An Act for providing a convenient Place or Fair Green, with proper Approaches thereto, for holding Fairs for the Sale of Cattle and other Animals, Wool and Flax, in the Province of Munster at or near the City of Limerick, and for regulating such Fairs. [28th May 1852.]

HEREAS the providing a convenient Place for Fairs for the Sale of Horses, Cattle, and other Animals, Wool, Hemp, and Flax, at or near the City of Limerick, will be an Undertaking of great public Advantage: And whereas it is expedient that Commissioners should be appointed for the Purposes of the Undertaking, but that such Commissioners should not derive any private or personal pecuniary Profit or Advantage from the Undertaking: And whereas it is expedient that a Guarantee as herein-after mentioned should be provided for the Payment of the Interest of Monies to be borrowed for the Purposes of the Undertaking: And whereas such Purposes cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and [Local.]

Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; (that is to say,)

Short Title.

I. That in citing this Act for any Purpose it shall be sufficient to use the Expression "The Great Munster Fair Act, 1852."

Certain Provisions of 8 & 9 Vict. c. 18. and ec.16. and 14. incorporated

II. That the "Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," the "Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," save and except the Clauses of that Act with respect to the Election and Rotation of Commissioners, 10 & 11 Vict. when the Commissioners are to be elected by the Ratepayers, and the "Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847," save and except Clause with this Act. Thirteen of that Act with respect to Sales elsewhere than in the Markets, and also save and except the Clauses of that Act with respect to Slaughter-houses, shall be incorporated with and form Part of this Act, except so far as the said Provisions or any of them may be expressly varied thereby.

"Quarter Sessions."

III. That the Expression "Quarter Sessions" in this Act and the said incorporated Acts shall mean the Quarter Sessions for the County of Limerick holden at the City of Limerick.

Newspapers for Advertisements.

IV. That the Newspaper or Newspapers in which Advertisements may be published under the Provisions of this Act or of the said Acts incorporated herewith shall be some Newspaper or Newspapers published in the County or County of the City of Limerick.

Appointment and Incorporation of Commissioners.

V. That the following Persons, by virtue of their respective Offices, (namely,)

The Lord Lieutenant for the Time being of the County of Limerick; the several Members of Parliament for the Time being of the County and County of the City or Borough of Limerick; the Mayor for the Time being of the County of the City of Limerick; the President for the Time being of the Chamber of Commerce of Limerick; the Chairman for the Time being of the Board of Guardians of the Union of Limerick; and the several Justices of the Peace for the Time being of the County and County of the City or Borough of Limerick; and also the several Persons, and their Successors, to be elected by the Grand Juries of the Counties of Cork, Kerry, Tipperary, and Clare, in manner herein-after provided, shall be Commissioners for putting this Act into execution, and shall be known as "The Commissioners of the Great Munster Fair," and by that Name shall be a Body Corporate, with perpetual Succession and a Common Seal, and shall have Power to purchase, take, and hold Lands for the Purposes of this Act, and also to sue and be sued,

and

and as the Promoters of the Undertaking to put this Act into execution.

VI. That on the First Day of the First Assizes after passing of this Act, and of every subsequent yearly Spring Assizes to be holden for the Counties of Limerick, Cork, Kerry, Clare, and the North and South Ridings of the County of Tipperary, each of the Grand Juries for the said Counties shall elect Six Persons to be Commissioners as aforesaid, who shall remain in Office until the First Day of the ensuing Spring Assizes: Provided always, that every elected Commissioner going out of Office as aforesaid may be re-elected: Provided also, that a Writing under the Hand of the Secretary for the Time being of each of the said Grand Juries, addressed to the Clerk for the Time being of the said Commissioners, and notifying the Election of any Person to be a Commissioner, shall be sufficient Evidence that such Person has been properly elected.

VII. That a Person shall not, on account only of his being a Commissioner, be incapable of acting as a Justice of the Peace for any of incapable of the Purposes of this Act or of any Act or Part of an Act incorporated herewith, if otherwise authorized so to act.

VIII. That a Mortgagee or Bondholder under this Act shall not be qualified to act as a Commissioner under this Act.

IX. That the Commissioners shall hold their First Meeting at the First and County Court House in the City of Limerick at the Hour of One o'Clock in the Afternoon on the Fourth Wednesday after the passing missioners. of this Act; and all subsequent Meetings shall be held at such Places in the County or Borough of Limerick and at such Times as the Commissioners shall think fit: Provided always, that the Commissioners shall hold an Annual Meeting in the Month of August in every Year after the passing of this Act.

X. That the Commissioners shall not be required to hold regular stated Monthly Meetings for the Transaction of Business.

XI. That the Commissioners in Meeting duly convened shall Powers of transact the ordinary and other Business of the Undertaking in the Commis-Manner prescribed by the "Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847."

XII. That the Commissioners shall require their Secretary or Duties of Clerk to attend at their Office on such Days and at such Hours only Commisas the said Commissioners shall from Time to Time direct, for the sioners. Purpose of receiving Notices and of transacting the ordinary Business of the Commissioners; and the said Commissioners shall also require

their Clerk, Treasurer, and other Officers to attend at their respective Offices at such Days and Hours as the Auditor or Auditors to be appointed as herein-after mentioned shall think proper, for the Purpose of auditing the Accounts of the Commissioners.

Power to borrow on Mortgage.

XIII. That it shall be lawful for the Commissioners at any Time and from Time to Time to borrow on Mortgage or Bond, for the Purposes of this Act, on the Credit of the Stallages, Rates, and Tolls by this Act authorized, any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding in the whole the Sum of Ten thousand Pounds, at any Rate of Interest not exceeding the Rate of Five Pounds per Centum per Annum.

XIV. That in case the said Commissioners shall at any Time have paid off and discharged, by and out of the Stallages, Rates, and Tolls hereby authorized to be levied and raised, the Principal Monies secured by any Mortgage or Bond, it shall not be lawful for them again to borrow the Sum or Sums of Money so paid off, unless such Sum or Sums of Money shall have been paid off for the Purpose of borrowing Money at a lower Rate of Interest, pursuant to the Provisions of Section Eighty of "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847."

XV. That with respect to the enforcing of Arrears of Principal and Interest on Mortgages or Bonds, it shall be lawful to enforce the authorize the Payment of such Arrears by the Appointment of a Receiver, and the Sum necessary to authorize the Appointment of a Receiver shall be Five hundred Pounds.

Commissioners not bound to see to Trusts.

XVI. That the Commissioners shall not be bound to see to the Execution of any Trust, express, implied, or constructive, to which a Execution of Mortgage or Bond may be subject.

Application of surplus Income to

XVII. That the said Commissioners shall from Time to Time, so long as any Principal Monies shall be owing on the Security of any pay off Loan. Mortgages or Bonds, appropriate and set apart their surplus Income arising from the Stallages, Rates, and Tolls hereby authorized to be levied and raised, after providing for the annual Expenditure of the Commissioners, and the Interest due upon such Mortgages or Bonds, as a Sinking Fund, to be applied in paying off such Principal Monies, and shall from Time to Time cause the said Surplus and the accruing Dividends thereof to be invested in the Manner prescribed by the Eighty-fourth Section of the "Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847;" and the Commissioners shall determine the Mode of paying off such Mortgages or Bonds in the Manner prescribed by the Eighty-fifth Section of the said Act for the Payment of Mortgages or Assignations in Security.

XVIII. That within Seven Days after any surplus Income off Loan to be shall have been set apart, in accordance with the Provisions of the last

XIX. That the Register of Mortgages or Assignations in Security shall at all reasonable Times be open to Inspection by the Secretary for the Time being of the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick.

XX. XXI. XXII. That in case the said Secretary of the said Grand Jury shall disallow, or refuse or neglect to allow, or shall object to the Accounts submitted to him as aforesaid, previously to the First Day of the then ensuing Assizes for the said County, the Grand Jury for the County of Limerick shall, upon the Request of the Commiscounts of the sioners, signified by Writing signed by their Clerk or other proper Commission. Officer, appoint an Auditor to examine the same Accounts; and such Auditor shall, for the Purposes of such Examination, have and exercise all the Powers herein given to the Secretary of the said Grand Jury, and his Allowance or Disallowance of the same Accounts shall be final: Provided always, that the Secretary of the said Grand Jury and the said Auditor shall receive by and out of the annual Income of the Commissioners such Remuneration for his and their Trouble as the said Grand Jury shall from Time to Time determine.

XXIII. That on the Completion of every half-yearly Audit the Secretary or Auditor (as the Case may be) shall, by a Certificate under his Hand, certify the net Monies (if any) remaining in the Hands of the Commissioners, and the Interest which shall become payable as aforesaid, and the Balance or Sum which shall remain after deducting such net Monies from such Interest; and the said Secretary or Auditor shall forthwith deposit the said Certificate in the Office of the Secretary of the said Grand Jury, and shall deliver a Duplicate thereof to the Commissioners.

Grand Jury to present Balance.

XXIV. That the said Grand Jury shall and they are hereby required, from Time to Time, without Application to any Presentment Sessions, to present the Balance or Sum so certified as aforesaid, and the same shall be levied and raised in like Manner and subject to like Provisions as other Sums presented by the said Grand Jury shall be raised and levied; and the Treasurer for the County of *Limerick* shall, out of the Monies collected and remaining in his Hands, after Repayment of Government Advances, Gaol Expenses, and Salaries of public Officers payable by him, pay the Sum so presented by the Grand Jury unto the Commissioners, or as they shall direct; and if the said Grand Jury shall refuse or neglect to present the said Balance or Sum so certified as aforesaid, or any Part thereof, the said Treasurer shall and he is hereby required to insert such Balance or Sum, or such Part thereof as aforesaid, in his Warrant for raising the Monies presented at the same Assizes, in the same Manner as if such Balance or Sum, or Part thereof, had been duly presented by such Grand Jury, and the same shall be raised and levied accordingly; and the said Treasurer

Treasurer shall pay to the Commissioners the said Balance or Sum, or Part thereof, in the same Manner as if it had been duly presented by the said Grand Jury.

XXV. That if at any Time after Payment of all Principal and Application Interest Monies due upon Mortgages or Bonds under the Provisions of this Act, or of any Act or Part of an Act incorporated herewith, Repayment there shall be upon any Thirtieth Day of June or Thirty-first Day of December in any Year a Balance of Monies in the Hands of the sentments. Commissioners, after deducting all proper and necessary Expenditure previously incurred by them, and also after deducting a Sum which shall be deemed by them necessary or proper to meet the accruing Expenditure for Repairs, Improvements, Salaries, and otherwise, to be incurred by them during the succeeding Year, then and in such Case the said Balance shall, so far as the same shall extend, be applied by them, in the first place, in Repayment to the Treasurer of the said County of Limerick of such Sum or Sums of Money (if any) as shall have been levied off the said County, and paid to the said Commissioners, and shall not have been repaid by them pursuant to the Provisions of this Act, and lastly in such Manner and for such Purposes, for the Improvement and Extension of Agriculture, by assisting or establishing Agricultural Schools or Model Farms, or otherwise, as the said Commissioners shall in their uncontrolled Discretion think proper: Provided always, that every Receipt duly stamped and signed by the said Treasurer, and given to the Commissioners, shall be a sufficient Discharge to them for the Monies in such Receipt expressed to be received, and that all such Monies shall be applied by the said Treasurer in the same Manner as Monies levied off the said County: Provided also, that a Certificate under the Seal of the Commissioners, stating the Balance in their Hands on each of the said Days respectively, after making such Deduction as last aforesaid, shall be conclusive Evidence that such Statement is correct.

XXVI. That it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, subject to Power to the Provisions in this and the said incorporated Acts contained, to Commissionenter upon, purchase, take, and hold the Lands described in the chase and Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed, or such Part or Parts thereof hold Lands. as they may think proper, or to purchase, or rent on Lease, upon such Terms and Conditions as may be agreed upon between the said Commissioners and the Owner or Persons authorized to sell or let the same, any Lands in the County of Limerick which the said Commissioners may deem proper or necessary to be rented or purchased for the Purposes of this Act; and such Lands, or so much thereof as shall have been so purchased or acquired, shall when so purchased or acquired be appropriated to the Purposes

of this Act: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall authorize the Commissioners to purchase any Lands, except such as are specified in Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed, without the previous Consent of the Owner and Occupier thereof, or other Persons empowered to sell the same by virtue of this Act and of the Powers and Provisions of the several Acts incorporated therewith.

Power to enclose Fair Green and erect Buildings.

XXVII. That, subject to the Provisions contained in this and the said Acts incorporated herewith, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, upon the Lands described in Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed, or on any Lands which the Commissioners may purchase or take on Lease, pursuant to the Provisions of this Act, to enclose and establish a Fair Green, and to erect, construct, and maintain all necessary Buildings, Works, Approaches, and Conveniences thereto, for the Exposure and Sale of Horses, Cattle, and other Animals, Wool, Hemp, and Flax.

Lands to be taken not to exceed 100 Acres.

XXVIII. That the Lands to be taken or required by the Commissioners for the Purposes of this Act shall not exceed One hundred Acres Statute Measure.

Period for Completion of Works.

XXIX. That the Fair Green, Buildings, and other Works hereby authorized shall be enclosed, constructed, and completed within Five Years from the passing of this Act; and at the Expiration of such Period the Powers by this Act given to the Commissioners for purchasing, taking, or holding Lands shall cease and determine, save and except as to the Lands which shall have been previously purchased, taken, or held by them.

Tolls to be taken at or upon Fair Green.

XXX. That it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners from Time to Time to demand from any Person occupying or using any Stand, Stall, Shed, Station, or Place upon the Fair Green to be established under the Provisions of this Act, or the Buildings or Ground connected therewith, or bringing into or upon such Fair Green, Buildings, or Ground any Cattle or other Live Stock specified in the Schedule (B.) to this Act annexed, or any Wool, Hemp, or Flax, such Stallages, Rents, and Tolls as the said Commissioners shall from Time to Time appoint, not exceeding the several Stallages, Rents, and Tolls specified in the said Schedule.

XXXI. That when the said Fair shall be opened for public Use no Person shall, during the Three Days immediately preceding the Day appointed for holding the said Fair, or during the holding of the said Fair, sell or expose for Sale within One Mile from any Part of the Boundary of the said Fair Green and Buildings any Cattle or Live Stock specified in the said Schedule (B.), or any Wool, Hemp,

Hemp, or Flax; and any Person who shall during the said Three during the Days sell or expose for Sale any such Cattle or Live Stock, Wool, holding of a Hemp, or Flax, in manner aforesaid, shall be liable to a Penalty of Three Days Forty Shillings for every Animal and for every Hundredweight previously of Articles so sold or exposed for Sale by him, and to be recoverable thereto. in like Manner as Penalties are recoverable under "The Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847:" Provided always, that this Enactment shall not apply to any Person who shall sell or expose for Sale, in his own Dwelling House, Shop, or Premises, any Animal or other Article aforesaid which shall be his own Property: Provided further, that nothing in this Act contained shall interfere with the Establishment or holding of any Fair or Market beyond the said Distance of One Mile from any Part of the Boundary of the said Fair Green and Buildings, or the Establishment or holding of any Fair or Market within the Borough of Limerick.

XXXII. That nothing herein contained shall be deemed or Undertaking construed to exempt the Commissioners hereby incorporated, or the not to be Undertaking of which they are the Promoters, from the Provisions of Provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1848," or of any General Act relating 11 & 12 Vict. thereto, or to the Subject Matter thereof, which may pass during the c. 63. present or any future Session of Parliament.

XXXIII. XXXIV. That all the Costs, Charges, and Expenses attending or Expenses of incident to the preparing and applying for and obtaining this Act Act. shall be paid by the said Commissioners out of the First Monies which shall come to their Hands by virtue thereof.
