

**CHAPTER cliv.**

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 to 1909 relating to Portrush. A.D. 1913.
[15th August 1913.]

WHEREAS under the authority of the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 to 1909 the Board of Trade have made the Provisional Order set out in the schedule to this Act: 45 & 46 Vict.
c. 56.
51 & 52 Vict.
c. 12.

And whereas a Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under the authority of the said Acts is not of any validity or force whatever until the confirmation thereof by Act of Parliament: 9 Edw. 7.
c. 34.

And whereas it is expedient that the Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under the authority of the said Acts as set out in the schedule to this Act be confirmed by Act of Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Electric Lighting Order Confirmation (No. 6) Act 1913. Short title.

2. The Order as amended and set out in the schedule to this Act is hereby confirmed and the same shall from and after the passing of this Act have full validity and effect. Order in

S C H E D U L E.PORTRUSH URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL
ELECTRIC LIGHTING.

Portrush. Provisional Order granted by the Board of Trade under the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 to 1909 to the urban district council of Portrush in respect of the urban district of Portrush in the county of Antrim.

Short title. 1. This Order may be cited as the Portrush Electric Lighting Order 1913.

Incorporation of Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899. 2. The provisions contained in the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 (with the exception of section 83 of that schedule) are incorporated with and form part of this Order.

Undertakers. 3. The Undertakers for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 2 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are the urban district council of Portrush.

Area of supply. 4. The area of supply for the purposes of this Order and within the meaning of section 4 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 shall be the area which is described in the First Schedule to this Order and is more particularly delineated on the map deposited together with this Order at the Board of Trade by the Undertakers and signed by an assistant secretary to the Board of Trade.

Power to break up railway and tramways. 5. Subject to the provisions incorporated with this Order the Undertakers are specially authorised by this Order to break up the railway and tramways which are mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Compulsory works. 6. The streets throughout which the Undertakers are to lay down suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purposes of general supply within a period of two years after the commencement of this Order as mentioned in section 21 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those mentioned in the Third Schedule to this Order.

Maximum prices. 7. The maximum prices which may be charged by the Undertakers as mentioned in section 32 of the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 are those stated in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

8. This Order shall come into force upon the day when the Act confirming this Order is passed and that day shall be the commencement of this Order.

SCHEDULES.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA OF SUPPLY.

The urban district of Portrush as constituted at the commencement of this Order.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Railway and tramways which may be broken up by the Undertakers in pursuance of the special powers granted by this Order.

(a) RAILWAY :—

The level crossings of the Midland Railway Company (Northern Counties Committee) in Kerr Street.

(b) TRAMWAYS :—

The tramways of the Giant's Causeway Portrush and Bush Valley Railway and Tramways Company.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

Streets throughout which the Undertakers are to lay down suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purposes of general supply within a period of two years after the commencement of this Order.

Main Street Mark Street Kerr Street Eglinton Street Causeway Street Lansdowne Crescent Causeway View Terrace Bath Place Antrim Gardens Promenade.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

MAXIMUM PRICES.

In this schedule—

The expression "unit" shall mean the energy contained in a current of one thousand ampères flowing under an electromotive force of one volt during one hour.

SECTION 1.

Portrush.

Where the Undertakers charge any consumer by the actual amount of energy supplied to him they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates per quarter:—

For any amount up to twenty units thirteen shillings and fourpence and for each unit over twenty units eightpence.

SECTION 2.

Where the Undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity contained in the supply given to him they shall be entitled to charge him according to the rates set forth in section 1 of this schedule the amount of energy supplied to him being taken to be the product of that electrical quantity and the declared pressure at the consumer's terminals that is to say such a constant pressure at those terminals as may be declared by the Undertakers under the Board of Trade regulations.
