



CHAPTER xi.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the
Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act
1899 relating to Leith Harbour and Docks. A.D. 1929.
—
[26th July 1929.]

WHEREAS the Provisional Order set forth in the
schedule hereunto annexed has been made by
one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State under
the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure
(Scotland) Act 1899 as read with the Secretaries of State
Act 1926 and it is requisite that the said Order should
be confirmed by Parliament : 62 & 63 Vict.
c. 47.
16 & 17
Geo. 5. c. 18.

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent
Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords
Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present
Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same
as follows :—

SCHEDULE.

LEITH HARBOUR AND DOCKS.

Provisional Order to extend the time for the compulsory purchase of lands authorised by the Leith Harbour and Docks Act 1913 the Leith Harbour and Docks Order 1919 and the Leith Harbour and Docks Order 1925 and for other purposes.

WHEREAS by the Leith Harbour and Docks Act 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1913") and by the Leith Harbour and Docks Order 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1919") and by the Leith Harbour and Docks Order 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1925") the Commissioners for the harbour and docks of Leith (hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioners") were authorised to construct the works in the Act of 1913 and the Order of 1919 and the Order of 1925 described and to acquire compulsorily the lands shown on the plans deposited with reference to that Act and these Orders respectively :

And whereas it is expedient that the period limited by the Act of 1913 as extended by an Order made on the thirteenth day of October one thousand nine hundred and seventeen by the Board of Trade under the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act 1915 and further extended by the Order of 1919 and by the Leith Harbour and Docks Order 1924 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1924") for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of that Act should be further extended :

And whereas it is expedient that the period limited by the Order of 1919 as extended by the Order of 1924 for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of the Order of 1919 should be further extended :

And whereas it is expedient that the period limited by the Order of 1925 for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of that Order should be extended :

And whereas the purpose aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 : A.D. 1929.

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last mentioned Act as read with the Secretaries of State Act 1926 the Secretary of State orders as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Leith Harbour and Docks Order 1929 and this Order and the Leith Harbour and Docks Acts 1875 to 1925 may be cited together as the Leith Harbour and Docks Acts 1875 to 1929. Short and collective titles.

2. In this Order the several words and expressions to which meanings are assigned by the Harbour Acts shall have the same respective meanings unless there is something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction. Interpretation.

In this Order the expression—

“ The Commissioners ” means the Commissioners for the Harbour and Docks of Leith ;

“ The Act of 1913 ” means the Leith Harbour and Docks Act 1913 ;

“ The Order of 1917 ” means the Order made on the thirteenth day of October one thousand nine hundred and seventeen by the Board of Trade under the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act 1915 ;

“ The Order of 1919 ” means the Leith Harbour and Docks Order 1919 ;

“ The Order of 1924 ” means the Leith Harbour and Docks Order 1924 ;

“ The Order of 1925 ” means the Leith Harbour and Docks Order 1925 ;

“ The Harbour Acts ” means the Leith Harbour and Docks Acts 1875 to 1925.

3. The time limited for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of the Act of 1913 by section 17 (Period for acquisition of lands) of the Act of 1913 as extended by the Order of 1917 and further extended by Further extending period limited by Act of 1913

A.D. 1929. section 16 (Extending period limited by Act of 1913 for compulsory purchase of lands) of the Order of 1919 and by section 4 (Further extending period limited by Act of 1913 for compulsory purchase of lands) of the Order of 1924 is hereby further extended for a period of five years from the sixteenth day of April one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine and on the expiration of that period those powers shall cease.

Further extending period limited by Order of 1919 for compulsory purchase of lands. 4. The time limited for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of the Order of 1919 by section 12 (Period for acquisition of lands) of the Order of 1919 as extended by section 5 (Extending period limited by Order of 1919 for compulsory purchase of lands) of the Order of 1924 is hereby further extended for a period of five years from the sixteenth day of April one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine and on the expiration of that period those powers shall cease.

Extending period limited by Order of 1925 for compulsory purchase of lands. 5. The time limited for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purposes of the Order of 1925 by section 14 (Period for acquisition of lands) of the Order of 1925 is hereby extended until the sixteenth day of April one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four and on that date those powers shall cease.

Agreement with War Department under Order of 1925. 6. The agreement between the Commissioners and His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department set forth in the Second Schedule to and confirmed and made binding on the parties thereto by section 13 (Agreement with War Department) of the Order of 1925 shall be read and have effect subject to the following modification namely notwithstanding the provision respecting the two months' notice contained in the second head of the said agreement the first party thereto shall be entitled to retain occupation of (1) the existing Leith Dock Battery (being the battery presently situated upon the space delineated and coloured brown upon the plan which was docqueted and signed as relative to the said agreement) until such time as the second parties thereto shall have set apart the site for a new battery in the position delineated and coloured red on the said plan and shall have constructed and provided works in terms of the provisions of the fifth head of the said agreement and (2) the existing works situated upon the areas delineated and coloured green upon the said plan

until such time as the said second parties shall have set apart the other sites delineated and coloured blue upon the said plan or other substituted site or sites in terms of the provisions of the sixth head of the said agreement. A.D. 1929. —

7. All costs charges and expenses of and incident to the preparing for obtaining and confirming of this Order or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Commissioners out of the revenues of their undertaking. Costs of Order.
