



## CHAPTER clxviii.

An Act to confirm a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners for the application or management of the Charity called the Hulme Trust Estates (Non-Educational) in the County of Lancaster and elsewhere. A.D. 1913.

[15th August 1913.]

**W**HEREAS the Charity Commissioners in their report to His Majesty of their proceedings during the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven reported that they had approved and certified a scheme for the application and management of the charity called the Hulme Trust Estates (Non-Educational) comprised in an Act of the seventh and eighth years of King George the Fourth chapter nine and an Act of the second year of Queen Victoria chapter seventeen a scheme made under the Endowed Schools Acts on the twenty-sixth day of August eighteen hundred and eighty-one and an Order made by the Charity Commissioners on the twenty-second day of September nineteen hundred and three under the Board of Education Act eighteen hundred and ninety-nine section two subsection (2):

And whereas it is expedient that the scheme as the same is fully set out and defined in the schedule to this Act should be confirmed:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The said scheme is hereby confirmed. Provided always that nothing in this Act or in the said scheme shall be held to interfere with the ordinary jurisdiction over endowed charities now exerciseable or hereafter to become exerciseable by the High Court of Justice and the Charity Commissioners. Confirmation of scheme.

2. This Act may be cited as the Hulme Trust Estates Scheme Confirmation Act 1913. Short title.

SCHEDULE.

*Scheme for the Application or Management of the Hulme Trust Estates (Non-Educational).*

1. *Appointments to Benefices.*—In default of fit candidates who are or have been holders of Hulmeian Scholarships or Exhibitions at Brasenose College in the University of Oxford for appointment as incumbents to the benefices belonging to the above-mentioned charity the following persons in the following order of priority shall be eligible for such appointment:—

- (1) Members or past members of the said college who have resided in Oxford for not less than two years and taken the degree of Bachelor of Arts of the University of Oxford or any equivalent degree of that University:
- (2) Members or past members of the University of Oxford qualified as regards residence and degree as aforesaid.

2. *Sale of Superfluous Benefices.*—The Trustees of the charity shall as soon as practicable regard being had to the obtaining of a fair price sell otherwise than by auction the advowsons and rights of patronage of the benefices specified in the schedule hereto belonging to the charity. The Trustees may do and execute all proper acts and assurances for carrying the sales into complete effect.

3. *Sale of Stock.*—The Trustees shall sell the sum of four thousand six hundred pounds Consols part of the sum of eight thousand six hundred pounds Consols standing in their name and representing (1) a sum of six thousand pounds Consols retained by them for meeting expenses incurred in connexion with the ecclesiastical trusts referred to in clause 2 of the above-mentioned scheme made on the twenty-sixth August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one and (2) accumulations of dividends on the said sum of six thousand pounds Consols.

4. *Application of Net Proceeds of Sales.*—The fund consisting of the net proceeds of the sales of the said advowsons and rights of patronage and sum of four thousand six hundred pounds Consols shall be applied as herein-after directed.

5. *As to Part not exceeding One Third.*—A part not exceeding one third of the said fund may be applied by the Trustees in the exercise
