An Act for repairing the Road leading from *Ipswich* to *South Town*, and from the said Road, at or near *Beech Lane* in the Parish of *Darsham*, to *Bungay* in the County of *Suffolk*. [13th May 1828.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled *An Act for amending and keeping in repair the Road leading from Ipswich to South Town, and from the said Road at Beech Lane in the Parish of Darsham to Bungay in the County of Suffolk*: And whereas another Act was passed in the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, intituled *An Act to revive and continue the Term and Powers of an Act passed in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for amending the Road leading from Ipswich to South Town, and from the said Road at Beech Lane in the Parish of Darsham to Bungay in the County of Suffolk*: And whereas the Trustees appointed in or by virtue of the said recited Acts have proceeded in the Execution thereof, and have from Time to Time for that Purpose borrowed several considerable Sums of Money on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be taken on the said Road, Part of which Money still remains due and owing, and the same cannot be repaid, nor can the said Road be effectually amended and kept in repair, unless the Terms and Powers of the said Acts are enlarged, and

the Tolls increased or regulated: And whereas, in consequence of the Inroad made by the Sea upon the Town of *Pakefield* in the County of *Suffolk*, through which Part of the said Road passes, it has become necessary that such Road should be altered and diverted; and it would be of Public Utility if Power were given to make such Diversion from and out of the present Turnpike Road at or near a certain Point where a Road leading from *Mutford* and adjacent Parishes falls into the said main Line of Road, about Twenty-two Yards to the Eastward of a certain Barn in *Pakefield*, belonging to *John Borrett*, and now in the Occupation of *William Foreman*, over and through the Lands of the Reverend *John Grove Spurgeon*, *Abraham Scales*, and *William Morris*, in the Parishes of *Pakefield* and *Kirkley* otherwise *Kirtley*, or one of them, into the present Road near *Kirkley* otherwise *Kirtley Church*, at the North East Corner of a Field belonging to the said *William Morris*: And whereas Part of the said Road passing through the Parish of *Martlesham* in the said County, between certain Buildings and Gardens, the Property of *Zedekiah Balls*, *William Perry*, *Freeman Widow*, and *Letitia Barker*, is narrow and inconvenient, and it would be of Public Utility if Power were given to widen and improve the same: And whereas an Act was passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled *An Act to amend the General Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England*: And whereas another Act was passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled *An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, to amend the General Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England*: And whereas another Act was passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled *An Act to enable Justices of the Peace for Ridings, Divisions, or Sokes, to act as Trustees for repairing and maintaining Turnpike Roads*: And whereas another Act was passed in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled *An Act to amend the Acts for regulating Turnpike Roads in England*: And whereas it would facilitate the Execution of the Purposes aforesaid if the said Two first-recited Acts were repealed, and if further and other Powers and Provisions were granted instead thereof, for the Repair of the said Roads, and for making the Diversion and Improvement herein-before mentioned: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That upon the Tenth Day of *July* after the passing of this Act the said recited Acts passed in the Twenty-fifth and Forty-seventh Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George the Third* shall be and the same are hereby declared to be repealed.

II. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be put in execution for and during the Term herein-after mentioned; for the Purpose of more effectually amending, widening, improving, and keeping in repair the present Turnpike Road commencing at a Point on the Eastern Part of a certain Street called *Rotten Row*, in *Ipswich* aforesaid, between the Dwelling House and Premises of *Joseph Parke* Coach-

Coachmaker and a certain Inn called the *Chaise and Pair* on the one Side and a certain Inn called the *Post Chaise* on the other, and thence leading to *South Town* in the said County of *Suffolk*, and from the said Road at or near *Beech Lane* in the Parish of *Darsham* to *Bungay* in the same County; and also for making and maintaining the said new Branch or Diversion of Road in or through the Parishes of *Pakefield* and *Kirkley* otherwise *Kirtley*, and for effecting the before-mentioned Improvement of the said Road in the Parish of *Martlesham*, and the several other Purposes of this Act.

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act, and the Term and Tolls hereby granted, shall be and the same are hereby made subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies heretofore borrowed for making, repairing, and maintaining such Road, and now due and owing upon the Credit or on Account of the said Acts hereby repealed, or either of them, or secured upon or made payable out of the Tolls thereby authorized to be taken upon the said Road, and of all Interest due and to grow due thereon, as fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purposes, as if such Monies had been borrowed and become due on the Credit of this Act, or of the Tolls hereby authorized to be collected.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the said recited Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, and all and every the Powers, Provisions, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Payments, Remedies, Matters, and Things therein contained, (save and except such Parts thereof as are varied, altered, or repealed,) and also the said recited Act passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, and all and every the Powers, Provisions, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Payments, Remedies, Matters, and Things therein contained, (save and except such Parts thereof as are varied, altered, or repealed,) and also the said recited Act passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, and also the said recited Act passed in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, and all and every the Powers, Provisions, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Payments, Remedies, Matters, and Things therein respectively contained, (save and except such Parts thereof as are varied, altered, or repealed,) shall respectively be as good, valid, and effectual, for carrying this Act into Execution, as if the same had been repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this Act.

V. And be it further enacted, That all Arrears of Tolls or Rents, or other Monies due to, and Property Real or Personal, and all Choses in and Rights of Action, either at Law or in Equity, vested in the said Trustees under the said Two first-recited Acts or either of them, shall immediately on the Commencement of this Act be vested in the Trustees for executing this Act, who shall be and are hereby enabled to sue for and recover the same, and for that Purpose to cause to be commenced and prosecuted all Actions and Suits at Law and in Equity, and to act in respect thereof as effectually as if the same had become due to or had been vested in them under and by virtue of this Act; and all the Costs to be incurred by the Trustees, or Persons in

in whose Names such Proceedings shall be had, shall be paid and defrayed by and out of the Monies to be received by virtue of this Act; and the Monies, when recovered, shall be paid over to the Treasurer or Treasurers of the said Trustees, to be applied for the Purposes of this Act.

VI. And be it further enacted, That all and every the Books and Book of Proceedings which have been kept by the Trustees acting in the Execution of the Acts hereby repealed, or either of them, or by their Treasurer or Clerk under their Direction, according to the Provisions of such Acts, and made Evidence thereby, shall be admitted as Evidence in all Courts, and by all Judges, Justices, and others.

VII. And be it further enacted, That all Bonds, Conveyances, Covenants, Agreements, Contracts, Leases, Mortgages, and Securities made to or by, or entered into by any Person or Persons to or with the Trustees for executing the said recited Acts hereby repealed, or either of them, shall remain in full Force and Effect, and be and continue available in all Courts of Law and Equity, until the same be fully satisfied and performed on account of the Trusts under this Act; and all Bargains, Contracts, Agreements, or Notices, made, entered into, or given by the Trustees for executing the said recited Acts hereby repealed, or either of them, with or to any Person or Persons, for any Purpose relating to the said Road, or to the Execution of such Acts, shall remain in force and effect, and be observed and kept by the Trustees under this Act, and by the other respective Parties to such Contracts, Agreements, or Notices, according to the Terms and Stipulations thereof.

VIII. And whereas some Creditor or Creditors on the said Road may have lost or mislaid the Mortgages or Assignments of the Tolls executed by the Trustees, for securing to him, her, or them the Principal Money lent on the Credit of the said Acts hereby repealed, or the Tolls thereby granted, with Interest for the same, or the Transfers of such Mortgages or Assignments; and it is reasonable that in Cases where it can be proved to the Satisfaction of the Trustees that any Person is truly and *bonâ fide* entitled to any Sum or Sums of Money secured on the Tolls granted by the said last-mentioned Acts, or either of them, although he may not be able to produce the said Mortgage Security, that another Assignment of the Tolls hereby granted shall be executed for securing the Repayment of the Money now due on the Credit of this Act, or the Tolls thereby granted; be it therefore further enacted, That in all Cases where it shall appear by any satisfactory Evidence adduced at any Meeting of the said Trustees, that any Person or Persons is or are a Creditor or Creditors on Security of the Tolls granted by the said Acts hereby repealed, or either of them, and that the Mortgage or Assignment of the Tolls for securing any such Sum or Sums of Money, or the Transfer thereof, has been lost, mislaid, or by Accident destroyed, it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Three or more of them, to execute, at the Expence of the Person or Persons applying for the same, an Assignment of the Tolls by this Act granted for the Sum or Sums of Money

Meetings of
Trustees.

X. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall meet together on the Third *Wednesday* next after the Commencement of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, between the Hours of Ten of the Clock in the Forenoon and Two of the Clock in the Afternoon, at the House called the *Three Tuns*, in *Yoxford* in the said County of *Suffolk*, or at some other convenient Place in or near *Yoxford* aforesaid, and shall then and there proceed to carry this Act into Execution, and shall and may then and from Time to Time afterwards adjourn to and meet at such Times, and at such Place or Places on or near to the said Road, as the said Trustees, or the major Part of them present at any such Meetings, shall think proper and appoint; and the General Annual Meeting of the said Trustees shall be held on the Thirtieth Day of *August* in every Year, unless that Day shall fall on a *Sunday*, in which Case such Meeting shall be held on the Day following.

XI. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, from Time to Time, at any of their Meetings, to elect and appoint any Number of Persons being duly qualified according to the Provisions and Directions of the said recited Acts passed in the Third and Fourth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, not exceeding Three in the whole, in addition to the Number of Trustees herein named and appointed, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act; and such Persons so elected and appointed shall be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, and are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act as if they had been herein named.

XII. And be it further enacted, That every Treasurer appointed according to the Provisions of the said recited Act passed in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, and each and every Clerk, Receiver, Collector, Surveyor, and other Officer appointed under and by virtue of the said Acts hereby repealed; shall hold and enjoy such their several Offices and Employments until removed therefrom by the Trustees for executing this Act; and each and every such Treasurer, Clerk, Receiver, Collector, Surveyor, and other Officer shall have the like Power and Authority for the Purposes of this Act, and for carrying the same into Execution, and shall be subject to the like Pains and Penalties, and to the like Power of Removal, and to the like Rules and Regulations in all respects whatsoever, as if he had been appointed by virtue of this Act.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to continue or to remove all and every or any of the Toll Gates, Turnpikes, Side Bars, and Chains now standing or being in, upon, or across the said Road, or on the Sides thereof; and also from Time to Time to erect and set up, or cause to be erected and set up, in, upon, or across the said Road, or any Part thereof, or on the Sides thereof, when, where, and as the said Trustees shall judge necessary or expedient; any Toll Gate or Toll Gates, Turnpike or Turnpikes, Side Bar or Side Bars, Chain or Chains, and also to continue, or, where need shall be, to erect and build, or cause to be erected and built, proper Toll Houses, with sufficient Outhouses and Conveniences thereto, at or near each and every such Toll Gate, Turnpike, Side Bar, or Chain, and to inclose, on the Sides of the said Road, suitable Gardens, not exceeding One Eighth Part of a Statute Acre each, for the Use and Convenience of the Occupiers of the said Toll Houses; and from Time to Time to take down and remove, or alter and discontinue the aforesaid Toll Gates, Turnpikes, Side Bars, and Chains, Toll Houses and Gardens, or any of them, as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time think proper and expedient.

Power to continue, remove, or erect Turnpikes.

XIV. Provided nevertheless, and be it further enacted, That the several Tolls and Duties granted and made payable by the said secondly-recited Act shall be and continue in force till the Eleventh Day of *October* next after the passing of this Act, when the same shall cease, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding; and upon and from that Day the Tolls following shall be demanded and taken at every Turnpike or Toll Gate erected or to be erected in or upon the said Road by virtue of the said Act or of this Act, before any Horse or other Beast or Cattle shall be permitted to pass through the same; (that is to say,)

Present Tolls to be taken until October next; after which Time the following Tolls shall be taken.

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Beast, drawing any Coach, Chariot, Landau, Barouche, Sociable, Vis-a-vis, Phaeton, Berlin, Chaise, Chaise Marine, Curricule, Calash, Cabriolet, Van, Caravan, Chair, Gig, Whiskey, or Hearse, or any such like Carriage, the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny :

Tolls.

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Beast, and every Pair of Oxen or other Neat Cattle, drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage of the like Nature, except such as are before described, the Sum of Two-pence :

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Beast, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of One Penny :

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or other Neat Cattle, the Sum of Ten-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :

And for every Drove of Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Hogs, or Swine, the Sum of Five-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number :

Which said respective Tolls or Sums of Money shall be demanded and taken as aforesaid before any Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Beast or Cattle, or Carriage, upon which any Toll is by this Act imposed, shall be permitted to pass through any such Turnpike or Toll Gate, Side Bar or Side Gate or Chain; and such respective Tolls or Sums of Money

Money shall be and are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and shall be applied in manner herein-after directed.

XV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if any Person shall have paid the Toll hereby authorized to be taken for the passing of any Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage through any one of the said Toll Gates continued or erected or to be erected by virtue of this Act, such Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage shall, upon a Ticket denoting the Payment thereof for that Day being produced, be permitted to pass Toll-free through the same Toll Gate, and through such other Gate or Gates as the Ticket for such Payment shall free, at any Time or Times during the same Day, to be computed as aforesaid; any thing in this Act contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XVI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to empower the said Trustees to cause more than Six full Tolls to be demanded or taken for or in respect of the Passage of the same Horse, Beast, Cattle, or Carriage, on the same Day, through all the several Turnpikes or Toll Gates now erected or to be erected on the whole Line of the said Road between *Ipswich* and *South Town* aforesaid, nor more than Two full Tolls to be demanded or taken on the like Account, on the same Day, at the Turnpikes or Toll Gates erected or to be erected on the Line of Road leading from *Darsham* to *Bungay* aforesaid.

XVII. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for and in respect of all Horses or Cattle drawing any Stage Coach, Van, Caravan, or Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage conveying Passengers or Goods for Pay or Reward, for every Time of passing or repassing along the said Road; and also for and in respect of all Horses or other Beasts drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage travelling for Hire, for every Time of passing or repassing along the said Road, whenever a new Hiring of such Post Chaise or other Carriage shall have taken place.

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That out of any Monies already received by virtue of the said recited Acts or any of them, or out of the first Monies which shall be raised or received by virtue of this Act, the said Trustees shall in the first place pay and discharge all the Expences and Costs relative to the procuring and passing of this Act; and the Remainder of such Monies shall from Time to Time be employed in erecting Turnpikes, Toll Houses, and Weighing Machines, and in amending, widening, altering, and improving the said Road, and keeping the same in repair, and in defraying all the Charges and Expences of carrying this Act into Execution, and in defraying the Principal Monies by this Act charged or to be borrowed, and the Interest due and to grow due thereon.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to make and carry the said new Line or Diversion of Road, and also the said Improvement, in, upon, over, or through any private Lands or Grounds

Grounds described in the Maps or Plans and Books of Reference herein-after mentioned, and to make the same respectively of such Width as they shall think proper, not exceeding Forty Feet, together with such Footpaths, Causeways, Bridges, Culverts, Fences, Ditches, and Drains as they shall think necessary or expedient; and for the better Execution of such Purpose or Purposes, or any of them, to purchase and take, and to pull down, use, and lay into the said new and improved Lines of Road, any of the Tenements, Yards, Gardens, and Hereditaments mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed, making Satisfaction to the Owners thereof and other Persons interested therein for the same, or for the Damage they may respectively sustain thereby.

XX. And whereas Maps or Plans, describing the Diversion and Improvement herein-before respectively authorized to be made, and the Lands and Hereditaments through or over which the same are intended to be made or carried, have been deposited, together with Books of Reference containing Lists of the Names of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands and Hereditaments, at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of *Suffolk*; be it therefore enacted, That the said Maps or Plans and the said Books of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County, to the end that all Persons may at all seasonable Times have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and take Copies and Extracts thereof, at their Will and Pleasure, paying to such Clerk of the Peace the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Four-pence for every Seventy-two Words of such Copies or Extracts of the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference.

Plans deposited with the Clerk of the Peace to remain there, and be open to Inspection.

XXI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees to make and carry the said Diversion and Improvement into, through, across, or over the Lands of any Person or Persons who is or are or may be Owner or Owners of any Lands over which the same are set out and described in the said Maps or Plans as being intended to be made and carried, although the Name or Names of such Owner or Owners, or of his or their Tenant or Tenants, may happen to be omitted or erroneously stated in the said Books of Reference, in case it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the said County of *Suffolk*, and be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Error or Omission proceeded from Inadvertence or Mistake.

Lands marked in the Plans may be used notwithstanding Errors in the Books of Reference.

XXII. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Powers and Authorities given by this Act, for making the said Diversion and Improvement herein-before respectively mentioned, shall not extend or be construed to extend to empower or authorize the said Trustees to take or use, for any of the Purposes of this Act, any Dwelling House or other Building, or any Garden, Yard, Paddock, Lawn, planted Walk, or Avenue to a House, or any inclosed Ground planted as an Ornament or Shelter to a House, or planted and set apart as a Nursery for Trees, or any Part thereof, without the Consent in Writing of the Owner or Proprietor thereof first had and obtained, except such as are mentioned in the said Schedule to this Act annexed.

XXIII. Provided also; and be it further enacted, That if the said Trustees shall not purchase the Buildings, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments mentioned in the said Schedule within Five Years from the passing of this Act, all the Powers granted by this Act, for purchasing, taking, or using the same, or such of them as shall not have then been purchased, shall cease and determine, save and except with the Consent of the Owners or Proprietors thereof, for the Time being.

XXIV. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall and they are hereby required, in the first instance, to make and erect sufficient Fences on the Sides of the said Road, in all Cases where any new or diverted Line of such Road to be made under the Authority of any of the said recited Acts or this Act shall pass through or over any private Lands or Grounds, or where any Fence shall be taken away for the Purpose of widening and improving any Part of the present Road, or of any new or diverted Line thereof; and after such Fences shall be first made, the same shall be for ever thereafter the Property of the Persons or Parties on whose Lands or Grounds the same shall have been made and erected, and shall be supported and maintained by or at the Expence of the Owners or Occupiers of the Lands or Grounds whereon such Fences shall have been so made and erected; any thing in the said recited Acts, or any of them, contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

XXV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Part of the Tolls by the said recited Acts, or any of them, or by this Act granted, or of the Money to be borrowed on the Credit thereof, shall be laid out or expended in making, repairing, maintaining, lighting, or watching any Highway, Street, Lane, Passage, or Place in any Town through or into which the said Road leads; any thing in this Act contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

XXVI. And be it further enacted, That if any Person or Persons shall hang out any Linen or other Clothes on any Bank, Rail, or Fence adjoining the said Road, every Person so offending shall pay a Sum not exceeding Forty Shillings for every such Offence; and such Penalty shall be levied and recovered (together with the necessary Costs and Charges of levying the same) by the same Ways and Means and in the like Manner as any Penalty or Forfeiture for any other Nuisance committed in or upon any Turnpike Road may by Law be levied or recovered; and one Moiety of such Penalty shall be paid to the Informer, and the other Moiety thereof shall be paid to the Treasurer to the said Trustees, and applied and disposed of for the Purposes of this Act.

XXVII. And be it further enacted, That all Demises or Leases of the Tolls arising on the said Road by this Act authorized to be repaired, and all Bonds and other Securities which have been given for Payment of the Rents reserved by such Leases respectively, and for the Performance of the Covenants and Agreements in such Leases contained on the respective Lessee's Part, shall respectively continue in force until the Eleventh Day of October now next ensuing, on
-on JULY 5 - which

which Day the said respective Leases, Bonds, or other Securities aforesaid shall cease and determine, save as to the Obligations, Covenants, or Agreements for Payment of Rent and Performance of Covenants, in such Leases, Bonds, or Securities, on the respective Lessee's or Obligor's Part to be observed and performed, during the Continuance of such Leases, Bonds, or Securities, by virtue of this Act.

XXVIII. And be it further enacted, That in case any of the Lessees of the said Tolls shall claim to be entitled to any Compensation or Satisfaction for or on account of such Continuance or Determination of his or their Lease or Leases as aforesaid, then, if the said Trustees and such Lessee or Lessees cannot agree as to the Amount of such Compensation or Satisfaction, such Lessee or Lessees may sue for and recover the same, by Action of Debt or on the Case, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at *Westminster*. Differences in vacating Leases, how to be settled.

XXIX. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed Public Act, and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded.

XXX. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence Term of Act. on the Tenth Day of *July* next after the passing thereof, and shall continue and be in force for the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
