# HORACHAINA.

Cap. CXXXVIII.

An Act to provide for the Arrangement of the financial Affairs of the City of Perth; for the Maintenance of the Port and Harbour; and for other Purposes therewith connected.

[29th July 1856.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth and First Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled An Act for enlarging, improving, and maintaining 11 G. 4. & the Port and Harbour of Perth, for improving the Navigation of 1W.4.c.cxxi. the River Tay to the said City, and for other Purposes therewith connected, whereby certain Commissioners were appointed for improving the Navigation of the said River and Port and Harbour in manner and to the Extent therein mentioned, for levying the Rates and Duties therein also mentioned, and for carrying the said Act into execution: And whereas by the said recited Act the said Commissioners were authorized and empowered to cleanse, scour, cut, and deepen the said River within certain Limits therein specified, and to widen the same, for enabling Vessels resorting to the said City and Harbour to pass and repass with Safety and Facility, and [Local.]23 Yalso

also to construct, repair, rebuild, extend, and enlarge the Quays, Shores, Piers, Landing Places of the said Harbour, and Retaining Walls and Embankments necessary for the same, the Powers of the said Commissioners as to the Execution of Works being limited to the Space of Five Years from the passing of the Act: And whereas, in consideration of the great Charges to be incurred in the Execution of the Works thereby authorized, the said Commissioners were by the said recited Act empowered to demand and take the several Rates and Duties specified and contained in the Schedules (A.) and (B.) annexed to the said Act respectively: And whereas by the said recited Act the said Commissioners were authorized to borrow and take up at Interest from Time to Time any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding Sixteen thousand Pounds, upon the Credit of the said Rates and Duties, and assign the same for the Security of the Person or Persons lending the Money: And whereas by the said recited Act Provision was made for the Indemnification of the Proprietors or Occupiers of Salmon Fishings or other Properties which might be used or taken for or injured by the Execution of the aforesaid Works, and the whole Property and Common Good of the said City was declared liable for such Indemnification: And whereas another Act was passed in the Fourth and Fifth Year of the Reign of His late 4 & 5 W. 4. Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled An Act to alter and amend an Act passed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty and First Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled 'An Act for enlarging, improving, and maintaining the Port and 'Harbour of Perth, for improving the Navigation of the River Tay 'to the said City, and for other Purposes therewith connected,' by which second-recited Act certain Commissioners were appointed for carrying the Powers of the said first and second recited Acts into execution, and were authorized and empowered, in addition to the Works and Operations contemplated and authorized by the firstrecited Act, to cause, make, form, and erect a Tide Harbour, Dock or Docks, Canal or Canals, and other Works, and to take and use certain Lands necessary for these Purposes, and also to cause to be done, performed, and executed every Act and Operation tending to preserve and improve the Navigation of the said River Tay within the Bounds of the said Port and Harbour by the Removal of natural or artificial Obstructions in the Bed or along the Banks of the River, and the connecting of certain Islands with the Mainland, and the Time for the Execution of the Works and Operations authorized by the recited Acts was by the second-recited Act extended to Five Years from the passing thereof for deepening and improving the Navigation of the River beyond the Bounds to which the first-recited Act applied, and Twenty Years from the passing of the second recited Act for the Execution of the other Works and Operations so authorized: And whereas by the second-recited Act Provision was

made for Compensation to the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, Tenements, Salmon Fishings, and others, as might be deteriorated or injured by or in consequence of the said Operations, and the Commissioners were authorized to borrow and take up at Interest an additional Sum of Thirty-four thousand Pounds upon the Credit and Security of the Rates and Duties imposed by the first-recited Act as altered and explained by the second-recited Act and Schedules (A.) and (B.) thereto annexed; and it was by the said secondrecited Act declared not to be competent to the said Commissioners to proceed further in the Execution of the Works and Operations thereby authorized than to deepen and improve the Navigation of the said River Tay, and to form and complete the Tide Harbour thereby authorized to be made, formed, and erected, nor for these Purposes to expend, borrow, or take up at Interest any Sum exceeding the Sum of Fifteen thousand Pounds Sterling beyond the Debt then incurred under the Authority of the said first-recited Act, until Compensation should be made or provided for in Terms of the Directions in the said second-recited Act contained for that Purpose to the Proprietors of Fishings for any Damage that might be sustained by them in consequence of the Operations and Works executed by the said Commissioners; and it was by the said second-recited Act further enacted, that the Proprietors or Owners of Salmon Fishings situated in that Part of the River Tay to which the Operations authorized by both the said recited Acts extended, and the Lessees, Tenants, or Occupiers of the same, should be entitled to Indemnification for any Loss or Damage which their said Fishings might suffer or sustain in consequence of any such Operations, the Amount of such Loss or Damage to be ascertained in the Manner by the said Act provided; and it was by the said second-recited Act enacted, that so soon as the Operations thereby and by the first-recited Act authorized should be completed, it should be in the Power of the said Commissioners to make over to and devolve upon the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council of the City of Perth the entire Charge and Management of the said Harbour, Docks, and other Operations, Works, and Erections, the Preservation of the Navigation of the said River, of levying the foresaid Rates and Duties, and Application of the same to the Purposes of the second-recited Act, and that in the event of such Devolution being made, then and from that Time forward the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council should be entitled to exercise and execute the whole Powers, Authorities, and Duties conferred upon the said Commissioners by the first and second recited Acts, in the same Manner and to the same Extent as the said Commissioners were authorized in every respect to do, act, and perform the same: And whereas another Act was passed in the Second and Third Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to alter, amend, and enlarge the 2 & 3 Vict.

Powers and Provisions of Two several Acts of the Eleventh Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth and First Year of the Reign of King William the Fourth, and Fourth and Fifth Years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, for improving the Port and Harbour of Perth, and the Navigation of the River Tay to the said City, by which inter alia the Time allowed by the first and second recited Acts for the Execution of the Works and Operations connected with the deepening and improving the Navigation of the said River was extended to the Thirty-first Day of December in the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-one; and the said Commissioners were thereby authorized to borrow on the Credit of the Rates and Duties leviable at the said Port and Harbour, before Compensation should be made or provided to the Proprietors of Salmon Fishings in manner directed by the said secondrecited Act, any Sum or Sums of Money, not exceeding Six thousand Pounds Sterling on the whole over and above the foresaid Sum of Fifteen thousand Pounds, and in addition to the Debt authorized to be contracted under the Authority of the first-recited Act: And whereas another Act was passed in the Twelfth and Thirteenth Year 12 & 13 Vict. of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to amend and equalize the Rates and Duties leviable at the Port and Harbour of Perth, to authorize the borrowing of an additional Sum of Money, and for other Purposes in relation thereto, whereby inter alia certain new Rates and Duties were authorized to be levied at the said Port and Harbour, and the said Commissioners were, in addition to the Sums of Sixteen thousand Pounds and Thirty-four thousand Pounds authorized to be borrowed and taken up by the said first and second recited Acts, authorized and empowered to borrow and take up at Interest, in the Way and Manner provided for in the said recited Acts, any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding Thirty thousand Pounds Sterling, which, in so far as necessary, they should be bound. to expend and apply for the Purpose of making Compensation to the Proprietors of Salmon Fishings in Terms of the Provisions of the said recited Acts, with the Expenses of ascertaining the same and the Expenses of obtaining the said last-recited Act: And whereas by the several Acts above recited the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council of the City of Perth were authorized and empowered to interpose the Security of the said City and common Funds thereof in guarantee of the Repayment of the Sums of Money thereby authorized to be borrowed: And whereas the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council, and their Predecessors in Office, have from Time to Time borrowed and taken up at Interest, for the Use of the said City, various Sums of Money, on which a Balance remains due after deducting Debts due to the City of Nineteen thousand three hundred Pounds or thereby: And whereas the Commissioners appointed by the first and second recited Acts did, in the Exercise

Exercise of the Powers thereby committed to them, and previously to the Expiration of such Powers, cleanse, scour, and deepen the said River Tay within the Limits in the said recited Acts specified respectively, and did construct, repair, rebuild, extend, and enlarge the Quays, Shores, Piers, and Landing Places of the said Harbour and Works connected therewith, and construct a Tide Harbour for the better Accommodation of the Shipping frequenting the Port of Perth, and remove various Obstructions in the Bed of the said River, and connect certain Islands with the Mainland, by all which the Navigation of the said River to the said City, as well as the Port and Harbour of Perth, have been much improved, and the Merchants, Traders, and Inhabitants of the said City and Suburbs and Vicinity thereof have been greatly benefited: And whereas in the Execution of the Powers contained in and to enable them to discharge and perform the Responsibilities and Duties imposed upon them by the several Acts above recited, the said Commissioners have from Time to Time borrowed and taken up at Interest various Sums of Money, amounting, with Accumulation of Interest, in the whole to Seventyeight thousand seven hundred and forty Pounds, or thereby, for the Payment of which the Security of the City of Perth has been interposed, and have also incurred other Liabilities to the Amount of Three thousand five hundred and seventy Pounds, or thereby: And whereas the free Revenues of the said Commissioners are insufficient to meet the Payment of the Interest of the Debt so contracted by them, and the whole Property and Revenues of the said City, so far as the same can legally be made available by Creditors, are, taken together with the free Revenues of the said Commissioners, inadequate to the Payment of the Debts contracted both by the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council on account of the City, and by the said Commissioners on the Interposition of the Security of the City, or even to the Payment of the Interest on the aggregate Debt, in consequence of which the Affairs of the said City have been for some Time in a State of increasing Embarrassment, and it is most desirable that a Remedy should be provided against the Inconvenience thence arising, and that the whole Debt due by the City and Commissioners should be properly regulated and secured as is herein-after provided; and it is moreover expedient that the whole Powers, Duties, Functions, and Responsibilities of the said Commissioners should now be transferred to and vested in the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council; but as these Purposes cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament, may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

Interpretation of Terms. I. The following Words and Expressions when used in this Act shall, in the Construction thereof, be interpreted as follows, except when the Nature of the Provision or the Context of the Act shall exclude or be repugnant to such Construction; (that is to say,)

The Word "Magistrates" shall include the Lord Provost, Dean of Guild, Four Bailies, and City Treasurer of Perth:

The Expression "the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council" or "the Magistrates and Town Council" or "Magistrates and Council" shall mean the Lord Provost and other Magistrates and Town Councillors of the said City for the Time: The Word "Ship" shall extend to and include all Vessels, Boats,

Barques, or Lighters, whether navigated by Steam or otherwise: The Word "Commissioners," used in reference to the Port and Harbour, shall mean the Commissioners acting under the Acts for the Improvement of the Port and Harbour of Perth and Navigation of the River Tay.

Recited Acts II. The said recited Acts shall be and the same are hereby repealed. repealed.

Port and Harbour vested in Town Council.

III. From and after the passing of this Act all Heritable and Moveable Estate and Property, Rights and Privileges, vested in the aforesaid Commissioners for the Improvement of the Port and Harbour of Perth and Navigation of the River Tay, together with the Rates and Duties authorized by this Act, shall be and the same are hereby vested in the Magistrates and Town Council of Perth for the Purposes of this Act; and the Powers and Functions of the Commissioners shall cease and determine.

Works executed under first and second recited Acts to be maintained.

IV. The whole Works, Operations, and Erections authorized by the said first and second recited Acts shall, so far as the same have under the Authority thereof been made, erected, and executed, be maintained, upheld, and kept in repair and efficient Condition by the said Magistrates and Council.

V. "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," shall, save so far as the Clauses thereof are expressly varied or excepted by this Act, be incorporated with this Act; and the said Magistrates and Council shall be the "Undertakers" for the Execution of the said Act: Provided always, that the Clauses of the said Act numbered respectively Six, Seven, Eight, Nine, Ten, and Eleven, and with respect to the Construction of Works for the Accommodation of Officers of Customs, with respect to Life Boats, with respect to keeping a Tide and Weather Gauge, with respect to the Construction of Warehouses and Cranes, with respect to the Accounts of Rates, with respect to Buoys, Lighthouses, and Beacons, with respect to

Meters

Meters and Weighers, and with respect to the Tender of Amends, shall not be incorporated with this Act: Provided also, with regard to the Accounts of the Rates, that the same shall be kept, laid open to Inspection, and published, in the same Manner, at the same Time, and under the same Penalties, as the Accounts of the Revenues of the City are by Law required to be kept, laid open to Inspection, and published.

VI. Notwithstanding the Repeal of the said recited Acts, all Deeds, &c. Purchases, Sales, Conveyances, Leases, Mortgages, Bonds, Contracts, in force. Agreements, Securities, and other Acts and Things before the Commencement of this Act done, entered into, executed, or instituted under or by virtue of the said recited Acts, or with reference to the Purposes thereof, shall be as good, valid, and effectual to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever as if this Act had not been passed, and may, subject to the Provisions of this Act, be proceeded on and enforced by or against the Magistrates and Council accordingly.

VII. Notwithstanding the Repeal of the said recited Acts, any Actions, &c. Action, Suit, Prosecution, or other Proceeding, commenced either by not to abate. or against the Commissioners under the said recited Acts before the Commencement of this Act, shall not abate or be discontinued or be prejudicially affected, but, on the contrary, the same shall continue and take effect both in favour of and against the said Magistrates and Council, as in room of the said Commissioners, in like Manner in all respects as the same would have continued and taken effect in favour of or against the Commissioners under the said recited Acts if this Act had not been passed; and all Offences against the Provisions of the said recited Acts committed before the Commencement of this Act may be prosecuted, and all Penalties incurred by reason of such Offences recovered, in like Manner in all respects as if this Act had not been passed.

VIII. Notwithstanding the Repeal of the recited Acts, and except Acts of Haronly as by this Act expressly provided, everything before the bour Com-Commencement of this Act done or suffered under the said recited be valid not-Acts or any of them shall be as valid as if the said recited Acts were not repealed; and the Repeal thereof and this Act respectively shall Repeal of Acts. accordingly be subject and without Prejudice to everything so done or suffered, and to all Rights, Liabilities, Claims, and Demands, both present and future, which, if the said recited Acts were not repealed and this Act were not passed, would be incident to or consequent on any and every thing so done or suffered; and with respect to all such Rights, Liabilities, Claims, and Demands, the Magistrates and Council shall to all Intents and Purposes represent the Commissioners under the said recited Acts: Provided always, that the Generality of

this Enactment shall not be confined or restricted by any Provisions in this Act contained.

Debts to be paid to or by the Council.

IX. Notwithstanding the Repeal of the said recited Acts, all Persons who immediately before the passing of this Act owed any Sum of Money to the Commissioners under the said repealed Acts, or to any Person on their Behalf, shall pay the same, with all Interest (if any) due or to accrue for the same, to the said Magistrates and Council; and all Debts and Monies which, immediately before the passing of this Act, were due or owing by or recoverable from the Commissioners under the said repealed Acts, or for the Payment of which they were or but for the passing of this Act would have been liable, shall, subject to the Provisions of this Act, be paid, with all Interest (if any) due or to accrue thereon, by or be recoverable from the Magistrates and Council.

Existing
Byelaws, &c.
to remain in
force.

X. Notwithstanding the Repeal of the said recited Acts, all Byelaws, Rules, and Regulations which, immediately before the passing of this Act, were in force under or in reference to the said repealed Acts, shall, after the passing of this Act, continue and be in full Force and Effect under and in reference to this Act, except in so far as the same may be repealed or altered by or under the Provisions of this Act.

Officers to account and deliver up Books, &c.

XI. All Persons who shall have been employed to receive or who shall have received any Rates and Duties or other Monies by virtue or in pursuance of the said recited Acts, or any of them, or who shall have in their Custody or Possession any Books, Accounts, Papers, Writings, Documents, or Things relating to the said Harbour or Navigation of the said River, shall immediately after the passing of this Act pay and deliver over the same to the said Magistrates and Council.

Books, &c. to remain Evidence.

XII. Notwithstanding the Repeal of the said recited Acts, all Books and other Documents by the said Acts directed or authorized to be kept, and which if the same had not been repealed would have been receivable in Evidence, shall be admitted as Evidence in all Courts of Law and Equity and elsewhere accordingly.

Powers to levy Rates and Duties on Vessels and Goods. XIII. It shall be lawful to the said Magistrates and Council, and their Servants, and all such Persons who are, shall, or may be commissioned or employed by them, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to demand and take, upon every Ship coming to or being within that Part and Portion of the Precincts of the said Port and Harbour of Perth which is situated to the Westward or further up the River Tay than a Line drawn from a Point on the South Side of the

the said River, immediately above the Junction of the River Earn with the said River Tay, to the West End of the Dyke or Embankment on the North Side of the said River Tay, forming the Landmarch between the Estates of Pitfour and Inchyra, to receive or discharge a Cargo or Part of a Cargo, or sailing in Ballast within the said Precincts, the several Rates and Duties contained in the Schedule (A.) hereunto annexed; and also to take and demand from all and every the Owners and Proprietors of all Goods, Wares, Merchandise, and Commodities whatsoever which shall be imported or exported in any Ship coming to and within or leaving the said Port or Harbour of Perth, or any Part or Place within the Precincts or Boundaries thereof as herein-before specified and defined, or which shall be brought, floated, or conveyed by Water within the said Precincts or Boundaries, or from the Agents, Factors, or Managers of such Owners and Proprietors, the several Rates and Duties specified and contained in the Schedule (B.) hereunto annexed; and it shall at all Times be lawful for the said Magistrates and Council to let or lease out the said Rates and Duties hereby imposed, or any Portion thereof, for a Period not exceeding Three Years at One Time: Provided always, that it shall not be competent to or in the Power of any Person or Persons to plead or claim Exemption from Payment of the Rates and Duties by this Act imposed, or any Part thereof, upon the Ground or Plea of their being exempted or having any Claim of Exemption from Payment of the Rates, Dues, or Duties formerly exigible by the said Magistrates and Council, by Consuetude, Grant from the Crown, Statute, or otherwise: Provided also, that no Alteration whatever shall be made upon the said Rates or Duties when under Lease as aforesaid, to take effect at any Time during the Continuance of such Lease.

XIV. The Rates and Duties hereby granted shall, after defraying Application the Charges of collecting, accounting for, and managing the same, be of Duties. applied in the first place towards maintaining the Works for the Improvement of the Navigation of the said River Tay, executed under the Authority of the First and Second Acts before recited, and repairing and rebuilding the Quays, Piers, Shores, and Landing Places pertaining to the Port and Harbour of Perth, and Roads and Accesses thereto, and Retaining Walls, Jetties, and Embankments requisite for the same; and the Remainder or Surplus of the said Rates and Duties shall be applied in the Manner herein-after directed.

XV. Convener, and to fix the Members of such Committees who shall form a Quorum, and the Times of meeting of such Committees; and the Convener who shall preside at such Committees, or in his Absence the Preses to be elected by the Committees, for the Time, shall be entitled to a Casting Vote in case of Equality; and the Committees so to be formed shall report their Proceedings at each Ordinary Meeting of the Magistrates and Council.

No Councillor to be concerned in Contract.

XVI. No Person who shall be a Magistrate or Town Councillor shall accept or continue to hold any Office or Place of Profit under this Act, or be concerned or participate in any Manner in any Contract or in the Profit thereof, or of any Work to be done under the Authority of such Act.

Debts of the Community to be compounded for.

XVII. It shall be lawful to the said Magistrates and Town Council and they are hereby authorized and required to compound for all and every Debt due and Obligation lawfully contracted by them and their Predecessors in Office prior to the Eleventh Day of November One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and which shall have been bearing Interest prior to that Term, including all Debts and Obligations incurred as before recited by the Commissioners of the Navigation and Port and Harbour, and which shall have been bearing Interest prior to the last-mentioned Term, by granting, free of all Charges and Deductions, to all and every Person in right of such Debts Bonds of Annuity in the Manner and Form herein-after provided, at the Rate of Three Pounds Ten Shillings yearly for every One hundred Pounds Sterling of such Debts, and which Bonds of Annuity all and every Person in right of such Debts shall be bound to accept in full Payment thereof; and for every such Bond, including the Entry of the same in the Register of Bonds herein-after mentioned, the Town Clerks or Clerk shall be entitled to charge the City the Sum of Two Shillings and Sixpence per Hundred Pounds.

Bonds of perpetual Annuity to be granted.

XVIII. The Bonds of Annuity to be granted by the said Magistrates and Council to the various Persons in right of the said Debts, as at the Eleventh Day of November One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in manner above provided, shall be for the Sum and at the Rate of Three Pounds Ten Shillings per Centum per Annum on the Amount of their respective Debts, either in One Bond or in such Number of Bonds as the Parties entitled to receive the same may require, and all such Bonds may be written or printed, or partly written and partly printed, in the Words or to the Effect following:

And each such Bond shall be subscribed by the Lord Provost or acting Chief Magistrate, the Treasurer, and Clerks or Clerk of the City of *Perth* for the Time being, and such Bonds shall be Personal or Moveable Estate, and transmissible as such, and not of the Nature or Real or Heritable Estate.

XIX. All such Bonds before being delivered shall be numbered Register of in the Order in which they are granted; and an Entry or Memorial Bonds to be of every such Bond shall be made in a Book to be kept by the Town Clerks under the Direction of the said Magistrates and Council for that Purpose, to be termed "the Register of Bonds," which Entry shall embrace the Date and Number of the Bond, the Name of the Person or Persons to whom the same has been granted, and the Amount of Annuity thereby secured, and which Entry shall be certified on each Bond by the Town Clerks or Clerk of the said City; and such Book shall be kept and the said Entries made therein free of Expense to the Bondholders.

XX. All and every Person and Persons, or Bodies Corporate or Bonds may Politic, to whom any such Bond of Annuity shall be granted, may be transferred. from Time to Time transfer the same by Deed duly stamped, in which the Consideration shall be truly stated, and such Deed may be according to the following Form, or to the like Effect:

And all Transfers shall be valid and effectual if executed according to the usual Mode of executing such Instruments either in Scotland or England, or partly according to one Mode and partly according to the other.

Transfers to be registered.

XXI. The Transfers (when duly executed) shall be delivered to the Town Clerks or Clerk, and be kept by them or him, and they or he shall enter a Memorial thereof in a Book to be called "the Register of Transfers," and shall indorse such Entry on the Bond; and for every such Entry and Indorsement they or he may demand any Sum not exceeding Two Shillings and Sixpence.

Transmission of Bonds
by other
Means than
Transfers.

XXII. If the Interest in any Bond shall have become transmitted in consequence of the Death or Bankruptcy or Insolvency of any Bondholder, or in consequence of the Marriage of a Female Bondholder, or by any other lawful Means than by a Transfer according to the Provisions of this Act, such Transmission shall be authenticated by a Declaration in Writing as herein-after mentioned; and every such Declaration shall state the Manner in which and the Party to whom such Bond shall have been so transmitted, and shall be made and signed by some credible Person before a Sheriff or Justice of Peace; and such Declaration shall be left with the Town Clerks or Clerk, who shall thereupon enter the Name of the Person entitled under such Transmission in the Register of Bondholders, and for every such Entry he may demand any Sum not exceeding Two Shillings and Sixpence.

Proof of Transmission by Marriage, Will, &c.

XXIII. If such Transmission be by virtue of the Marriage of a Female Bondholder, the said Declaration shall contain a Copy of the Register of such Marriage or other Particulars of the Celebration or effecting thereof, and shall declare the Identity of the Wife with the Holder of such Bond; and if such Transmission have taken place by virtue of any Testamentary Instrument, or by Intestacy, the Probate of the Will or Letters of Administration, or an official Extract therefrom, obtained from any Prerogative Court if granted in England, or a Testament Testamentary or Testament Dative if expede in Scotland, or an official Extract thereof, shall together with such Declaration be produced to the said Clerks or Clerk, who upon such Production in either of the Cases aforesaid shall make an Entry of the Declaration in the said Register of Transfers.

Magistrates and Council not bound to regard Trusts.

XXIV. The Magistrates and Council shall not be bound to see to the Execution of any Trust, whether express or implied or constructive, to which any of the said Bonds may be subject, and the Receipt of the Party in whose Name any such Bond shall stand shall from Time to Time be a sufficient Discharge for any Dividend or

other

other Sum of Money payable in respect of such Bond, notwithstanding any Trust to which such Bond may then be subject, and whether or not the Magistrates and Council have had Notice of such Trusts, and they shall not be bound to see to the Application of the Money paid upon such Receipt.

XXV. In the event of the Magistrates and Council disposing of Application any Part of the Property of the City otherwise than for Feu Duty, Property Rent, or Ground Annual, the free Proceeds thereof shall be deposited which may in a separate Bank Account, to be called "the Annuity Bond be sold. Account," and the Amount thus deposited shall from Time to Time be applied in Redemption of the Annuity Bonds to be granted under this Act, the Priority of Redemption to be determined by Ballot to be taken by the Lord Provost or Chief Magistrate of the City for the Time being among such of the Bondholders as shall previously to the taking of such Ballot have intimated in Writing their Desire to participate therein, of which intended Ballot One Month's previous Notice shall be given by the Magistrates and Council, by Circular addressed to the registered Holders of such Bonds as appearing on the said Register, and sent through the Post Office, and also by Advertisement in Two of the Newspapers printed and published in the said City: Provided always, that the Interest arising on the said Annuity Bond Account shall form Part of the ordinary annual Revenue of the City, and be applied as such under the Provisions of this Act.

XXVI. It shall be lawful to the said Magistrates and Council at Bonds may be redeemed. any Time to purchase and redeem any Bond of Annuity to be granted by them in pursuance of this Act upon making Payment to the Person or Persons in right of such Bond of the Sum of One hundred Pounds Sterling, or such other lesser Sum as may be agreed on for every Three Pounds Ten Shillings of Annuity thereby constituted, the Priority of Redemption of such Bonds being determined in manner herein provided in regard to the Redemption of Bonds on the Disposal of any Part of the Property of the City.

XXVII. The said Magistrates and Council may grant, and they Bonds may are hereby authorized and required, on a Demand to that Effect being be renewed. made by any Person entitled to a Bond, to grant a Renewal thereof at the Expense of the Party requiring the same, and to cancel the original Bond; and such renewed Bond, being duly stamped, shall be entered in the Register of Bonds, and may be transferred as is herein-before provided in regard to original Bonds.

XXVIII. From and after the passing of this Act it shall not be Creditors not competent for any of the Creditors of the City or Harbour Commis- to obtain Preferences. 24 B $\lceil Local. \rceil$ sioners

sioners at the passing of this Act, or of the Holder of any Bond granted under the Authority of this Act, by Arrestment or any other legal Proceedings, to obtain a Preference over the other Creditors or Bondholders.

Surplus

XXIX. The Sums contained in the Bonds of Annuity to be granted by virtue of this Act shall be paid out of and from the Monies arising from (first) the Surplus, if any, of the annual Proceeds of the Rates and Duties to be levied by the said Magistrates and Council under this Act, or other Revenues arising from the Management of the said Port and Harbour, after defraying the necessary Expenses of Management, Repairs, and Maintenance, and (secondly) the Surplus, if any, of the ordinary annual Municipal Revenue of Perth, to the Extent to which such surplus Revenues may be found available; and any Deficiency which may thereafter remain of the Amount necessary to meet the Payment of the Sums contained in or payable under the said Bonds shall be made good by Assessment in the Manner hereinafter provided.

Deficiency, if any, to be estimated.

XXX. The said Magistrates and Council shall, with all convenient Despatch, after the Fifteenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, make and record an Estimate of the Sum of Money which when added to the surplus Revenues before mentioned, if any, may be sufficient for the Payment of the Sums contained in or payable under the said Bonds of Annuity for the Period from the Eleventh Day of November One thousand eight hundred and fiftyfive to the Fifteenth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and thereafter they shall yearly, and with all convenient Despatch, after the Fifteenth Day of October in each Year, make and record a similar Estimate of the Sum of Money which when added to the surplus Revenues before mentioned, if any, may be sufficient for the Payment of the Sums contained in or payable under the said Bonds of Annuity for the Year from the Fifteenth Day of May in the Year in which such Estimate is made to the Fifteenth Day of May in the Year next ensuing.

Power to raise Money by Assessment within the Bounds described in Sched. (M.) of 2 & 3 W. 4. c. 65.

XXXI. So soon as such Estimate shall have been made, it shall be lawful to the said Magistrates and Council, and they are hereby authorized and required, in each Year to raise and provide the Amount thereof (together with a reasonable Sum to cover the Expenses of Collection) by an Assessment, not exceeding the Sum of Fourpence in the Pound, upon the annual Value of all Lands and Heritages (excepting as is herein-after provided) within the Limits of the ancient Royalty of the Burgh of Perth, in so far as it is included within the Boundaries described in Schedule (M.) to an Act of the Second and Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William

William the Fourth, intituled An Act to amend the Representation of the People in Scotland, as such annual Value shall be instructed by the Valuation Rolls for the Time being, and which Lands and Heritages shall include and consist of all Lands, Houses, Fishings, Woods, Copse, and Underwood from which Revenue is actually derived, Ferries, Piers, Harbours, Quays, Wharfs, Docks, Canals, Railways, Mines, Minerals, Quarries, Coalworks, Waterworks, Limeworks, Brickworks, Ironworks, Gasworks, Factories, and all Buildings and Pertinents thereof, and all Machinery fixed or attached to any Lands or Heritages, provided that no Mine or Quarry shall be assessed unless it has been worked during some Part of the Year to which the Assessment applies; and such Assessment may be demanded either from the Proprietors or Occupiers of such Lands and Heritages; but if the same be paid by any Proprietor, he shall have recourse for One Half thereof against the Occupier of the Subjects to which the Assessment applies, and if paid by the Occupier, he shall have the like Recourse against the Proprietor.

XXXII. The said Assessment shall be recovered in the same Way Recovery of and Manner in all respects, and with the same Powers and Right of Assessment. Action and Diligence, and of using summary Warrants and Proceedings, as the Magistrates and Council may at present by Law exercise in regard to the levying of the Rates authorized by the Act of the Second and Third Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, "to improve Prisons and Prison Discipline in Scotland."

XXXIII. The said Magistrates and Council shall not, under the Exemptions Powers of this Act, assess any Lands or Heritages which shall be from Assessunoccupied for the whole Year from one Term of Whitsunday to ment. the succeeding Term of Whitsunday, nor the Council House, City Chambers, Gaol, Police Office, County Buildings, Courts of Law, or Incorporation Halls of Perth, nor the Public Baths, nor the General Prison at Perth, nor any Church or Place of Divine Worship, nor any Buildings which are solely used in connexion with the Collection of the Public Revenue, or solely occupied for the Purposes of Public Charity, Science, or Education.

XXXIV. If any Surplus of the said Assessment to be annually Surplus imposed shall remain at the End of any Year after the Purposes for Monies to be which such Assessment was imposed shall be provided for, the same short Asshall be applied towards the same Purposes respectively for the Year sessments following; and if the Assessment for any Year or Period shall not be sufficient for such Purposes for that Year or Period, the said Magistrates and Council shall be entitled, and they are hereby authorized and required, to make Provision for Payment in the following and subsequent Years till the same shall be fully paid; provided

that for no One Year shall the Rate of Assessment hereby authorized be exceeded.

Expenditure of City restricted.

XXXV. So long as any Bond or Bonds of Annuity to be granted in pursuance of the Provisions of this Act shall stand unredeemed, it shall not, subject to the Provisions of this Act, be lawful for the said Magistrates and Council to apply any Part of the ordinary Revenues, Property, or Common Good of the said City or Proceeds thereof to any other Purpose than to the Payment of the Sums contained in or payable under the said Bonds of Annuity, and such other Debts and Obligations as they may from Time to Time be responsible for by Law, and to such Disbursements as shall be necessary for the letting, collecting, repairing, upholding, and Management of the said Revenues, Property, and Common Good, or the Sale or Disposal thereof, or otherwise for the proper Management of the Affairs of the City.

Law Accounts of City to be taxed.

XXXVI. The whole Law Accounts incurred by the City shall be annually taxed by an Auditor appointed by the Magistrates and Council.

Accounts of the Harbour to be kept se-

XXXVII. The Accounts of the Income and Expenditure of the Port and Harbour and Navigation, and other Accounts therewith connected, shall at all Times be kept separate and distinct from the those of City. Accounts of the City.

Reserving Claims of the City against Harbour.

XXXVIII. And whereas the Magistrates and Council are entitled, under the Harbour Acts before recited, to Payment of One Twelfth the Port and Part of the Amount of the maximum Rates thereby leviable at the Port and Harbour of *Perth*, in lieu of the Rates, Dues, and Duties formerly exigible by them under the Name of Custom, Anchorage, Cess Boll, Shore Dues, Coal Deacon's Dues, or otherwise: And whereas a Portion of the Debts before mentioned, due by the Commissioners, is due to the said Magistrates and Council; and further, Claims of Relief may arise in respect of Payments to be made by the Magistrates and Council under this Act: Be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall be held to extinguish such Claims in whole or in part, but the same shall be good, valid, and exigible as against the Rates and Duties leviable at the said Port and Harbour under this Act: Provided always, that the said Claims shall be and the same are hereby postponed until the Debts otherwise due by the Commissioners shall be extinguished.

Application of surplus Revenues of Harbour after Satis-

XXXIX. When and so soon as all lawful Claims against the said Port and Harbour, and the Rates and Duties leviable thereat, whether now existing or to arise through the Operation of this Act, shall be discharged and satisfied, the surplus Revenues of the said Port and Harbour

Harbour shall, subject to the Provisions of this Act, be applied to faction of the Purposes of the said Port and Harbour and Navigation, and the Claims. Magistrates and Council shall, as far as then practicable, reduce the Rates and Duties leviable in respect thereof by this Act authorized.

XL. Nothing in this Act contained shall extend or be construed Reservation to extend to take away, impeach, diminish, limit, change, or affect of Rights of Corporation. the Rights, Powers, Privileges, Jurisdictions, or Authorities of the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council of the City of Perth in any way belonging to or vested in them on behalf of the Community thereof, in virtue of their Right to Free Port and Harbour, or as Conservators of the Navigation of the River Tay, or otherwise; but without Prejudice always to the Right of the Free Port and Harbour claimed by the Right Honourable the Earl of Kinnoull at Bridgend of Perth as a Part and Pertinent of the Barony of Balhousie, in so far as his Rights and Titles shall legally support or establish the same; and also without Prejudice to the legal Rights, Claims, and Privileges of any other Person or Persons constituted either by a written Title or Consuetude to any Right of Free Port and Harbour or of Public Ferry, or other Right in or upon the said River Tay, Bed or Channel thereof, or any Part of the same not specially taken away or limited by the recited Acts or this Act; but nothing herein contained shall be deemed, construed, or taken to exempt Ships frequenting the said Port of Bridgend of Perth, or Goods imported or exported thereat, from Payment of the Rates and Duties by this Act imposed and authorized to be levied.

XLI. All Ships coming to or frequenting any private Quay, Pier, Reservation or Landing Place within the said Port and Harbour of Perth, at of Rights to which the Proprietor, or his or her Tenants, have a legal Right, Quays. either by written Title or Consuetude, to export or import any Goods, Articles, or Things, and also the said Goods, Articles, or Things so exported or imported at such private Quay, Pier, or Landing Place, having a legal Right as said is, shall be and they are hereby exempted from Payment at such private Quay, Pier, or Landing Place of the Rates and Duties by this Act authorized to be levied, but without Prejudice to the Liability of such Ships proceeding to and receiving or discharging a Cargo or any Part of a Cargo at any other Quay, Pier, or Landing Place not having such legal Right, or the Goods, Articles, or Things exported or imported at such other Quay, Pier, or Landing Place, in Payment of the Rates and Duties imposed by this Act.

XLII. Nothing contained in this Act, or in any of the Acts Saving herein referred to, shall extend to authorize the Magistrates and Rights of the Crown. Council to take, use, or in any Manner interfere with any Land, Soil,  $\lceil Local. \rceil$ 24 C Tenements,

Tenements, or Hereditaments, or any Rights in respect thereof, belonging to the Queen's most Excellent Majesty in right of Her Crown, without the Consent in Writing of the Commissioners for the Time being of Her Majesty's Woods, Forests, and Land Revenues, or One of them, on behalf of Her Majesty first had and obtained for that Purpose, (which Consent such Commissioners are hereby respectively authorized to give,) or to take away, prejudice, diminish, or alter any of the Estates, Rights, Privileges, Powers, or Authorities vested in or enjoyed or exerciseable by the Queen's Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors.

Saving Rights of the Admiralty:

XLIII. Nothing in this Act contained shall diminish, prejudice, take away, alter, suspend, or affect any Right, Power, Authority, Privilege, or Jurisdiction of the Lord High Admiral, or of the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain* and *Ireland*.

Expenses of Act,

XLIV. The Expenses of this Act shall be defrayed out of the Proceeds of the Common Good of the said City.
