An Act to revive and extend certain of the Powers of the Waveney Valley Railway Company with relation to their Railway. [29th July 1856.]

HEREAS by "The Waveney Valley Railway Act, 1851," 14 & 15 the Waveney Valley Railway Company were incorporated, c. lxvi. THEREAS by "The Waveney Valley Railway Act, 1851," 14 & 15 Vict. and were authorized to make a Railway from the EasternUnion Railway to Bungay in Suffolk: And whereas the Company have completed and opened to the Public so much of the Railway as is situate between the Eastern Union Railway and Redenhallcum-Harleston, but they have not purchased all the Land which is required for constructing, nor have they as yet constructed, their Railway between Redenhall-cum-Harleston and Bungay, but the Powers granted to the Company by the said Act for the compulsory Purchase of Lands and for making the said Railway having expired, it is expedient that those Powers should be revived and extended: And whereas by "The Waveney Valley Railway Extension Act, 1853," 16 & 17 Vict. the Company were authorized to extend their Railway from Bungay c. cxliv. to Beccles, and the Fourth Day of August One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five was the Time limited by the same Act for the compulsory Purchase of Lands by the said Company, which Period was extended by "The Waveney Valley Railway Act, 1855," for a Year; 22 N[Local.]

Year, but it is necessary that this Period should be still further extended; but inasmuch as these Objects cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament, may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

Reviving Time for the Purchase of certain Lands.

I. The Powers of "The Waveney Valley Railway Act, 1851," for the compulsory Purchase or taking or using of Lands for the Purpose of making so much of the Railway and Works by that Act authorized as lies between the Parish of Redenhall-cum-Harleston in Norfolk, inclusive of the said Parish, and the Parish of Bungay Holy Trinity in Suffolk, likewise inclusive, shall be and are hereby revived, and shall continue in force until the Thirty-first Day of August One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven.

Extending Time for the Purchase of Lands.

II. The Powers of "The Waveney Valley Railway Act, 1855," for the compulsory Purchase or taking or using of Lands for the Purpose of making the Railway and Works authorized by "The Waveney Valley Railway Extension Act, 1853," shall be and are hereby extended, and shall continue in force until the Thirty-first Day of August One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

Parties | aggrieved by Extension granted may have Compensation for additional Damage.

III. The Justices, Arbitrators, Umpires, or Juries respectively, as the Case may be, who, under the Provisions of the said recited Acts of Time being or this Act, shall award or assess the Compensation to be made by the Company to the Owner or Occupiers of or other Persons interested in any of the Lands the Powers for taking which are by this Act revived and extended, or extended alone, or who shall award or assess the Compensation to be made by the Company to the Owners or Occupiers of or other Persons interested in any Lands which may be injuriously affected by the Construction of the said Railways or Works, shall, in estimating the Amount of such Compensation, have regard to and make Compensation for the additional Damage sustained by such Owners, Occupiers, or other Persons by reason of the Extension of Time hereby authorized.

Existing Contracts and Notices not to be affected.

IV. Provided always, That nothing herein contained shall in anywise prejudice or affect any Contract entered into or Notice given totake Lands by the Company before the passing of this Act for the Purchase or taking of any Lands, but every such Contract and Notice respectively shall be construed and shall take effect, and the same Proceedings shall be had thereunder, and all Parties thereto shall be entitled to the same Rights and Remedies in respect thereof, both at Law and in Equity, as if this Act had not been passed.

The Powers conferred upon the Company by "The Waveney Time re-Valley Railway Act, 1851," for making the Railway thereby authorized, shall be and the same are hereby revived, and shall continue completing in force until the Thirty-first Day of August One thousand eight the Railways. hundred and fifty-eight.

VI. In case the Railways authorized to be constructed by virtue If Railways of the first-recited Act and this Act shall not be completed and opened for public Traffic within the Period named in this Act, then and from thenceforth it shall not be lawful for the Company or the Directors thereof to pay any Dividend to the Shareholders on the ordinary or unguaranteed Capital of the Company until such Railways shall have been completed and opened for public Traffic.

VI. It shall not be lawful for the Company, out of any Money Deposits for which they are at present authorized to raise, to pay or deposit any Sum of Money which, by any Standing Order of either House of Parliament now in force or hereafter to be in force, may be required to be deposited in respect of any Application to Parliament for the Purpose of obtaining an Act authorizing the Company to construct any other Railway or execute any other Work or Undertaking.

VIII. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to Provisions exempt the Railways by this or the said recited Acts authorized to for General Railway be made from the Provisions of any General Act relating to such Acts. Acts, or of any General Act relating to Railways, or to the better and more impartial Audit of the Accounts of Railway Companies, now in force or which may hereafter pass during this or any future Session of Parliament, or from any future Revision and Alteration, under the Authority of Parliament, of the maximum Rates of Fares and Charges authorized by this Act or the said recited Acts, or of the Rates for small Parcels.

IX. All the Costs, Charges, and Expenses of applying for, obtain Expenses ing, and passing this Act, or in connexion with or preparatory or in of Act. anywise relating or incident thereto, shall be paid and discharged by the Company.

X. In citing this Act for any Purpose it shall be sufficient to use Short Title. the Expression "The Waveney Valley Railway Amendment Act, 1856."
