



CHAPTER iv.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Minister of Health relating to Bognor and South Mimms. A.D. 1929.
[26th July 1929.]

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875 the Minister of Health has made certain Orders which are set out in the schedule hereto: 38 & 39 Vict. c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force. Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Ministry of Health Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act 1929. Short title.

URBAN DISTRICT OF BOGNOR.

Provisional Order altering certain local Acts.

WHEREAS the Urban District Council of Bognor are the local authority within the meaning of the Public Health Act 1875 for the Urban District of Bognor and by the Bognor Urban District Council Act 1928 were empowered to carry on a water undertaking and supply water within the area prescribed as the limits for the supply of water by section 5 of that Act;

And whereas the Council have applied to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to alter or amend the local Act of 1928 and the Bognor Water Act 1891 in the manner following :

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Bognor (Water) Order 1929 and shall come into operation on the date of the Act of Parliament confirming it.

Interpreta-
tion.

2. In this Order “the Council” means the Urban District Council of Bognor.

Extension of
water limits.

3. The limits for the supply of water by the Council shall be extended so as to include the parishes of Climping and Ford in the rural district of East Preston and administrative county of West Sussex and all the provisions of the Bognor Urban District Council Act 1928 and of the Bognor Water Act 1891 with respect to the supply of water and otherwise with respect to the water undertaking of the Council shall apply and have effect within the water limits of the Council as extended by this Order subject to such modifications as may be necessary.

4.—(1) The Council shall not be bound to supply with water otherwise than by measure—

(a) any building used by an occupier as a dwelling-house whereof any part is used by the same occupier for any trade or manufacturing purpose for which water is required; or

- (b) any workhouse hospital asylum (whether public or private) sanatorium school club hotel public-house or inn; or
 (c) any public institution which is habitually occupied by at least twenty persons.

(2) The minimum quarterly charge for a supply of water by measure to any of the premises mentioned in this article shall be one-fourth of the annual amount which would be payable according to the scale from time to time in force for a domestic supply furnished to a dwelling-house of the same annual rack rent or value.

(3) In section 61 of the Bognor Water Act 1891 (which provides that the Council shall not be compelled to supply water in certain cases) the words from "To any dwelling-house" to the end of the section are hereby repealed.

5. That portion of subsection (1) of section 28 of the Bognor Urban District Council Act 1928 which provides that nothing in that section shall authorise the Council to refuse a supply of water for domestic purposes to a farmhouse at the ordinary rate calculated on the annual value thereof shall have effect as if the words "rack rent or" were inserted before the word "value."

URBAN DISTRICT OF BOGNOR.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban District Council of Bognor to put in force the compulsory clauses of the Lands Clauses Acts.

WHEREAS the Urban District Council of Bognor (in this Order referred to as "the Council") require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule to this Order for the purposes of cricket football and other games and recreations in the Urban District of Bognor:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by section 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows:—

1. The Council shall be empowered for the purposes aforesaid to put in force with reference to the lands described in the Schedule to this Order (subject to the continuance of any existing public rights of highway if any) the powers of the Lands Clauses

RURAL DISTRICT OF SOUTH MIMMS.

A.D. 1929.

*Provisional Order dissolving the South Mimms Special
 Drainage District.*

WHEREAS the South Mimms special drainage district in the parish of South Mimms in the county of Middlesex is comprised within the rural district of South Mimms and by virtue of section 229 of the Public Health Act 1875 the special drainage district and that portion of the parish of South Mimms which is not comprised within the special drainage district are separate contributory places for the purposes of that Act;

And whereas the rural district council of South Mimms have borrowed money for the execution of works for the benefit of each of the contributory places aforesaid and the money so borrowed in respect of each contributory place is a separate charge on that contributory place by virtue of the enactment above-mentioned;

And whereas the rural district council of South Mimms have applied to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to dissolve the special drainage district and to merge it in the parish of South Mimms:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by section 270 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the South Mimms Order 1929 and shall come into operation on the appointed day. Short title and commencement.
2. In this Order unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation.
 - “the appointed day” means the first day of April nineteen hundred and thirty;
 - “the contributory places” means the contributory places consisting of the special drainage district of South Mimms and that portion of the parish of South Mimms which is not comprised within that special drainage district;
 - “the parish” means the parish of South Mimms;
 - “the rural council” means the rural district council of South Mimms.
3. The South Mimms special drainage district shall be dissolved and shall be merged in the parish. Dissolution of special drainage district.

4.—(1) So much of any sums borrowed by the rural council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged on the special rate of either of the contributory places shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Order be charged on the special rate of the parish.

(2) Any expenses which immediately before the appointed day are payable by the rural council as special expenses incurred in respect of either of the contributory places shall on the appointed day be payable by that council as special expenses incurred in respect of the contributory place consisting of the parish :

Provided that nothing in this article shall affect the power of the Minister under section 29 of the Local Government Act 1894 by order to direct special expenses to be raised in like manner as general expenses or the application to special expenses of the rural council of any provision of the Local Government Act 1929 enabling that council to contribute to special expenses from their fund available for general purposes.

5. All property held by the rural council on behalf of either of the contributory places shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Order be held by the rural council on behalf of the contributory place consisting of the parish.

6. The order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-seventh day of January eighteen hundred and eighty-eight approving of the constitution of the South Mimms special drainage district shall on the appointed day be repealed.

Saving for
local rates.

7. Nothing in this Order shall affect the collection or recovery of any local rate which may be outstanding immediately before the appointed day.
