CHAPTER xviii.

An Act to confirm a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners for the application or management of the Charities in the City of Winchester called St. John's Hospital and the Allied Charities and the Hospital of St. Mary Magdalen. A.D. 1929.

[10th May 1929.]

WHEREAS the Charity Commissioners in their report to His Majesty of their proceedings during the year nineteen hundred and twenty-eight reported that they had approved and certified a Scheme for the application or management of the charities in the City of Winchester called or known as (1) St. John's Hospital and the Allied Charities and (2) the Hospital of St. Mary Magdalen :

And whereas it is expedient that the said Scheme as the same is fully set out and defined in the schedule to this Act should be confirmed :

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The said Scheme is hereby confirmed Provided always that nothing in this Act or in the said Scheme shall be held to interfere with the ordinary jurisdiction

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SCHEDULE.

A.D. 1929.

Scheme for the application or management of the following Charities in the City of Winchester :—

- (1) *The Charities called St. John's Hospital and the Allied Charities regulated by a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners of the 1st January 1895 as varied by Schemes of the said Commissioners of the 10th May 1907 3rd December 1915 and 25th January 1918 but exclusive of the Educational Branch of the said Charities constituted by an Order made by the said Commissioners on the 10th October 1905 under the Board of Education Act 1899 s. 2 (2);*
- (2) *The Charity called or known as the Hospital of St. Mary Magdalen regulated by a Scheme of the said Commissioners of the 9th June 1925.*

1. *Administration of Charities.*—The above-mentioned charities and the endowments thereof specified in the schedule hereto and all other the endowments (if any) of the said charities shall be consolidated and shall be administered and managed by the body of Trustees hereinafter constituted subject to and in conformity with the provisions of this Scheme under the title of St. John's Hospital and the Allied Charities with which is united the Hospital of St. Mary Magdalen hereinafter referred to as the charities.

2. *Dissolution of Corporation.*—The Corporation called the Master Brethren and Sisters of the Hospital of St. Mary Magdalene near Winchester is hereby dissolved.

3. *Vesting.*—Any lands and hereditaments comprised in this Scheme and not already vested in "the Official Trustee of Charity Lands" are hereby vested in the said Official Trustee for all the estate and interest therein belonging to or held in trust for the charities.

4. *Investment of Cash.*—All sums of cash at any time belonging to the charities and not needed for immediate working purposes shall (unless otherwise ordered) as soon as possible be

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A.D. 1929. — invested under the authority of a further Order of the Charity Commissioners in the name of "the Official Trustees of Charitable Funds."

TRUSTEES.

5. *Trustees.*—The body of Trustees shall when complete consist of fifteen competent persons being—

- One ex-officio Trustee ;
- One nominated Trustee ;
- Seven representative Trustees ; and
- Six coöptative Trustees.

6. *Ex-officio Trustee.*—The ex-officio Trustee shall be—
The MAYOR for the time being of the city of Winchester.

7. *Nominated Trustee.*—Every nominated Trustee shall be nominated in writing by the Lord Bishop of Winchester for the time being and shall hold office for a term of four years.

8. *Representative Trustees.*—The representative Trustees shall (subject as hereinafter provided with respect to the first representative Trustees) be appointed as follows :—

- Six by the council of the city of Winchester ; and
- One by the councillors for the time being elected for St. John's Ward and St. Michael's Ward in the said city.

Each appointment shall be made for a term of four years at a meeting convened and held according to the ordinary practice of the appointing body or in case of need or doubt according to rules made or approved by the Charity Commissioners. The chairman of the meeting shall forthwith cause the name of each person appointed to be notified to the Trustees or their clerk. The person appointed may be but need not be a member of the appointing body.

9. *First Representative Trustees.*—The following persons shall if living at the date of this Scheme and willing to act be the first representative Trustees and shall be entitled subject to the provisions hereinafter contained with respect to determination of trusteeship to hold office for the following periods respectively:—

WILLIAM HOWARD FORDER of Beaufort St. Cross Winchester gentleman until the 7th May 1930 ;

HOWARD ELKINGTON of Fayreacre Worthy Road Winchester gentleman until the 5th January 1931 ;

EMILY FLORENCE FIRMSTONE of Pyotts Cottage Airlie Road Winchester spinster until the 1st January 1930 ;

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ALFRED EDMEADES of Maymyo Bereweke Road Winchester A.D. 1929;
gentleman until the 7th May 1930;

FREDERICK WEBB MANLEY of No. 60 St. Cross Road Winchester gentleman until the 1st February 1930; and

THOMAS HOLT of Westfield Chilbolton Avenue Winchester gentleman until the 6th September 1930.

Appointed by the said Councillors.

WILLIAM HAYWARD of The Old House St. Cross Road Winchester gentleman until the 6th October 1931.

10. *Coöptative Trustees.*—The coöptative Trustees shall be persons residing or carrying on business within the county of Southampton.

11. *First Coöptative Trustees.*—The following persons shall if living at the date of this Scheme and willing to act be the first coöptative Trustees and shall be entitled subject to the provisions hereinafter contained with respect to determination of trusteeship to hold office for the following periods respectively:—

The Right Honourable FRANCIS GEORGE EARL OF NORTH-BROOK until the 3rd April 1933;

Colonel WILLIAM BARROW SIMONDS of Abbots Barton Winchester until the 3rd April 1933;

WILLIAM HENRY MYERS of Swanmore Hants gentleman until the 2nd January 1931;

The Reverend PHILIP ROBERT WICKHAM Vicar of St. John Winchester until the 4th October 1929;

The Reverend Canon ALBERT GOSSAGE ROBINSON of The Close Winchester until the 2nd January 1931; and

PHILIP EDWARD WELLS of No. 11 College Street Winchester gentleman until the 1st July 1932.

12. *Future Coöptative Trustees.*—Every future coöptative Trustee shall be appointed for a term of eight years by a resolution of the Trustees to be passed at a special meeting.

13. *Declaration by Trustees.*—No person shall be entitled to act as a Trustee whether on a first or on any subsequent entry into office until after signing in the minute book of the Trustees a declaration of acceptance and of willingness to act in the trusts of this Scheme.

14. *Determination of Trusteeship.*—Any coöptative Trustee who ceases to be qualified as aforesaid any representative or coöptative Trustee who is absent from all meetings of the Trustees during a period of two consecutive years and any Trustee who is adjudged bankrupt or makes a composition or arrangement

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A.D. 1929. with his creditors or who is incapacitated from acting or who communicates in writing to the Trustees a wish to resign shall thereupon cease to be a Trustee.

15. *Vacancies*.—Upon the occurrence of a vacancy the Trustees shall at their next meeting cause a note thereof to be entered in their minute book and in the case of a vacancy in the office of representative Trustee shall cause notice thereof to be given as soon as possible to the proper appointing body. Any competent Trustee may be re-appointed. No vacancy in the office of coöptative Trustee shall be filled till after the lapse of one calendar month from its occurrence.

MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS OF TRUSTEES.

16. *Ordinary Meetings*.—The Trustees shall hold at least four ordinary meetings in each year.

17. *First Meeting*.—The first meeting of the Trustees shall be summoned by the said mayor or if he fails for two calendar months after the date of this Scheme to summon a meeting by any two of the Trustees.

18. *Chairman*.—The Trustees shall at their first ordinary meeting in each year elect two of their number to be chairman and vice-chairman respectively of their meetings until the commencement of the first ordinary meeting in the following year. The chairman and vice-chairman shall always be eligible for re-election. If at any meeting neither the chairman nor the vice-chairman is present within ten minutes after the time appointed for holding the same or there is no chairman or vice-chairman the Trustees present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of the meeting.

19. *Special Meetings*.—A special meeting may at any time be summoned by the chairman or any two Trustees upon seven days' notice being given to all the other Trustees of the matters to be discussed.

20. *Quorum*.—There shall be a quorum when five Trustees are present at a meeting.

21. *Voting*.—Every matter shall be determined by the majority of votes of the Trustees present and voting on the question. In case of equality of votes the chairman of the meeting shall have a casting vote whether he has or has not previously voted on the same question but no Trustee shall in any other circumstances give more than one vote.

22. *Minutes and Accounts*.—A minute book and books of account shall be provided and kept by the Trustees. All proper

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accounts in relation to the charities shall in each year be made out and certified in such manner as the Charity Commissioners require and copies thereof shall be transmitted to the said Commissioners and published in conformity with the provisions of the Charitable Trusts Acts. A.D. 1929.

23. *General Power to make Regulations.*—Within the limits prescribed by this Scheme the trustees shall have full power from time to time to make regulations for the management of the charities and for the conduct of their business including the summoning of meetings the deposit of money at a proper bank and the custody of documents.

OFFICERS.

24. *Officers.*—The Trustees may from time to time appoint the following officers in connection with the charities and may pay to them respectively the annual salaries hereinafter specified or such other salaries or remuneration as may from time to time be approved by the Charity Commissioners Every officer so appointed shall hold office at the pleasure of the Trustees Subject as herein provided the Trustees shall from time to time prescribe the duties to be performed by each of the said officers.

25. *Chaplain for St. Mary Magdalen Almshouses.*—The Lord Bishop of Winchester for the time being may appoint a chaplain for the St. Mary Magdalen almshouses and may prescribe the duties to be performed by such chaplain Every such chaplain shall hold office at the pleasure of the Lord Bishop of Winchester for the time being and shall be paid by the Trustees such salary not exceeding £50 as the said bishop shall direct A Trustee shall not be appointed chaplain under this clause.

ADDITIONAL ALMSHOUSES.

26. *Erection of additional Almshouses.*—The Trustees may erect on the land belonging to the Charity called the Hospital

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A.D. 1929. — of St. Mary Magdalen and situate in Mant's Lane or on some other site to be approved by the Charity Commissioners six new almshouses to take the place of the existing almshouses belonging to that charity and to be called the St. Mary Magdalen Almshouses and may apply a sum not exceeding £2,500 or such larger sum as may be approved by the said Commissioners in erecting such almshouses Any part of the capital endowments of the charities applied for this purpose shall be replaced out of the income of the charities within such period and in such manner as the said Commissioners shall by a further Order direct.

MANAGEMENT OF LANDS.

27. *Allotments Extension Act 1882.*—The Trustees may set apart and let in allotments in the manner prescribed by and subject to the provisions of the Allotments Extension Act 1882 any portion of the land belonging to the charities other than buildings and the appurtenances of buildings.

28. *Management and Letting of Lands.*—Subject as aforesaid all the lands belonging to the charities not required to be retained or occupied for the purposes thereof shall be let and otherwise managed by the Trustees In every case public notice of the intention to let any land shall be given by the Trustees in such manner as they consider most effectual for ensuring full publicity The Trustees shall not create any tenancy in reversion after more than three years of any existing term or for more than 21 years certain or for less than the improved annual value at rackrent without the sanction of the Charity Commissioners or a competent court.

29. *Leases.*—The Trustees shall provide that on the grant by them of any lease the lessee shall execute a counterpart thereof and every lease shall contain covenants on the part of the lessee for the payment of rent and if necessary the proper cultivation of the land and all other usual and proper covenants applicable to the property comprised therein and a proviso for re-entry on non-payment of the rent or non-performance of the covenants.

30. *Repair and Insurance.*—The Trustees shall keep in repair and insure against fire all the buildings of the charities not required to be kept in repair and insured by the lessees or tenants thereof.

BRANCHES.

31. *Branches.*—For the purpose of convenient administration the charities shall be divided into two branches to be called respectively the Eleemosynary Branch and the Advancement in Life Branch The endowments of the Advancement in Life

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Branch shall consist of the endowments specified in Part II of the schedule hereto the endowments of the Eleemosynary Branch shall consist of the remaining endowments of the charities. A.D. 1929.
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ELEEMOSYNARY BRANCH.

32. *Expenses of Management.*—The Trustees shall out of the yearly income of the Eleemosynary Branch first defray—

- (1) The cost of repairs and insurance and all other charges and outgoings payable in respect of the property of the charities ;
- (2) All the proper costs charges and expenses of and incidental to the administration and management of the charities including the salaries properly payable to the officers of the charities.

33. *Application of Income.*—Subject to the payments aforesaid the yearly income of the Eleemosynary Branch shall be applied by the Trustees to the following objects and in the following order of priority :—

- (1) The payment of the following fixed sums :—

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- (2) The payment of the stipends to and other sums herein authorised to be extended for the benefit of the almspeople of the charities ;
- (3) The appropriation of a yearly sum not exceeding £100 in making grants to charitable societies or institutions in the city of Winchester The amounts and destination of such grants shall be determined annually by the Trustees ;
- (4) The contribution of any sum not exceeding £20 in any one year to the Advancement in Life Branch ;
- (5) The payment of annuities in conformity with the provisions hereinafter contained.

ALMSPEOPLE.

34. *Number of Almspeople &c.*— The full number of almspeople shall be fifty of whom forty-four shall be called the St. John almspeople and six shall be called the St. Mary Magdalen almspeople The forty-four almshouses belonging to the charities called St. John's Hospital and the Allied Charities shall be appropriated for the use of the St. John almspeople and the six new almshouses hereinbefore mentioned when erected and until such erection the existing almshouse buildings belonging to the charity called the Hospital of St. Mary Magdalen shall be appropriated for the use of the St. Mary Magdalen almspeople.

35. *General qualifications of Almspeople.*—All almspeople shall be poor persons of good character who are not at the time of their appointment in receipt of poor-law relief other than medical relief and who from age ill-health accident or infirmity are wholly or in part unable to maintain themselves by their own exertions.

36. *Special qualifications of Almspeople.*—(1) Four of the St. John almspeople shall have resided for the qualifying period in one of the parishes of St. John St. Peter Cheesehill or St. Michael in the city of Winchester In selecting these four almspeople the Trustees shall pay due regard to the population and circumstances of each parish.

(2) Eight of the St. John almspeople shall have resided for the qualifying period in some part of the city of Winchester or the Soke or suburbs thereof.

(3) The St. Mary Magdalen almspeople shall have resided for the qualifying period in the city of Winchester three of the St. Mary Magdalen almspeople shall be men and three women.

(4) In this Scheme the expression "the qualifying period" shall mean the period of ten years next preceding the time of

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appointment or such less period as shall in special cases be approved by the Charity Commissioners. A.D. 1929.

37. *Stipends of Almspeople.*—There shall be paid to each almsperson out of the income of the Eleemosynary Branch by weekly or other periodical payments as the Trustees think fit such a stipend being at the rate of not less than 7s. 6d. a week and not more than 16s. a week as the Trustees may from time to time fix having regard to the needs and circumstances of the respective almspeople and to the income and resources of the said branch Provided that—

- (1) The Trustees instead of paying the whole amount of the stipend to any almsperson in money may from time to time expend the whole or any portion thereof for his or her benefit as they think fit;
- (2) In the case of a person appointed or qualified to be appointed as an almsperson possessing or becoming possessed of a properly secured income from other sources or in receipt of assistance from relations or others the Trustees may fix such a smaller stipend to be payable out of the income of the said branch as they think fit provided that the total income of the recipient shall not be less than the said minimum.

38. *Absence from Almshouses.*—No almsperson shall be absent from the almshouses for a period exceeding 24 hours without the consent in writing of the Trustees or their clerk but in special cases such consent may for any sufficient reason be given retrospectively after the absence has occurred.

39. *Rooms not to be let.*—No almsperson shall be permitted to let or part with the possession of the room or rooms allotted to him or her or except with the special permission of the Trustees to suffer any person to share the occupation of the same or of any part thereof.

40. *Matron.*—The Trustees may if they think fit whenever the income of the said branch suffices for the purpose appoint a matron dismissible at their pleasure to perform such duties as may be necessary for the superintendence and care of the almspeople at such salary as may from time to time be approved by the Charity Commissioners and may allot to the matron a room or rooms in the almshouses as a residence for her while she holds office as matron.

41. *Porter.*—The Trustees may if they think fit appoint a porter dismissible at their pleasure to perform such duties as the Trustees may prescribe at such salary as the Trustees think fit and may allot to the porter a room or rooms in the almshouses as a residence for him while he holds office as porter.

42. *Sanatorium &c.*—The Trustees may if they think fit adapt one of the almshouses for use as a sanatorium for the

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A.D. 1929. almspeople in case of illness and use the same for this purpose
— The Trustees may also provide the almspeople with any necessary attendance in case of illness or permanent infirmity.

43. *Medical Officer.*—The Trustees may if they think fit appoint a medical officer to attend upon the almspeople and to supply them with medicines and such medical appliances as may be necessary at a yearly salary not exceeding £75 inclusive of the cost of such medicines and appliances or in lieu of appointing a medical officer the Trustees may pay to the committee of the provident dispensary at Winchester a yearly subscription or donation of £31 10s. and in addition a sum of 15s. a year in respect of each almsperson having a wife or other dependant living with him in the almshouses and a sum of 8s. 6d. a year in respect of each almsperson living alone in the almshouses in consideration of the medical officers of the dispensary attending upon the almspeople and supplying them with medicines and such medical appliances as may be necessary at the cost of the dispensary.

ANNUITANTS.

44. *Annuitants.*—There shall be three classes of annuitants namely St. Mary Magdalen annuitants widows and dependant annuitants and general annuitants.

45. *General qualifications of Annuitants.*—All annuitants shall be poor persons of good character who are not at the time of their appointment in receipt of poor-law relief other than medical relief and who from age ill-health accident or infirmity are wholly or in part unable to maintain themselves by their own exertions.

46. *Special qualifications &c. of Annuitants.*—(1) The St. Mary Magdalen annuitants shall be two in number of whom one shall be a man and the other a woman they shall have resided for the qualifying period in the city of Winchester The out-pensioners of the charity numbered 2 above at the date of this Scheme shall be the first St. Mary Magdalen annuitants.

(2) Every widow and dependant annuitant shall be the wife or other dependant of a former almsman of the charities who was residing with him in the almshouse buildings at the time of his decease The amount applied in any year in the payment of annuities to widow and dependant annuitants shall not exceed £150.

(3) The general annuitants shall have been born in the city of Winchester or the Soke or suburbs thereof or shall have resided therein for the qualifying period.

47. *Annuities.*—There shall be paid to each annuitant out of the income of the Eleemosynary Branch by weekly or other periodical payments as the Trustees think fit such an annuity

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being in the case of the St. Mary Magdalen annuitants at the rate of not less than £26 a year and not more than £36 a year and in the case of the widow and dependant annuitants and general annuitants at the rate of not less than £10 a year and not more than £20 a year as the Trustees may from time to time fix having regard to the needs and circumstances of the respective annuitants and to the income and resources of the said branch Provided that—

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- (1) The Trustees instead of paying the whole amount of the annuity to any annuitant in money may from time to time expend the whole or any portion thereof for his or her benefit as they think fit;
- (2) In the case of a person appointed or qualified to be appointed as an annuitant possessing or becoming possessed of a properly secured income from other sources or in receipt of assistance from relations or others the Trustees may fix such a smaller annuity to be payable out of the income of the said branch as they think fit provided that the total income of the annuitant shall not be less than the prescribed minimum.

48. *Term of Annuities.*—Each annuitant shall be appointed for a term of three years in the first instance but may be continued as an annuitant by the Trustees if they think fit for a further period of not more than three years at each continuation.

PROVISIONS AS TO ALMSPEOPLE AND ANNUITANTS.

49. *Saving for existing Almspeople and Annuitants.*—Appointments of almspeople and annuitants under this Scheme shall be made without prejudice to the interests of the existing almspeople and annuitants.

50. *Notice of Vacancy.*—No appointment of an almsperson or an annuitant (other than a widow and dependant annuitant) shall be made by the Trustees until a sufficient notice (which may be according to the form annexed hereto) of the vacancy to be filled up specifying the qualifications required from candidates has been published in the city of Winchester by advertisement or otherwise so as to give due publicity to the intended appointment Provided that it shall not be necessary to give notice of any vacancy if such vacancy occurs within twelve calendar months after the last notice of a vacancy among the same class of almspeople or annuitants has been published as aforesaid.

51. *Applications for Appointment.*—All applications for appointment shall be made in the first place in writing in such manner as the Trustees may direct to the Trustees or their clerk and shall be made within one calendar month of the publication

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A.D. 1929. of the notice hereinbefore referred to The clerk shall enter the statement of each applicant on a form provided by the Trustees and shall take such steps as they may direct to verify the statements and shall thereupon prepare and send to each Trustee a list of all applications. No appointment of an almsperson or an annuitant shall be made unless his or her name appears on the list. Except in case of physical disability the Trustees shall before appointing any applicant to be an almsperson or an annuitant require him or her to attend in person. Every applicant must be prepared with sufficient testimonials and other evidence of his or her qualification for the appointment.

52. *Appointments of Almspeople and Annuitants.*—Every appointment of an almsperson or an annuitant shall be made by the Trustees and shall be made at a special meeting to be held as soon as conveniently may be after an interval of one month or such longer period as may in special cases be approved by the Charity Commissioners from the occurrence of the vacancy to be filled up allowing a reasonable time for publication of notice (if the case so requires) and for inquiries as to the applicants.

53. *Selection of Almspeople and Annuitants and Payment of Annuities.*—The almspeople and annuitants shall be selected after full investigation of the character and circumstances of the applicants and inquiry whether they have shown reasonable providence and whether and to what extent they may reasonably expect assistance from relations or others.

The annuities shall be paid subject to such reasonable regulations for ascertaining the identity and good conduct of the annuitants and their continued possession of the required qualifications as the Trustees from time to time prescribe.

For the purposes of this clause the Trustees may avail themselves of the agency of any charity organisation society or other like agency.

54. *Register.*—The Trustees shall provide and keep a book in which shall be entered the name age and description of every person appointed to be an almsperson or an annuitant the date of every appointment and the date and occasion of every vacancy. They shall also keep a register of all applications for appointment.

55. *Removal of Almspeople and Annuitants.*—(1) The following persons shall be removed from being almspeople or annuitants :—

- (a) Any almsperson or annuitant who receives poor-law relief other than medical relief;
- (b) Any almsperson or annuitant detained under lawful authority as a person suffering from mental disease;
- (c) Any almsperson or annuitant becoming an inmate of any poor-law institution for the purpose of receiving medical relief.

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(2) If in the opinion of the Trustees any almsperson or annuitant is guilty of insobriety insubordination breach of regulations or immoral or improper conduct or is disqualified for retaining his or her appointment by having become entitled to a sufficient income from sources other than the charities or from any other cause or if any almsperson in the opinion of the Trustees is suffering from mental or other disease rendering him or her unfit to remain an almsperson or if in any case it appears that any almsperson or annuitant has been appointed without having the required qualifications the Trustees upon proof thereof to their satisfaction may remove the almsperson or annuitant.

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(3) Upon the removal of any almsperson the Trustees shall take possession of the tenement or room occupied by him or her and upon the removal of any almsperson or annuitant the Trustees shall proceed to appoint another almsperson or annuitant in his or her place.

(4) In any case of such misconduct as aforesaid the Trustees may suspend the payment of the stipend or annuity to the almsperson or annuitant either wholly or in part during such time as they think fit.

(5) Any almsperson or annuitant removed under head (b) or (c) of section (1) of this clause and any almsperson removed on account of mental or other disease under section (2) of this clause may on recovery be re-appointed without previous notice being given of the vacancy to be filled up and need not possess the qualifications as to residence and non-receipt of poor-law relief. In any such case the Trustees may pending a vacancy make a reasonable allowance if funds permit to any person who is to be re-appointed.

56. *Regulations.*—The Trustees may from time to time prescribe such reasonable regulations as they consider expedient for the government of the almspeople and annuitants provided that the same shall not be at variance or inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Scheme and by such regulations may provide that the almspeople shall render such assistance to each other and to the matron as is within their power.

ADVANCEMENT IN LIFE BRANCH.

57. *Advances.*—The Trustees may from time to time advance the sum of £200 cash specified in Part II of the schedule hereto and any other sums of cash for the time being belonging to the Advancement in Life Branch in sums not exceeding £50 each to deserving young men being inhabitants of the city of Winchester or the Soke or suburbs thereof. The advances in each case shall be made for 10 years without interest but upon sufficient security with the view of assisting such persons to carry on some honest

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A.D. 1929. trade business or calling within the said city or the Soke or
— suburbs thereof.

58. *Apprenticing &c.*—Subject as aforesaid the Trustees shall apply the yearly income of the Advancement in Life Branch in one or both of the following ways :—

- (a) Defraying the whole or a portion of the cost of placing out as apprentices to any suitable trade business or occupation boys resident in the city of Winchester or the Soke or suburbs thereof;
- (b) Assisting persons resident as aforesaid who are under the age of 21 years and who are preparing for entering upon or engaged in any trade occupation or service by outfits payment of fees for instruction payment of travelling expenses or such other means for their advancement in life or to enable them to earn their own living as the Trustees think fit.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

59. *Variation of Payments.*—The amount or conditions of any payment or allowance prescribed by this Scheme may be varied from time to time by the Trustees with the sanction of the Charity Commissioners.

60. *Appropriation of Benefits.*—The appropriation of the benefits of the charities shall be made by the Trustees from time to time at meetings of their body and not separately by any individual Trustee or Trustees.

61. *Trustees not to be personally interested.*—No Trustee shall take or hold any interest in property belonging to the charities otherwise than as a Trustee for the purposes thereof and no Trustee shall receive any remuneration or be interested in the supply of work or goods at the cost of the charities.

62. *Charities not to relieve Rates.*—The funds or income of the charities shall not in any case be applied in aid of any rates for the relief of the poor or other purposes.

63. *Alteration of Scheme.*—The Charity Commissioners may from time to time in the exercise of their ordinary jurisdiction establish Schemes for the alteration of any of the provisions of this Scheme as if these provisions had been made by the founder in the case of a charity having a founder.

64. *Questions under Scheme.*—Any question as to the construction of this Scheme or as to the regularity or the validity of any acts done or about to be done under this Scheme shall be determined conclusively by the Charity Commissioners upon

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such application made to them for the purpose as they think sufficient. A.D. 1929.

65. *Date of Scheme.*—The date of this Scheme shall be the date of the Act of Parliament confirming the same.
