CHAPTER xi.

An Act to regulate the expenditure on capital account and lending of money by the London County Council during the financial period from the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and forty-four to the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and forty-five and for other purposes.

[13th July 1944.]

WHEREAS the borrowing of money by the London County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") for the purposes of expenditure on capital account and of loans to bodies and persons is governed by the London County Council (Finance Consolidation) Act 1912 as amended or extended by 2 & 3 Geo. 5. subsequent Acts (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act") c. cv. and by Acts to be obtained by the Council for regulating such expenditure and loans during the several periods from the first day of April in any year to the thirtieth day of September in the next following year (which periods are in the principal Act and in this Act referred to severally as a "financial period"):

And whereas such expenditure and loans as aforesaid are in relation to the financial period ending on the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and forty-four regulated by the London County Council (Money) Act 1943:

And whereas emergency provisions were enacted in the London 3 & 4 Geo. 6. County Council (Money) Act 1940 (hereinafter referred to as c. xxii. "the Act of 1940") with reference to the expenditure of money on capital account and the lending of money by the Council for any purpose arising out of war damage or in connection with measures rendered necessary or expedient by the existence of a state of war in addition to the amounts specified in any annual money Act:

A

And whereas it is expedient that the expenditure of the Council on capital account and the lending of money by them during the financial period from the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and forty-four to the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and forty-five (hereinafter referred to as "the financial period 1944-1945") otherwise than under the said provisions of the Act of 1940 should be regulated as by this Act provided:

And whereas estimates have been prepared by the various committees of the Council of the amounts which may be required for the purposes of expenditure on capital account and of loans during the financial period 1944-1945 in the execution of the powers and duties respectively delegated to those committees and all those estimates have been considered by the finance committee of the Council and submitted by that committee to the Council and the estimates as so submitted have been adopted by the Council:

And whereas the sums estimated to be so required as aforesaid for expenditure on capital account during the financial period 1944-1945 are set out in Part I of the schedule to this Act:

And whereas the sums estimated to be so required as aforesaid for the purpose of loans by the Council during the financial period 1944-1945 are set out in Part II of the said schedule:

And whereas the further sums which the Treasury in pursuance of subsection (3) of section 8 (Powers as to expenditure or loans in event of insufficiency of specified amounts) of the London County Council (Money) Act 1937 may authorise the Council to expend on capital account or to lend during the financial period 1944-1945 are set out in Part III of the said schedule and it is expedient that the provisions contained in this Act for enabling the Treasury to increase the sums so set out should be enacted:

And whereas the sums specified in the said Parts I II and III of the schedule to this Act are to the extent set out in Part IV of the said schedule sums which the Council were by virtue of the said London County Council (Money) Act 1943 authorised to expend or lend but were not before the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and forty-four expended or lent:

And whereas the objects of this Act cannot be attained without the authority of Parliament:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:--

1. This Act may be cited as the London County Council Short title (Money) Act 1944 and shall be read and have effect as one with construction. the principal Act.

2. In and for the purposes of this Act—

Interpretation.

- "the Council" means the London County Council;
- "the principal Act" means the London County Council (Finance Consolidation) Act 1912 as amended or extended by any subsequent Act;
- "the Act of 1940" means the London County Council (Money) Act 1940;
- "the financial year" means the period from the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and forty-four to the thirty-first day of March one thousand nine hundred and forty-five both dates inclusive;
- "the following six months" means the period from the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and forty-five to the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and forty-five both dates inclusive;
- "the financial period 1944-1945" means the financial year and the following six months; and
- "the schedule" means the schedule to this Act:
- 3.—(1) The purposes for which during the financial period Expenditure 1944-1945 the Council may under the powers of section 4 (Power on capital to expend money on capital account) of the principal Act expend account money on capital account shall be the purposes mentioned in the financial second column of Part I of the schedule.

- (2) The sums which during the said period the Council may 1944-1945. under the said powers expend on capital account shall as regards the financial year and the following six months respectively be sums which except as by the principal Act otherwise provided shall not exceed those mentioned in the sixth and seventh columns respectively of Part I of the schedule in relation to the said purposes respectively.
- 4. The sums which during the financial period 1944-1945 the Amount Council may lend under the powers of section 7 (Power to lend authorised to money to local authorities and others) of the principal Act and be lent to and which the bodies and persons mentioned in that section are local authorised to borrow from the Council shall as regards the financial authorities year and the following six months respectively be sums which and others except as by the principal Act otherwise provided shall not exceed during those specified in the second and third columns respectively of financial Part II of the schedule in relation to such badios and training for the second and third columns respectively of period Part II of the schedule in relation to such bodies and persons 1944-1945. respectively.
- 5. The sums which the Council may be authorised by the Amount of Treasury under the powers of subsection (3) of section 8 (Powers further as to expenditure or loans in event of insufficiency of specified expenditure and loans amounts) of the London County Council (Money) Act 1937 to which expend on capital account or to lend during the financial period Treasury

may authorise in case of insufficiency.

1944-1945 in case the amounts specified in Parts I and II of the schedule or any of those amounts are found to be insufficient shall as regards the financial year and the following six months respectively be sums not exceeding in the aggregate the amounts specified in the second and third columns respectively of Part III of the schedule:

Provided that the amounts so specified may be increased by the Treasury to such extent as they think proper but that any minute of the Treasury authorising such increase shall be laid before Parliament as soon as may be after it is made and if either House of Parliament within the next twenty-eight days on which the House has sat after such a minute as aforesaid is laid before it resolves that the increase be annulled the minute shall thereupon cease to have effect except as respects things previously done but without prejudice to the issue by the Treasury of a new minute.

Periods for repayment of loans to certain bodies and persons.

6.—(I) Any money lent by the Council to governors or managers of educational institutions (including special and approved schools) or to committees of school treatment centres or to governors or committees of voluntary hospitals and hostels in pursuance of powers conferred by the principal Act and this Act shall be repaid to the Council within such period or periods not exceeding sixty years from the date or respective dates of lending the same as the Council with the approval of the Treasury may determine.

2 & 3 Geo. c. 31. (2) Any money lent by the Council to any bodies or persons in pursuance of the provisions of the Civil Defence Act 1939 shall be repaid to the Council within a period not exceeding ten years as prescribed by that Act.

7. Nothing in this Act shall alter or affect the operation of section 7 (Emergency expenditure or lending for war damage &c.) of the Act of 1940.

8. So long as the making of an issue of capital in the United Kingdom without the consent of the Treasury is prohibited by regulations made under the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts 1939 and 1940 it shall not be lawful to exercise the powers of borrowing conferred by this Act without such consent.
