An Act for constructing and maintaining a Quay
and other Works in the Borough of *Gateshead*
in the County of *Durham*, and for other Pur-
poses. [16th *July* 1855.]

WHEREAS certain Streets, Roads, Passages, or Places called *Church Walk* and *Hillgate* in the Municipal Borough of *Gateshead* (in this Act called "the Borough") are ill-constructed and inconvenient, and the Dwelling Houses and other Buildings situate therein are unhealthy, whereby Disease has been engendered, and Annoyance and unnecessary Expenditure occasioned to the Ratepayers and other Inhabitants of the Borough: And whereas an Explosion and Conflagration lately occurred in a Street called *Hillgate*, extending to *Church Walk* in the Borough, and a large Number of Houses, Warehouses, Manufactories, and other Buildings were destroyed, and many of them are now in Ruins: And whereas the Street called *Hillgate*, situate on the South Bank of the River *Tyne*, offers eligible Sites for the Erection of a Quay, Landing Places, and Dwelling Houses, and of Shops, Warehouses, and other Buildings suitable for the Purposes of Trade, and such Quay, Landing Places, Dwelling Houses, Shops, Warehouses, and other

Buildings are required for the Commerce of the Borough, and the Convenience of the Ratepayers and other Inhabitants thereof, and the other Persons resorting thereto: And whereas by an Act passed in the Fifty-fourth Year of *George the Third*, intituled *An Act for cleansing, lighting, and otherwise improving certain Streets and Places within and near the Town and Borough of Gateshead in the County of Durham*, Commissioners were appointed for putting that Act into execution: And whereas under and by virtue of the Act for the Regulation of Municipal Corporations in *England and Wales*, and of a certain Indenture bearing Date the Twenty-fourth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, the Powers and Authorities of the said recited Act of the Fifty-fourth Year of *George the Third* were transferred to and became vested in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of *Gateshead* (in this Act called "the Corporation"): And whereas under and by virtue of a Provisional Order of the General Board of Health, dated the First Day of *February* 1851, and "The Public Health Supplemental Act, 1851, No. 2," confirming that Order, "The Public Health Act, 1848," except Section Fifty and Part of Section Eighty-eight thereof, was applied to and put in force within and throughout the Borough, and the Corporation were constituted the Local Board of Health for the Borough: And whereas by "The River *Tyne* Improvement Act, 1850," it was enacted, that when the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of *Tynemouth*, or the Corporation, or the *South Shields* Improvement Commissioners, or the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of *South Shields* (if *South Shields* were constituted a Municipal Corporation), should have opened within their respective Boroughs a Quay of not less than One hundred Yards in Length, for the Use of the Public, subject to the Payment of Quay Dues thereat to the Parties erecting such Quay, the Goods landed thereat should thenceforth be exempted from the Payment of One Half of the Dues described in that Act as the Import Dues; and that it should be lawful for the Corporation, or the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of *Tynemouth* or of *South Shields*, or for the *South Shields* Improvement Commissioners, to receive and take from any Vessel within the Port any Ballast, to be employed in the Construction of the said last-mentioned Quays or in any Repairs thereof, without any Licence from the Commissioners for executing that Act, who should out of the Ballast Dues payable in respect of such Ballast allow, for receiving, conveying, and depositing the same, after the Rate of One Shilling *per* Ton; and it was by that Act also enacted that the Corporation of *Newcastle-upon-Tyne* should not be entitled to Compensation for any Right or Interest which they might have or claim to have in that Part of the Bed and Soil of the River *Tyne* or Foreshore thereof upon which such respective Quays might be constructed: And whereas by "The *Tyne* Improvement Act,

Act, 1852," the Management and Control of the Moorings for Vessels in the River *Tyne*, and the watching of the same River, were transferred to the *Tyne* Improvement Commissioners: And whereas it is expedient that the Corporation be authorized, as by this Act provided, to construct, maintain, improve, and regulate the Quay by this Act authorized, and the Works and Conveniences connected therewith, and to make the new Streets and other Works by this Act authorized, and to raise Money and levy Rates for the several Purposes of this Act, and to carry this Act in all respects into execution: And whereas the several Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

I. This Act may be cited for any Purpose as "*Gateshead Quay Short Title Act, 1855.*"

II. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough, acting by the Council of the Borough, shall be the Commissioners for executing this Act (in this Act called "the Commissioners"), and their Meetings and Proceedings, when so acting, shall be regulated according to the Laws from Time to Time in force for the Regulation of Municipal Corporations in *England* and *Wales*, and affecting the Municipal Corporation of the Borough; and any Meeting of the Council, duly held according to such Laws, shall be deemed to be held for the Purposes of this Act, as well as for any other lawful Purposes.

III. The Quarterly Meeting of the Council of the Borough in the Month of *August* in every Year shall be deemed to be the Annual Meeting of the Commissioners.

IV. The Auditors from Time to Time of the Borough shall be the Auditors of the Accounts of the Commissioners under this Act, and shall be entitled to such Remuneration for every such Audit as the Commissioners from Time to Time deem equitable.

V. "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and the Clauses of "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," with respect to the Contracts to be entered into and the Deeds to be executed by the Commissioners, and with respect to the Liabilities of the Commissioners, and to legal Proceedings by or against the Commissioners, and with respect to the Appointment and Accountability of the Officers of the Commissioners, and with respect to the Mortgages to be executed by the Commissioners, and with respect to the Accounts to be kept

kept by the Commissioners (except the Clause numbered Ninety-two thereof), and with respect to giving Notices and Orders, and with respect to the Proof of Debts on Bankruptcy or Insolvency, shall, save so far as the same respectively are expressly varied by this Act, be incorporated with this Act.

VI. "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," shall, save so far as the Clauses thereof are expressly varied or excepted by this Act, be incorporated with this Act: Provided always, that the Clauses of that Act with respect to the Construction of Works for the Accommodation of Officers of Customs (except so far as the same require Huts and Weighing Materials to be provided and kept in repair), with respect to Life Boats, with respect to keeping a Tide and Weather Gauge, with respect to the Tender of Amends, and with respect to Access to the Special Act, shall not be incorporated with this Act.

VII. In this Act the following Words and Expressions shall have the several Meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, unless there be something in the Subject or Context repugnant to or inconsistent with such Construction; (that is to say,)

The Expression "the *Gateshead Quay*" shall include and mean the Quay by this Act authorized, and the Approaches, Warehouses, Wharfs, Shipping and Landing Places, Stairs, Slips, Sheds, Cranes, Sluices, Works, and Conveniences connected therewith:

The Words "Harbour, Dock, or Pier," used in "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," shall for the Purposes of this Act extend to and include the *Gateshead Quay*:

The Expression "Harbour Master," in "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," shall extend to and include the Quay-masters appointed under this Act, and their Assistants:

The Word "Ballast" shall include Stone, Gravel, Sand, Clay, Earth, and other Substances used as Ballast:

The Word "Rubbish" shall include Ballast, Wreck, Ashes, Filth, and other waste Substances.

VIII. The several Words and Expressions to which Meanings are assigned by the Acts wholly or partially incorporated with this Act, and to which Meanings are not otherwise assigned by this Act, have respectively in this Act the same respective Meanings, unless there be in the Subject or Context something repugnant to or inconsistent with such Construction: Provided always, the Expression "the Superior Courts" in those Acts shall for the Purposes of this Act include all Courts of competent Jurisdiction.

IX. Except as by this Act otherwise provided, any Vessel lying moored to or at or alongside of the *Gateshead* Quay shall be deemed to be within the Limits of the same for the Purposes of this Act.

As to Vessels lying within Limits of *Gateshead* Quay.

X. Notwithstanding anything in this Act contained, it shall not be requisite for the Commissioners to cause any Part of the *Gateshead* Quay to be set apart for light Vessels, except for such Vessels as are about to load their Cargoes or some Part thereof at that Quay.

No Part of Quay to be set apart for light Vessels.

XI. And whereas Plans and Sections of the Quay, new Streets, and other Works by this Act authorized, describing the Lines and Levels thereof, together with Books of Reference to the said Plans, have been deposited at the Offices of the Clerks of the Peace for the County of *Durham* and the County of the Town of *Newcastle-upon-Tyne* respectively: Therefore, subject to the Provisions of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners to make and maintain the Quay, new Streets, and other Works by this Act authorized in the Lines and Situations and according to the Levels and within the Limits of Deviation restricted as herein-after mentioned, and upon the Lands delineated on the said Plans and Sections and described in the said Books of Reference, and to purchase, take, and use such of the said Lands as the Commissioners shall deem necessary for such Purposes: Provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners in carrying the said Works into execution to deviate to any Extent not exceeding Five Feet from the Levels defined on the said Sections.

Power to make and maintain Works according to deposited Plans.

XII. The Quay and Works by this Act authorized include the following; (to wit,)

Works authorized as herein set forth.

A Quay, with all necessary and proper Approaches, Wharfs, Shipping and Landing Places, Stairs, Slips, Sheds, Cranes, Warehouses, Sluices, and other Works and Conveniences adjoining thereto or connected therewith, commencing at or near a certain Point in the Borough and Parish of *Gateshead* and Parish of *Saint Nicholas* in the Borough and County of *Newcastle-upon-Tyne*, or one of them, in or near to the Bed of the River *Tyne*, and at the North-west Corner of a certain Quay demised to and in the Occupation of Messrs. *David Haggie* and *Peter Haggie*, in or near *Hillgate* in the Borough and Parish of *Gateshead*, and terminating at the East Side of the *Tyne Bridge* in the Borough and Parish of *Gateshead* and the Parish of *Saint Nicholas* in the Borough and County of *Newcastle-upon-Tyne*, or one of them, which Quay and other Works and Conveniences will be wholly made or situate within the Borough and Parish of *Gateshead* in the County of *Durham* and Parish of *Saint Nicholas* in the Borough and County of *Newcastle-upon-Tyne*, or one of them:

Provided always, that the Quay hereby authorized to be made and maintained shall, from its Eastern Extremity to the North-east Corner of the Quay and Premises marked 67 on the said Plans, be made on the Line laid down on such Plans, and thence Westward to the West Corner of the Quay called *Bertram's Quay* on the Line of the existing Quay, and thence Westward to its Western Extremity on a Line within the Limits of Deviation delineated on the said Plans, to be hereafter agreed upon by the *Tyne Improvement Commissioners* and the Commissioners.

XIII. The new Streets by this Act authorized include the following ;
(that is to say,)

First, a new Street commencing at or near a Point in or near to *Bridge Street* in the said Borough and Parish of *Gateshead*, and which Point is marked C on the deposited Plans, and running in an Easterly Direction, and terminating at a Point at or near a certain Railway Staith or Drop belonging to the *North-eastern Railway Company*, and which Point is marked D on the said Plans :

Secondly, a new Street or Road in lieu thereof, commencing at a Point in or near to *Church Street* aforesaid, and which is marked E on the said Plans, and running in an Easterly Direction, and terminating at a Point in or near a certain Road or Way leading from *Oakwellgate* and *Cannon Street* respectively to the South Shore, and which Point is marked F on the said Plans :

Thirdly, for the Purpose of making such new Streets, to alter, divert, stop up, or inclose so much of the Street called *Hillgate* as is not required in forming the said new Streets, and to divert, stop up, or inclose the several Stairs, Alleys, or Passages, or any Part thereof, communicating with *Church Walk* and *Hillgate*, or either of them.

XIV. And whereas by an Act passed in the Forty-first Year of *George the Third*, intituled *An Act for continuing and amending an Act made in the Twenty-eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled 'An Act for enlarging the Terms and Powers of 'Two Acts of the Twelfth and Nineteenth Years of His present Majesty's Reign, made for building a temporary Bridge and completing a new Stone Bridge over the River Tyne, between the Town 'of Newcastle-upon-Tyne and Gateshead in the County of Durham, 'and making the Avenues to and the Passages over the same more 'commodious, and for removing and preventing Nuisances and Annoy- 'ances in the Streets, Lanes, or Avenues leading to the said new Stone 'Bridge within the Town of Gateshead, in the County of Durham,' and for enabling the Trustees named in the said Act to widen and enlarge the said new Stone Bridge, Trustees therein named were

authorized to widen and enlarge *Tyne Bridge* aforesaid, and to make and erect a Parapet thereon, of such Dimensions, Form, and Materials as they should think proper; and by that Act a Fund was created for the future Repair of the said Parapet and Extensions: And whereas it is expedient that so much of the said Parapet on the East Side of *Tyne Bridge* as extends from *Bridge Street* to the Outside of the *Gateshead Quay* should be taken down, for the Purpose of forming Approaches to that Quay: Therefore, for the making of such Approaches, the Commissioners may take down and remove the said Parapet to the Extent aforesaid, and join the *Gateshead Quay* with the Bridge, according to the Plans and Sections respectively deposited for the Purposes of this Act, and after such Part of the said Parapet is so taken down and removed the Obligation to maintain and repair such Part, under the last-recited Act, shall cease.

XV. When and so soon as the new Streets by this Act authorized shall be completed by the Commissioners, and put into good Repair, such new Streets shall thereupon become public Highways, and be for ever thereafter maintained and repaired, in like Manner and at the like Expense as the other public Highways in the Borough.

XVI. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners from Time to Time to make, alter, improve, and maintain all such Sheds, Buildings, Warehouses, Roads, and other Works and Conveniences as they may deem necessary, for the Reception, Security, Accommodation, and Transit of Goods landed or being at or upon the *Gateshead Quay*, and to alter, stop up, and divert such Streets, Highways, Roads, public Ways, and other Places, Sewers, Mains, and Pipes, as may be necessary or convenient, in the Execution or for the Purposes of the Quay, new Streets, and other Works by this Act authorized; and the Consent or Approval of the *Tyne Improvement Commissioners*, as Conservators of the River *Tyne* or otherwise, shall not be necessary for the Construction, Repair, or Alteration of such Quay or other Works, or any of them.

XVII. If any Omission, Mis-statement, or wrong Description shall have been made of any Lands or Buildings, or of the Owners, Lessees, or Occupiers of any Lands or Buildings, described on the said Plans or mentioned in the said Books of Reference, the Commissioners, after giving Ten Days Notice to the Owners, Lessees, and Occupiers of the Lands affected by such proposed Correction, may apply to any Two Justices for the Correction thereof; and if it appear to such Justices that such Omission, Mis-statement, or wrong Description arose from Mistake, they shall certify the same accordingly,

ingly, and they shall in such Certificate state the Particulars of any such Omission, Mis-statement, or wrong Description; and such Certificate, with the other Documents to which it relates, shall be deposited with the said Clerks of the Peace, and such Certificate shall be kept by such Clerks of the Peace with the other Documents to which it relates, and thereupon such Plans or Books of Reference shall be deemed to be corrected according to such Certificate, and the Commissioners may take any Lands in accordance with such Certificate, as if such Omission, Mis-statement, or wrong Description had not been made.

XVIII. True Copies of the said Plans, Sections, and Books of Reference, or of any Alteration or Correction thereof, or Extract therefrom, certified by either of the said Clerks of the Peace, which Certificate such Clerks of the Peace shall give to all Parties interested, when required, shall be received in all Courts of Justice or elsewhere as Evidence of the Contents thereof.

XIX. If any Works of the Commissioners under this Act shall render it necessary to take up or displace any Mooring already or hereafter placed under the Authority of "The River *Tyne* Improvement Act, 1850," or "The *Tyne* Improvement Act, 1852," in the Bed of the River *Tyne*, the Party or Body on whom such Mooring or the Management thereof may for the Time being be vested may fix and replace such Mooring in such other Part of the said Bed as they shall see fit, and the Expenses incurred in taking up and fixing and replacing such Mooring shall, on Demand, be repaid to him or them by the Commissioners, and if not so paid may be recovered, with full Costs of Suit, in any Court of competent Jurisdiction.

XX. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners to make and maintain the *Gateshead* Quay or any Part thereof in, over, and upon the Bed, Soil, and Foreshore of the River *Tyne*, without making any pecuniary or other Compensation for the Portion of the said Bed, Soil, and Foreshore which may be taken or used for the Purposes thereof, to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of *Newcastle-upon-Tyne*, and the River *Tyne* Improvement Commissioners, or either of them, for any Right or Interest which they respectively may have or claim to have in such Bed, Soil, or Foreshore.

XXI. The Powers of this Act for the compulsory Purchase of Lands shall not be exercised after the Expiration of Three Years after the passing of this Act.

XXII. The Commissioners shall construct and for ever after keep in repair sufficient public Landing Places along the Front of the
Gateshead

Gateshead Quay at Distances not exceeding One hundred Yards apart from each other, with Steps down to Low Water, and other Conveniences connected therewith, for the free Use, Passage, and Convenience of the Public, and shall place and for ever after keep in repair good and sufficient Mooring Posts and Rings for the Safety of and Cranes for the loading and unloading of Vessels frequenting that Quay.

XXIII. The Commissioners shall provide, fix, and place good and sufficient Mooring Posts and Mooring Rings on and in the *Gateshead Quay*, at the said several public Landing Places, and shall at all Times repair and maintain the same in good and sufficient Repair, and shall permit the same to be used by small Boats of a less Burden than Three Tons, and by Keels, Wherries, and Lighters, without any Charge for the Use thereof: Provided always, that in Cases of Gales of Wind, Floods, or other Cases of Emergency, it shall be lawful for the Quay-master to authorize or direct that any Vessel may use any Mooring Post or Ring upon that Quay, and no Payment to the Commissioners shall be made in respect of such Use so authorized or directed by such Quay-master.

XXIV. Nothing contained in this Act, nor any Powers conferred on the Quay-master under or by virtue of this Act, shall in any Manner interfere with the Powers of the Harbour Master, acting under the Authority of the *Tyne Improvement Commissioners* or otherwise, but such Powers of such Harbour Master shall and may be exercised over all Vessels in the River in the same Manner and to the same Extent as if this Act had not been passed.

Powers of Quay-masters not to interfere with Jurisdiction of Harbour Master.

XXV. Except as by this Act otherwise provided, after the Commissioners shall have opened for public Use the *Gateshead Quay* to the Extent of not less than One hundred Yard in Length, the Goods landed thereat shall (subject nevertheless to the Payment to the Commissioners of the Rates by this Act authorized to be taken by them) thenceforth be exempted from the Payment of One Half of the Dues in "The River *Tyne Improvement Act, 1850*," described as the Import Dues.

XXVI. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners from Time to Time to take from any Vessel in the River *Tyne* any Ballast to be employed in such Construction, Alteration, or Repairs, without any Licence from the *Tyne Improvement Commissioners*, who shall, out of the Ballast Dues payable in respect of Ballast so received, and received from any such Vessel, allow for receiving, conveying, and depositing the same after the Rate of One Shilling *per* Ton, or such smaller Sum as the Commissioners think fit.

XXVII. The Commissioners from Time to Time may sell or demise, on such Terms and Conditions and to such Persons and for such Periods as they think fit, any of the Lands purchased or taken by them under this Act, and any of the Warehouses and other Buildings, Works and Conveniences, so from Time to Time erected by them, and may make, alter, and repeal all such Orders and Regulations with respect to the Erection, Construction, Elevation, Levels, Improvement, and Maintenance of the Houses, Warehouses, Shops, Offices, and other Buildings to be from Time to Time erected by any Persons whomsoever on the Sides of or abutting on or adjoining to any Part of such new Streets as they from Time to Time think fit: Provided always, that the Commissioners shall not sell or demise any such Lands, Warehouses and other Buildings, Works and Conveniences, so erected by them, for a longer Term than Thirty-one Years, without the Approval of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, or Two of them, signified by Writing under their Hands.

XXVIII. Except as by this Act otherwise provided, it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, so soon as One hundred Yards in Length of the *Gateshead* Quay shall be open for public Use, to demand and take, for every Vessel using that Quay or any Part thereof, any Sum for every Ton of Measurement of such Vessel not exceeding the Rates on Shipping specified in the Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed, for each and every Time such Vessel shall use that Quay or any Part thereof, and every such Rate on Shipping shall be payable by the Master of such Vessel, and also to demand, for all Goods shipped or unshipped, received or delivered, upon or from the *Gateshead* Quay or any Part thereof, any Sums not exceeding the several Rates on Goods respectively specified in the Schedule (B.) to this Act annexed specified; and as to all such Goods as shall not be specified in that Schedule, the Commissioners may demand and take a Rate on Goods equal to the Rate for the Time being payable in respect of Goods of a similar Nature, Package, and Quality, and every such Rate on Goods shall be payable by the Owner or Consignee of the Goods.

XXIX. Provided always, That none of the Rates on Shipping specified in Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed shall be payable in respect of any Vessel, unless such Vessel shall receive, deposit, load, or unload any of the Cargo thereof from or upon the *Gateshead* Quay or some Part thereof.

XXX. Provided also, That none of the Rates on Goods shall be payable in respect of any Goods received or delivered into or from any small Boat of a less Burden than Three Tons at or from any public Landing Place.

XXXI. Provided also, That no Rate shall be payable under this Act in respect of any Passenger landing or embarking at or from any public Landing Place.
