Cap. xxxviii.

An Act for erecting and maintaining new Public Offices for the County of *Aberdeen*, for altering and enlarging the present Record Office of the County, and for other Purposes. [5th June 1851.]

WHEREAS the Building in which the Public Records of the County of *Aberdeen* are now kept has no Accommodation for the Custody and Preservation of the said Records other than the Rooms which are used as Offices for the Transaction of the Public Business of the County: And whereas the said Building is much too small, and altogether defective in its Arrangements, both for the Custody of the said Records and for affording Accommodation for the due Despatch of the Public Business of the said County, and is also not sufficiently protected from Fire: And whereas it is important and necessary, for the Protection of the Rights and Interests of all the Proprietors of Lands in the said County, and of the Commissioners of Supply and other Officers and Persons connected with the said County and interested in the Records thereof, that sufficient Accommodation should be immediately provided for the Deposit and safe Custody of the said Records, and that the Building in which the same are deposited should be better protected from Fire: And whereas it would be of great Public Advantage if a new Building of suitable

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Extent were erected for the Accommodation of the different Public Offices of the County, and if Powers were granted for altering the present Building in which the Public Records of the County are now kept, and for protecting the same and the Records deposited and to be deposited therein from Fire: And whereas it would be highly beneficial to the said County if the Commissioners of Supply of the said County were authorized to provide such additional Building for the Public Offices, and to alter the existing Building for the safe Custody of the Public Records, and to raise Money for such Purposes, and for the Maintenance and Repair of such Buildings, and for other Purposes: And whereas the said beneficial Objects and Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same,

I. That the Commissioners of Supply of the County of *Aberdeen* for the Time being, duly qualified and acting as such Commissioners, shall be and they are hereby nominated and appointed Commissioners for executing the several Powers and Authorities by this Act vested in them; and such Powers and Authorities may be lawfully executed by the said Commissioners at any of their Ordinary Meetings, or at any Special Meeting of which Notice, stating the Objects of such Meeting, shall have been given, or at any Meeting of the Commissioners to be held under the Provisions of this Act.

Interpre-
tation of
Terms.

II. That in the Construction of this Act and of the Acts incorporated herewith the following Words and Expressions shall have the Meanings hereby assigned to them, unless there be something in the Subject or Context repugnant to such Construction; (that is to say,)

The Word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of Supply for the Time being of the County of *Aberdeen*, duly qualified and acting as such Commissioners:

The Word "Committee" shall mean any Committee of such Commissioners nominated by them for executing all or any of the Powers by this Act vested in the Commissioners:

The Word "Clerk" shall mean the Clerk, or the joint Clerks if the Office be vested in more than One Person, for the Time being, of the Commissioners of Supply of the said County; and in the Case of joint Clerks the Duties by this Act imposed upon the Clerk may be exercised by either of such joint Clerks.

First Meeting

III. That the Commissioners shall hold their First Meeting at *Aberdeen* on the Third *Tuesday* next after the passing of this Act, or

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as soon after such Day as conveniently may be, at the Hour of Twelve at Noon, and shall proceed to put this Act in execution.

IV. That any Three of the Commissioners may at any Time require the Clerk to call a Special Meeting of the Commissioners for any of the Purposes of this Act or connected therewith. Special Meetings may be held.

V. That at every Meeting of the Commissioners for any of the Purposes of this Act One of the Commissioners present shall be elected Preses by the Majority of Votes of the Commissioners present at such Meeting. Preses to be elected at every Meeting.

VI. That at all Meetings of the Commissioners the Questions there considered shall be decided by the Votes of the Majority present, and if there be an equal Division of Votes upon any Question the Preses at such Meeting shall, in addition to his own Vote as a Commissioner, have a Second or Casting Vote: Provided always, that if at any such Meeting there be an Equality of Votes in the Election of the Preses it shall be decided by Lot which of the Commissioners having an equal Number of Votes shall be Preses. Manner of voting.

VII. That at all Ordinary and Special Meetings of the Commissioners for the Purposes of this Act any Five of them shall be a Quorum, and no Business shall be transacted at any such Meeting unless the said Number of Commissioners be present. Quorum of Commissioners.

VIII. That the Commissioners present at such First Meeting, or at any Ordinary or Special Meeting, or at any adjourned Meeting, may from Time to Time adjourn such Meeting to the same or any other Place within the County of *Aberdeen*; and if at any Meeting of the Commissioners there be not Five Commissioners present within One Half Hour after the Time appointed for such Meeting, the Commissioners present, or the major Part of them, or any One Commissioner if only One be present, or their Clerk if no Commissioner be present, may adjourn such Meeting to another Day at the same or any other Place within the County of *Aberdeen*. Meetings of Commissioners may be adjourned from Time to Time.

IX. That the Notice of the First Meeting of the said Commissioners for executing the Purposes of this Act, and the Notice of every Special Meeting of the Commissioners in pursuance thereof, shall be given by Advertisement in any One Newspaper usually circulated through the County of *Aberdeen*, at least Eight clear Days before the Day appointed for holding such Special Meeting, and shall specify the Time and Place of Meeting, and in case of a Special Meeting shall specify the Object thereof; and no Business shall be transacted at any Special Meeting except such as is stated in the Notice thereof. How Notices of Meetings of Commissioners are to be given.

X. That

Committee.

X. That the Commissioners may, if they shall think fit, at any Meeting, from Time to Time appoint a Committee or Committees to carry into effect all or any of the Purposes of this Act which in the Opinion of the Commissioners would be better regulated and managed by means of such Committee, and they may fix the Quorum of any such Committee, and may continue, alter, or discontinue such Committee, and may delegate to such Committee all or such of the Powers hereby granted to the Commissioners as the Commissioners may think proper.

XI. That every Committee so appointed may meet from Time to Time, and may adjourn from Place to Place, as they may think proper, for carrying into effect the Purposes of their Appointment; and at all Meetings of the Committee One of the Members present shall be appointed Preses; and all Questions shall be determined by a Majority of the Votes of the Members present, and in case of an equal Division of Votes the Preses shall have a Casting Vote, in addition to his Vote as a Member of the Committee.

XII. That all Proceedings of the Commissioners, or of a Committee of Commissioners, or of any Person acting as a Commissioner, shall, notwithstanding it be afterwards discovered that there was some Defect in the Appointment of any such Commissioners or Persons acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every such Person had been duly appointed, and was qualified to be a Commissioner.

XIII. That the Commissioners shall cause Entries of all the Proceedings of the Commissioners under the Powers of this Act, and of every Committee appointed by them, with the Names of the Commissioners who shall attend each Meeting, to be duly made from Time to Time in Books to be provided for that Purpose, which shall be kept by the Clerk, under the Superintendence of the Commissioners; and every such Entry shall be signed by the Preses of the Meeting at which the Proceeding took place; and such Entry, so signed, shall be received as Evidence in all Courts, and before all Judges, Justices, and others, without Proof of such Meeting having been duly convened or held, or of the Persons attending such Meeting having been or being Commissioners or Members of Committees respectively, or of the Signature of the Preses, or of the Fact of his having been Preses, all of which last-mentioned Matters shall be presumed, until the contrary is proved; and such Books shall at all reasonable Times be open to the Inspection of any of the Commissioners, and of any Mortgagee of the Rates authorized by this Act.

XIV. That

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XIV. That all the Clauses and Provisions of "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," with respect to the following Matters, that is to say,

Certain Provisions of 10 & 11 Vict. c. 16. incorporated with this Act.

With respect to the Construction of the Act, and any Act incorporated therewith ;

With respect to the Contracts to be entered into and the Deeds to be executed by the Commissioners ;

With respect to the Liabilities of the Commissioners, and to legal Proceedings by or against the Commissioners ;

With respect to the Appointment and Accountability of the Officers of the Commissioners ;

With respect to the Mortgages to be executed by the Commissioners, except Sections 86 and 87, with respect to the Appointment of a Receiver ;

With respect to the Accounts to be kept by the Commissioners ;

With respect to giving Notices and Orders ; and

With respect to Access to the Special Act,

Shall be incorporated with this Act, and be applicable to the Objects and Purposes thereof.

XV. That for the Purpose of enabling the Commissioners to defray the Costs and Expense of purchasing Lands, and of erecting and fitting up, furnishing, and completing the proposed new Building, and of making such Alterations and Improvements in the said existing Building as may be found necessary, and of furnishing and fitting up the same, and also the Costs and Expense of and incident to the obtaining and passing this Act, and carrying the several Powers and Provisions thereof into execution, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the Authority of any Ordinary or Special Meeting of the Commissioners, from Time to Time to borrow at Interest any Sum of Money which, together with any Sum previously borrowed for the Purposes of this Act, shall not exceed in the whole the Sum of Seven thousand Pounds, on Mortgage of the Rates and Assessments by this Act authorized to be assessed and levied, and for securing the Monies so to be borrowed, with Interest, not exceeding the Rate of Five Pounds *per Centum per Annum*, to assign over the said Rates or Assessments, or any Part thereof, to the Persons who shall advance such Money, or to any Trustee for them; as a Security for the Payment of the Money so to be borrowed, together with Interest for the same ; and every such Assignment may be executed, in the Name and on behalf of the Commissioners, by the Preses of the Ordinary or Special Meeting of the Commissioners at which the Sum of Money to be thereby secured was authorized or directed to be borrowed,

XVI. That the Sum to be set apart and appropriated out of the Rates and Assessments as a Sinking Fund to be applied in paying off

the Principal Sums which shall have been borrowed or secured on Mortgage of such Rates and Assessments shall be in each Year not less than One Fourteenth Part of the Monies from Time to Time so borrowed or secured.

XVII. That the Costs and Expenses of any Mortgages, and also the Interest to become due upon or in respect of such Mortgages, may be paid by the Commissioners out of any Rates or Assessments received by them, or out of the Monies to be borrowed by the Commissioners under the Powers of this Act.

XVIII. That the Commissioners at their Ordinary Meeting on the Thirtieth Day of *April* or the First Day of *May* in each Year shall appoint One or more Persons to be Auditor or Auditors, to audit the Accounts of the Commissioners, and shall pay to such Auditors such Sum by way of Remuneration for their Trouble as the Commissioners shall think reasonable.

XIX. That "The Lands Clauses Consolidation (*Scotland*) Act, 1845," shall be incorporated with and form Part of this Act.

XX. That, subject to the Provisions in this and in the said Lands Clauses Consolidation (*Scotland*) Act contained, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to enter upon, take, and use all or any Part of the Houses and Lands and other Hereditaments mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed, and all Estates and Interests, of what Kind soever, therein or in any Part thereof.

XXI. That if any Omission, Mis-statement, or wrong Description shall have been made of any Lands, or of the Owners, Lessees, or Occupiers of any Lands, mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed, the Commissioners, after giving Ten Days Notice to the Owners, Lessees, and Occupiers of the Lands affected by such proposed Corrections, may apply to Two Justices for the Correction thereof; and if it appear to such Justices that such Omission, Mis-statement, or wrong Description arose from Mistake, they shall certify the same accordingly, and they shall in such Certificate state the Particulars of any such Omission, Mis-statement, or wrong Description; and such Certificate shall be deposited with the Principal Sheriff Clerk of the County of *Aberdeen*, and such Certificate shall be kept by such Principal Sheriff Clerk; and thereupon the said Schedule shall be deemed to be corrected according to such Certificate, and the Commissioners may take any Lands, in accordance with such Certificate, as if such Omission, Mis-statement, or wrong Description had not been made.

XXII. That

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XXII. That it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to agree with the Owners of any other Houses or Lands which the Commissioners may think desirable to purchase for better effecting the Objects and Purposes of this Act, for the absolute Purchase, for a Consideration in Money, of any such Houses or Lands, and of all subsisting or other Interests therein, and of all Charges thereon and Incumbrances affecting any such Houses or Lands, and all Rights to which such Houses or Lands may be subject, and all other Estates or Interests in such Houses or Lands, of what Kind soever.

Power to purchase other Ground, by Agreement with the Owners.

XXIII. That all Houses and Lands which shall be purchased by the Commissioners for the Purposes of this Act, and all Rights of Property and Servitude connected therewith, shall be conveyed to and feudally vested in the Sheriff Clerk and the Clerk of Supply of the County for the Time being respectively, and their respective Successors in Office, but in trust nevertheless for the Commissioners, and to permit such Houses, Lands, and Property to be used for all or any of the Purposes of this Act, and to convey and dispose of the same for any Purpose authorized by this Act, at such Times and in such Manner as the Commissioners shall from Time to Time direct.

Property purchased to be vested in certain Public Officers.

XXIV. That it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to erect and build, upon any Ground or Land to be purchased by them under the Powers of this Act, a new Building, of such Dimensions, and according to such Plans and Elevations, and containing such Rooms and other Conveniences, as the Commissioners shall from Time to Time think necessary or expedient, and suited for Offices for the convenient conducting and carrying on the Public Business of the County, and also for the Accommodation, Preservation, and safe Custody of the Public Records thereof.

Power to erect new Offices.

XXV. That, for the Purpose of enabling the Commissioners to make a Passage or Communication, if the same shall be found necessary, to the present Record Office of the County situate on the West Side of *King Street*, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to make and construct a covered Passage over the Street or Lane leading from the *Lodge Walk* to *Queen Street*, past the East Entry to the Poultry Market in *Aberdeen*, at such Elevation above the Level of the Surface of the said Lane as the Commissioners shall think fit, but so as to leave sufficient Headway for the convenient Passage of Carriages under the same.

Power to make a covered Passage over a certain Lane.

XXVI. That when the Commissioners shall have completed the said new Building and Offices, and the same shall be fit for the Use of the Public Officers for whom the same have been made, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to direct and require the same to be used

When new Offices completed, Commissioners may appropriate the same among the

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Public Officers of the County.

used by such Officers for the transacting therein of the Public Business of their respective Offices ; and the Commissioners are hereby empowered to apportion the Rooms in the said new Building and the said Offices among the Public Officers aforesaid in such Manner as to the Commissioners shall seem most expedient for the Accommodation of the Public Business of the County ; which Apportionment the Commissioners shall be and are hereby empowered to alter from Time to Time, in such Manner as to them shall appear fitting or necessary.

When new Building completed, the existing Offices to be altered, and fitted up as a Record Office.

XXVII. That upon such new Building and Offices being so completed and occupied, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to cause the Building and Rooms now used for the Custody and Preservation of the Public Records aforesaid, and as Offices, to be altered, fitted up, and repaired, ventilated, and made fire-proof, or otherwise protected from Fire, and in all other respects made fit for the safe Custody and Preservation of the Public Records of the County therein, and to make such Additions thereto, and such Provisions for the Preservation and safe keeping of the said Records therein, as the Commissioners shall from Time to Time think proper.

Commissioners to obtain and approve Plans before entering into Contracts.

XXVIII. That the Commissioners, before beginning to build or furnish and fit up the proposed new Building, and before beginning to alter, furnish, and fit up the said existing Building, shall procure a Plan and Elevation of the proposed Building, and a Plan of the proposed Alterations in the said existing Building, and in each Case a Plan of all the necessary and necessary Erections and Accommodations to be made, and Estimates of the whole Expense of the proposed Work to be made and delivered to them ; and the Plan and Estimate of any such proposed Work shall be approved of by the Commissioners before any Contract for the Execution thereof shall be entered into on their Behalf.

Power to levy Rates or Assessments.

XXIX. That it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, at their First or at any Ordinary or Special Meeting, from Time to Time to assess upon all Heritors of Lands and Fishings within the Landward Part of the County of *Aberdeen*, and rated in the Cess and Valuation Books of the said County of *Aberdeen*, and upon all Heritors of Lands and Fishings locally situated within the Landward Part of the said County of *Aberdeen*, but not rated in the Cess and Valuation Books thereof, such Sums as the Commissioners shall from Time to Time deem necessary and sufficient for completing, maintaining, and keeping in repair the said Buildings, and for paying the Interest of the Money to be borrowed under this Act, and for setting aside the Sum by this Act directed to be set apart to form a Sinking Fund for the Liquidation of the Principal Money so to be borrowed, and otherwise carrying into execution the Powers of this Act.

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XXX. That the Rates and Assessments by this Act authorized shall be assessed and levied upon the same Principle and in the same Manner, and shall be collected and received by the same Collectors or Persons, as the Rates and Assessments authorized to be assessed and levied upon the Landward Parts of Counties under the Powers and for the Purposes of the Act. 2 and 3 Vict. Cap. 42., to improve Prisons and Prison Discipline in *Scotland*, are by such Act directed or authorized to be assessed, levied, and collected respectively, with this Variation, that for every Five Pounds *Scots* that shall be assessed on every Hundred Pounds *Scots* of the valued Rent of Property contained in the Cess and Valuation Books of the said County of *Aberdeen* there shall be assessed the Sum of Three Farthings Sterling on every Pound Sterling of the annual Value of Property locally situated within the Landward Part of the said County, but not valued in the said Cess and Valuation Books; and all the Powers and Provisions of the said Act for the assessing, levying, collecting, recovering, and receiving the Rates or Assessments thereby authorized shall apply and may be exercised and put in force by the Commissioners for assessing, levying, collecting, recovering, and receiving the Rates and Assessments by this Act authorized: Provided always, that Fourteen Years after the passing of this Act, or at such earlier Time as the whole Principal Money hereby authorized to be borrowed by the Commissioners, together with the Interest due thereon, shall have been paid, the Powers hereby given to the Commissioners to levy Rates and Assessments as aforesaid shall cease and determine.

XXXI. That after the whole of the Principal Money which shall be borrowed by the Commissioners under the Authority of this Act, and all Interest in respect thereof, shall have been fully paid, then, from Time to Time and all Times thereafter, the Costs and Expense of maintaining, keeping in repair, and altering or extending the Record Office for the Time being of the said County, and the Public Offices and Buildings connected therewith, and of otherwise carrying into execution the Powers of this Act, shall be paid and discharged by the Commissioners out of the County Rates of the said County which for the Time being shall be levied by the said Commissioners within the Landward Part of the said County of *Aberdeen* under the Name of "Rogue Money;" and for the Purpose of defraying such Expenses it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners to assess and levy such increased or additional Amount of the said County Rates called "Rogue Money" as they shall from Time to Time deem necessary for the Purposes authorized by this Act.

When Money raised for the new Buildings has been paid off, then the Buildings to be maintained out of Monies called "Rogue Money" of the County.

XXXII. That the Collectors and Persons by whom the Rates and Assessments by this Act authorized shall be collected and received shall from Time to Time pay all Sums of Money which shall be received

received by them in respect of such Rates or Assessments into such Bank or Banks as the Commissioners shall from Time to Time direct; and all Sums of Money which shall be received in respect of such Rates or Assessments, and also all Sums of Money which shall be raised by the Commissioners by Mortgage of such Rates or Assessments, shall be applied to the several Purposes authorized by this Act.

Recovery of Damages and Penalties.

XXXIII. That the Clauses of "The Railways Clauses Consolidation (*Scotland*) Act, 1845," with respect to the Recovery of Damages not specially provided for, and to the Determination of any other Matter referred to the Sheriff or to Justices, shall be incorporated with this Act, and such Clauses shall apply to this Act and to the Commissioners respectively, and shall be construed as if the Word "Commissioners" had been inserted therein instead of the Word "Company."

Things done by Two Justices may be done by the Sheriff, &c.

XXXIV. That all Things in this Act, or any Act incorporated herewith, authorized or required to be done by Two Justices, may and shall be done by the Sheriff of the County or his Substitute.

Persons giving false Evidence liable to Penalties of Perjury.

XXXV. That every Person who upon any Examination upon Oath under the Provisions of this Act, or of any Act incorporated herewith, shall wilfully and corruptly give false Evidence, shall be liable to the Penalties of wilful and corrupt Perjury.

Short Title.

XXXVI. That in citing this Act in any Act of Parliament, in legal Instruments or Proceedings, in Notices, Advertisements, or other Documents, it shall be sufficient to use the Expression "The *Aberdeen* County Records and Public Offices Act, 1851."

Expenses of Act.

XXXVII. That the Costs, Charges, and Expenses of or incident to the applying for, obtaining, and passing of this Act shall be paid out of the Monies which shall be assessed and levied and come to the Hands of the Commissioners by virtue of this Act; and in the meantime, and until the Commissioners shall receive sufficient Money for such Purposes, under the Powers of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to advance and pay the same out of any Monies now in their Hands or under their Control belonging to the said County, and applicable to the general Purposes thereof, or out of the Monies which the Commissioners may borrow upon the Credit of the Rates and Assessments authorized by this Act.
