

college shall not fail by reason of anything in this Order but shall as from the commencement of this Order take effect in favour of or be administered by or in connection with the University.

10.—(1) The Corporation are hereby discharged of all obligations incumbent on them by virtue of the trust disposition and settlement of the deceased William Dick veterinary surgeon to Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and professor of veterinary medicine in Edinburgh dated the sixteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight and with codicil thereto dated the twenty-eighth day of September one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four registered in the books of council and session the twelfth day of April one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six. Saving for Corporation board etc.

(2) The Corporation the board and the individual members of the board in office at the commencement of this Order are hereby respectively discharged of all their actings and intromissions in respect of the college and of their management and administration thereof and of the property vested in the college.

11. Section 54 (Incorporation of Royal (Dick) Veterinary College and confirmation of agreement) of the Act of 1906 and the agreement set forth in the Second Schedule to the Act of 1906 shall cease to have effect as from the commencement of this Order but nothing herein contained shall affect the previous operation of the said section and agreement or anything done thereunder. Certain provisions of Act of 1906 to cease to have effect.

12. All costs charges and expenses incurred preparatory to and in applying for obtaining and confirming this Order or in any way incidental thereto shall be paid by the University Court out of the funds which immediately before the commencement of this Order were held by the board and were applicable to the general purposes of the administration of the college and which are by virtue of this Order transferred to and vested in the University Court. Costs of Order.

SCHEDULE

AGREEMENT between the ROYAL (DICK) VETERINARY COLLEGE as incorporated in terms of the Edinburgh Corporation Act 1906 (6 Edw. VII c. 163) of the First Part and the UNIVERSITY COURT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF EDINBURGH as incorporated under the Universities (Scotland) Act 1889 of the Second Part

WHEREAS the Royal (Dick) Veterinary College of the First Part (referred to hereinafter as the College) and the University Court of the University of Edinburgh of the Second Part (referred to hereinafter as the Court) have approved that in order to make better provision for the teaching of veterinary studies the College should be embodied

within the University Therefore the two parties for their respective rights and interests have agreed and hereby agree as follows videlicet:—

EMBODIMENT OF THE COLLEGE WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY

First When the College shall promote a Provisional Order under the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act nineteen hundred and thirty-six they shall insert in such Order a clause or clauses to be adjusted and approved by the parties hereto for the purpose of embodying the College within the University dissolving the College as at present incorporated and transferring to the Court with the consents of the lord provost magistrates and council of the city of Edinburgh and the Secretary of State for Scotland the heritable and moveable property assets and endowments belonging to the College as shown in Schedule A of this agreement and providing for such other matters as may be relevant to the afore-mentioned embodiment of the College within the University The expense of obtaining such Order shall be borne by the College In the event of the parties hereto differing in opinion as to the necessary adjustment of such clauses the adjustment shall be settled by the Dean of the Faculty of Advocates for the time being Notwithstanding anything herein contained the College shall only be bound to take such steps as may be in their power to get the said Provisional Order containing such clauses passed into law without incurring any responsibility in the event of their efforts being unsuccessful.

DATE OF AGREEMENT TAKING EFFECT

Second These presents shall come into operation on the last date hereof without awaiting the confirmation of the Provisional Order.

PROVISIONS TO BE MADE BY THE COURT

Third The Court undertake on their part in order to provide for the embodiment of the College within the University and for the better provision of veterinary studies therein—

- (i) To promote an ordinance under the provisions of the Universities (Scotland) Act of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine providing for the institution of a degree or degrees in veterinary medicine and surgery the curriculum and regulations thereof to be administered by a board of veterinary studies within the faculty of medicine and for the revocation of University Court Ordinances Nos. XXXVIII (Edinburgh No. 13) (Institution of Degrees in Veterinary Science and relative Regulations) and CLXXXVII (Edinburgh No. 65) (Affiliation of the Royal (Dick) Veterinary College Edinburgh);
- (ii) As soon as conveniently may be after the embodiment of the College within the University to promote ordinances under the provisions of the Universities (Scotland) Act of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine for the institution of chairs in the three following subjects (namely) (a) veterinary surgery (b) veterinary medicine and (c) veterinary hygiene and preventive medicine;

- (iii) To make provision in consultation with the College that all members of the teaching staff and other employees of the College shall be given placing on the University salary scales as shown in Schedule B of this agreement to mitigate any hardship which may be caused to them by the embodiment of the College within the University and to provide compensation in such cases as may be determined between the parties hereto;
- (iv) To take over the veterinary practice at present belonging to the College and situated at Dalkeith together with the clinical practices of the College and to make provision that the free revenue from the foresaid veterinary practice and clinical practices and from the various diagnostic laboratories of the College shall be made available for use within the University Veterinary School;
- (v) To provide that the following endowments (namely) the Alexander Inglis MacCallum Endowment and the Mary Dick Endowment shall continue to be utilised for the specific purposes originally stipulated in the trust deeds;
- (vi) To associate the name of Dick with the Veterinary School within the University retaining if possible the designation "Royal";
- (vii) To assume all interests and obligations of the College in the Edinburgh Centre of Rural Economy.

INTERIM PROVISIONS

Fourth For the period between the last date hereof and the date of embodiment of the College within the University the following provisions shall have effect (namely) :—

The Senatus Academicus of the University shall appoint an interim board of veterinary studies within the faculty of medicine to be composed of eight members four being members of the Faculty of Medicine of the University and four being members of the College teaching staff including the principal of the College to be recommended by the College. This interim board of studies shall make recommendations for the curriculum for the proposed degree or degrees in veterinary medicine and surgery and other matters relating thereto including the terms of the aforesaid ordinance.

For the period between the embodiment of the College within the University and the institution of a degree or degrees in veterinary medicine and surgery the University shall maintain adequate provision for the teaching of veterinary studies for qualification for membership of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons and it shall be the duty of the interim board of veterinary studies to make recommendations therefor.

VESTING OF FUNDS IN THE UNIVERSITY

Fifth Upon the confirmation of the foresaid Provisional Order and the embodiment of the College within the University as contemplated under the same as aforesaid the titles to the heritable properties belonging to the College subject to the bonds secured over the same as shown in Schedule A and all moveable assets including endowments and liquid funds as shown in the same Schedule shall be transferred to and vested in the Court and thereupon the College shall be freed and discharged of their responsibilities and liabilities thereanent.

Sixth The parties hereto for their respective rights and interests consent to the registration hereof for preservation and execution.

VII. c. 163) of the First Part and the UNIVERSITY COURT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF EDINBURGH as incorporated under the Universities (Scotland) Act 1889 of the Second Part:

WHEREAS an agreement was entered into between the Royal (Dick) Veterinary College of the First Part (referred to hereinafter as the College) and the University Court of the University of Edinburgh of the Second Part (referred to hereinafter as the Court) dated twenty-eighth July and seventeenth August nineteen hundred and fifty prescribing *inter alia* the conditions for embodying the College within the said University dissolving the College as constituted by the Edinburgh Corporation Act 1906 as a body corporate and transferring to the Court the heritable and moveable property assets and endowments of the College:
