CHAPTER xxxix.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of A.D. 1931.
the Minister of Health relating to Birkenhead
and Chepping Wycombe. [8th July 1931.]

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Public 38 & 39 Vict.
Health Act 1875 the Minister of Health has c. 55.
made certain provisional orders which need confirmation
by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent
Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the
Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this
present Parliament assembled and by the authority of
the same as follows :—

1. The orders of the Minister of Health which are Orders in
set out in the schedule to this Act are hereby confirmed schedule
and shall have full validity and force. confirmed.

2. This Act may be cited as the Ministry of Health Short title.
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SCHEDULE.

BOROUGH OF BIRKENHEAD.

*Birkenhead
Order.*

Provisional Order amending certain local Acts.

WHEREAS the borough of Birkenhead is an urban district and the mayor aldermen and burgesses acting by the council are in relation to the borough the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Act 1875 and under the provisions of the Birkenhead Corporation Water Act 1907 and other local Acts carry on a water undertaking and supply water within the borough and certain other areas;

And whereas by virtue of clause 1 of the agreement set forth in the first schedule to the local Act of 1907 made between the corporation and the rural district council of Holywell which was confirmed and made binding by section 55 of the Act it was provided that the corporation should supply the district council with a quantity of water not exceeding one million gallons in any one quarter of a year at the price of sixpence per thousand gallons and it was further provided by clause 2 of the said agreement that if at any time the corporation and the district council should by a further agreement agree for a supply of water to the district council by the corporation exceeding one million gallons per quarter the price to be charged by the corporation for such supply should not exceed sixpence for every thousand gallons supplied under any such agreement;

And whereas by section 17 of the Birkenhead Corporation Act 1923 the said agreement set forth in the local Act of 1907 was amended so as to increase the price chargeable thereunder for any supply of water by seventy-five per centum;

And whereas the corporation have applied to the Minister of Health for the issue of a provisional order to amend the local Acts of 1907 and 1923 in the manner following :

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of his powers under section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Birkenhead Order 1931 and shall come into operation on the date of the Act of Parliament confirming it.

(2) In this order—

“the Act of 1907” means the Birkenhead Corporation Water Act 1907; and

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“the agreement of 1907” means the agreement made between the mayor aldermen and burgesses of the county borough of Birkenhead of the one part and the Holywell rural district council of the other part set forth in the first schedule to the Act of 1907.

2.—(1) Section 55 of the Act of 1907 shall have effect as if in clause 2 of the agreement of 1907 for the words “not exceed sixpence for every thousand gallons supplied” there were substituted the words “be such price as may be determined by or” and section 17 of the Birkenhead Corporation Act 1923 shall cease to have effect in relation to that clause.

(2) Section 68 of the Act of 1907 shall not apply to any agreement to which clause 2 of the agreement of 1907 relates.

BOROUGH OF CHEPPING WYCOMBE.

Provisional Order to enable the Chepping Wycombe Corporation to put in force the compulsory clauses of the Lands Clauses Acts.

WHEREAS the mayor aldermen and burgesses of the borough of Chepping Wycombe acting by the council (in this order referred to as “the Corporation”) require to purchase and take the lands described in the schedule to this order for the purposes of widening opening enlarging or otherwise improving the streets known as Crendon Street and Oxford Street in the said borough in pursuance of their powers under section 154 of the Public Health Act 1875 and section 83 of the Public Health Act 1925 :

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by section 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows :—

1. For the purposes recited in this order the Corporation may put in force with reference to the lands described in the schedule to this order (subject to the continuance of existing public rights of highway if any) all or any of the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts as modified by the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act 1919 with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement.

2.—(1) This order may be cited as the Chepping Wycombe (Acquisition of Land) Order 1931 and shall come into operation on the date of the Act of Parliament confirming it.

(2) In the schedule to this order “deposited plan” means the plan which was deposited for the purposes of this order in the Office of the Minister of Health on the twenty-ninth day of

November nineteen hundred and thirty of which duplicates were on the same day deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Parliaments House of Lords and in the Committee and Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
