said Mortgage Security, that another Assignment of the Tolls hereby granted shall be executed, for the securing the Repayment of the Money now due on the Credit of the said Act, or the Tolls thereby granted; be it therefore further enacted, That in all Cases where it shall appear, by the Books kept by the Clerk or Treasurer to the said Trustees for executing this Act, or by any other satisfactory Evidence, adduced at any Meeting of the said Trustees, that any Person or Persons is or are a Creditor or Creditors on Security of the Tolls authorized by the said Act hereby repealed to be taken on the Road comprized in this Act, and that the Mortgage or Assignment of the Tolls for securing any such Sum or Sums of Money, or the Transfer thereof, has been lost, mislaid, or by Accident destroyed, it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Three or more of them, to execute, at the Expence of the Person or Persons applying for the same, an Assignment of the Tolls by this Act granted, for the Sum or Sums of Money mentioned

Purpose thereof Fourteen Days Notice shall be given in manner directed by the said recited Act of the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty with respect to Meetings for the Appointment of Trustees on Vacancies), to elect and appoint any Number of Persons, not exceeding Five, to be Trustees for executing this Act, in addition to the Trustees hereby appointed; and such Persons so elected and appointed, and being duly qualified, shall be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, and they are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act, as if they had been named and appointed Trustees in and by this Act.

X. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall meet Meetings of at the Swan Inn in the City of Chichester aforesaid, or at some other Trustees. convenient Place in the said City, on the Second Saturday next after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, between the Hours of Eleven in the Morning and Two in the Afternoon, and shall then and there proceed to put this Act into Execution; and shall and may then and from Time to Time afterwards adjourn to and meet at such Times, and at such Places upon or near to any Part of the said Road, as they shall think proper.

XI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That each and every Treasurer who shall have been appointed consistently with the Provisions of the said recited Acts, and not contrary to the Provisions and Directions of this Act, and each and every Clerk, Trustees. Receiver, Collector, Surveyor, and other Officer appointed under and by virtue of the said Act hereby repealed, shall hold and enjoy [Local.] such

such their several and respective Offices and Employments until removed therefrom by the Trustees for executing this Act; and each and every such Treasurer, Clerk, Receiver, Collector, Surveyor, and other Officer, shall have the like Power and Authority for the Purposes of this Act, and for carrying the same into Execution, and shall be subject to the like Pains and Penalties, and to the like Power of Removal, and to the like Rules and Regulations in all respects whatsoever, as if he had been appointed by virtue of this Act.

XII. And be it further enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Trustees to continue or appoint the Person or Persons who has or have been or may be appointed their Clerk or Clerks in the Execution of this Act, or the Partner or Partners of any such Clerk or Clerks, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Clerk or Clerks, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of the Partner or Partners of such Clerk or Clerks, the Treasurer or Treas surers for the Purposes of this Act, or to continue or appoint any Person or Persons who has or have been or may be appointed Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Partner or Partners of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, the Clerk or Clerks to the said Trustees; and if any Person shall accept both the Offices of Clerk and Treasurer for the Purposes of this Act, or if any Person or Persons, being the Partner or Partners of any such Clerk or Clerks, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Clerk or Clerks, shall accept the Office of Treasurer, or being the Partner or Partners of any such Treasurers, or the Clerk or Clerks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of any such Treasurer or Treasurers, or the Clork or Clorks or other Person or Persons in the Service or Employ of the Bartner or Partners of such Treasurer or Treasurers, shall accept the Office of Elerk in the Execution of this Act, or if any such Treasurer shall hold or accept any other Place or Office of Profit or Trust under the said Trustees, every such Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay the Sum of One hundred Pounds to any Person or Persons who shall sue for the same, to be recovered with full Costs of Suit in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster, by Action of Debt or on the Case, or by Bill, Suit, or Information, wherein no Essoign, Protection, or Wager of Law, nor more than One Imparlance, shall be allowed.

Power to continue and erect Toll Gates, Toll

XIII. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall and may and they are hereby authorized and empowered to continue or remove all or any of the Toll Gates, Toll Houses, Turnpikes, Bars, Houses, &c. or Chains now standing in, upon, or across the said Road, and also from Time to Time to erect and set up, or cause to be erected and set up, in, upon, or across the said Road, or any Part thereof, or on the Sides thereof, when, where, and as the said Trustees shall judge necessary or expedient, any Toll Gate or Toll Gates, Turnpike or Turnpikes, Bar or Bars, Chain or Chains, or any Weighing Machine or Weighing Machines, and also to erect or provide a Toll House or Toll Houses, with suitable Outbuildings, Lamps, and Conveniences thereto,

thereto, and to take in and inclose from the Sides of the said Road convenient Garden Plats to the said Toll Houses respectively, not exceeding One Eighth Part of a Statute Acre for each Toll House; and from Time to Time afterwards to remove, alter, or discontinue such Turnpikes, Toll Gates, Bars, Chains, or Toll Houses, or any of them, as they the said Trustees shall think proper and expedient.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That upon and from and after Power to the Third Saturday next after the passing of this Act, the respective take Tolls. Tolls following shall (subject nevertheless to any Order which shall be made respecting the same at the first Meeting of the said Trustees, and subject thereafter to the Provisions, Restrictions, and Exemptions in this Act and in the said recited Acts of the Third and Fourth Years of His present Majesty contained,) be demanded and taken at each and every Turnpike, Toll Gate, and Side Gate, Bar or Chain, to be continued or erected upon, across, or on the Side or Sides of the said Road, by such Person or Persons as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time appoint to receive the same, before any Horse, Beast, Cattle, Coach, Cart, or other Carriage shall be permitted to pass through any such Turnpike, Toll Gate, or Side Gate, Bar or Chain; (that is to say,)

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Coach, Chariot, Landau, Tolls. Berlin, Chaise, Curricle, Calash, Hearse, or other such Carriage, the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Chaise, Chair, Taxed Cart, Market Cart, or other Cart for conveying Passengers or light

Goods, the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny:

For every Horse or Mule, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of One Penny:

For every Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of One Halfpenny:

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, the Sum of One Shilling and Eight-pence per Score, and so in proportion for a greater or less Number:

For every Drove of Calves, Hogs, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Ten-pence per Score, and so in proportion for a greater or less Number:

For every Horse or other Beast (except an Ass) drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth or Gauge of Nine Inches, and rolling a Surface of that Breadth so flat or level as not to deviate more than an Inch from a flat Surface, the Sum of Three-pence; and for every Ass drawing any such Carriage, the Sum of One Penny Halfpenny:

For every Horse or other Beast (except an Ass) drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth or Gauge of Six Inches, and less than Nine Inches, and rolling such Surface as aforesaid, the Sum of Four-pence; and for every Ass drawing any such Carriage, the Sum of Two-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast (except an Ass) drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom

Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth or Gauge of Four and a Half Inches, and less than Six Inches, the Sum of Five-pence; and for every Ass drawing any such Carriage,

the Sum of Two-pence Halfpenny:

For every Horse or other Beast (except an Ass) drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, having the Sole or Bottom of the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of a less Breadth or Gauge than Four and a Half Inches, the Sum of Five-pence Halfpenny; and for every Ass drawing any such Carriage, the Sum of Two-pence Three Farthings:

And such respective Tolls or Sums of Money shall be and they are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and shall be applied in manner herein-after directed.

Tolls to be paid but Once for passing and repassing on the same Day;

XV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if any Person shall have paid the Toll hereby authorized to be taken for the passing of any Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage through any one of the Turnpikes or Toll Gates, Bars or Chains, to be continued or erected by virtue of this Act, such Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage shall (upon a Ticket being produced denoting such Payment for that Day, and which Ticket the Collector or Collectors of such Toll is and are hereby required to deliver gratis to the Person paying the same, and whereon shall be named and specified the Gate at which the same shall have been paid, and also the Gate or Gates, if any, freed by the Payment of such Toll,) be permitted to pass Toll-free through the same Toll Gate, and also through such other Gate or Gates as the Ticket for such Payment shall free, at any Time during the same Day, except as herein-after provided: Provided always, that all and every Person or Persons who shall have passed and repassed Once in after passing the same Day through the same Turnpike or Toll Gate, Bar or Chain as aforesaid, shall be subject and liable to the Payment of the like Toll for every Time such Horses, Cattle, Beasts, or Carriages shall afterwards pass and repass through the same Turnpike or Toll Gate, Bar or Chain, during the same Day, (any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding).

Number of Tolls limited.

XVI. Provided nevertheless, and be it further enacted, That no more than Two full Tolls shall be demanded or taken from any Person or Persons for passing and repassing with the same Horses, Cattle, Beasts, and Carriages, on the same Day, through all the Turnpikes, Toll Gates, or Bars to be continued or erected on the whole Extent of the Road to be repaired by virtue of this Act.

Stage Coaches, Post Chaises, &c.

XVII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for and in respect of all Horses or Cattle drawing any Stage Coach, Van, Caravan, or Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage conveying Passengers or Goods for Pay or Reward, for every Time of passing or repassing along the said Road; and also for or in respect of all Horses or other Beasts travelling for Hire, drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage travelling for Hire, for every Time of passing or repassing along the said Road, whenever a new Hiring thereof shall have taken place.

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That no Toll shall be demanded Exemptions. or taken for or in respect of any Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, employed in carrying or conveying, or going to fetch, carry, or convey, or returning from carrying or conveying, having been employed only in carrying or conveying, on the same Day, nor for any Horse or Horses employed in carrying or conveying, any Corn, Grist, Barley, or Malt, of the Owner's own Growth, to or from any Corn Mill or Kiln situate within any of the Parishes, Hamlets, or Places in which any Part of the said Road may lie, for the Grower's own Consumption only, and not for Sale, within the Distance of Two Miles.

XIX. And whereas Maps or Plans describing the present Road, Maps and and the proposed Alterations and Improvements therein, and the Plans, with Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments through or over which the Reference, same are intended to be made or carried, together with Books of deposited. Reference containing the Names of the Owners or reputed Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, have been deposited with the respective Clerks of the Peace for the Counties of Southampton and Sussex; be it therefore enacted, That the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the said respective Clerks of the Peace, to the end that all Persons may, at all seasonable Times, have liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and take Copies thereof or Extracts therefrom at their Will and Pleasure, paying to such Clerk of the Peace One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts: Provided always, that the said Trustees, in widening and altering the said Road, shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards from the Line described in the said Maps or Plans, without the Consent in Writing of the Person or Persons, Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Lands or Grounds such Deviation shall be made.

XX. XXIII.
