



CHAPTER viii.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the A.D. 1929.
Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act —
1899 relating to the Glasgow Young Women's
Christian Association. [27th March 1929.]

WHEREAS the Provisional Order set forth in the
schedule hereunto annexed has been made by
one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State under
the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure
(Scotland) Act 1899 as read with the Secretaries of State
Act 1926 and it is requisite that the said Order should
be confirmed by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent
Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords
Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present
Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same
as follows :—

1. The Provisional Order contained in the schedule
hereunto annexed shall be and the same is hereby
confirmed.

Women's Christian Association Order Confirmation Act
1929.

SCHEDULE.

GLASGOW YOUNG WOMEN'S CHRISTIAN
ASSOCIATION.

Provisional Order to transfer the property belonging to the Glasgow Young Women's Christian Association or vested in trustees for that Association to new trustees for two sections of the said Association respectively or to committees of the said sections to make provision for the constitution of the said sections to dissolve the said Association and to discharge the existing trustees and for other purposes.

WHEREAS the Glasgow Young Women's Christian Association (hereinafter referred to as "the Association") was formed in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four :

And whereas the basis and aim of the Association are set out in the First Schedule to this Order :

And whereas the Association is not a body corporate and its affairs are administered by committees elected annually by the members of the Association :

And whereas by its constitution the Association is by payment of an annual capitation fee linked to a body known as "the Scottish Division of the National Young Women's Christian Association" (now represented by a body known as "the Scottish Division of the Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain") having a basis and aim similar to those of the Association :

And whereas serious differences arose in the council or governing body of the said Scottish Division of the Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain as to the methods of carrying on social work amongst young women :

And whereas the said council ultimately divided into two parties one of which now forms the body known

as "the Young Women's Christian Association of Scotland" and the other of which continues as the said Scottish Division of the Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain : A.D. 1929.

And whereas the Association carried on the aims and objects for which it was constituted continuously until the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four :

And whereas in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four differences arose amongst the members of the Association similar to those which had occurred as aforesaid in the said council of the said Scottish Division of the Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain as to the methods of carrying out the aims and objects of the Association or as to the means by which they might be attained and as a result of such differences the Association became divided into two sections one section holding the same views as the said Young Women's Christian Association of Scotland and the other section holding the same views as the said Scottish Division of the Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain :

And whereas each of the said sections of the Association aforesaid carries on its work in accordance with its views and has appointed a general committee and office bearers :

And whereas certain heritable and other property of the Association is vested in trustees (hereinafter referred to as "the trustees") and in other persons for the benefit of the Association or for specified objects or purposes of the Association and each of the sections aforesaid of the Association has called upon the trustees to give it the exclusive possession and use of such property or to transfer it to trustees on its behalf :

And whereas with a view to placing the two sections aforesaid of the Association on a satisfactory and legal basis and providing for the transfer to them respectively of the property now vested in the trustees and other persons as aforesaid an agreement dated the sixteenth day of September and the twelfth day of October one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven (hereinafter referred to as "the agreement") has been entered into by and between committees respectively appointed by

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A.D. 1929. — and acting for the said two sections of the Association on behalf of their respective sections which agreement has been approved at a meeting of each of the said sections specially convened :

And whereas doubts have arisen as to the powers of the trustees to give exclusive possession or use of such property to either of the sections of the Association or to transfer the same to trustees on their behalf or to give effect to the provisions of the agreement without the authority of Parliament :

And whereas it is expedient that the parties to the agreement and the bodies by whom those parties are to be represented and the Association the trustees and any other persons affected should be enabled to carry the agreement into effect and that the Association should be dissolved and the trustees discharged :

And whereas it is expedient that the other provisions in this Order contained should be enacted :

And whereas the purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 :

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last-mentioned Act as read with the Secretaries of State Act 1926 the Secretary of State orders as follows :—

Short title. 1. This Order may be cited as the Glasgow Young Women's Christian Association Order 1929.

Interpretation. 2. In this Order the following words and expressions shall unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say) :—

“ The Association ” means the Glasgow Young Women's Christian Association ;

“ The scheduled property ” means the property described in the Fourth Schedule to this Order ;

“ The trustees ” means Elspeth Murray Stephen Archibald Hope Robertson Hugh Brown Leonard Gow and Alexander Moncreiff Mitchell and the survivors and survivor of them and the heir of the last survivor and their successors in office ;

“ The Glasgow Scottish section ” means that section of the Association which acts under and in

conformity with the constitution set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order; A.D. 1929.

“The Glasgow Great Britain section” means that section of the Association which acts under and in conformity with the constitution set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order;

“The committees of the sections” means the committees of the Glasgow Scottish section and the Glasgow Great Britain section appointed by those sections respectively;

“The agreement” means the agreement between the committee of that section of the Association now to be represented by the Glasgow Scottish section and the committee of that section of the Association now to be represented by the Glasgow Great Britain section dated the sixteenth day of September and the twelfth day of October one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven;

“The arbiter” means the Dean of the Faculty of Procurators in Glasgow for the time being whom failing the President for the time being of the Institute of Accountants and Actuaries in Glasgow as sole arbiter;

“The new trustees” means—

(a) Isabella Renwick Oatts president Effie Raphael vice-president Charlotte Duncan Sharp interim honorary secretary and treasurer and Edith Gray Stewart as trustees of the Glasgow Scottish section for the purposes of and to the extent of the interests of such section in this Order; or

(b) Charlotte Elsé Wilson or Cuthbert president and Elma Margaret Boyd Doris Helen Gumprecht Katharine Ritchie Mather Reid and Violet Mary Craig Robertson vice-presidents and Marjorie Jessie Duncan Minto general secretary as trustees of the Glasgow Great Britain section for the purposes of and to the extent of the interests of such section in this Order;

and any other persons appointed in terms of the constitutions of the said sections respectively

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in substitution for or in addition to the persons named above;

“The commencement of this Order” means the date of the passing of the Act confirming this Order.

Transfer of
property.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Order and notwithstanding anything contained in any disposition deed of gift feu charter or other deed—

(1) On the commencement of this Order—

(a) the properties mentioned in the paragraphs numbered 1 and 2 in Part I of the Fourth Schedule to this Order shall by virtue of this Order be transferred to and vested in the new trustees for the Glasgow Scottish section; and

(b) the properties mentioned in the paragraphs numbered 1 2 3 4 and 5 in Part II of the Fourth Schedule to this Order shall by virtue of this Order be transferred to and vested in the new trustees for the Glasgow Great Britain section;

for the whole right title and interest therein of the Association or of the trustees or of any one or more of them with other persons or of any other person on behalf of the Association or such sections thereof without the necessity of any disposition assignation transfer conveyance notarial instrument notice of title or any other continuing or connecting title or separate investiture or infeftment other than this Order :

(2) On the commencement of this Order—

(a) the properties mentioned in the paragraphs numbered 3 4 5 and 6 in Part I of the Fourth Schedule to this Order shall by virtue of this Order be transferred to and vested in the committee of the Glasgow Scottish section on behalf of that section; and

(b) the properties mentioned in the paragraphs numbered 6 7 and 8 in Part II of the Fourth Schedule to this Order shall by virtue of this Order be transferred to and vested in the committee of the Glasgow Great Britain section on behalf of that section :

Provided that the war stock being the properties mentioned in the paragraphs numbered 5 in Part I and numbered 7 in Part II of the Fourth Schedule to this Order shall be retained by the trustees in so far as required to be applied by them in defraying the expenses incurred by them in connection with the agreement and also the expenses incurred or to be incurred by them in the preparing for obtaining and confirming this Order or otherwise in relation thereto or arising in any manner of way out of the agreement or the settlement of the dispute referred to in the agreement in the proportion of one-third out of the said property mentioned in the paragraph numbered 5 and of two-thirds out of the said property mentioned in the paragraph numbered 7 :

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- (3) All property (other than the scheduled property and any legacy or bequest that may have vested in the Association or the trustees or other persons on its behalf and not yet been paid) heritable and moveable and real and personal including all rights to property heritable and moveable and real and personal which may belong to or be vested in the trustees or any one or more of them with other persons or any other person on behalf of the Association shall on the commencement of this Order and by virtue of this Order be transferred to and vested in the new trustees for their respective sections as to one-third to the Glasgow Scottish section and as to two-thirds to the Glasgow Great Britain section without the necessity of any disposition assignation transfer conveyance notarial instrument notice of title or any other continuing or connecting title or separate investiture or infeftment other than this Order :
- (4) This section shall not apply to any such shares stocks annuities or property as are only transferable in books kept by a company or other body or in manner prescribed by or under Act of Parliament all which excepted property is intended to be and shall be forthwith by the appropriate means transferred to and vested in the new trustees or the committees of the

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sections as the case may be for their respective sections as to one-third to the Glasgow Scottish section and as to two-thirds to the Glasgow Great Britain section.

As to head-
quarters.

4.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the section of this Order of which the marginal note is “Transfer of property” the Glasgow Great Britain section shall pay to the Glasgow Scottish section one-third of the value of the headquarters of the Association at 80 Bath Street Glasgow and of the furnishings thereof ascertained and subject to deduction as in this section provided.

(2) The value of the buildings forming and the furnishings of the said headquarters shall be ascertained as at the twelfth day of October one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven by a valuator or valutors to be chosen and instructed by the trustees. Such valuation shall be made on the basis of the price being fixed as between a willing seller and a willing buyer.

(3) There shall be deducted from the valuation the sum of six hundred and fifty pounds in respect of expenditure by the Glasgow Great Britain section on the said buildings and furnishings and the Glasgow Great Britain section shall within a period of three months from the commencement of this Order pay to the Glasgow Scottish section the said one-third of the amount so ascertained remaining after such deduction as aforesaid together with interest thereon as from the twelfth day of October one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven at the rate of five per centum per annum till payment.

Minute
books &c.

5. All minute books accounts and records of the Association shall be inventoried and shall belong jointly to the Glasgow Scottish section and the Glasgow Great Britain section but shall remain in the possession of the section holding the same at the commencement of this Order and shall be preserved for reference and made available to the other section when required.

Obligations
and debts.

6. All outstanding debts and obligations including liabilities to banks affecting to the scheduled property and any other property referred to in subsection (3) of the section of this Order of which the marginal note is “Transfer of property” due by or exigible from the Association as at the twelfth day of October one thousand

nine hundred and twenty-seven shall forthwith after the commencement of this Order be paid and implemented by the section in occupation or possession at the twelfth day of October one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven of the property to which such debts and obligations may effeir and the section in occupation or possession of such property after that date shall free and indemnify the other section and the trustees of all obligations in respect thereof in all time coming. A.D. 1929.
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7. The property transferred to and vested in the new trustees for the Glasgow Scottish section and the committee of that section under the provisions of this Order shall be held in trust for that section in terms of the constitution set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order. Terms of trusts for Glasgow Scottish section.

8. The property transferred to and vested in the new trustees for the Glasgow Great Britain section and the committee of that section under the provisions of this Order shall be held in trust for that section in terms of the constitution set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order. Terms of trusts for Glasgow Great Britain section.

9. On the commencement of this Order the Association shall be and is hereby dissolved. Association dissolved.

10. The trustees and persons in whom the scheduled property and all other property heritable and moveable and real and personal including all rights to property heritable and moveable and real and personal were vested before being transferred to and vested in the new trustees or the committees of the sections by virtue of this Order are hereby as soon as they are divested of the said property absolutely finally and for ever exonerated and discharged of their actings transactions intromissions and management and of all omissions if any not only in relation to the said property but also in respect of their having acted either as trustees or otherwise in any way on behalf of the Association. Trustees discharged of actings.

11. Without prejudice to anything hereinbefore in this Order contained it is hereby provided :— Completion of title

- (1) That for the purpose of enabling the new trustees for their respective sections or the committees of the sections to complete a title if thought fit to the scheduled property or any part thereof

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or to any of the lands buildings and heritable property transferred to and vested in them by virtue of this Order respectively by expeding a notarial instrument notice of title or otherwise this Order shall be deemed to be and may be used as a general disposition or assignation as the case may be of the scheduled property or any part thereof or of such lands buildings and other heritable property in favour of the new trustees for their respective sections; and

- (2) That all persons holding the title to or having any interest in any moveable or personal property transferred to and vested in the new trustees or the committees of the sections by virtue of this Order shall be bound at the expense of the Glasgow Scottish section or of the Glasgow Great Britain section as the case may be to execute any such transfers conveyances assignations deeds and writings as may be necessary and usual to vest the same in the new trustees for their respective sections or the committees of the sections.

Stamp
duty.

12. A copy of the Act confirming this Order stamped with conveyance on sale duty on the amount to be paid to the Glasgow Scottish section as provided by the section of this Order of which the marginal note is "As to headquarters" shall be produced to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue within three months after the commencement of this Order and in default of such production the duty with interest thereon at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum from the commencement of this Order shall be a debt due to His Majesty by the Glasgow Great Britain section.

Legacies
not to
lapse.

13. No legacy or bequest in any will or testamentary disposition whether bearing date before or after the commencement of this Order (whether already vested or to become vested) shall lapse or fail by reason of the passing of the Act confirming this Order but any such legacy or bequest which but for this Order would have accrued or enured for the benefit of the Association or the trustees on its behalf shall accrue or enure for the benefit of the Glasgow Scottish section and the Glasgow Great Britain section or one of them as may be agreed between the said sections or failing agreement as may be

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determined by the arbiter who shall be entitled in deciding as to which of such sections shall be the beneficiary to take into consideration inter alia the testator's connection with the Glasgow Scottish section or the Glasgow Great Britain section as the case may be through work contribution or otherwise and the capacity of those sections respectively to carry out any special trusts annexed to any legacy or bequest and his decision shall be final and binding and any executor trustee or other person acting in a fiduciary capacity paying any such legacy or bequest to the Glasgow Scottish section and the Glasgow Great Britain section or either of them as the case may be in pursuance of this section shall be and is hereby relieved from all liability accordingly. A.D. 1929.

14. The trustees and the officers and servants of the Association or of the trustees or of the Glasgow Scottish section or the Glasgow Great Britain section at the commencement of this Order shall be indemnified by such sections against and it shall be the duty of such sections out of their property and funds to pay all costs losses and expenses which any such trustees officers or servants may have incurred or may incur or have or may become liable to by reason of any contract entered into or act or deed done by them or any of them as such trustees officers or servants in the discharge of their or his duties and payments made by the Glasgow Scottish section and the Glasgow Great Britain section in pursuance of this section so far as indemnifying the trustees and the officers and servants of the Association or of the trustees shall be made as to one-third by the Glasgow Scottish section and two-thirds by the Glasgow Great Britain section and so far as indemnifying the officers and servants of the said sections shall be made by the particular section to which they belong. Indemnity for trustees.

15. The costs charges and expenses of and incident to the preparing for obtaining and confirming of this Order or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the trustees out of any funds or money of the Association in their hands and so far as the said funds or money are insufficient for that purpose shall be paid as to one-third by the Glasgow Scottish section and as to two-thirds by the Glasgow Great Britain section. Costs of Order.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

BASIS AND AIM OF THE GLASGOW YOUNG WOMEN'S
CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION.

BASIS.

Faith in God the Father as Creator and in Jesus Christ His only Son as Lord and Saviour and in the Holy Spirit as Revealer of Truth and Source of Power for life and service according to the teaching of Holy Scripture.

AIM.

To win young women and girls to faith in our Lord Jesus Christ to service in His Kingdom and to the fellowship of His Church For this end to unite them in fellowship of prayer bible study and service and to make available for them all that ministers to Christian character mental capacity and physical health.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

CONSTITUTION AND RULES OF ADMINISTRATION OF
THE GLASGOW YOUNG WOMEN'S CHRISTIAN
ASSOCIATION OF SCOTLAND.

CONSTITUTION.

1. The Association shall be called the "Glasgow Young Women's Christian Association of Scotland."

2. Basis Faith in God the Father as Creator in Jesus Christ His only Son as Lord and Saviour and in the Holy Spirit as Revealer of Truth and Source of Power for life and service according to the teaching of Holy Scripture leading to present experience of living union with Christ the shedding abroad in the heart by the Holy Spirit of the love of God and union in prayer and work for the extension of the Kingdom of God by such means as are in accordance with His Holy Word.

3. Aim To win young women and girls to faith in our Lord Jesus Christ to service in His Kingdom and to the fellowship of His Church For this end to unite them in fellowship of prayer bible study and service and to make available for them such aids as minister to Christian character mental capacity and physical health. A.D. 1929.
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4. This constitution is fundamental.

RULES OF ADMINISTRATION.

1. Membership Girls and women are eligible as—

- (a) Associates or prayer union members (over 16 years of age);
- (b) Intermediate members (between 13 and 16 years of age);
- (c) Junior members (under 13 years of age).

Only members over 16 years of age and of at least one year's standing are entitled to a vote.

Membership fees Full members one shilling per annum;
Intermediate members sixpence per annum;
Junior members fourpence per annum.

2. The affairs of the Association shall be conducted by a general committee consisting of not more than thirty members including president vice-presidents general secretary and treasurer meeting monthly except during the summer vacation seven to form a quorum There shall be sub-committees for departments of the work the convener of each to be a member of general committee President vice-presidents secretary and treasurer to be ex officio on all committees.

3. Members of committee and office bearers shall be elected for three years one-third retiring annually but being eligible for re-election.

4. A public business meeting shall be held annually to receive a report of the previous year's proceedings with a statement of accounts duly audited and to fill up any vacancies in the list of office bearers and committee and the general committee shall have power to call a special meeting of the Association at any time they may judge necessary.

5. The Association shall work on inter-denominational lines endeavouring to serve the churches by encouraging its members to be loyal to their own denomination.

6. The Association may be affiliated to the Young Women's Christian Association of Scotland or any other central body having a similar basis but while working with others in a common

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A.D. 1929. cause it shall retain its independence as a separate unity and
— have full control of its own property and funds.

7. The heritable properties now belonging to the Association shall be vested in Mrs. Isabella Renwick Oatts president Mrs. Effie Raphael vice-president Miss Charlotte Duncan Sharp interim honorary secretary and treasurer and Mrs. Edith Gray Stewart as trustees of the Association and such other trustees as may from time to time be appointed by the general committee and such trustees shall hold the said heritable properties and all property heritable and moveable that may at any time be handed over to the trustees for behoof of and pay the income thereof to the Association. Any property or funds belonging to any particular branch of the Association may also be handed over to the trustees and shall be held by them for behoof of and the income thereof paid to the particular branch. The general committee shall through the trustees by whom any property is held for behoof of the Association or of any of the branches thereof have full power if and when they think fit (unless it be otherwise expressly provided by the conveyance or title in favour of the Association) to sell by public roup or private bargain or to excamb or to borrow on the security of the whole or any part of such property and the said trustees shall be bound when required by the general committee so to do to grant all deeds necessary for carrying out any resolution or resolutions of the general committee to sell excamb or borrow. The general committee shall be entitled through the body of trustees appointed as aforesaid to invest the funds of the Association or any part thereof not only in the securities sanctioned by law but also in the purchase of property heritable and moveable for the purposes of the Association and generally in loan on or purchase of such other funds property estate or effects heritable or moveable as they in their discretion may consider sufficient and satisfactory it being hereby declared that the general committee and trustees shall be held as freed from all responsibility incurred or that may be incurred through said investments loans and purchases or any of them not being in accordance with the investments authorised by law for trust funds.

8. The Association shall have power at any meeting of the Association specially called for the purpose by advertisement appearing at least twice in a Glasgow newspaper the first advertisement to be given not later than ten days before the meeting to alter the rules of administration by a majority of at least two-thirds of the members of the Association entitled to vote present and voting at such meeting. Such advertisements need not specify the proposed alterations but shall bear that such alterations may be inspected by the members in the hands of the secretary for at least one week before the meeting.

THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

CONSTITUTION AND RULES OF ADMINISTRATION OF THE GLASGOW YOUNG WOMEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION (YOUNG WOMEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION OF GREAT BRITAIN).

CONSTITUTION.

1. Name The Association shall be called the "Glasgow Young Women's Christian Association (Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain)."

2. Basis The basis of the Association shall be Faith in God the Father as Creator and in Jesus Christ His only Son as Lord and Saviour and in the Holy Spirit as Revealer of Truth and Source of Power for life and service according to the teaching of Holy Scripture.

3. Aim The aim of the Association shall be to call young women and girls to the allegiance of our Lord Jesus Christ the fellowship of His Church and the service of His Kingdom.

To unite them in a fellowship of prayer bible study and service through which they may make their contribution to the spiritual moral and social progress of the world.

To make available for them all that will minister to Christian character mental capacity and physical health.

4. Relation to the Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain and to the World's Young Women's Christian Association The Association shall be a part of the Scottish division of the Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain which is affiliated to the World's Young Women's Christian Association and the basis and aim of the Association can only be altered in terms of the constitution and byelaws of the Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain.

RULES OF ADMINISTRATION.

1. Membership (a) Full membership shall be open to women and girls over sixteen years of age who are willing to make the following declaration "I wish in joining the world-wide fellowship of the Young Women's Christian Association to declare my faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and my desire to serve others in His spirit of love."

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(b) Associate membership shall be open to all women and girls over thirteen years of age who wish to share in the activities of the Association Club and branch members over thirteen years of age who are not full members shall be associates in virtue of their club or branch membership.

(c) Junior membership shall be open to girls under thirteen years of age.

Membership Fees In addition to the fee of 6*d.* payable to the local association and the local club or branch fees the following membership fees shall be payable :—

Full members 1*s.* per annum allocated as follows :—

Scottish Division 6*d.*

Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain
3*d.*

World's Young Women's Christian Association 3*d.*

Associate members over 16 1*s.* per annum.

Do. under 16 6*d.* do.

Junior Members 3*d.* per annum.

The fees of the associate and junior members shall also be allocated in the above proportions.

2. Administration The affairs of the Association shall be administered by a general committee elected as follows :—

- (1) One representative from each branch or club of 100 or less than 100 full or associate members and one additional representative for every further 100 members thereof Such representative shall as regards club and branch be elected by the full members thereof who have then been members for at least one year and are over 18 years of age ;
- (2) One representative from each hostel elected by the hostel committee ;
- (3) Co-opted members to a number not exceeding one-fourth of the committee ;
- (4) Conveners of all standing sub-committees not otherwise members of committee ;
- (5) The president vice-presidents and treasurer elected by the general committee from their own number or otherwise.

Office bearers and members of committee shall be elected biennially and elected members of the general committee shall be ineligible for election after having served for four years until a period of two years has elapsed.

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3. Annual Meeting A public business meeting shall be held annually to receive a report of the previous year's proceedings with a statement of accounts duly audited and the general committee shall have power to call a special meeting of the Association at any time they may judge necessary. A.D. 1929.
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4. Funds of the Association The heritable properties and the investments of the funds belonging or that may at any time belong to the Association shall be vested in Mrs. Charlotte Elsé Wilson or Cuthbert president and Miss Elma Margaret Boyd Miss Doris Helen Gumprecht Miss Katharine Ritchie Mather Reid and Bailie Violet Mary Craig Robertson C.B.E. vice-presidents and Miss Marjorie Jessie Duncan Minto general secretary all of the Association and their successors in office as trustees ex officiis for the Association and the said trustees shall hold the said heritable properties and investments for behoof of the Association The said trustees shall act only on and in terms of the instructions of the said general committee which general committee shall have the exclusive control of all the heritable and moveable property belonging or that may at any time belong to the Association and the exclusive control and disposal of the revenue thereof prices realised therefrom and sums borrowed on the security thereof An excerpt from a minute of meeting of the said committee certified by the chairman at that meeting shall be sufficient evidence of such instructions And subject to such instructions the said trustees shall have full power and authority to purchase or otherwise acquire heritable or moveable property to invest the funds of the Association in any of the investments from time to time competent to trustees by the law of Scotland or England to accept and hold securities and others bequeathed or gifted to the Association that are outwith the said powers provided always that liability is not thereby attached to them or the Association to sell feu excamb lease or otherwise dispose of either by public roup or private bargain any of the heritable properties vested in them to sell or otherwise realise any of the moveable property vested in them to vary and change from time to time the said investments securities and others to borrow money for behoof of the Association on the security of the said heritable and moveable property or any part thereof and to execute the deeds necessary for any of these purposes Purchasers from or lenders to the said trustees and all others paying them money shall have no concern with the application thereof but shall be sufficiently exonerated and discharged by the receipt of the said trustees The said trustees shall not be liable for any losses which may arise from any investment of the funds of the Association nor for any errors neglect or omissions nor for the intromissions of any treasurer secretary factor or agent and they shall be entitled to be indemnified out of the funds and property of the Association

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A.D. 1929. for and against all outlays and liabilities incurred by them on
— behalf of the Association.

5. These rules of administration may only be altered at a public meeting of full members of the Association and by the consent of two-thirds of those present and voting.
