



CHAPTER cli.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders made by the Board of Trade under the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 to 1909 relating to Lossiemouth and Branderburgh Maxwelltown and Port Glasgow. [15th August 1913.]

WHEREAS under the authority of the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 to 1909 the Board of Trade have made the several Provisional Orders set out in the schedule to this Act:

And whereas a Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under the authority of the said Acts is not of any validity or force whatever until the confirmation thereof by Act of Parliament:

And whereas it is expedient that the several Provisional Orders made by the Board of Trade under the authority of the said Acts as set out in the schedule to this Act be confirmed by Act of Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 3) Act 1913. Short title.

2. The several Orders as amended and set out in the schedule to this Act are hereby confirmed and the same shall from and after the passing and subject to the provisions of this Act have full validity and effect. Orders in schedule confirmed.

If and when the provost magistrates and councillors of the burgh of Greenock become and so long as they continue to be the Undertakers for the purposes of the Port Glasgow Electric Lighting Order 1913 confirmed by this Act section 84 of the Greenock Corporation Order 1901 and section 146 of the Greenock Corporation Act 1909 shall respectively apply to the undertaking authorised by the said Electric Lighting Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Lossiemouth and Branderburgh Electric Lighting Order 1913.

2. The provisions contained in the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 (with the exception of section 84 of that schedule) are incorporated with and form part of this Order.

Undertakers.

3. The Undertakers for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 2 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are the provost magistrates and councillors of the burgh of Lossiemouth and Branderburgh.

Area of
supply.

4. The area of supply for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 4 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 shall be the area which is described in the First Schedule to this Order and is more particularly delineated on the map deposited together with this Order at the Board of Trade by the Undertakers and signed by an assistant secretary to the Board of Trade.

Purchase,
and use of
land for
generating
station.

5.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Order the Undertakers may enter upon and take all or any part of the land delineated on the deposited plan and described in the deposited book of reference in connection therewith and in the Second Schedule to this Order.

(2) For the purpose of the acquisition of the said land the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts which relate to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement and to the entry upon lands by the promoters of the undertaking are incorporated with this Order.

(3) The Undertakers after they shall have acquired the said land may use the same for the purposes of the undertaking authorised by this Order and may thereon erect construct maintain use and work a station or stations together with all such buildings engines batteries dynamos accumulators and other plant machinery apparatus works and conveniences as may be necessary or suitable for generating electricity for the purpose of giving a supply under this Order.

6. The powers of the Undertakers for the compulsory purchase of land for the purposes of this Order shall cease after the expiration of three years from the commencement of this Order.

7. Subject to the provisions incorporated with this Order the Undertakers are specially authorised by this Order to break up the streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority mentioned in the Third Schedule to this Order.

8. The parts of streets throughout which suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purposes of general supply are to be laid down within a period of two years after the commencement of this Order as mentioned in section 21 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

9. If the Undertakers obtain the consent of the Board of Trade under subsection (1) of section 5 of the Electric Lighting Act 1909 to the supply by them within their area of supply of electricity for the purposes of haulage or traction on any railway tramway or canal situate partly within and partly without that area or for the purposes of lighting vehicles and vessels used on any such railway tramway or canal they may so supply electricity to be used for purposes incidental to the working or lighting of such railway tramway or canal other than the purposes aforesaid.

10. The maximum prices which may be charged by the Undertakers as mentioned in section 32 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those stated in the Fifth Schedule to this Order.

11. This Order shall come into force upon the day when the Act confirming this Order is passed and that day shall be the commencement of this Order.

LAND FOR THE ERECTION OF GENERATING STATION OR STATIONS.

All and whole that piece of land belonging or reputed to belong to George James M'Lay of St. Ninian's Lossiemouth situate in the area of supply and containing an area of two roods eleven poles and three square yards or thereabouts with the buildings thereon bounded on the south-east by Clifton Road on the north-west by the part of the Coulard Hill belonging or reputed to belong to the lord provost magistrates and councillors of the city and royal burgh of Elgin on the north-east by a piece of land now held in feu by John William Denoon of Garlinebeg Lossiemouth and on the south-west by other land belonging or reputed to belong to the trustees of the late Andrew Brander sometime farmer of Stewart Place Garmouth.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

SECTION 2.

Where the Undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity contained in the supply given to him they shall be entitled to charge him according to the rates set forth in section 1 of this schedule the amount of energy supplied to him being taken to be the product of that electrical quantity and the declared pressure at the consumer's terminals that is to say such a constant pressure at those terminals as may be declared by the Undertakers under the Board of Trade regulations.

1. This Order may be cited as the Maxwelltown Electric Lighting Order 1913.

2. The provisions contained in the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 (with the exception of section 84 of that schedule) are incorporated with and form part of this Order.

Undertakers.

3. The Undertakers for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 2 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are the Dumfries Electricity Supply Company Limited whose registered office is in Leafield Road Dumfries.

Area of
supply.

4. The area of supply for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 4 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 shall be the area which is described in the First Schedule to this Order and is more particularly delineated on the map deposited together with this Order at the Board of Trade by the Undertakers and signed by an assistant secretary to the Board of Trade.

Power to
break up
streets.

5. Subject to the provisions incorporated with this Order the Undertakers are specially authorised by this Order to break up the streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority which are mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Compulsory
works.

6. The streets and parts of streets throughout which suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purposes of general supply are to be laid down within a period of two years after the commencement of this Order as mentioned in section 21 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those mentioned in the Third Schedule to this Order.

7. The maximum prices which may be charged by the Undertakers as mentioned in section 32 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those stated in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

Power to use
land for
purposes of

8. The Undertakers may after they shall have acquired either absolutely or otherwise the land described in the Fifth Schedule to this Order use the said land or any part thereof for the purposes of a generating station and may upon such land or any part thereof erect maintain work and use a station or stations for producing and

generating transforming storing and distributing electricity with all such buildings engines batteries dynamos accumulators and other plant machinery apparatus works and conveniences as may be necessary or suitable for those purposes and may produce generate transform store use and supply such electricity accordingly.

9. The sum to be deposited or secured in pursuance of section 5 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 is two hundred pounds.

Deposit.

10.—(1) The provost magistrates and councillors of the burgh of Maxwelltown (hereinafter called "the council") shall be entitled to purchase the undertaking authorised by this Order including the interest at the time of such purchase of the Undertakers (as the Undertakers under this Order) in all lands buildings works materials and plant within the area of supply under this Order suitable to and used by the Undertakers (as the Undertakers under this Order) for the purposes of the undertaking and the goodwill thereof upon giving six months' notice in writing to the Undertakers terminating on the thirteenth day of January one thousand nine hundred and eighteen the thirteenth day of July one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five the thirteenth day of January one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three or the thirteenth day of July one thousand nine hundred and forty or at any time thereafter up to the day of the expiration of a period of forty-two years after the commencement of this Order upon the terms of paying to the Undertakers—

Purchase

(a) A sum equal to the amount of the capital expended by the Undertakers upon the undertaking at the date of the notice including all costs charges and expenses of the Undertakers in obtaining this Order;

(b) An addition in name of premium of twenty-five per centum upon the sum so ascertained; and

(c) The amount of any capital expended by the Undertakers upon the undertaking between the date of the notice and the date on which the purchase takes effect.

(2) The sum to be paid by the council upon any such purchase shall be determined in default of agreement by arbitration The Board of Trade may determine any other question arising as to the purchase and in default of agreement as to the date at which that purchase is to take effect may fix that date.

(3) As from the date at which the purchase takes effect the undertaking shall vest in the council freed from all debts mortgages or other similar liabilities of the Undertakers or attaching to the undertaking and the powers of the Undertakers under this Order shall cease and determine and the council shall become the Undertakers for the purposes of this Order.

(4) The power to purchase given by this section shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the powers of the council as the local authority to purchase the undertaking under section 2 of the Electric Lighting Act 1888.

4. The area of supply for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 4 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 shall be the area which is described in the First Schedule to this Order and is more particularly delineated on the map deposited together with this Order at the Board of Trade by the Undertakers and signed by an assistant secretary to the Board of Trade.

5. The streets and part of a street throughout which the Undertakers are to lay down suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purposes of general supply within a period of two years after the commencement of this Order as mentioned in section 21 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order.

6. Subject to the provisions incorporated with this Order the Undertakers are specially authorised by this Order to break up the streets not repairable by the local authority which are mentioned in

the Third Schedule to this Order and the railway and tramways which are also mentioned in that schedule. A.D. 1913.

7. The maximum prices which may be charged by the Undertakers as mentioned in section 32 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those stated in the Fourth Schedule to this Order. **Maximum prices.**

8.—(1) The powers given by this Order shall not be exercised unless within twelve months or such extended period not exceeding in the whole fifteen months as the Board of Trade allow after the passing of the Act confirming this Order the Undertakers transfer the undertaking to the provost magistrates and councillors of the burgh of Greenock (hereinafter called "the corporation"). **Transfer of undertaking.**

(2) Within that period the Undertakers shall transfer and the corporation shall take a transfer of the undertaking with the consent of and on such terms and conditions as may be approved by the Board of Trade by deed approved by that Board.

(3) On such transfer the rights powers authorities obligations and liabilities of the Undertakers in respect of the undertaking shall be transferred to and may be exercised by and shall attach to the corporation and the corporation shall subject to the provisions of this Order become the Undertakers for the purposes of this Order.

(4) If the transfer has not been made before the expiration of the period limited in that behalf in this section the Board of Trade may revoke this Order upon the expiration of that period.

9. The Order made by the Board of Trade under section 6 of the Electric Lighting Act 1909 and dated the tenth day of July nineteen hundred and thirteen permitting the corporation to give a supply of electricity to certain premises in the burgh of Port Glasgow shall be revoked as from the commencement of this Order but without prejudice to anything done or suffered thereunder and the corporation shall in respect of such supply and all electric lines and apparatus provided by them for the purpose of giving the supply have the same rights and powers and be subject to the same duties and obligations as if the supply had been given and the electric lines and apparatus had been so provided by them after the commencement of this Order. **Revocation of Order made under section 6 of Electric Lighting Act 1909.**

10. Except for the purpose of enabling the said transfer to be made this Order shall not come into force until the day when the transfer takes effect and that day shall be the commencement of this Order. **Commencement of Order.**
